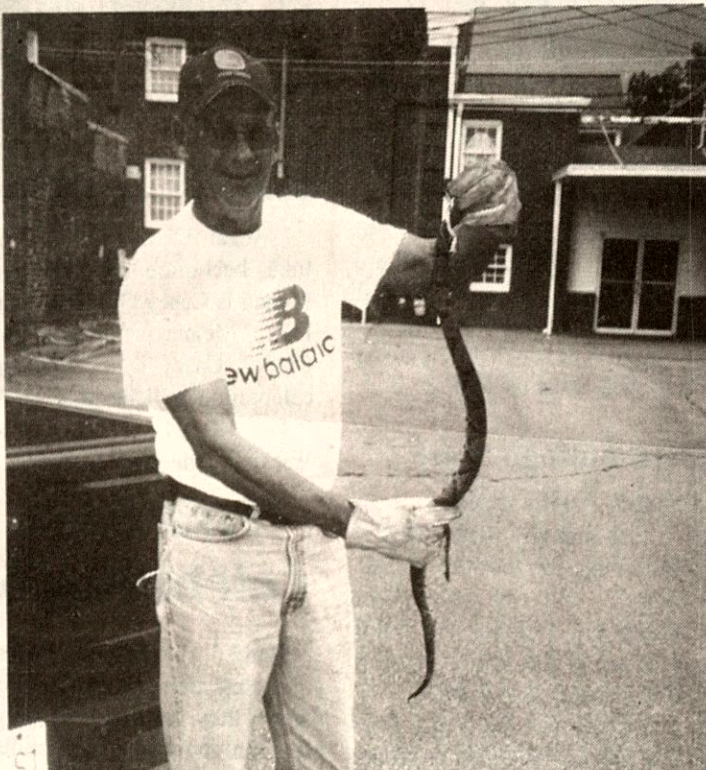

Last week Pete Walker, Jr., who lives out on Harmony Road, next door to his dad, Pete Walker, Sr., was walking down to his Dad's house when he walked upon this viscous Copperhead slithering across the yard. This big snake was precariously close to the front door of the elder Pete's house. Young Pete quickly located a "kizer"-blade and sliced the Copperhead's head off. The snake measured about 3 inches around and was about 50 inches long before having his head chopped off. Now, Pete, since this is your second snake in the last month, all your snake hunting-buddies are looking for some more repeats in the next few weeks.

worried about the one back at the house that wouldn't come. "Well, he is twenty-one".

When you get there, the one with the flashlight goes in first to locate the snake, they like to hide on that shelf or under a slab. "Now there is one over there in that corner that I couldn't reach with a hoe, but he is just as scared of us as we are of him". I never believed that.

It makes a lasting impression sitting there listening to adults grumble. thunder. rain on that tin roof and the smell of mold mingled with fresh snake blood. Once somebody got wise during the snake killing part and the hoe handle busted a half gallon jar of pickles that had been there for eight or nine years—that is a smell that will stay with you.

Travis Childers told me that his memories of the storm house were pretty much the same as mine. He remembers one night, "it is always night. I don't think bad storms come in the daytime". His whole community was in the same storm house, the Timbes' and the Beardens, and the Stokes' and several others, he was sitting on his Grandmother Stokes' lap, holding on tight. The thunder was bad, the lightning, they were getting the whole works. His Grandmother Stokes was of that generation of women that wore their hair long and rolled up into a neat little bun on top of her head. So they are sitting there in the half of light of the coal-oil lamp and she notices that Travis is pulling on her hair, "Travis, don't pull on Granny's hair", he denied it. After the third warning, Grandpa Stokes turned from the door with the flashlight. Like us, they always had a man standing in the door to tell everybody what was happening. He shined the light in her direction, mostly to get Travis' attention. That is when he saw it, it wasn't a BIG snake, but there it was wrapped in Granny's hair. It had crawled off that shelf. Travis said he didn't remember exactly what happened next, but there was a lot of activity. He did remember that they didn't kill the snake, I guess it wasn't that important.

We took things to the storm house, the flashlight and the hoe, the hoe was to kill the snake with.

A storm house is a fascinating place for a kid, mud under your feet, and pine slabs, and God knows what else. A wooden bench full of adults, some complaining about having to be there, others

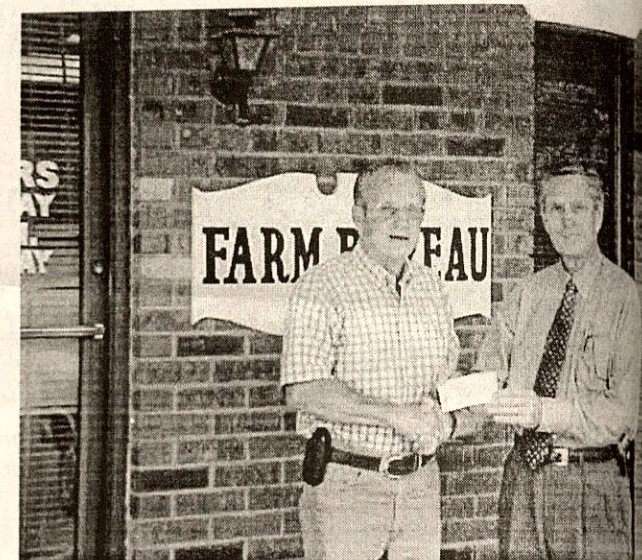

**Will Glasses Weaken Eyes?**

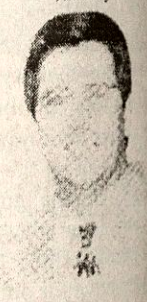
It is pure mythology that wearing glasses (or contact lenses) will weaken your eyes or, conversely, that wearing glasses will strengthen them. The truth is that glasses correct optical errors when they are worn, but they have no effect - good or bad - on the optical system within the eye and cannot, therefore, make the eyes weaker or stronger.

The notion that glasses do the work instead of your eyes is probably at the bottom of each of these myths. Some people assume that "vacationing: eyes are getting stronger because they do not have to work so hard, while others believe that the eyes get weaker from lack of exercise.

Both ideas are patently absurd. When you wear glasses, your eyes are working as hard as they can, just as they do when you do not wear glasses. The only difference is that you see better when glasses do what your eyes cannot do alone.

## LAST WISHES

While physicians are generally charged with preserving the patient's life by using whatever medical means necessary, this strategy may not be in accordance with a dying patient's wishes. If so, healthcare directives provide patients with the opportunity to write out their wishes in advance and ensure some legal respect for themselves in the event they are ever unable to speak for themselves. A healthcare directive is a straightforward legal document that creates a contract with the attending doctor. It sets forth the patient's wishes about what medical treatment should be withheld, or provided, when the patient is unable to communicate those wishes him- or herself. This document should be prepared in tandem with a will.

It is important to have legal assistance when creating a healthcare directive and when you decide to write your own documents, have them reviewed by a lawyer to ensure it is understood exactly as you intended and meets legal requirements. When you require legal guidance for a personal injury or security matter, call my office to schedule a consultation. HINT: If you wish to withhold life-prolonging treatments from your future care, make these wishes known to a trusted friend or family member.

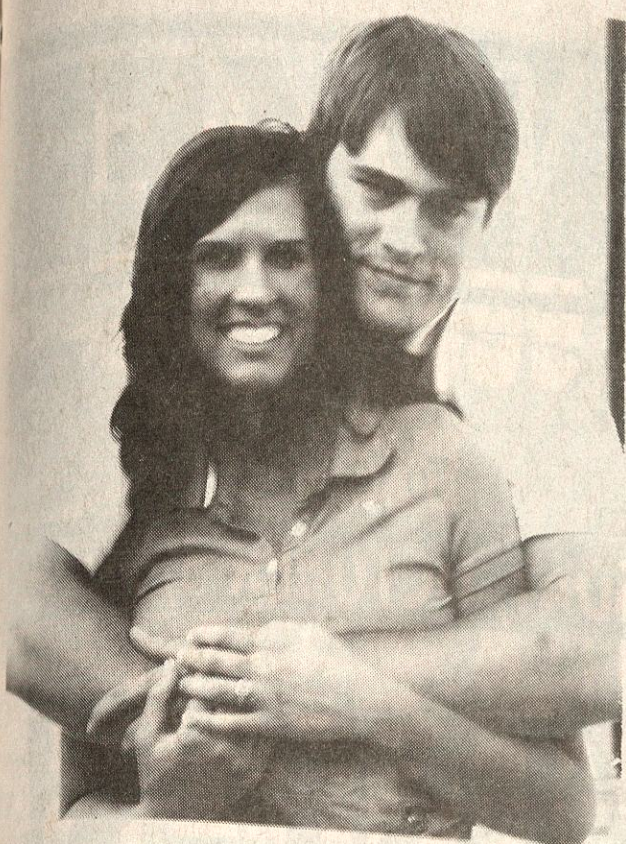

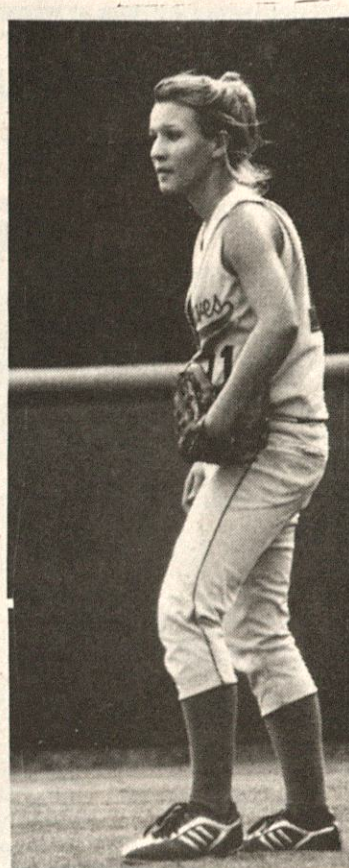

## Iuka Loses Its Citizen Soldier

The Iuka community lost one of its own when Sergeant First Class Ricky Digby went to be with the Lord. He was diagnosed with cancer in April, 2006, and passed away on August 11th, 2006, at approximately 8:05 p.m.

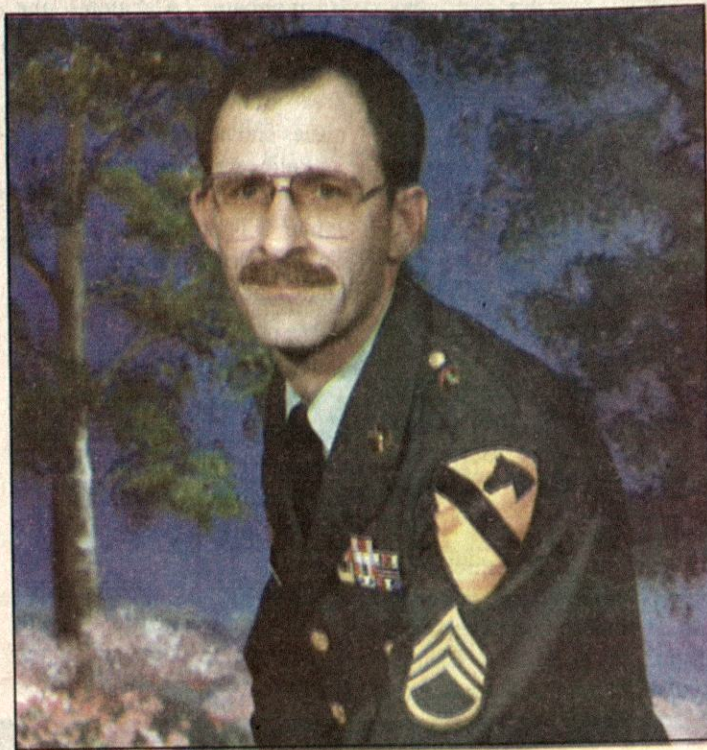
SFC Digby was an amazing soldier and a caring friend; and he had an influence on everybody he knew. If any soldier needed anything, they knew that SFC Digby could get it for them. And, he did. He never failed anyone. If it were an item or an answer, he would get it.

Someone who knew him well was Sergeant First Class John Rorie (R). He worked with SFC Digby at Company C, 1/198th AR, in Iuka for 16 years.

"Ricky was Charlie Company . . . he knew everything about Charlie Company. Any soldier who had an opportunity to work with him, around him, or just know him was aware of his ability to make Charlie Company go. Nobody knew it better than Ricky Digby."

SFC Rorie worked with SFC Digby at Iuka since 1985. Ricky was an ASP (Administration Specialist Personnel). His knowledge, patience, and determination for the soldiers of Charlie Company and the City of Iuka were evident . . . all a person had to do was look around . . . there was SFC Digby . . . in his uniform. Whether it was at Wal-Mart, the Post Office or voting, he was affectionately known as "Mr. National Guard" in the Iuka community.

I, personally, remember him telling me that during Annual Training at Camp Shelby (in 1996), he didn't take his boots off one time!!! "That's how

dedicated he was . . . the last to bed down, and the first to rise!!! That was SFC Digby's way of letting the soldiers know they were in good hands. "He touched everybody in his presence," said Rorie.

Digby served 28 years in the Army/National Guard, and he retired in October, 2001. After retirement, he went to work with the City of Iuka in the Public Water & Gas Department.

"He always told soldiers to be serious about their career. . . take it to the next level. Go to school and further your military career. I can hear him saying to never settle for second best. He was a great friend . . . a great mentor . . . he was a soldier's soldier," said Rorie.

SFC Digby was honored with a military burial and interment at Oak Grove Cemetery

in Iuka, MS. He is survived by his wife, Doris; son, Trey, both of Iuka; and mother, Eunell of Fulton, MS.

Brother Jackie Gray officiated the ceremony at Iuka Baptist Church. Brother Gray was a lifelong friend of SFC Digby. Mr. Eugene Digby, SFC Digby's uncle, also presided over the service. Former 155th Brigade Commander, Brigadier General Augustus Collins, told the family and friends that SFC Digby was one of the best men to ever serve in the military.

"I know there will never be another like him . . . you can't duplicate a SFC Ricky Digby . . . but, we will always try to emulate him. You will never be forgotten, SFC Digby. Your presence will always be felt at Charlie Company!! Well done, SFC Digby . . . your mission has been accomplished!!!
