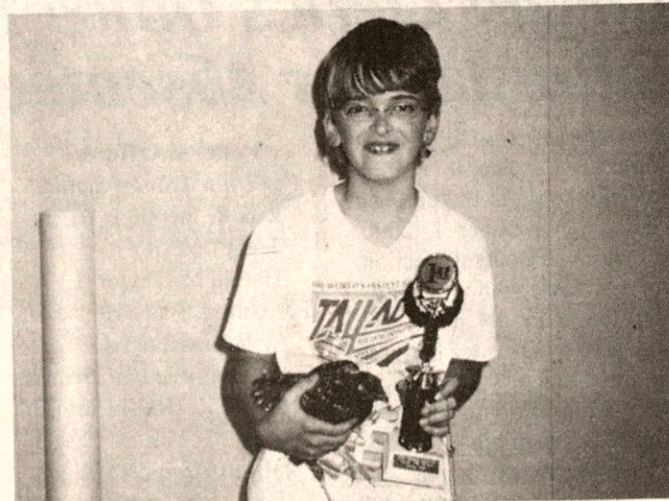

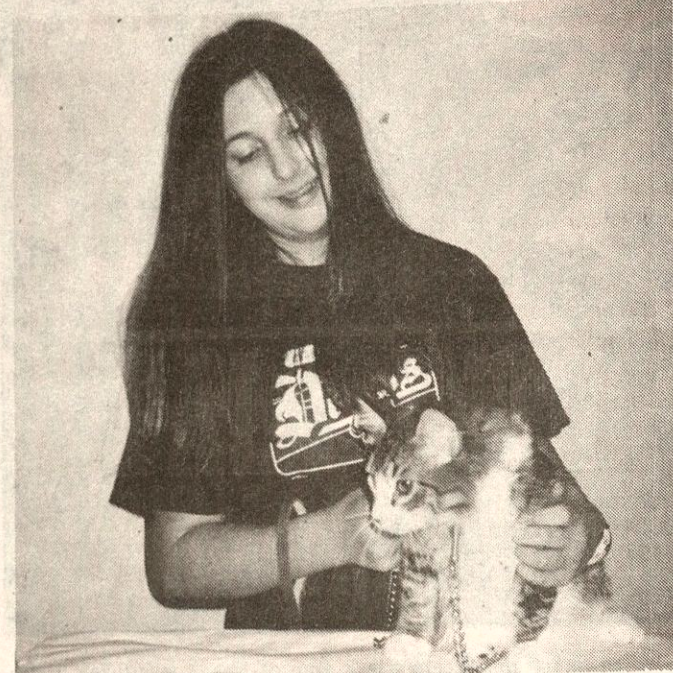

Lazyeye

The reason that lazy eye (amblyopia) develops is not completely understood. What is known is that if a person is unable to use both eyes together, one eye will eventually become dominant and the other will fall in disuse. The unused eye (lazy eye) will eventually become useless.

Corrective lenses, prisms, contact lenses and/or vision therapy programs can be prescribed to teach the lazy eye to function normally. Sometimes, the better eye is covered with a patch to stimulate use and strengthening of the lazy one. Early diagnosis and treatment can usually improve the clarity of vision in the lazy eye.

Since amblyopia usually occurs in only one eye while the better eye "takes over" to see for both, persons are often unaware of the condition. Periodic optometric examinations, beginning by or before age three, are an excellent means of diagnosing lazy eye. Some cases of lazy eye are identified in vision screenings.

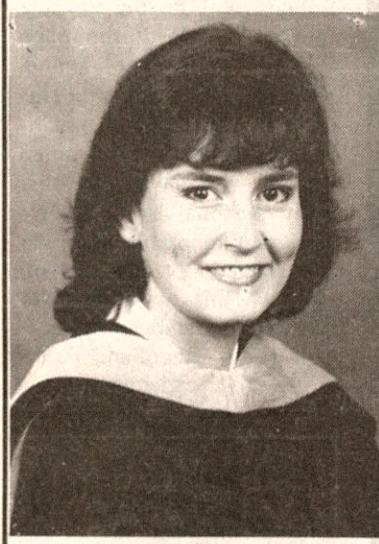

PRINCIPALS AND THEIR AGENTS

If you were to suffer an injury as the result of the negligence of a delivery person, would you seek to recover damages by suing the delivery person or his or her employer? The answer to this question largely rests with the fact that an "agent" is an individual who is authorized to act on behalf of another. The person or entity who granted authority to an agent is called the "principal." In the event that the agent acts negligently and harms another person as a result, "vicarious liability" exists, and the principal may be held liable for the actions of the agent. In the case of the delivery person who acts negligently, the employer may be held liable.

Although many of us know a bit about our legal system, it can seem perplexing to those of us who are not in the field. Legal matters, like any other issue requiring expertise, truly are best handled by a professional. When you have a personal injury matter at hand, call my office to schedule a consultation.

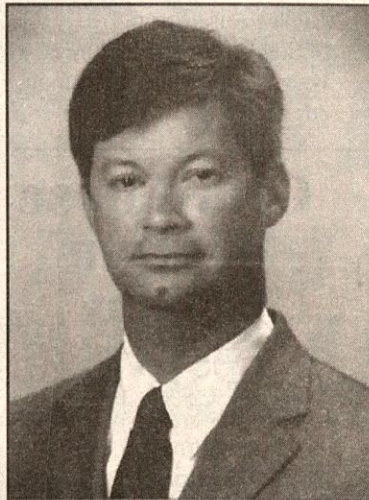

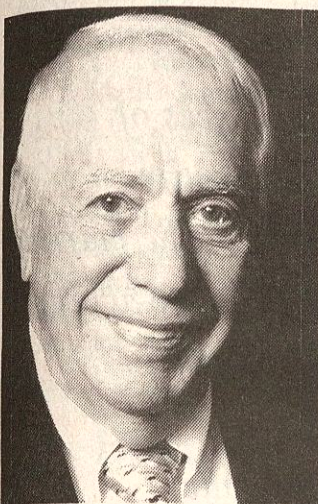

Our Chaplain, Mary Ledbetter welcomed Mrs. Mary Sue Wright, a prospective member. A sympathy card was signed by all to be sent to Mrs. Vicky Durham at the death of an aunt. Mrs. Ledbetter asked us to remember the family in prayer.

Members were given new year books which have been dedicated to Mrs. Marquita Mathis and Mrs. Vicky Durham for their devotion that has made this chapter possible.

Mrs. Eunell Handy was presented with her new Certificate of Membership and a UDC coffee cup by Mrs. Marquita Mathis, and was welcomed to the chapter.

We were reminded by our president of the upcoming 110th

Annual MS Division UDC Convention to be held October 6-8, 2006 at the Eola Hotel in Natchez, MS. The chapters of District IV will be serving as hostesses.

Mrs. Mary Sue Wright had her display of Sunbonnets and Aprons at the Iuka Library during the month of September. She mentioned some of particular interest, some donated, some purchased. This display correlated with the program given by Mrs. Jeanie McKee, entitled, "The Sunbonnet Heroine".

Emma Sansom was born in

1847 in Georgia, the daughter of Micajah and Lamila Sansom. She was the youngest of several children.

When Emma was about 5 years old, the family moved close to Gadsden, Alabama in a home near Black Creek.

Emma was sixteen years old when she and her mother were working the yard and saw smoke coming from the direction of the only usable bridge over Black Creek. They rushed in an attempt

to save the bridge, but saw it was too far-gone to save and too, blue coated soldiers stood on the opposite bank to deter anyone from saving it or crossing over.

Emma and her mother returned to their home as other soldiers dressed in gray rode up on horses. They saw the bridge burning and asked if there was any other way to cross the river. Emma explained that she knew of a ford farther up the river she had seen the cows crossing and if the soldier would saddle her horse, she would show him the place.

The big, burly soldier responded, "There is no time to saddle your horse so come ride with me on my horse and you can show me the place. I am General Nathan Bedrord Forrest and you will be safe and I will return you to your home." He pulled his horse near a bank where Emma jumped on behind him.

Emma guided Gen. Forrest to the spot, his soldiers were able to cross while she was returned to her home.

The Sunbonnet Heroine saved the cavalry several precious hours of riding. They were in pursuit of the Union army and eventually captured them. Thanks largely to Emma's service as a guide, a Union raid through three states was prevented.

Emma married a Confederate soldier and moved to Texas where they raised a family. She died knowing she was the only female ever to climb aboard the

war-horse of General Nathan B. Forrest and ride with him.

As a footnote to this story of Emma Sansom, Mrs. Eunell Handy told of living in Gadsden, Alabama. She stated that a monument had been erected to the memory of Emma Sansom in the median of the east-west thoroughfare through Gadsden at Black Creek; a high school built and named Emma Sansom High School. Such a fitting memorial to this heroine!

Today, September 19th marks the 144th anniversary of the Battle of Iuka. Approximately 11,00 Confederate soldiers fought, 1,438 were killed, wounded or missing. Twenty-eight Union Soldiers fought with 732 killed, wounded or missing. To honor those men, a gray candle was lit for the Confederacy

and a blue candle for the Union. A moment of silence followed.

The meeting adjourned at 3:40 p.m. and refreshments were served and enjoyed by everyone. Hostesses were Mrs. Jeanie McKee and Mrs. Eunell Handy.

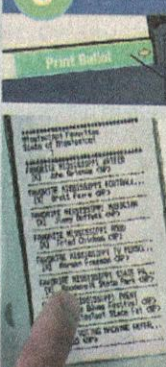
If you wish to write in a candidate, touch "Write-In" and type the name. Then touch "Record Write-In".

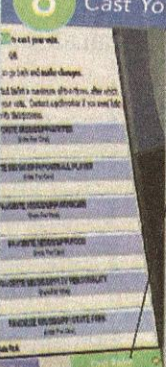
