Costs for this program vary a bit, but generally include a \$30 joining fee and \$12 a week for the meetings and lots of literature that explain the program, gives recipes, food and point lists and inspirational before and after testimonies. From January to March there are special reduced prices, and there are senior citizen discounts.

Fitness & Exercise

Any health improvement program is going to include recommendations for increasing your exercise, and options abound here in our beautiful county for at least starting a regular walking program.

Every town in the county has a walking track that provides a safe and level place to start walking. The weather usually allows for walking a couple times a week, even on your lunch hour.

According to the Let's Go Walkin' Mississippi website (www.letsgowalkin.com), walking one mile briskly in

15 minutes burns nearly as many calories as jogging the same distance in 8.5 minutes!

Walking is inexpensive, low-impact and effective for people of all ages. All you need to get started is a good pair of walking shoes, and walking with a buddy can be rewarding, and provide some accountability to get you out there and actually do it! Having someone to talk to makes half an hour go by before you know it, and you can do it at lunch, waiting for kids to finish ball practice or any other time you have a few minutes.

Iuka Wellness Center

The Iuka Wellness Center is a great resource our county has for affordable fitness coaching, weight management and classes.

Since the Wellness Center, on Battleground Drive near Fred's, is a hospital based center, you have the full resources of the Northeast Mississippi Medical Center behind the planning of a program that meets your individual needs, explained center Director Emily Wadkins. Whether you are on a physician-referred program or

rehab, or just want to work out in a top-level facility, they can help you at Iuka Wellness Center.

And about 300 Tishomingo countians do, paying about \$25-40 a month to use the machines and weights, do cardio workouts, or take classes in yoga or many others periodically offered for many different interests and ages. Hours for the center accommodate about everyone, opening at 5:30 a.m. and closing at 7 or 8 p.m. on weeknights.

Personal instruction on how to use the machines like treadmills, bikes, and elliptical trainers is provided, along with as much, or as little, supervision or coaching as you desire, explained Wadkins. You can work with hospital dieticians for a personal eating plan to combine with your workout schedule.

"We are very fortunate to have what we have for our size of a town," said Wadkins.

MDEQ Promotes Green Christmas and Holiday Conservation

Jackson, Miss.- The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) encourages all Mississippians to remember the environment this holiday season through the recycling of Christmas trees and other holiday materials.

According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the amount of household trash increases by 25 percent or 25 million tons nationally between Thanksgiving and the New Year. Trimming holiday waste stream can require less effort than one may think.

Christmas trees provide a number of ecological opportunities. Recycled Christmas trees are used as fish spawning habitats, mulch for public

landscaping projects and homeowner use, for boiler fuel, and for lake, river, and beachfront stabilization.

Root ball Christmas trees can be planted in the yard when the decorations come down and will increase soil stability and air quality. For more information on tree recycling programs, contact local solid waste departments, a Keep Mississippi Beautiful affiliate, or County Extension Service agents.

Other conservation tips include: buying products with the Energy Star logo for energy efficiency; recycling any electronic devices that are being replaced by newer models; when mailing holiday cards use post cards, which

generate less waste and require less energy to manufacture and transport; saving gift boxes and wrapping paper for future use and separating recyclables. Many communities and schools also offer Christmas card and wrapping paper recycling programs.

Holiday foods also present opportunities to reduce holiday environmental impact. Give food gifts in reusable or recyclable containers. Store leftovers in reusable containers. Instead of trashing uneaten food; donate it to a food bank. Composting fruit and vegetable trimmings will help Spring gardens.

MDEQ Executive Director Trudy Fisher said, "Simple steps can provide an inexpensive and enduring gift to our natural resources and our future generations. On behalf of the staff at the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality, I wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a safe, enjoyable holiday season."





Therapist Suggests Ways To Prevent Your Child From Becoming A Tater Tot

Researchers say it is no mystery why one third of children in the United States are obese and some 60 percent of overweight children between 5 and 10 years of age have at least one risk factor for heart disease.

Cathy Henderson, a physical therapist at Methodist Rehabilitation Center in Jackson, says that eating fast food and sugar-filled snacks, along with an increase in sedentary activities, is putting children at risk of heart disease, diabetes and the propensity to become overweight adults.

"Physical education classes have declined in schools over the last ten years and more children are watching television now than ever," Henderson said.

Henderson says parents can help propel their children into a healthier adulthood by encouraging physical activity at an early age. She says that implementing daily physical activity during early childhood will help establish good exercise habits and challenge motor coordination.

"Limiting television time, videos, computer games and Internet time will allow for more spontaneous physical activity," Henderson said. "Be creative and encourage games like Twister, which gets them moving and promotes flexibility."

She also recommends that parents exercise with their children to set good examples and show them how much fun it can be.

Henderson said the reward will be more than just improvements in your children's physical well-being. "Many children see an improvement in self-esteem, mental health and academic performance," she said. "Their attention span and energy level also can be increased when they stay physically active."

Tips for increasing physical activity:

- Walk or ride a bike to school or to a friend's house.
- Take your children to the park or swimming pool on sunny days.
- Get involved in exercising with your children. Play tag, Simon Says, chase and other sports.
- Go for walks with the family after dinner instead of watching TV.
- Encourage participation in sports at school and in the community.
- Encourage physical activity by giving special equipment like a bat, ball or Frisbee.





HCVFD Receives Grant

Harmony-Central Fire Department recently received a \$100,000 grant to purchase 20 new Self Contained Breathing Apparatus. Harmony-Central applied for a Regional Federal Grant through FEMA/DHS to purchase the SCBA's in May and received notice of the award August 31st. The grant had a 5% match requirement which means we only had to put up \$5,000 to receive the money. Twenty SCBA's were purchased at a cost of \$5,000 each for a total of \$100,000. The SCBA's were divided between Harmony-Central, Coleman Park, Eastport-Millcreek and Snowdown-Pleasant Hill. Each department received 5 complete SCBA's and 5 spare bottles. The SCBA's purchased were Scott Model 50, 4500psi with 45min bottles. The SCBA's meet new NFPA code with the heads up display in the mask that lets the firefighter know the amount of air left in his/her tank and the new voice amplification system on the mask. They also have integrated PASS devices that activate when the air is turned on. The packs were also purchased with a tracking device built into the pack that will allow a downed firefighter to be located by use of a handheld tracking device. We are the first departments in the state to have this tracking device as it is brand

new to the market. I understand much of this language is unfamiliar to some of you, but if you would like to see the SCBA's, contact one of the fire departments listed and ask to see them. They will be glad to let you see and touch as you are all part owner of the equipment. Thank you for supporting your local fire departments with your donations. Without you we would never be able to purchase equipment and fund everyday expenses. Opportunities to apply for the grants would not be possible without the support and effort of our local, state and federal government. We want to thank you for your support of the grant programs and ask for your continued support.





AMERICA'S HEROES

The Purple Heart: A Tradition Of Courage

(NAPS)—Americans know to salute the brave military men and women who have earned the distinguished Purple Heart. But how much do you know about the medal itself?

The Purple Heart is the oldest military decoration still in active use. Originally created as the Badge of Military Merit by General George Washington in 1782, it was revived and redesigned by General Douglas MacArthur in 1931 and reissued on February 22, 1932.

To be eligible for a Purple Heart, one must be wounded by an instrument of war inflicted by the enemy. That makes the medal the only decoration that attests, without question, to the bearer having been in combat.

Purple Heart Status
To learn if next of kin has been awarded the Purple Heart, a written request, signed and dated, must be mailed to the Military Personnel Records facility of the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC). The address is 9700 Page Ave., St. Louis, MO 63132-5100.

After 10 days or so, you may send an e-mail requesting status of your request. The e-mail address is mprsta@nara.gov. Or you may

call to ask about the status at (314) 801-0800. E-mailed original requests will not be honored.

It's important to note



however, that because of privacy issues, not anyone can seek information about a veteran. The veteran must give written permission for even next of kin. Next of kin can seek this information for deceased veterans by proving relationship.

Protecting The Purple Heart

The Military Order of the Purple Heart (MOPH), a veterans service organization consisting of 40,000 combat-wounded veterans, is the keeper of the medal and actively seeks out those who would wear or claim it without authority.

Under the provisions of the Stolen Valor Act, those who could face stiff fines and jail time.

Aviation Cadet David Kimberly, formerly of Memphis, is now at Cochran Air Forces Basic Flying training School, at Macon, Ga. His experiences were many during this period, including the sinking of a ship on which he was working. The crew was saved.

Sudden Flashes And The Retina

If you've been disturbed by sudden flashes in your eyes, this may be caused by an irritation of the retina. The retina is a layer of light-sensitive cells located in the back of the eye. When it is stimulated (or in this case irritated) it is capable of sending only one sensation to the brain: light. Just as the nerves in other organs have specific purposes - the ear for receiving sounds, the nose for smell and so forth - light is the only sensation the retina can transmit. Even if the retina was pricked with a sharp pin, the only sensation it would transmit to the brain would be a flash of light.

Even a tiny pull on the retina or a momentary stress on a tiny blood vessel caused by a slight rise in blood pressure may result in a flash of light to the brain. An occasional flash may be harmless. But it may also be an early warning of detachment of the retina, which can cause serious vision problems. Only an examination by your eye specialist can determine the cause and how it can best be treated.
