New Supervisors Meet for Extended Meetings Monday and Tuesday

The newly elected Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors met for the first time shortly after being sworn in, stayed in session for most of the afternoon, and handled more business Tuesday afternoon.

Monday the board elected Brian Grissom as president and James McDowell vice-president, then immediately went into executive session to settle some personnel matters.

The board selected Phillip Whitehead, of Tishomingo, to serve as board attorney and awarded engineering services for state aid work to Cook Coggins Engineering of Tupelo.

Later in the day the board approved some other personnel changes on the individual supervisor's staffs. **Meetings Televised**

New for the board this term will be the broadcast of the board meetings on WRMG-TV12 Iuka, and TV97 in Belmont, Golden, Dennis and Tishomingo. Most times, the meetings will be broadcast the evenings after the meetings, reported station owner Jack Ivy, who will be taping the meetings.

"All our meetings are open to the public," said board president Brandon Grissom.

Regional Jail Request

The board voted to issue a letter of intent to request the Mississippi Department of Corrections to petition the state legislature to allow the county to get a regional jail that would house non-violent state prisoners.

The county would provide the land, and the facility would be financed by revenue bonds paid for by the revenue that the county would receive from the state for housing its prisoners. It will not require a tax hike, and the prison would have its own

medical facility. **Pickwick Pines Not**

Addressed

An issue not addressed Monday was the ever evolving Pickwick Pines utility district issue, which was tabled by the old board back in December for the new

board to consider. About four Pickwick Pines residents were present when the board meeting opened, but they were not around when the board returned from lunch break after executive session, said board president Grissom.

Other Business -

In other business Monday, the board approved two sheriff's deputies and youth court Judge Joey Cobb to attend training sessions.

-They approved travel for the supervisors, chancery clerk and board attorney to attend the Mid Winter Supervisor's Conference January 15th through the

-The board discussed various transition issues involving the supervisors, including the state of much of the county equipment.

On Tuesday afternoon, after 1 1/2 hours in executive session, the board approved the hiring of a full-time 911 dispatcher on recommendation of 911 Supervisor Jerry Bonds. Angie Gober will fill the post that opened when Russ Robinson retired.

Bids were accepted for Fulton Pipe to supply the county with spiral metal culverts, and they discussed at length bids for companies supplying road resurfacing services and other construction materials.

Next Meeting

next regularly scheduled meeting will be January 22nd, accommodate the Martin Luther King Day holiday on the 21st. Regular meetings of the board will be at 10 a.m. the second and fourth Monday of each month, stated Brandon Grissom.

The Honorable Jim Pounds, Circuit Court Judge for the First District administered the oath of office for 17 county officials, and numerous sheriff's deputies.

"Pray, and pray often regarding the decisions you will be making about the lives and resources of those who elected you, and whom you serve," Pounds exhorted those taking office for the first time and those who have been

A dozen officials are returning incumbents, including the people who supervise most of the offices in the courthouse, and the sheriff's department.

There was definitely some younger blood in the new officials, including Peyton Cummings, who defeated long time chancery clerk Hayden Ables to serve in his first elected county position. A new generation of supervisors also took the reins Monday, joining long-time thirddistrict supervisor Danny Ryan. Brandon Grissom of luka, James McDowell and Steve Thorne of Belmont, and Nicky McRae of Burnsville lead in a new generation in the leadership of the county government.

Getting Your Financial House In Order for the New Year

Are you tired of working hard for a paycheck and wondering where it all went? Of having more month left at the end of your money? Are you dreading getting the January bills for your fun-filled holiday spending sprees?

"It is easy to get caught up in the excitement of giving during the holidays," said Suzanne Boas, president of Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Atlanta (CCCS). "But many overdo a good thing and then struggle to make even minimum payments on their credit cards.'

Developing and sticking to a plan for your money can really help your peace of mind and give you a sense of control in your life and there are some resources right here in the county where you can get informed on how to make the

Families First offers Financial Peace University (FPU), which many people have heard of on the Dave Ramsey Radio show that airs on Supertalk Mississippi (94.3, 1 p.m. daily). In this class you receive instruction on how to get on a budget, start getting out of debt, and generally get some control over your finances.

In the past year, Danny McClung, program educator with Families First, led about 30 students through two FPU classes in the county in 2007 and said that participants become more money conscious and develop a financial discipline that helps them gain control of spending, and their incomes.

"We will be starting a class before February," stated

"It is a 13-week class, but the commitment results in re-

ally learning not only the basics of money management, but also teaches investment and wealth-building strategies," said McClung. "Participants gain a financial discipline they didn't have."

For more information on taking a class, call the Families First Center at the TCHS

campus, 423-7318.

Also available is one-onone counseling through the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service.

"We have some information in our office on how to start better money management," said Robyn South, Family and Consumer Science Program Associate with the Tishomingo County branch of the Extension Service. "But we also have someone who can give you one-onone guidance or help with a

Daily encouragement for setting your financial house in order can be found in daily radio shows that like the Dave Ramsey Show, and Money Matters on 88.3 at 8:30 p.m.

CCCS advises consumers to top their list of New Year's resolutions with a commitment to improve their financial outlook. To help consumers tackle what can be a stressful time, CCCS suggests following the following tips:

Know how much you owe. A common mistake is not keeping track of debt. The thinking is that as long as you can keep up with the payments, everything is fine. However, if circumstances change due to a layoff or other unexpected event, you could find yourself unable to make payments and in immediate financial stress. The only way to understand what you are facing is to have a realistic picture of what you owe.

Gather all your credit card statements and other bills and add up the total.

Create a spending plan. The easiest way to take control of your money is to set out a plan for how you will spend it. This is not glamorous and can be something of a task, but it gives you the power to decide where your money goes. The plan should be flexible and include monthly expenses such as mortgage or rent, utilities, food, transportation, entertainment, clothing, etc. Make sure your expenses are not more than your income. If


they are, go back to the plan and make adjustments.

Pay off credit card debt. The average household has close to \$10,000 in credit card debt and the interest paid on those balances can be as high as \$1,800 a year. Baby Bottles I remember when baby

bottles were made of glass and had rubber nipples. My sister who was next to me in age, as a small child with teeth that she could bite off the end of the nipple, "threw a temper tantrum" and broke her bottle. One didn't break a bottle in those days because it might be two weeks before anyone would be traveling to Iuka. My mom had another bottle which was made a little different than the first and filled it with milk for my little sister. She wouldn't have such. She threw it down onto the floor and broke it to pieces. My mom found a third bottle. This bottle was also rejected. My mom turned her over in her lap, spanked her real good and never gave her another bottle. She was quickly weaned! This was not child abuse but simple discipline by my mom. My sister began to eat more food and made it fine without the bottle of milk, after all she had several teeth. She was accountable for her actions and received her punishment, which was a spanking. She grew up just fine under the hand of authority of our parents. There was no negotiation for disobedience at our house. Daddy spoke and we obeyed and there was no argument, sassing or talking back to our parents. We were taught to say "yes sir and no sir" to all that were older than we. And by-the-way, we never had to "stand in the corner, have time outs" or any other inventions of discipline. One can learn early from the sound of a peach tree switch across the rear end. It taught us respect for our parents and for Looking back, I deserved every "whooping" I

received and many more that I did not get. There is a proper way to correct a child, without it being child abuse

In those days, when men entered the courthouse, or any other public building, they removed their caps or hats. When a woman entered a room, most men stood up and offered their seat. Men were real men and women were real ladies. We still have some real men and real ladies today. We witnessed respect in action.

We live in a time when society is the boss and the family structure is now reached a point that 51% of marriages end up in divorces. Marriage vows are no more than comic strips. Children have been cast aside to care for themselves; the elderly receive little respect in most places, and the care of people as a whole is growing less and less. I believe the family breakdowns in our nation are the result of sin ruling in the lives of people.

Sin brings forth an act and state that many people do not think about. It is the act and state of being selfish. It seems to me that it is more of "I" and "Me" that really matters to some folks these days. It is what "I" want and that's all that matters.

We live in a time when child abuse is rampaging. Little girls are hunted down by grown men like dogs after a fawn deer to fill their own lust. It is no wonder that our nation is going down, down ever so fast. Yet these things are not something new. It has been happening down through the pages of time. The differences are that in these days things are being brought to light more than ever before. The Psalmist David spoke of these things that existed in that day. He stated in Psalms 106:38 concerning a nation of people that they "...shed innocent blood, even the blood of their sons and of their daughters, whom they SACRIFICED unto the idols of Canaan: and the land was polluted with blood." He punched a hole in the can, poured the milk into a glass and drank it all himself. The children got up from the

that as a very young boy I was by his bedside when he died vomited up some peaches that he had eaten earlier. It seemed that "I" and "ME" is all that mattered to him.

And if you break your baby bottle, maybe it's time you were weaned from such a thing. Grow up! And by the way, "Leave that cookie alone, it is MINE!" Herman Clark

When was the last time you were at the top of Mountain? Yesterday after church I asked Larry to drive up to the top of Woodall Mountain. I was so disappointed with what we found there. There were paper cups, papers strewn about and beer cans, pop cans, water bottles, logs that appeared to be ready for making a bonfire, a cement bench was overturned and broken, evidently by vandals. A far cry from the memories I have of Woodall as a

teenager. As a teenager, in the late 1950s, on long hot summer days, if our moms did not have us breaking a tub of green beans or shelling a mountain of peas, friends from the area: Vernell, Juanita, Shirley, Mae and I, would get together and walk all the way from our homes (all near Bethel Church) up to the top of Woodall Mountain. We were allowed to do this because our Uncle, Tab Whitfield, would look out for us once we arrived there. Talmadge Whitfield was the keeper of Woodall Mountain for almost 30 years. We youngsters would climb to the top of the old wooden tower and see what a big beautiful, green world was out there.

Woodall had lovely grassy areas and wonderful views back in those days. There was no litter or vandalism evident. The old wooden tower - now in the

hands of one of Tab's sons, was not surrounded with fences and barbed wire. There was a lovely sign. I found a strange comment about this sign when I looked up Woodall Mountain, MS on the Internet. Along with all "Woodall the statistics: Mountain is the highest point in Mississippi, 860 feet high. It played a central roll in the Civil War back in 1862 during the battles of Shiloh, Iuka and Corinth." There is a photograph with comment, "This is what the summit sign is supposed to

Tishomingo County is an amazingly diverse area with many wonderful points of interest. How can we let one of our treasurers be left in this condition.

I admit - as someone who roamed Tishomingo Park as a child, sat in front of the old courthouse to watch couples coming to get married there, and remembers Iuka when there were lots of stores other than Wal-Mart such as Mrs. Brown's Dress Shop, Reed's Men's Store, the hardware store, the movie theatre, the Cotton Gin, the Hadley Hotel - I know things will not stay the same, and life is full of constant changes.

Was the library in Jay Bird Park at one time? And now the entire main street of Iuka looks like it is competing with LaSalle Street in Chicago - one attorney after another. Back then there were a few, two I vaguely remember were Click Clark and Cecil Summer(son?).
