TCHS Braves Win Division 1-4A

Braves To Face Greenwood at New Hope Today

The Tishomingo County High School Braves Basketball team captured their first ever Division 1-4A Championship trophy last weekend.

The outstanding young athletes defeated West Point 76-59 Saturday evening at the Itawamba Community College Davis Event Center, bringing home the first place trophy.

On Tuesday evening, Feb. 20th, the Braves hosted the Neshoba Central Rockets, who finished fourth in the Division 4-4A Tournament. The Braves easily slid past the Rockets with a 83 - 41 victory. The TCHS gym was filled and the fans were not disappointed. With a 45-20 lead at the half, it was smooth rolling for the rest of the game. Josh McCalmon was

the lead scorer for the Braves with 19 points; Tyler Pritchard had 17; Tyler Walker, 15; and Cody Crum had 10.

The Braves will now travel to New Hope today, Thursday, to face Greenwood at 4:00 in North Half play. If the Braves win Thursday, they will play again Friday and Saturday in the double-elimination North Half tournament being hosted by New Hope. The top three teams in North Half will go to State which begins next Tuesday in Jackson.

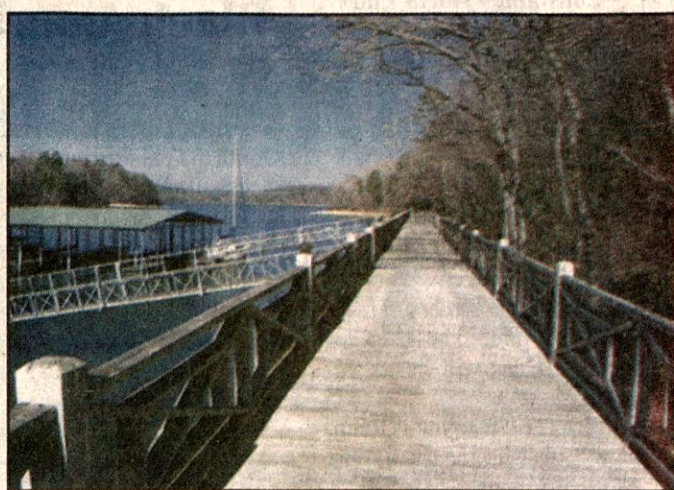
Deadline to qualify for public office is Thursday, March 1, 2007. A complete list of candidates will be released after that date.

River Trace Boardwalk Completed

In preparation for the expansion of the marina, River Trace Resort has completed construction of an extended boardwalk along the shores of Pickwick Lake.

The approximately 750 foot boardwalk allows access to the existing marina, as well as the expanded marina spaces.

The \$3,000,000 expansion includes an addition to the marina, construction of additional infrastructure and access, and opening of 50 additional lots, many with a view of Pickwick Lake or tree covered hills and valleys. The marina will add approximately



90 boat slips and dredge approximately 12,900 cubic yards of sediment in addition of the boardwalk extension.

River Trace is owned by River Trace LLC of Southaven, Mississippi and was purchased in 2005.

North Mississippi Schools Get Large Grant For Directing Teens Toward Healthy Relationships

The Administration for Children & Families of the U.S. Department of Human Services recently awarded eleven School Districts over 2.7 million dollars over the next five years to direct teens toward healthy relationships by:

- Supporting and educating parents and the community regarding healthy relationships
- Working to create a social environment in which marriage is ultimately the preferred choice among teens
- Helping teens set higher standards for themselves.

The project is in 11 school districts in 7 Northeast Mississippi counties since January 2007 which are: Alcorn, Lee, Tippah, Tishomingo, Marshall,

Benton, and Prentiss.

The 11 school districts are: 1) Booneville School District; 2) Tishomingo County School District; 3) Marshall County School District; 4) Benton County School District; 5) Alcorn School District; 6) Prentiss County School District; 7) Baldwin School District; 8) Lee County Schools; 9) Tippah School Districts; 10) Corinth School District; and 11) Holly Springs School District.

The five goals of this program are:

1. To increase the knowledge of adolescents about marriage-related concepts, including recognition of signs of abusive relationships.
2. To increase positive attitudes/beliefs about

marriage-related concepts.

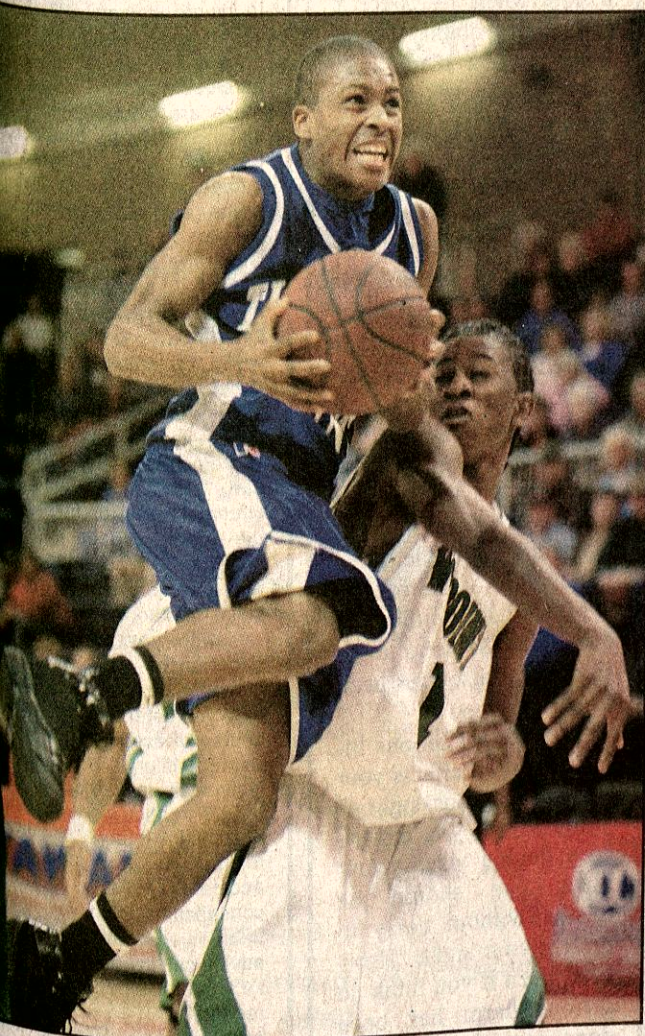
3. To help students change short-term behavior.

4. To demonstrate positive long-term changes in behavior related to healthy relationships.

5. To increase the knowledge and understanding of parents and community about healthy relationships through educational and media campaigns.

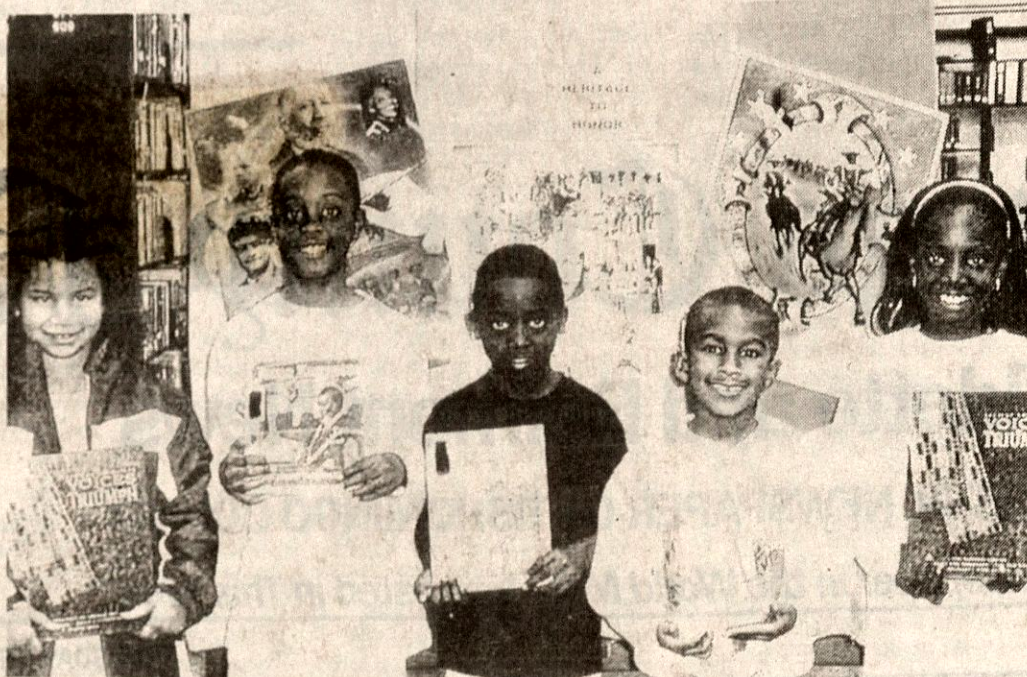

Treating A "Shiner"

If you were involved in a fight when you were a kid you probably came home with a black eye. Most black eyes are not serious injuries. But there are exceptions.

If a blow or injury to the eye is severe enough to cause a "shiner" or hemorrhage under the skin of the eyelid, the eye itself may also have been injured. Some of the complications are serious.

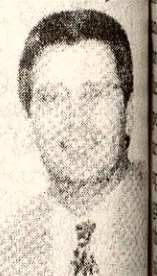
Among the most common are a torn retina, which might lead to detachment, a torn choroid, dislocation of the lens, inflammation of the iris, or a hemorrhage within the eye ball. The bone of the socket may also have been fractured.

One test of serious injury is how it affects your vision. If your sight is blurred or if you experience double vision, your black eye should be treated without delay to protect your sight. However, even if you think no serious harm has been done, it is best to have your eye examined by your eye doctor just to be sure.

Crow's Neck Environmental Education And Conference Center

Crow's Neck has a simple two-part education philosophy: Have Fun and Learn Something! We believe sharing knowledge in an outdoor setting encourages exploration and discovery, while generating an enthusiasm for learning. Experience shows this kind of enthusiasm stays with our students long after their visit, and we often find adult leaders are more excited than their kids, as the visit rekindles a passion for learning!

Environmental education, cooperation, group dynamics, life skills, natural sciences, and outdoor recreation are brought together to form the heart of the Crow's Neck experience. All of our classes are tailor-made to meet the specific needs of individual groups, and are aligned with the state frameworks for Mississippi, Alabama and Tennessee public schools.

During the month of January, we had 67 students and 12 teachers from Grenada High School staying with us for four days and three nights. Grenada High School has established a long tradition with us since Jack Holiday, the lead teacher, has been bringing his classes to Crow's Neck since the Center opened in 1993. (Yes, we even canoe in January !!!) Classes about medical and edible plants and forestry were taught by the Grenada teachers. All in all, it was a little

cool, but the group bundled up and breezed on through their classes. Grenada also enjoyed some competitive game time while playing Outpost, one of most popular night-time activities played after dark. (One frequent visitor compares it to "Capture the Flag with flashlights".) On the last night of their visit, the group enjoyed a hearty walk to the Campfire Ring, while taking advantage of this beautiful night sky and discussing astronomy along the way.

At Crow's Neck time spent learning the great outdoors, time shared with friends and colleagues, and time spent enjoying the special sense of place passes much too quickly. Strong new friendships are made, and old ones grow stronger. As cliques seem to vanish and everyone pulls together, kids say they feel safe and accepted at Crow's Neck. And in the case of the Grenada kids, many of them returned this year for the fourth time, having come as Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors. If you ever wondered how we came up with our tag line, Jack Holliday is responsible for it when he said one time during a Closing Circle: "Crow's Neck...It's not just a place, it's an experience."

The month of February, we will be hosting the following groups: East Booneville Baptist Church (Ladies Conference); First Baptist Church of Saltillo; The 4th Grade Class from Houston Elementary School and The Aquatic Science Club from Biggersville High School. We'll leave you with this: What are you and your kids doing? "We have to do a better job of running bases and not leaving runners on base," said Coach Brown. This week, the Lady Braves hosted Alcorn Central on Tuesday.

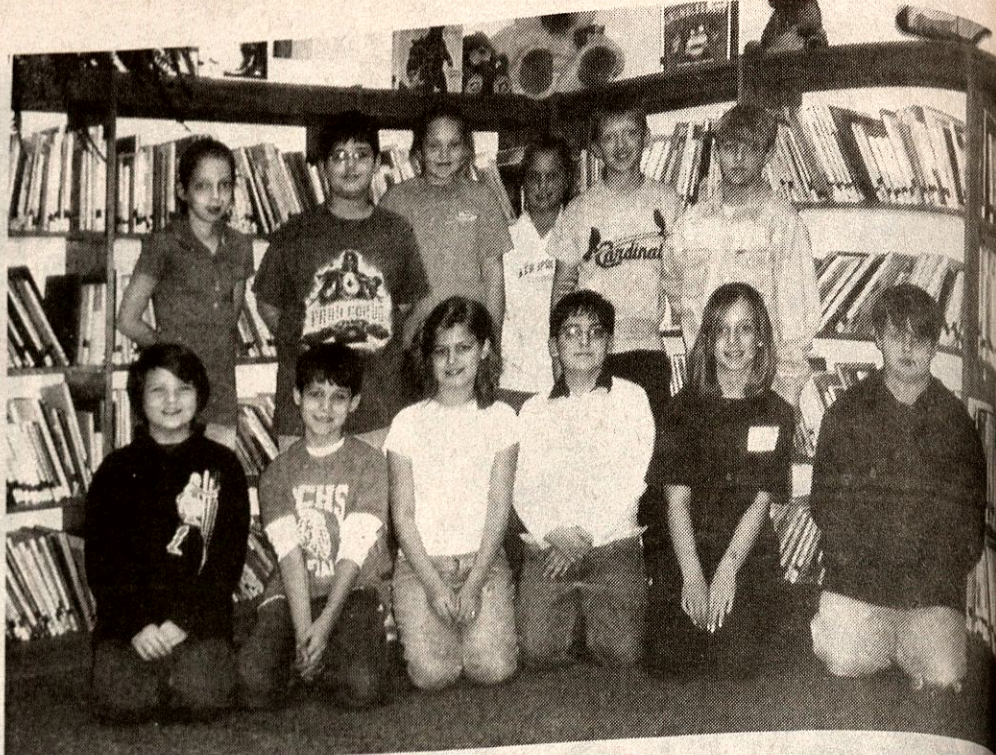

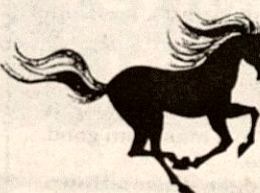

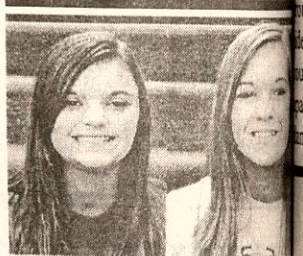

According to Iuka Fireman, Brandon Grissom, the department was paged out around 8:00 Saturday morning and quickly arrived at the scene. It appeared the fire started in one side of the unit where a curio cabinet had been left in front of a wall heater. Grissom said flames could be seen coming from the front of the apartment when volunteers arrived. The two apartments shared a common attic, but the fire was contained to just one side and only smoke damage affected the other side of the duplex. The occupants were out-of-town at the time.

Conservation Corner

Wildlife Mississippi applauds the recent announcement by the Bush Administration

which proposed legislation to increase conservation funding by \$7.8 billion; this is

almost three times the existing funds.

According to Billy Van Devender, the President of Wildlife Mississippi, "Wildlife Mississippi has placed a high priority on making sure that Mississippi landowners have available a variety of conservation programs to meet their needs. President Bush's Farm Bill proposal, if adopted by the Congress, could result in one of the greatest pieces of conservation legislation since the bi-partisan efforts of the 1970s."

Specifically, the proposed legislation will provide \$1.6 billion in new funding for renewable energy research, development and production, targeted for cellulosic (from trees) ethanol, which will support \$2.1 million in guaranteed loans for cellulosic projects and includes \$500 million for a bio-energy and bio-based product research initiative.

The proposal also combines the Healthy Forests Reserve Program and the Grasslands Reserve Program into a new "Private Lands Protec-

tion Program." The proposed funding for these programs is \$900 million greater than the funded levels in the previous Farm Bill. Mississippi is currently one of three states in the Nation participating in the Healthy Forests Reserve Program.

The acreage available for the Wetland Reserve Program has increased from an average of 150,000 acres per year to 250,000 acres per year. Mississippi is one of the top three states in the Nation that receives the most funding for the Wetland Reserve Program.

The acreage for the Conservation Reserve Program will remain the same, which is 39 million acres. Mississippi has one million acres enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program, which is one-third of the acreage in the South.

The Bush Administration is also to be commended for proposing a new \$175 million

Regional Water Enhancement Program. Part of its purpose is to improve water quality in the Gulf of Mexico.

"It is obvious that President Bush cares passionately about fish, wildlife, trees and the land. We are glad he is putting some common sense in fish and wildlife conservation for the good of our waters, fields, forests and the wildlife that reside there," continued Van Devender.

I am also especially pleased that this Farm Bill is reform-minded, ensures that a safety net exists for our farmers and provides financial support for those most in need. This is needed to maintain a strong quality of life in rural Mississippi.

President Bush is to be commended for this superb conservation proposal. Also to be recognized is his excellent staff that drafted the proposal. These people include Hunter Moorhead, David Anderson, Mark Keenum, Mark Rey, Greg Schildwachter, Arlen Lancaster and James Connoughton. Our Nation is fortunate to have the fine service of these dedicated public servants.

Last Week In The Mississippi Senate

We completed the sixth week of the 2007 Legislative Session. The Senate worked diligently over the week to meet the deadline for original floor action on non-appropriation/non-revenue Senate bills. Now that we met our deadline, I want to take this opportunity to discuss some of the major bills passed by the Senate.

SB 2617 dealing with the controversial issue of voter identification passed. Under this bill, individuals would have to produce a form of identification before voting in any election occurring in our State.

Forms of acceptable identification include a valid state or federal issued identification card, social security card, voter identification

card or other forms of identification such as an electricity or phone bill.

We passed three bills addressing the sensitive issue of a abortion availability in our State. SB 2795 bans abortions in the State of Mississippi except for in the case of rape, incest or eminent threat to the life of the mother. SB 2801 requires a woman have the opportunity to view a sonogram and auscultation of the fetal heart tone prior to consenting to an abortion. In addition, SB 2391 passed making it unlawful for a minor without parental consent to obtain an abortion until a judge waives the consent requirement.

We also passed some bills

that either directly or indirectly deal with Katrina issues. SB 2577 clearly defines a modular contractor, home requires them to register as a modular home contractor and pay fees to serve as a contractor. After the devastating loss of housing due

to Hurricane Katrina, many people have looked to the availability and efficiency offered by modular housing. This bill aims to protect those seeking to rebuild their lives by purchasing a modular home. We want to ensure that a legitimate contractor serves those individuals. As the popularity of modular homes increases, this bill serves all individuals our State interested in purchasing a modular home.

The Senate passed SB 2764 dealing with the State Board of Health and Department of Health. This topic has received a great deal of press recently. The question has been raised as to whether the board and the department have fulfilled their duties to the level that the people of this State deserve. We passed a bill that would allow this board to dissolve as provided by law on June 30, 2007. At that time, the board will be reconstituted under new guidelines and the Department of Health will be reauthorized.

SB 2668 was authorized that further strengthens Mississippi's sex offender registration laws. First, it requires individuals convicted of a sex offender crime in a foreign country whose laws meet our standards of due process to register as a sex offender here. Sex offenders also be issued a driver's license with designation of their sex offender status. In addition to the required fingerprints that sex offenders must provide to the state, they also would be required to provide a palm print for the record.

The Senate passed two laws encompassing the ever-growing topic of illegal immigrants. SB 2482 states that any contractors a w a r d e d Government contractors must employ US citizens or legal aliens to carry out those contracts. If a contractor is knowingly found to violate this requirement, they will be revoked from carrying out any Government contracts and be subject to fines. In addition, SB 2123 passed, which requires an individual to show verification of citizenship or lawful presence prior to receiving public assistance benefits.

SB 3036 revises the definition of domestic violence. The purpose of this law is to expand the definition of domestic abuse to include certain forms of stalking, like cyberstalking, internet communications and other electronic communications. The bill also helps the

victim creating the Domestic Violence Court Forms Fund to help defray the cost of issuing orders of protection for the victim. On a final note, the Senate Appropriations Committee approved a plan to fully fund MAEP. In light of the encouraging revenue turns our has received, the Senate Appropriation Committee believes fully funding MAEP at this time is a prudent and stable decision. Senate's would add health insurance and retirement benefits for teachers. It adds money for mentoring dyslexia programs, and raise for education employees state

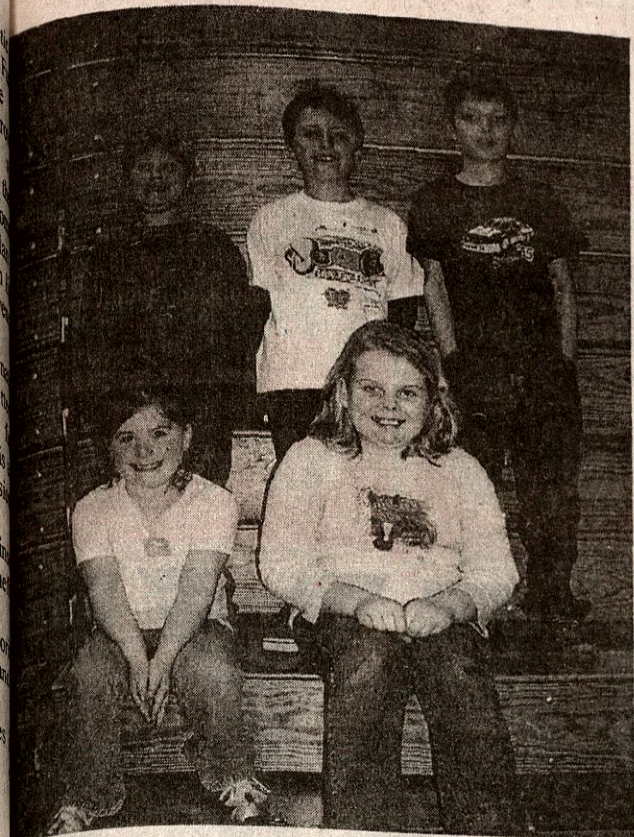

THE BURNSVILLE FIRE OF 1926...

The business section of Burnsville was destroyed by fire Thursday morning about four o'clock. The Methodist Church located in business section was also destroyed, as well as was the residence of W.C. Faust and the telephone exchange.

The buildings, with the exception of one owned and occupied by the Burnsville Mercantile Company, were frame and burned rapidly. A part of the stocks were saved by some of the merchants, while others lost everything. The only store building left standing was the Epperson Mercantile Company, over which was the Masonic Hall.

Other buildings destroyed were: the post office, the stores of R.L. Smith, G.R. Whitaker, J.J. Patrick and C.L. Blakely; the office of Dr. Haynie, where he also kept a supply of drugs; and the store of Miss Mary Walker. It is thought the fire was of incendiary origin as one of the stores was saturated with kerosene. There was very little insurance on any of the buildings though some carried it on their stocks of merchandise. This was a heavy blow to Burnsville and to the county, but most of the merchants rebuilt soon.

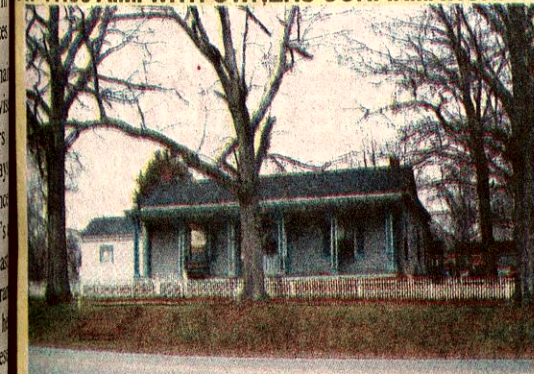

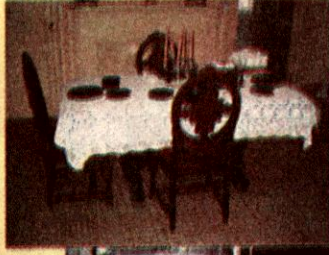

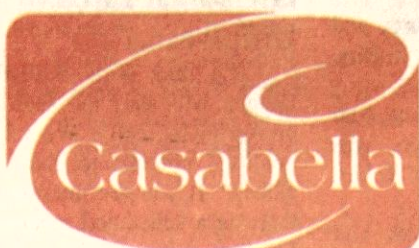
