### Tishomingo County Teacher Receives MS Society Daughters Of American Revolution Award

Tishomingo County is honored to have Mr. Jeffery Horn selected as the Mississippi Society Daughters of American History Teacher of the year. Horn graduated from the University of North Alabama in 1997 with a B.S. degree in Secondary Education, Social Sciences. He received his Master's degree from the University of North Alabama in 2001.

Horn has taught Spanish, World History, Mississippi Studies, Geography, U.S. History, and English as a Second Language. This year, he is teaching Sophomore English, Senior English, American Government/Economics, and 6th grade Language Arts at Belmont High School, where he has been employed for the past nine years.

In December, Horn was awarded the Chief Tishomingo Chapter American History Teacher of the Year award. This recognition put him in competition for the State award. Having won the State award, Horn is now in the running for the National Award.

Horn chose American History as his focal point in college because of his growing interest in the heritage of our country. American history is very exciting and ever

changing with each passing day. "A professor made a statement to my class one day that stuck with me," he said. "You can't know where you are going until you know where you have been." This statement created a great desire to know more about my country and my own heritage; more than I really had ever thought I would want to know," says Mr. Horn.

Horn continues to read and study American history and parlay this into his teaching of American History/Government. "I want to instill in my students a desire to learn and know all they can about where they come from and where they are heading." He issues extra credit for his students to visit and learn more about history at the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum where they achieve hands-on learning.

On February 17, 2007, at the 101st Mississippi Daughters of American Revolution State Convention. Mr. Horn was honored with a luncheon and then presented a certificate and a check for \$100.00 from this year's Mississippi American History Teacher Chairman, Junie Fuller, of Louisville, Miss.

Mr. Horn and Chief

Tishomingo Chapter DAR members, Cindy Nelson, Eunnell Handy, and CAR Chapter President Morgan Wright, accompanied Mr. Horn to Jackson to receive his award. Chief Tishomingo Chapter Regent Cindy Nelson was presented a Silver Bowl bearing the name of "Jeffery Horn as the 2006-2007 American History Teacher of the Year." The Chief Tishomingo Chapter will keep the bowl until the 102nd State Convention, at which time another American History teacher for Mississippi will be selected.

The Outstanding Teacher of American History Contest honors notable, full-time teachers of American history (and related fields, such as social studies, government, and citizenship education) in public, private, and parochial schools from grades 6-12. DAR honors an Outstanding Teacher of American History at the chapter, state, and national levels. Each year, DAR chapters across the country select a local American history teacher to honor, and then nominate for the award in their state. The state winner dossier is sent to the Historian General and the National winner is selected. All Tishomingo County schools are invited to participate in the competition each year.

### Stateline Narcotics Task Force Cracks Down On Those Possessing Controlled Drugs With the Intent To Sell

During the past 6 months, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Belmont Police Department and the Stateline Narcotics Task Force initiated an investigation into James Cruse and others Distributing Oxycontin, Hydrocodone and other Controlled Substances from Cruse's residence and other locations in Tishomingo County. As a result of the investigation, the Stateline Narcotics requested and re-

ceived a Search Warrant for Cruse's residence from Circuit Court Judge Thomas Gardner.

On 10-20-06, Officers with the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Belmont Police Department, MS Bureau of Narcotics, Alcohol Beverage Control and Agents with the Stateline Narcotics Task Force executed a Search Warrant at the residence of James Cruse located at 157, CR 7, Belmont, MS. As a

result of the Search Warrant, James Cruse was arrested for Possession of a Schedule II Controlled Substance, Oxycontin, with Intent to Sell. The Officers also seized approximately \$5,000.00 in cash, three vehicles and 2 Firearms.

James Cruse was indicted by a Tishomingo County Grand Jury on 12-15-2006 for Possession of a Controlled Substance with Intent to Distribute. On 2-5-07, Cruse pled guilty to the Indictment in front of Circuit Court Judge Thomas Gardner. As part of a Plea Agreement, Cruse was sentenced to 10 years in custody of MS Department of Corrections with credit for time served and 5 years Post Release Supervision.

The Stateline Narcotics Task Force has continued to investigate the organization and additional arrests and indictments from a Tishomingo County Grand Jury are anticipated in the near future. The organization was responsible for distribution of approximately 200 dosage units of Oxycontin and undetermined amount of Hydrocodone and other controlled substances a month for the past 18 months.

### Traffic Stop Leads To Arrest Of One & Seizure Of Controlled Substances

On 2-15-07, Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Deputy Brandon Lambert and Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Jail Administrator Benny Parrish initiated a traffic stop of a 2006 GMC Pickup traveling on Highway 72 West near Burnsville, MS for no tag. As a result of the traffic stop, Deputy Lambert arrested Randall A. Mitchell for Possession of Methamphetamine with Intent to Distribute and Possession of Hydrocodone with Intent to Distribute. Deputy Lambert seized approximately 3 grams of Methamphetamine Ice and approximately 75 Hydrocodone pills. The street value of the Controlled Substance seized is approximately \$750.00. Mitchell was also arrested for misdemeanor traffic offenses.

Deputy Lambert is to be commended for his attention to detail investigating a routine traffic stop into a felony arrest. The Stateline Narcotics Task Force and the Burnsville Police Department assisted in the investigation.

### Notice Of Change In Collection Of Past Due Accounts For T.C.E.P.A.

Tishomingo County Electric's policy has always been to grant, subject to management approval, occasional extensions of time to pay electric bills. Unfortunately, a number of individual consumers have abused this privilege and caused additional collection efforts and created chronic past due balances.

This abuse has created the need to establish a more rigid collection policy for past due balances:

Approximately 4 to 5 days after the due date of the bill, a past due notice will be mailed to the customer at the same address as stated on the bill. This past due notice will give a date after which service will be

terminated. No additional notice will be given.

- 1 TCEPA's collector will be required to terminate service if the account has a past due balance when he arrives unless the total past due balance is paid to him.
- 2 Customers who have not received an extension of time to pay within the preceding six (6) calendar months may be granted an extension subject to management approval. No more than one extension will be granted in any six month period.
- 3 This policy becomes effective March 1, 2007. All past due balances must be paid by this date.
- 4 Collections will continue in January and February,

2007, under existing policy.

TCEPA provides the following payment options, other than by mail:

- 1 An automatic draft service for customers who wish to pay electric bills without the worry of missing due dates
- 2 Level payment plan for customers with approved credit history.
- 3 Due date change to the 5th of the month for customers on Social Security or once-a-month retirement benefits with approved credit history if due date is the 25th or 1st of the month
- 4 Drop box payment receptacles at the Iuka Office and Belmont City Hall

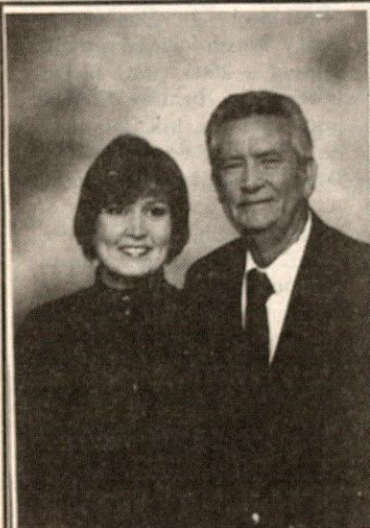

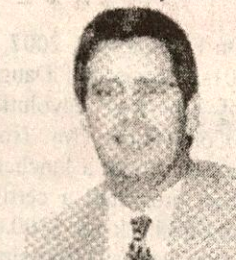

### THE SEARCH FOR IMPARTIAL JURORS

When selecting a jury for a civil trial, lawyers from both sides have the right to engage prospective jurors in a questioning process ("voir dire") in order to select an impartial jury. During this process, jurors may be challenged and excused in one of two ways: A challenge "for cause" asks the judge to excuse a prospective juror because a legal impediment to that person's service as a juror exists. For instance, something in the person's answers to questions indicates that he or she is not fair and impartial. A "peremptory" challenge can be exercised for any reason whatsoever. There is no limit to the amount of challenges for cause, but the number of peremptory challenges is limited.

HINT: Unlike a challenge for cause, the lawyer need not explain or justify a peremptory challenge.

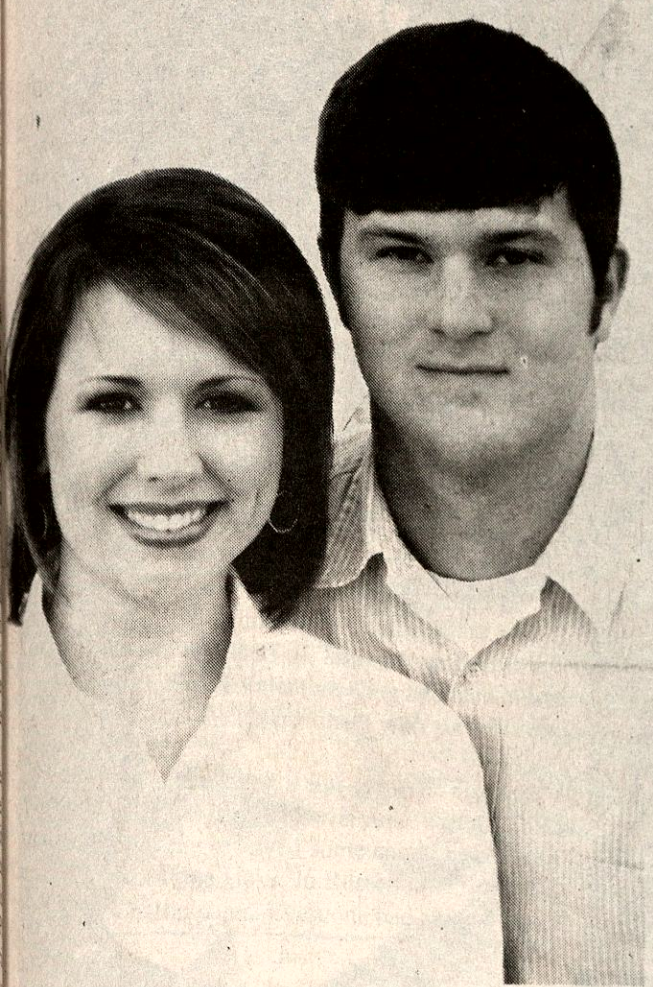
### Blinking, Tears, And Oxygen

Like all living tissue, eyes must have a continuous supply of oxygen. Tears dissolve oxygen from the air and carry it to eye tissue. Not only do tears bathe eyes with oxygen, they also keep contact lenses moist and comfortable. Some people, particularly the elderly, have eyes so dry that they cannot wear contact lenses; others must use lubricating drops frequently.

Most of us have enough tears, but we may not be able to use them efficiently because we have poor blinking habits. Blinking pumps tears over the surface of the eyes. If your eyes are red and burning and your vision becomes blurred when you are wearing your contacts, it may be because your blinking is incomplete and tears cannot flow.

We tend to take blinking for granted, yet some people do not blink properly. Blinking problems can be corrected. Your optometrist can provide detailed instructions on proper techniques.

## LOCAL ANGUS BREEDER RECOGNIZED NATIONALLY IN PATHFINDER REPORT

Triple G Farm, Iuka, Mississippi, has been recognized nationally by the American Angus Association<sup>SM</sup> for having 1 registered Angus cow included in the Association's 2007 Pathfinder<sup>SM</sup> Report.

Only 2,324 of the more than 34,000 American Angus Association members are represented in this year's report, according to John Crouch, executive vice president of the Association with headquarters in Saint Joseph, Missouri.

The Pathfinder Program identifies superior Angus

cows based upon recorded performance traits that are economically important to efficient beef production. These traits include early and regular calving and heavy weaning weights, reports Bill Bowman, Association director of performance programs. More than 1.5 million eligible dams and more than 5 million weaning records were examined to determine Pathfinder status. All registered Angus cows that meet the strict Pathfinder standards are listed, along with their owners, in the Pathfinder Report that is published annually by the Association.

The 2007 Pathfinder Report lists 9,726 individual cows and 256 Pathfinder sires. It is published in the April issue of the *Angus Journal*, and copies are
