Since the Renaissance Day is the day before Easter, there will be two Easter Egg hunts for kids to enjoy! ## School District Announces Personnel Changes for Next Year

Most school personnel were approved by the school board at the regular "second Monday" meeting of the Tishomingo County School Board.

At the March meeting, most principal positions were recommended and approved by the board in a consent agenda (all at once). Monday the following list was released for next year's positions:

Burnsville gets a new principal: Lorie McCalmon moves up to principal after several years as assistant to Danny Smith, who is retiring. Assistant will be Mark Hood.

At TCHS, Jackie Beals was approved to stay, and will get a new assistant: Monica Moss will be assistant principal and Instructional Specialist.

Belmont remains under Van Roberts and assistants Jody McClung and Katie Crane. And

Shannon Edmondson remains principal at Tishomingo, with assistant B.J. Nunley. Josh McClung is staying to head up Iuka Elementary, and John-Grady Taylor remains at the Career and Technical Center.

The District is taking applications for Iuka Middle School principal and assistants for IES and IMS.

The board approves all the positions at once on a "consent agenda" which includes everything from personnel recommendations to field trip and fund raiser approvals, but here are some highlights of what they approved:

Approve the resignation of Blake Holly as TCHS Head Baseball Coach, and Seth Kennedy as his assistant at the end of the school year. They are both still on list as instructors at TCHS, Kennedy still as volleyball coach.

Tish. County lists boys track coach, cross country coach, band

director and assistant band director as TBD. Presumably baseball coaches will also be hired; the resignation of the coaches was a late add to the board meeting agenda.

Pam Whitehead, Tishomingo Middle School Librarian is retiring effective at the end of the day on May 24th.

Approve Kristy Counce as the Technology Specialist (200 day contract) within the District Technology Department for the 2017/2018 school year.

Approve the Salary Scales for the 2017/2018 school year.

Heather Sparks Deaton moving from Tishomingo Middle to Career and Technical Center for the 2017/2018 school year, replacing Tiffany Lowrey - who is going to TCHS as counselor to replace Diane Byars, who retired.

## Bill Gurley To Run For Mayor of Iuka

Retired aerospace executive, Bill Gurley and his wife, Kathy, of Iuka and current President of the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society. Bill Gurley is one of four candidates who have qualified to run for Mayor of Iuka in the municipal elections in June 2017.

Bill Gurley and his wife, Kathy Gurley Daugherty, have resided in Iuka since his retirement in 2011. They were high school sweethearts and attended Iuka High School, graduating in 1967 and 1970, respectively. Bill graduated from Mississippi State in 1970 with an Electrical Engineering degree. He is the son of the late Billy H. Gurley and grandson of Della Gurley who spent all of her adult life raising six kids in

Iuka. Kathy is the daughter of the late Charles and Ruth Daugherty. Charles was a barber in Iuka for over 60 years. Bill and Kathy have deep roots in Iuka.

Bill has been actively engaged in community activities since returning to Iuka. He and Kathy opened their beautifully restored historical home near the Iuka Mineral Springs Park to guests and activities during the 2012 Battle of Iuka Sesquicentennial and 2013 Battle Re-Enactments. He has been actively involved with the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum, Renaissance Day, Heritage Day and Dickens' Christmas. For his work in supporting these activities, which not only attract tourists to our county,

## District Rolling Out Student 1-to-1 iPad Plan in Coming Months

Tishomingo County School District Technology Director Chris Northington described plans for rolling out the new iPad for students program during the regular meeting of the Tishomingo County School Board on Monday, April 10<sup>th</sup>.

Chris Northington, Tech Director for the district, reported that before school finishes for the year, teachers at several levels will be getting training on the iPads; some from Apple, and many from Northeast Mississippi Community College instructors. Estimated rollout date is fall break for all 9-12<sup>th</sup> grade high school students to get personal iPads, and teachers will get them before then, to prepare curriculum and be ready to teach students using the various features and programs both in classrooms and for individual study.

"I've been to campuses to speak, and teachers are super excited about them, and even asked me why we can't start sooner?" said Superintendent Christy Holly. "I said we can 'If you'll give me your summer' for the training/professional development.... Then they were fine with fall break!"

Northington identified a potential cost savings of \$44,000 by recommending the district simply set aside

money to "self-insure" the iPads instead of paying \$99 per device for AppleCare insurance (\$99,000). Even with Apple's insurance, the students would still pay a \$50 deductible if they break the screen (apparently the most common maintenance and repair problem). A new price of \$300 for student iPads helps make this feasible, along with a 1 year manufacturer's warranty already in place.

New Albany schools is in its third year of an iPad student program, and Northington said that district has only lost 30 iPads that had to be replaced over the three years. By TCSD buying 1,000 iPads, they will have a few on hand to replace ones that need extensive back-to-the-manufacturer repairs.

First District School Board Representative Emily Wadkins cleverly suggested that current staff, or better yet, students in tech classes receive training on replacing screens.

Regarding filtering of inappropriate use or downloading, officials said there is currently iBoss filtering on every device, and so far that has proved effective, but no actual audit had been done similar to the Mississippi State Department of Education one recently announced that showed 20 percent of

student laptops and tablets tested had explicit material downloaded or accessed. The study was a very limited one (just a few school districts, random machines) but it does show a need for powerful filtering software.

Another issue with all the students using iPads for assignments is often unreliable local DSL, and often non-existent home internet access throughout the rural areas of Tishomingo County, and in homes that cannot afford such services. Officials said this will be part of the teacher training, to instruct students to download critical material or reading assignments directly to the device before leaving class, while they still have free Wi-Fi access.

Another option is a proposed effort to work with businesses, churches, and other places in communities for them to offer free Wi-Fi "hotspots" for students to use after school hours. Right now places like Iuka Library, Belmont Piggly Wiggly, and Subway often have full parking lots into the evening hours with people using their Wi-Fi, and the district hopes to build this program with places like churches so that students will have access regardless of their financial situation.

# Old Courthouse Museum Gets a Facelift for 2017 Visitors

Cindy Nelson and her volunteers have worked hard to produce some big changes in the Old Courthouse Museum and everyone will be able to tour through on Saturday.

Instead of intimidating shelves of genealogical research books, clean and attractive exhibits have been moved to the front part of the building, and many of them feature new donations to Tishomingo County's treasure trove of history, the Old Courthouse Museum.

The gift shop has been organized as well, with quality items available for sale, and they are attractively displayed in several

cabinets obtained through the estate of long-time Museum supporter, the late Patsy Clark Pace, of Aberdeen.

For interactive history, there's an area for some fun dress-up, and you can take photo-booth images of yourself in pioneer garb! The Civil War items are displayed, but there's also items from more recent history, including the collections of Cecil Summers, state senator and historian.

Be sure to come through the museum on Saturday and see not only the well-preserved historic building, but also lots of cool new exhibits.

## Living History Presentations Bring the Past to Life!

Get your History on at Renaissance Day festival Saturday and enjoy living-history demonstrations on Iuka pioneer life, Mexican War and a special presentation on the stage about a Modern Black Man's Confederate journey.

### Mexican American

At noon in the demo area, Randy Brown will present a first-person historical narrative on the Mexican-American war.

Brown is an avid historian, and has been since childhood. He has been a living historian/re-enactor over 17 years. Over the years, he has broadened his scope of knowledge to include others wars in which Americans have been involved, including the Mexican-American War. Mr. Brown has worked extensively to create a first-person Mexican War soldier's perspective, and has researched and read several books and books pertaining to the war. His presentation includes a historical timeline leading up to the events of the period, discussion of the major battles of the war, profiles of the major military

figures involved, and the consequences and ramifications resulting from the war. He will also present and discuss the basic arms and accoutrements of the private citizen soldier of the period. He will also be available for a question and answer period after the presentation.

### Civil War/Black History

Come by and visit with Al Arnold at his booth and hear his inspiring story of his African American ancestor, Turner Hall, Jr. At 1:45, Arnold will make a special presentation from the stage.

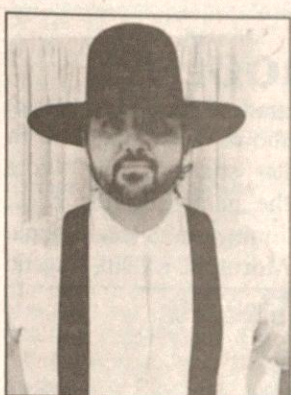
Arnold came to the knowledge of his Confed-

erate ancestor in 2008 and as he started to search for an understanding of why, how, what and when did his great-great grandfather serve during the Civil War. His journey led him to embrace his Confederate heritage and the roles of slaves in the Civil War during a primary focal point of America's history. He believes the Civil War history is inclusive of Black history and has a desire to see more African Americans study the Civil War and their connections to this vital part of America's history. To this aim he has written this book which will be available for purchase on Renaissance Day.

### David Hubbard, Founder of Iuka

The life of Iuka Founder David Hubbard will be explored at Renaissance Day by one of his descendants, Tom Johnson, a sixth generation descendant of Hubbard.

David Reeder Hubbard is recorded as giving much of the land for the town of Iuka. He originally lived in Eastport, but moved closer to the mineral springs. Buying 13 sections of land, he built a home for himself. David Hubbard donated the Mineral Springs Park area and a considerable amount of

other land south of where the railroad is currently located.

David Reeder Hubbard sold and surveyed hundreds of surrounding acres to the Iuka Townsite Company when the town of Iuka was planned. Many deeds are depicted as the "Hubbard Survey." On file in the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society's library is a copy of the original deed for the acquisition of five acres of land in such that would shape a railroad depot. The deed dated September 6, 1855, was awarded to the Memphis and Charleston Rail Road Company for the sum of \$1 by David R. and Margaret J. Hubbard. The railroad was completed in 1857. The town was incorporated in 1856.

cows compared favorably with any within the state. He also had a great interest in pharmaceuticals, and he was a progressive man for his time. The Rushing Drug Company was established by Kermit Rushing, Sr., and his wife, Quay Strickland Rushing in 1942.

On May 11 2017 at 6 pm the TCHS band will perform their spring concert. The concert is at the High School auditorium and is free and open to the public.

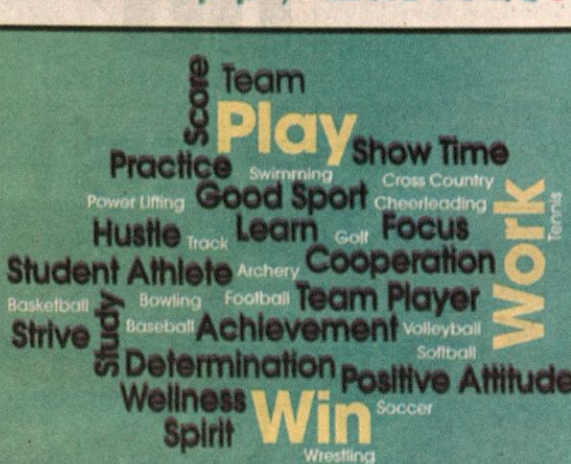
The Band Boosters are asking former students that if they can please attend because our Director Libby Cunningham is retiring from teaching.

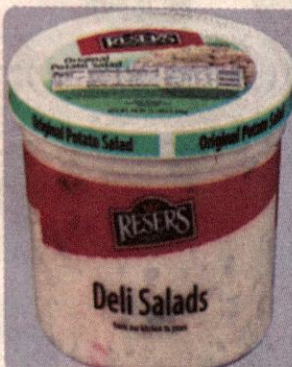

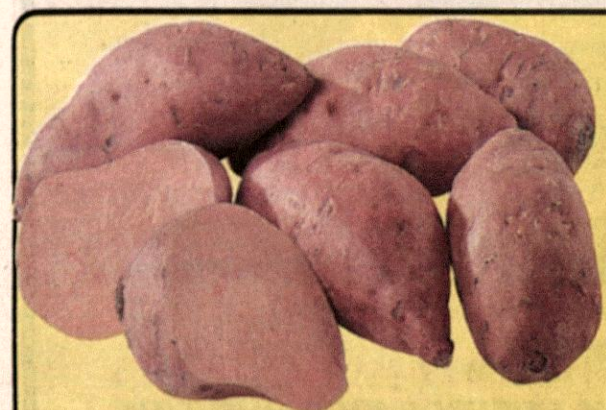

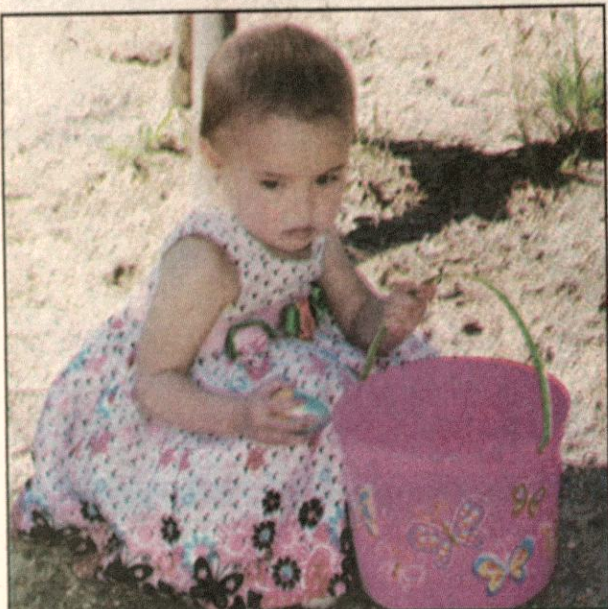




## Egg Hunt at Tishomingo State Park
