

The Myopia Myth?

It is estimated that a full 25% of our population is myopic (nearsighted). Some say this is an inherited condition. Statistics disprove this. Before age 10, approximately 4 to 6% of the population is nearsighted. When these same children finish college, the number varies from 60 to 80%, with a higher percentage among the honor and graduate students. Evidently, there is a connection between the amount of reading we do and nearsightedness.

In a survey of Eskimo families, only 2% of the children, who could not read or write showed myopia. Yet among their children who were attending school, approximately 65% were nearsighted. This happened in a single generation in a population known to be somewhat farsighted.

Yet, some still believe that nearsightedness is inherited, that it tends to run in families, although this example shows massive reversal in a single generation. Genetics cannot account for it.

May Is Mental Health Mon

One of the most difficult challenges the field of mental health faces in Mississippi is stigma. Mental health problems in Mississippi are surprisingly common. Mental illnesses are more common than cancer and heart disease combined. One in five people will experience a mental illness during their lifetime, and one family in four has a member who is mentally ill and who will require some type of treatment.

I think this cold weather has messed things up for the snakes, I have really tried to find one, but haven't had any luck. I even looked under my fishing boat down by the lake, there's always one there, nothing. I heard that a woman around luka was bitten, but didn't get her name, so I can't confirm. This may be an off year, if you can't find a snake in May, when they are supposed to be in their romantic mood, then something is wrong.

I don't know many people that have been bitten by snakes, except for my mother, but surely, a lot of people have. Mother's bite was way back when she was about 4, but she can tell you all about it today.

Since this is the week of Mother's Day, I was remembering seeing pictures of her when she was a young girl growing up in Paden. My mother is probably the prettiest woman that ever lived in Tishomingo Co. She had two beautiful sisters, and there were cousins and nieces, and of course my two sisters, now that I think of it, they were all beautiful. I don't believe there are any ugly women in the whole county. We ought to be really thankful for that.

I didn't get to spend a lot of years in Paden, we made that obligatory move to Memphis for work, but we came home every weekend, even when we

didn't have a car, I don't know how that happened. After we got a two door Chevy, we brought people home with us every time, even though that car didn't have a back seat. Half of Paden must have lived in Memphis back then, and they all wanted to come home.

Life was really different in Memphis, she would take me for long rides on those huge buses, with seats so tall my feet wouldn't touch. That bus would almost always stop at the Whiteway Drug store, where you could get icecream with a cherry on top. Memphis wasn't bad. Being the only child I got a lot of attention. We took a bus somewhere once and Daddy was with us, it was crowded, so Daddy and I had to sit in the back. I was maybe 3 or 4, and would do anything he told me.
