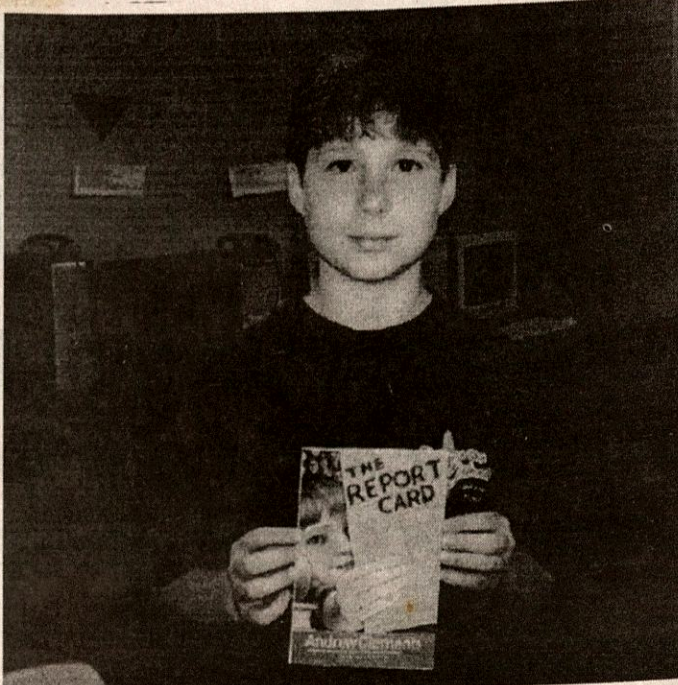
Hamburgers, hot dogs, and soft drinks will be available. Support our veterans organizations by attending this event.

The Myopia Myth?

It is estimated that a full 25% of our population is myopic (nearsighted). Some say this is an inherited condition. Statistics disprove this. Before age 10, approximately 4 to 6% of the population is nearsighted. When these same children finish college, the number varies from 60 to 80%, with a higher percentage among the honor and graduate students. Evidently, there is a connection between the amount of reading we do and nearsightedness.

In a survey of Eskimo families, only 2% of the children, who could not read or write showed myopia. Yet among their children who were attending school, approximately 65% were nearsighted. This happened in a single generation in a population known to be somewhat farsighted.

Yet, some still believe that nearsightedness is inherited, that it tends to run in families, although this example shows massive reversal in a single generation. Genetics cannot account for it.

May Is Mental Health Month

One of the most difficult challenges the field of mental health faces in Mississippi is stigma. Mental health problems in Mississippi are surprisingly common. Mental illnesses are more common than cancer and heart disease combined. One in five people will experience a mental illness during their lifetime, and one family in four has a member who is mentally ill and who will require some type of treatment.

It is our goal at the Mississippi Department of Mental Health (DMH) to change this. We are partnering with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to launch an Anti-Stigma Campaign in Mississippi. The campaign, "What a Difference a Friend Makes," is designed to decrease the negative attitudes that surround mental illness and encourage young adults to support their friends who are living with mental health problems.

Although public attitudes toward people with other disabilities have changed dramatically over the past two decades, people with mental health problems are often the subjects of scorn, ridicule and fear. Common misconceptions and stereotypes about mental health problems still create barriers to employment, education, housing, and most sadly of all, treatment.

The stigma attached to

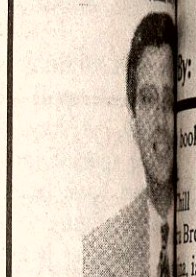
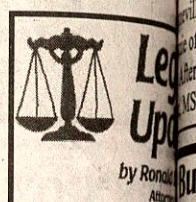
mental illness is a barrier people choose not to seek treatment. There are treatments, services, community support groups, ever before, and mental health workers. People with mental illnesses can lead productive lives.

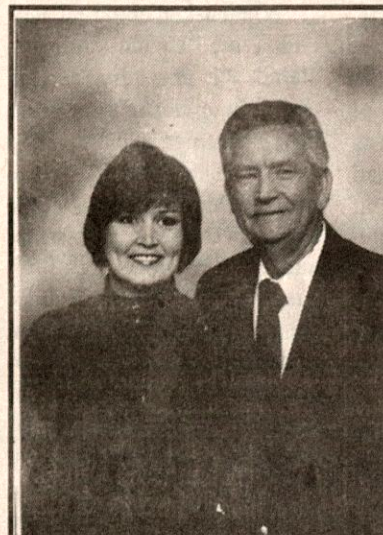

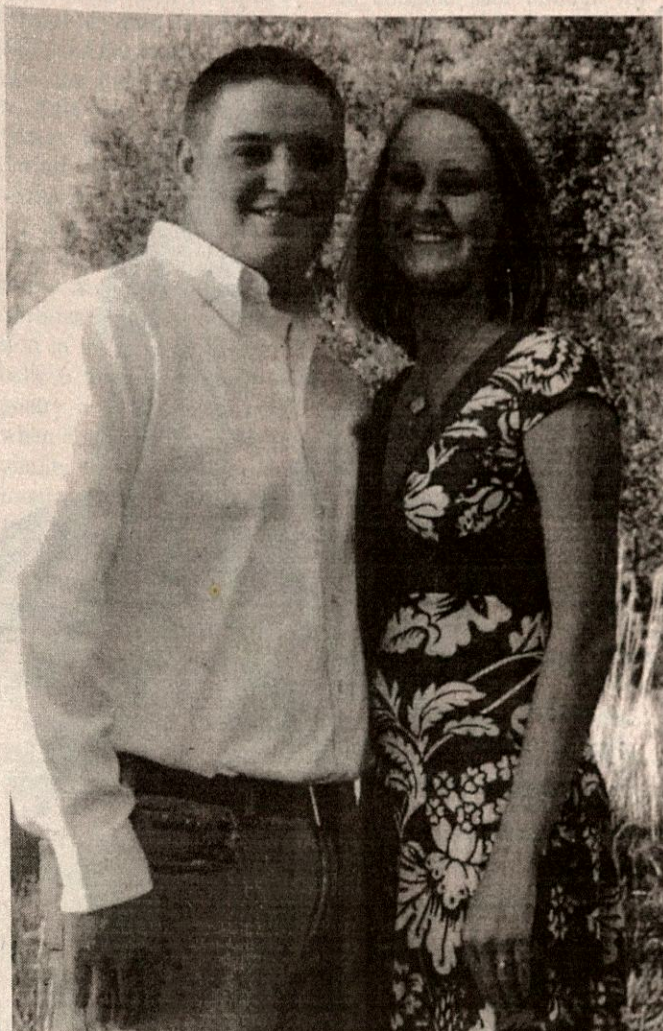


Smith-Jones To Wed May 12th, 2007

can be viewed during the day, with flying commencing at noon. Food, drinks and entertainment will be available all day.

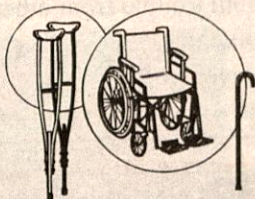

Spero Pottery To Give Demonstration At Iuka Library

Ray Gregory from Spero Pottery in Corinth, will be giving a pottery making demonstration at our Library lunch break, noon on Tuesday the 11th of May.

Ray has been working with clay since the Fall of 1996, when he took his first Ceramics class at Union University in Jackson, Tennessee. After graduating from Union

with a BA in Art, he went on to graduate school at Mississippi College in Clinton, Mississippi to earn a MFA, in 2002, and taught as an adjunct instructor there for two years. In 2004 Ray opened Spero Pottery in his hometown of Corinth, Mississippi to begin working as a full time potter.

Ray says that his enjoyment in working with clay comes from the limitless possibilities he finds for expression in the medium itself. "I believe there is presence and poetry in a handmade object when done well, and it is that quality that I desire to communicate to the user. I do not feel limited by making utilitarian pieces, since these provide the most direct connection to those who use them,

but I also find myself continually drawn to the sculptural and conceptual attributes of clay and hope to continue to explore them in both utilitarian and non-utilitarian pieces." He is currently firing work in cone 6 oxidation, and is also doing some raku and pit-firing.

Spero (pronounced like "sparrow") is a Latin word which means "to hope". Ray chose this name not only because he uses a sparrow as a signature on his pieces, but because hope is such a central idea to his work and his life. "Scripture," Ray says, "uses sparrows or birds in several instances to convey the intense care of God over us. This has always been a great source of hope to me, and my desire is that when someone drinks from my cups or eats from my bowls they will be

reminded of this hope as well. I can think of no greater Truth to communicate through my work than that."

All your friends at the Iuka library hope you will plan to attend this lunch break at noon on Tuesday to witness the hands of an artist at work. Lunch is still only \$2.00.

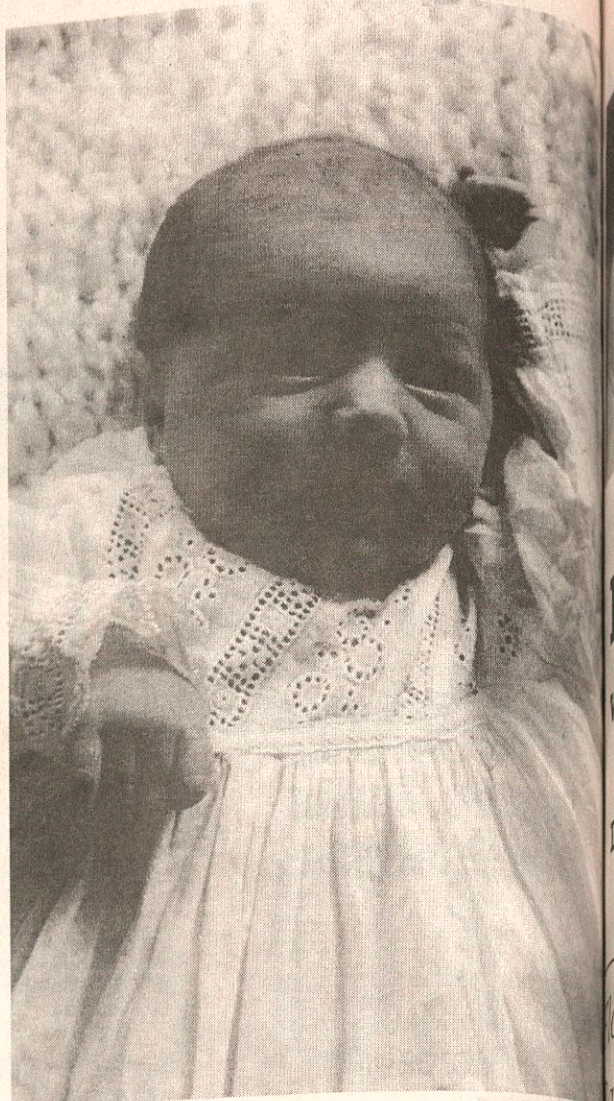
Letter to the Editor

The main objective of the program is to teach children what to do if they see a gun. The gun safety procedures taught by Eddie Eagle's Motto are Stop! Don't Touch, Leave the Area, and Tell an Adult. This message is covered by a video, posters, "The Attic Secret" story coloring book; handouts, and a shuffle. Gun safety in relation to Peer Pressure, Television, Toy

Guns vs. Real Guns, and 911 are also taught. The higher grades have skits, additional stories, and a short essay.
