Ralph Montgomery Announces Candidacy For County Sheriff



Pleas And Sentences From June Term Of Circuit Court

The most recent term of Tishomingo County Circuit Court yielded the following pleas from defendants and their sentences. Judges for this term of court were Circuit Judge Paul Funderburk and Circuit Judge Sharion Aycock.

David Praytor pleaded guilty to possession and receiving stolen property. He was sentenced to 10 years, to be suspended, but placed on five years supervised probation. He was also ordered to pay court costs, bond fees, \$1,000 fine, restitution of \$404 and \$880 along with co-defendant Edward Johnson.

Audrey Embrey pleaded guilty to sale of oxycodone. She was ordered to served 10 years, given credit for time served, with the balance suspended and defendant is placed on unsupervised post release supervision for 10 years. In addition, Embrey is ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, \$5,000 fine with it all suspended and \$115 restitution. This sentence will run consecutive to another sentence.

Audrey Embrey pleaded guilty to another charge of sale of oxycodone. She was ordered to serve 10 years, given credit for time served with the balance suspended. She will be placed on post release supervision for 10 years, with five years suspended, leaving five to be supervised. In addition, she shall be ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, pay \$5,000 fine with \$4,000 suspended and \$115 restitution. The Defendant must go to Region IV Mental Health for evaluation for treatment.

Jim Hastings pleaded guilty to grand larceny. He was sentenced to serve 10 years, all suspended, but will

be placed on five years supervision probation. Additionally, the defendant must pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$1000 fine, \$445 and \$754 restitution.

Shawn Riddell pleaded guilty to possession of marijuana with intent to distribute. He was sentenced to five years, with all suspended and was placed on three years of supervised probation. Also, he was ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee a \$500 fine and restitution.

Yvonne McFall pleaded guilty to the charge of grand larceny. the defendant was sentenced to 10 years, suspended, but placed on five years of supervised probation. McFall was ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$500 fine, and \$3,800 restitution.

James Timbes pleaded guilty to the charge of obtaining a controlled substance by fraud. He was sentenced to five years, all suspended. This sentence will run concurrent with another sentence. Also he was ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee a fine and must enroll and successfully complete the GED program.

James Timbes pleaded guilty to the charge of obtaining a controlled substance by fraud. He was sentenced to five years and is to be placed in the Intensive Supervision Program/House Arrest Program for a period of one year. This will be followed by supervised placed on supervised probation for four years. This sentenced will run concurrent with his other sentence. He is ordered to pay court costs, bond fee, \$1,000 fine and must complete the GED program.

Shelby Rast pleaded

guilty to the charge of possession of marijuana more than one kilo, less than five kilos. The defendant is ordered to served 10 years and is to be placed on the Intensive Supervision Program/House Arrest Program for one year. Following this, he will be placed on the post release supervision period for five years. Also, he is ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$2,500 fine and restitution.

Randy Nelson pleaded guilty to possession of cocaine.

He was sentenced to serve eight years, with credit for time served and the balanced of the sentence suspended and will be placed on post release supervision for a period of five years. He is ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$1,000 fine, restitution and must complete the GED program.

Diava D. Wilkins has pleaded guilty to False Pretense/Bad Check. She was ordered to be sentenced to three years, but will be placed on the Intensive Supervision Program/House Arrest Program for one year. Upon completion of this sentence, she will be placed on two years post release supervision. This sentence will run concurrent to another charge. Also, she is ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$1,000 fine, \$601.25 and \$273.12 and also court costs in an Alcorn County case.

Diava D. Wilkins pleaded guilty to false pretense/bad check. She has been sentenced to a term of three years, all suspended. She is ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee and a fine. This will run concurrent with the other case.

Gary Hale pleaded guilty to count 1: possession of methamphetamine. He was sentenced to four years, suspended. This count is to run concurrent with another charge.

Gary Hale pleaded guilty to count 2: conspiracy to distribute. He was sentenced to 10 years, suspended, with five years supervised probation. Additionally, he was ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$2,500 fine and restitution. This sentence is to run concurrent with count 1.

Cindy Timbes pleaded guilty to count 1: obtaining a controlled substance by fraud. She was sentenced to five years, suspended, and was placed on five years supervised probation. She was ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$1,000 fine. This sentence is to run concurrent with an additional sentence. Also, the defendant shall complete alcohol and drug treatment if the court deems appropriate.

Cindy Timbes pleaded guilty to the charge of obtaining a controlled substance by fraud. She was sentenced to five years, all suspended and shall run concurrent with count 1. She was ordered to pay court costs and a bond fee.

Jeffery L. Bolton pleaded guilty to the charge of burglary and larceny of a dwelling. He was sentenced to 10 years, with eight suspended. He is to be placed on five years post release supervision.

Longtime Businessman Frank Burns Dies At Age 78

Area residents were saddened with the recent death of longtime Iuka resident and businessman Frank Burns.

He died on Sunday, June 17, 2007 at his residence.

Burns, who was born October 17, 1928, was 78 years old. He was the son of Ben F. and Mary Jaco Burns. He graduated from Iuka High School and enlisted in the United States Navy for four years. Following his Navy service, Frank attended the University of Mississippi where he graduated from the School of Pharmacy.

He, along with his wife Bobbye Sue Carter Burns who died on June 14, 1994, owned and operated Rushing Drug Company and the Cozy Corner Gift Shoppe. Burns was a pharmacist for 45 years. He was a member of Iuka Methodist Church where he served on several committees throughout the years, and was a longtime member of the Tishomingo County Hospital Board of Directors.

Services were at 11 a.m. Wednesday, June 20, at Iuka United Methodist Church with Bro. Jim Holcomb officiating. Burial was in Oak Grove Cemetery in Iuka. Cutshall Funeral Home in Iuka was in charge of services.



Sudden Flashes And The Retina
 If you've been disturbed by sudden flashes in your eyes, this may be caused by an irritation of the retina. The retina is a layer of light-sensitive cells located in the back of the eye. When it is stimulated (or in this case irritated) it is capable of sending only one sensation to the brain: light. Just as the nerves in other organs have specific purposes - the ear for receiving sounds, the nose for smell and so forth - light is the only sensation the retina can transmit. Even if the retina was pricked with a sharp pin, the only sensation it would transmit to the brain would be a flash of light.
 Even a tiny pull on the retina or a momentary stress on a tiny blood vessel caused by a slight rise in blood pressure may result in a flash of light to the brain. An occasional flash may be harmless. But it may also be an early warning of detachment of the retina, which can cause serious vision problems. Only an examination by your eye specialist can determine the cause and how it can best be treated.

Tishomingo County Development Foundation Meets In Belmont

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation held its June board meeting at Red Bud Supply in Belmont. CEO Mark Chumbley reported that his business sells gloves, rainwear, boots, dust masks, and other safety supplies plus janitorial supplies and we feature special closeouts. Our customers are local governments, utilities, co-ops, schools, colleges, construction contractors, and others. Most of our sales are outside of Mississippi. Kansas and South Carolina are big markets for us. Sales are handled by catalogs, trade shows, and telephone. We stress personal service and people to people contact. We use a team approach to business. We have 20 employees. We train our people and we rarely have employee turnover. Red Bud Supply is proud to donate supplies to areas that have experienced a

disaster. Home-grown small businesses need help at the start-up stage. One way to encourage the growth of new small businesses like ours would be to build small buildings in each community ready to lease to small business start-ups. Small businesses must keep start up costs as low as possible. Board members heard a report on the status of the membership campaign. The foundation has 82 members and investments to date of \$11,840. All of these funds are used in marketing Tishomingo County. Chairman Ken Cooley reminded board members to continue working on getting new members. Board members heard a report on the ongoing regional labor survey. Auto Parts Committee Chairman Neil Davis reported that the committee had met with TVA on April 20. More information is needed on several industrial sites and Kirby McRae has been asked to assist with determining property boundaries, the location and capacity of utilities, and other information. The committee and TVA are considering four sites in Burnsville, Iuka, Tishomingo, and Belmont. Utility shortcomings may be a major impediment for some of the sites. Another problem

that needs to be addressed is how to fill jobs that are already available in Tishomingo County. A training facility is needed.

Chairman Ken Cooley reported that a meeting between TVA, Pickwick Pines Marina, and foundation representatives was held recently. Some of the committee also attended the TVA board meeting in Columbus to offer support for the project. A conference call is scheduled tomorrow with TVA and Pickwick Pines Marina to work out amendments to the lease agreement.

Board members voted to join with the Tishomingo County Tourism Council on paying for a membership in the Natchez Trace Compact. The compact consists of communities along the Natchez Trace in Mississippi, Alabama, and Tennessee. Joining would mean more publicity for Tishomingo County. Membership dues are used to match funds for marketing grants. The cost of membership is \$5,000 and the tourism council has agreed to contribute \$2,500.

sion upon his release. In addition, he was ordered to pay court costs, a bond fee, a \$1,000 fine and restitution of \$1,000 with co-defendant Nick Nelson.
