TCEPA Taking Nominations For Board Of Directors

In accordance with the Bylaws of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, nomination for positions on the Board of Directors are now being accepted. There will be four positions open for election. One director is to be elected for a three (3) year term for each of the following supervisors' districts: 3rd, 4th, 5th and an area at large position.

Members of the Association may make nominations by either of the following methods:

1. By petition bearing the signature of at least fifteen (15) members: Petitions must be received by the Secretary of the Board of Directors at least seven (7) days prior to the day of the Annual Meeting. Petitions may be pre-

sented for qualification at the Main Office of the Association during regular business hours, Monday thru Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

2. From the floor of the Annual Meeting to be held August 11, 2007: The by-laws require that five (5) percent of the membership by physically present in order that nominations may be made from the floor.

Nominees must be residents of the supervisors' districts which they will represent. Any member, regardless of place of residence, may be nominated for the area at large position; provided, that the nominees for the at large position may not be residents of the second and fourth supervisors' district. These districts presently have a resident serving in an at large position.

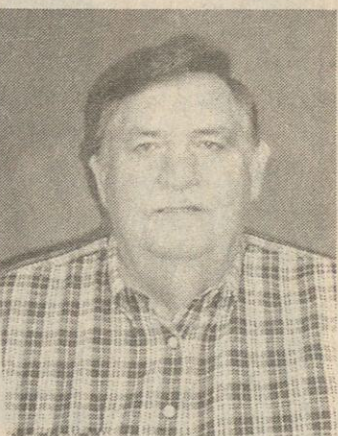

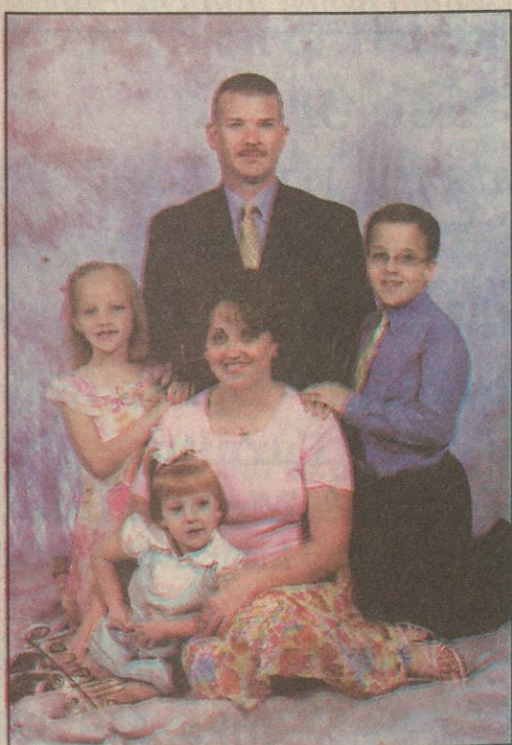

Letter To The Editor

As a concerned citizen of Tishomingo County, we have an election coming up in the state and each county which I want to touch on and think about.

Tishomingo County: You talk to anyone in the north end of county or south end of the county: We are in bad trouble. I want to talk about the supervisors in each district. We have five districts in the county. You talk to each supervisor in each district and they are concerned about themselves, want to work a little long to help their retirement and other reasons. No wonder we are losing jobs, plants are closing down, no roads to drive our vehicles on. Toyota was looking at Yellow Creek to build a plant. Nobody wanted them to come here. Nobody was pulling for this. They went to Well's Springs area, out from Tupelo. Those people had something to offer them.

I think it is time for Tishomingo County to wake up. We don't need to be running a disabled leadership or an old age leadership. This is the reason we are in the shape we are in. No road's to attract industry. We don't have the utility's up to par. They have got stale. We need new leadership.

Go to some of the other areas, close by, and see how they are growing, new plant's coming in, new housing being built. Go to our sister states—Alabama, Tennessee, Georgia—and see what's going on.

I'd like to ask a question here, : What's wrong?

When you talk to the supervisors about improving our utilities, our roads, they say we cannot do this and that we have people in the county who need's fire protection, need's better sewage lines. They tell you this was the way this was engineered and built. If we stay in this kind of leadership, we cannot do this or that.

To look and think positive about how they can help and not how it was built or

engineered.

If we will start thinking positive we might get the next Nissan or Toyota Plant. We have good things to offer from our area. We need good leadership to guide us. We have not had this leadership. I heard this the other day. We do not have the interstate roads in our area. Whose fault is it? I think it is the people in office riding the coupling pole. And not helping to guide the coupling pole in the way we need to go or what we need to do. We have to pay taxes. Are we getting any benefit from this?

If you want to see what goes on in this office attend some of their meetings. They sleep right through their meetings.

They spend the county money this way. No wonder we are in the shape we are in. We are still asleep.

I have been told the county is broke. If we are broke why is it that the banks from this area every year bids on the money to collect the interest from the money?

They have \$13 to \$15 million dollars in CDs. This is the people's money. Why can't we have a top notch in all utilities, roads, in any other things that would improve the county—Tishomingo County.

Legal Update

GETTING THE LEGAL BALL ROLLING

If you decide to sue someone over injuries that he or she caused you due to negligence or liability, your attorney will generally begin by filing a complaint and issuing a summons. The complaint sets forth the grounds of the lawsuit and states the injury or damage suffered by the plaintiff, as well as the names of the person(s) believed to be responsible and the type of remedy that the court is being asked to impose. A legal notice issued by the clerk of the court (a summons) informs the person named as defendant that legal action has been initiated against him or her. It also directs the defendant to file an answer with the court by a specified date.

It is important to consult with an attorney and understand your rights if you believe you have been injured by the negligent act of someone else. For more information about negligence, call my office to schedule a consultation. Come to experience you can trust.

HINT: Failure to respond to a summons usually results in a default judgment being entered against the defendant.

Contagious Conjunctivitis

If you have conjunctivitis, it is important to keep the disease from spreading. Conjunctivitis is an infection of conjunctiva, the thin, transparent membrane that covers the white of the eye. This eye infection can be sudden and severe and it can also be chronic.

Most cases are caused by germs such as certain pus-producing bacteria, viruses, and fungi. In some forms, it is highly contagious. Special care must be taken to keep the hands away from the face. When using eyedrops, the hands should be scrubbed with soap and warm water before and after applying medication. 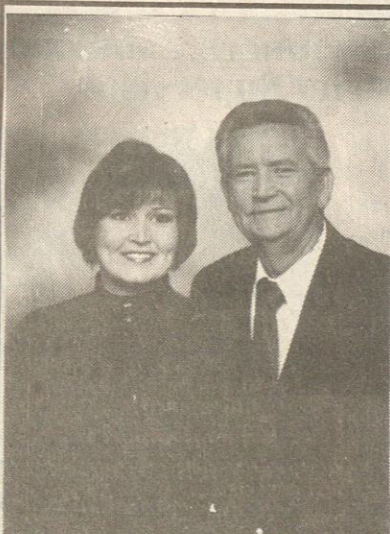

The annual board meeting of Short Coleman Park Water Association has been changed to Monday, August 6th, at 7:30 p.m. This change was

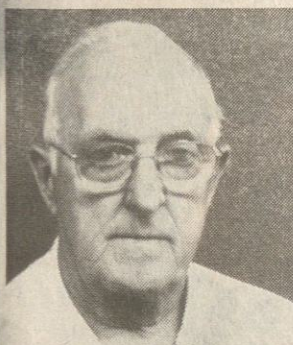

 come to work in X-ray. And

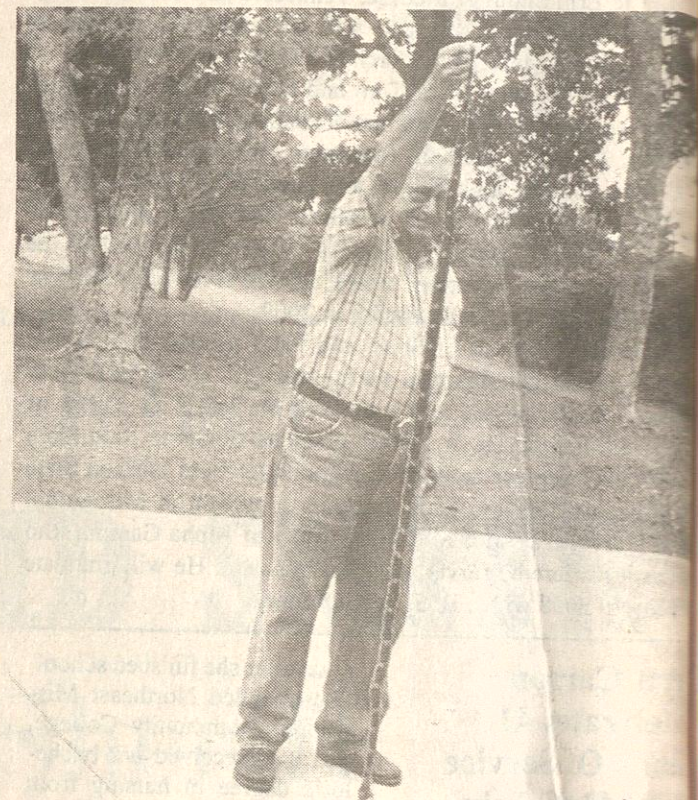
now it's all I've ever done."

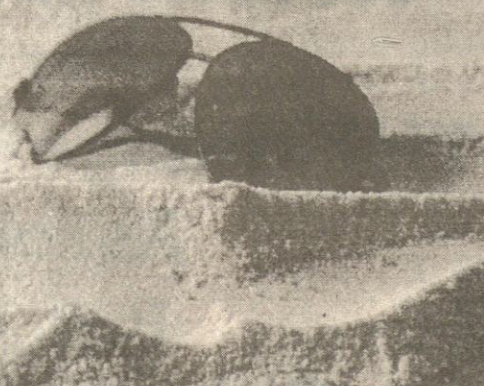

Tishomingo County for generations. My late grandparents J.C. "Cleck" and Inez Woodruff were life long residents. I am the son of Joe and Shirley Woodruff, formerly of Iuka. I also have two brothers who live here Greg, with his wife Pam, and Keith, with his wife Aimee.

During the course of my campaign, I have realized that not everyone knows what the duties of a constable are. According to Article 6, Section 171 of the Mississippi Constitution and of the Mississippi Code 19-19-5, the duties of the office of constable are; "to keep and preserve the peace within his county, by faithfully aiding and assisting in executing the criminal laws of the state". The constable is also "Authorized to serve process issued by any county,

chancery or circuit courts". In addition to serving court process your constable should be an integral part of the law enforcement community. Constables are empowered by the state constitution as Law Enforcement Officers. Whether you were aware of it or not you have been electing a law enforcement official with as much authority as a sheriff. A constable only means of income, however, is by serving legal process. No other salary from the county or tax payer is received.

My experience and qualifications are as follows:

- Academy certified law enforcement officer
- Top honor graduate of Southern Regional Public Safety Institute
- Graduate of Mississippi State Law Enforcement and Ethics and Integrity

- Certified firearms instructor for the State of Mississippi
- Certified D.A.R.E. Instructor for the State of Mississippi
- Former certified K-9 handler
- 4 1/2 years as Deputy Sheriff of Tishomingo County
- Interim Chief of Police for City of Burnsville

I also have experience in investigating felony crimes and presenting those cases to the Grand Jury for indictment.

The completion of these experiences are something I am proud to have accomplished. Experience breeds effectiveness. However, all of these qualifications alone, do not make a good officer. As I've said in some interviews, "people don't care how much you know - until they know how much you care." In active law enforcement assignments I tried to do just that.

I learned that there are two

types of law; "Letter of the Law" and "Spirit of the Law". The Letter of the Law is black and white - what is legal or illegal. For example, the law says that an officer can stop you for any minor traffic offense and make arrests. The officer would be justified in doing that because the law books say so. The Spirit of the Law, however, says there may be circumstances that need to be considered along with the letter of the law. An example: Mississippi Highway Patrol Officers stop citizens running at an excessive rate of speed and would have been justified by the letter of the law to write a ticket or make an arrest. The officer discovers though, that the driver/passenger has an emergent medical condition and is trying to get to the hospital. All of a sudden the spirit of the law takes over and the officer safely escorts the driver to the hospital - without a ticket or an arrest. This is an example of treating people with dignity and respect, taking into account that each situation is unique. Courtesy, Care and Respect, along with experience and qualifications, are the qualities of a good officer.

As mentioned above, I am also a certified D.A.R.E. officer. For two years I visited our county schools twice a week to educate young people about the dangers of Drugs, Alcohol and Violence. Teaching young people, about such important subjects, is a privilege. To realize that they understand and "get it" has been the most rewarding experience of my active law enforcement duties. Beth and I are raising our three children in this county. I would like them - along with all the other children - to be able to grow up in the best county that we, as responsible adults, can provide for them.
