

#### Contagious Conjunctivitis If you have conjunc-

tivitis, it is important to keep the disease from spreading. Conjunctivitis is an infection of conjunctiva, the thin, transparent membrane that covers the white of the eye. This eye infection can be sudden and severe and it can also be chronic.


#### **Donna Hudson Honored For 40 Years Of Service At NMMC-luka**

"I like what I do and I love the people that I work with. I just enjoy my job," Hudson said.

Hudson started at NMMC-Iuka on April 4, 1967. She had completed two years at Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and planned on transferring to the University of North Alabama in Florence, AL, when she applied for a job at the hospital in Iuka.

"I was studying accounting when I applied for a job but there were no openings in accounting," Hudson said. "They asked me if I'd like to come to work in X-ray. And hand. Then we got a processor that ran the film through and developed it. Now we're on PACS (Picture Archiving and Communication System) which digitizes images and eliminates the need for film. It's come a long way."
