

#### **luka Police Department Arrests One On Multiple Drug Charges**

According to Iuka Police Chief, Randy Stringer, on Wednesday, July 11, 2007, officers with the Iuka Police Department, assisted by the Stateline Narcotics Task Force, executed a Search Warrant at 210 Pride Street, Iuka, MS.

As a result of the Search Warrant, Sandy "Bud" Pritchard was arrested for Possession of Cocaine with Intent to Distribute, Possession of Oxycontin with Intent to Distribute Simple and Possession of Marijuana.

The Officers seized approximately five grams of powder cocaine, 10 dosage units of Oxycontin 40 mg., 10 grams of marijuana and 15 grams of crack cocaine.

Iuka The Department approximately \$500 in cash and two vehicles from Pritchard.

The street value of the cocaine is approximately \$2,000 and the Oxycontin approximately \$400.

The Search Warrant came as a result of a threeyear investigation conducted the Iuka Department. The Search Warrant was issued by Justice Court Judge Donnie Joe

Additional charges are anticipated in the future against Pritchard and also other possible co-defendants.

A hold was placed on Pritchard due to his arrest and indictment in Lonoke, AR for possession of approximately four ounces of cocaine and approximately five pounds of marijuana.
