## Early Morning Fire Sunday Destroys Downtown Iuka Building

A newspaper delivery man spotted smoke coming out of the corner building on Front Street and Main Street in Iuka around 4:30 a.m. Sunday.

The man called 9-1-1 and Iuka Fire Department responded at 4:32 a.m. The building comprised 101 and 105 Front Street, and 113 N. Main Street.

According to Iuka Police Chief Brian Grissom, the fire apparently started in the 101 Front location at the southwest corner of the building; however the cause at press time was not known.

The only business in the building was All-American Sports Cards, Comics and Skateboards, located at the

101 Front location. The other addresses were vacant; however, their were plans for a coffee shop to be located at the 105 Front address by the building's owner Gaylena Rhodes of Iuka, who had purchased the building only about one week ago. The other address on Main was presently vacant. Reports were that Rhodes did have insurance on the property.

The last person in the building was the card store owner, Thomas Martin, who left around 2:30 a.m. after a card competition at his store. He stated that everything was okay at that time. No one was in any of the addresses at the time the fire started,

according to reports.

Fire Chief Grissom stated that there was a two feet wide fire wall between this building and the adjoining buildings which helped the firefighters in the prevention of the connecting buildings from catching fire.

Firefighters battled the blaze until around 7 a.m. Sunday to ensure it was completely extinguished and that surrounding buildings were safe.

In addition to Iuka Fire Department, other departments assisting at the scene were Harmony Central, Coleman Park, Eastport/Millcreek, Snowdown/Pleasant Hill, Midway, and the

Corinth Fire Department's ladder truck.

The building that burned was probably built around 1902. The building next door that was the former Jourdan's Drug Store has a golden step in the concrete that says 1901. On a 1925 picture of downtown Iuka the building housed a cafe and service station. McGill's Grocery was located in the corner building in the 1950's and W.T. and Betty Dexter had a clothing store in the adjoining building. These two stores were remodeled in 1978 and became the Sears Store in Iuka operated by the Chaffins.

## Run-Off Elections Set For August 28th

**Whitlock & Smith in Sheriff's Race  
Offices of Chancery Clerk, Constable  
North-Half, and Supervisors District  
1, 2, 4 & 5 To Be Voted On**

The official Tishomingo County 1st Democratic Primary Election results have been released and they reveal that there will be a local run-off election for the offices of Sheriff, Chancery Clerk, Constable (North-Half) and Supervisors in the first, second, fourth and fifth districts.

The run-off will be Tuesday, August 28th.

In the race for Sheriff, incumbent Glenn Whitlock will face off against former Sheriff, David Smith. Whitlock received 2386 votes to Smith's 1635. Ralph Montgomery was the third highest with 1368 votes.

In the race for Chancery Clerk, incumbent Hayden Ables will face off against Peyton Cummings. Ables tallied 3216 votes to Cummings' 2368.

In the race for Constable, (North Half) incumbent Tim Bivins will face off against Russ Robinson. Bivins received 1700 votes to Robinson's 1033.

In the race for Supervisor, District 1, incumbent Dale Price will face off against Brandon L. Grissom. Price had 463 votes to Grissom's 395.

In the race for Supervisor, District 2,

incumbent Arlie South will face off against Nicky McRae. South had 588 to McRae's 623.

In the race for Supervisor, District 4, incumbent David Sanders will face off against Steve Thorne. Sanders had 329 votes to Thorne's 305.

In the race for Supervisor, District 5, incumbent Leon Cook will face off against James A. McDowell. Cook had 414 votes to McDowell's 404.

These totals are all official with all votes counted. It should also be noted that many of these Democratic nominees will face Republican and Independent candidates in the November general election.

At press time, the Mississippi Secretary of State's office had not released those who will be in the Democratic run-off election on the district and state levels.

Those interested in voting absentee in the run-off primary should contact Circuit Clerk, Donna Dill at her office Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. in the Tishomingo County Courthouse, 662-423-7026. Until all state races have been decided, ballots will not be available for absentee voting.

An election will be held Saturday, August 18th, 2007, to elect four (4) members for positions on the Board of Directors of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association. Members of the Association may vote for one person for each position on the ballot.

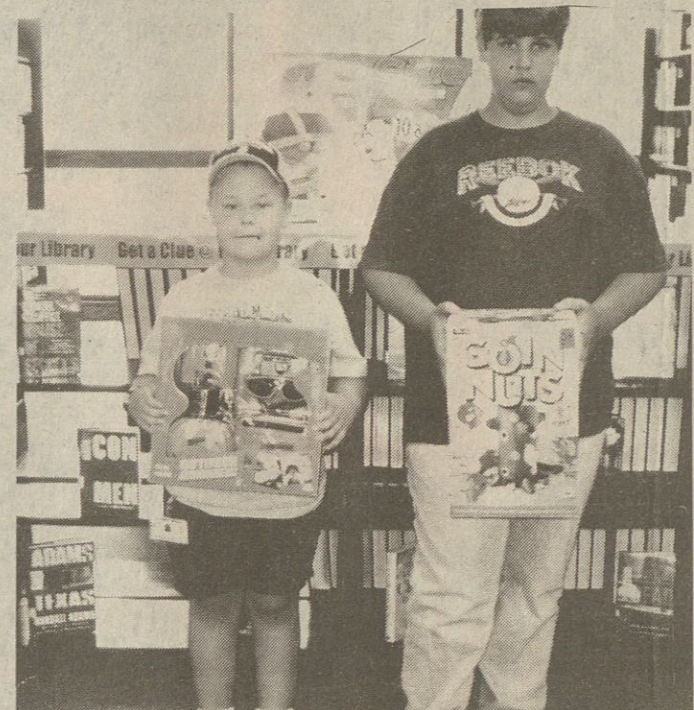

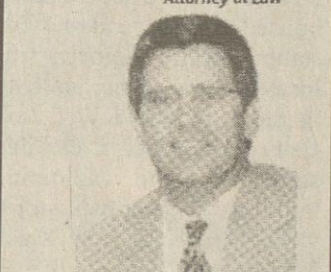

### ON APPEAL

Upon the completion of a trial, either party may ask for a new trial on the basis of newly discovered evidence, a verdict that is inconsistent with the weight of the evidence, an inadequate or too large a damage award, or errors of law made during the trial. Unsatisfied litigants may also appeal a final judgment. Instead of requiring that the trial begin anew, as a new trial does, an appeal requires that a transcript of the trial be sent to the appellate court. The party bringing the appeal (appellant) submits a brief with its petition for appeal. These documents outline why it is believed that the lower court has made an error by citing statutes and case law.

### Letter To The Editor

Having moved to Leflore County last August from Natchez to attend Mississippi Valley State University as a full-time student, I soon learned that living off campus disqualified me from the meal ticket dorm residents get. On four occasions, I've purchased a commuter meal ticket good for any 50 meals of my choice from MVSU's cafeteria. That's \$162.25 times four, which is really a great bargain, and I've enjoyed the meals.

Last September, a classmate told me I might qualify for food stamps, so I sat one day no less than 2 1/2 hours finally to be told by food stamp officials that though they sympathized with me, I did not qualify. Being a white, nontraditional college student, a male, in my forties, did not matter. My only income, as I explained, was and still is from playing piano at the First Baptist Church in Itta Bena. I had not qualified for a work-study job on campus. In order for me to qualify for food stamps, I was told I needed at least 20 hours of work each week. Imagine that! Based on hours worked rather than income earned, my application for food stamps was denied.

Having read about the local Food Pantry and the wonderful service it provides, I built up enough courage to pay it a visit, hoping to get a food box. The lady at the desk was very kind. She said

in order for me to qualify for a food box, I either had to be receiving \$60 or less per month in food stamps or else obtain proof from the food stamp office that I'd been denied. I was back in a short while with proof, and I received a one-time-only "emergency" box. The sweet lady told me if I should qualify later for food stamps, I'd also qualify to receive more food boxes. I thanked the workers at the Food Pantry and then drove away with the box of food.

Some things in life just do not make sense. Rules are rules, I guess, even if they result in a double-or-nothing

system. As I continue my efforts toward a degree in Elementary Education, I'll pray that God will provide the \$162.25 as needed.

## Notice To All Tishomingo County Residents From The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department

In this day and age we find ourselves constantly on the lookout for scams and deceptions that could land us in trouble or in financial ruin. Recently we have become aware of a new scam that has unfortunately befallen some residents of Tishomingo County and we would like to inform the public on what to be on the lookout for.

This scam is initiated by a person receiving a notification similar to those of Publishers Clearing House where they are told that they are the winners of a contest in which they did not enter. The envelope that the notification is in will be white, with no return address, and will be post marked from Canada. The grand prize is \$250,000. The contest is called the Aus-

tralian Sweepstakes. The letter will have a confirmation number and there will be a check included. There will be contact information in the letter that will tell you who to call and instructions to follow. The check included will in fact be a valid check. The check will be in the amount of \$3,900.

When you call the number provided you will reach a man with a middle eastern accent. He will tell you that you have won the Australian Sweepstakes. Most people ask for an explanation of how they could win a contest without entering and he will tell you that they have randomly chosen a name and address from the computer. The man will explain to you that the entire \$250,000 prize was in-

sured and that you must take \$2,900 out of the \$3,900 check to pay the cost of insurance along with applicable taxes and keep \$1,000 for yourself. The man will tell you to send the money via Western Union to a name and address in Canada and once the money reaches Canada, FED-EX will deliver the rest of your \$250,000 the following day. The man will also tell you to tell no one about the money so that you may avoid paying taxes on the \$250,000.

Now we will explain what actually happens... The scam artist picks your name from a list of names who are usually on disability, social security, or who have bad credit so that the scam will be most effective since you are in desperate need of a miracle. The letter and check arrive at your home and you follow the instructions by cashing the check at your local bank. The bank will be skeptical of the check and will run the check through the system to ensure that the check is valid. This process takes about thirty minutes. After the bank verifies the validity of the check they will in fact cash the check and give you the cash. Most people caught up in this scam are very skeptical about get-

ting this money for nothing

but they are in such bad financial shape that they can't afford to pass up this opportunity in case it is for real and since the bank actually cashed the check, you feel less skeptical. You will not inform law enforcement for in the case that it is real you don't want to have to pay the taxes on \$250,000. You will send the money via Western Union to Canada and you will never hear from them again. The check that you cashed that was good is now bad because the scam artist put a stop payment on the check. You have endorsed the check so when the check comes back, you are responsible for the \$3,900 and you are past the point where law enforcement can help you. You have just sent \$2,900 that didn't exist to a scam artist. Unfortunately there is no way to catch these criminals. They are ruthless, heartless, and have no remorse for who they hurt in their pursuit of monetary gain.

This scam originates in Canada where through tough international extradition and jurisdictional laws, the scam artists are practically immune from prosecution.

We are asking that no one respond to these types of letters and if you encounter a fishy offer like this, don't hesitate to call local law enforcement and inquire the validity of such offers.

Please remember that nothing in life is free.

### Limited Resource And Beginning Farmer Conservation Initiative...

Do You Require Financial Assistance to Fund Conservation Program Initiatives? According to Harold Mills Farm Loan Manager for the Alcorn/Tishomingo County Farm Service Agency Office, USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the Farm Service Agency (FSA) are working together to make conservation

programs more available to beginning, small, and limited resource farmers. As producers move from initial contract development into the implementation stage under NRCS' Environmental Quality Incentives Program, many face the inability to acquire the initial capital investment of their cost-share portion needed for contract implementation.

To help producers implement conservation measures, Harold Mills emphasized that FSA has several loan programs available to assist with up-front costs. FSA makes direct and guaranteed farm

ownership and operating loans to family-size farmers and ranchers who cannot obtain commercial credit otherwise. A primary objective of FSA's farm loan programs is to assist small, beginning, and socially disadvantaged (minority and female) producers. In fact, a portion of FSA's loan funds are reserved for beginning and socially disadvantaged producers. These loan programs are not new and have been used successfully in conjunction with conservation programs throughout the United States.

resources were received by the regents and treasurers. A delicious lunch and good fellowship was enjoyed by all.

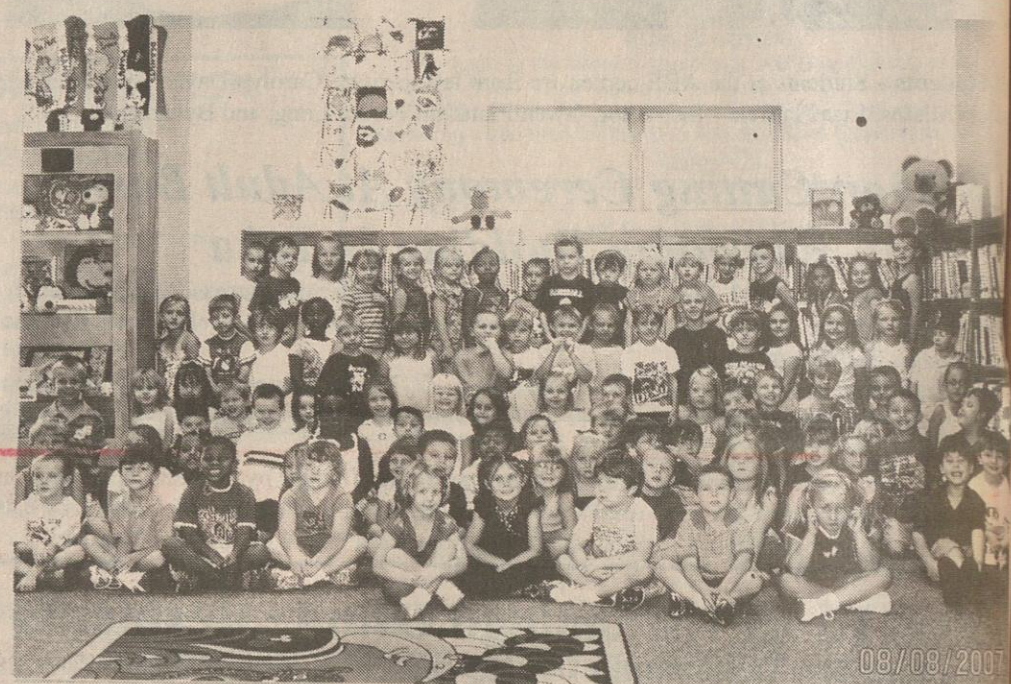

### TCDF Board of Directors Meets at International Converter

Plant Manager Keith Wooley gave board members an overview of International Converter. The plant was built in 1963 and has been known in the area as the

"aluminum plant." Packaging Dynamics purchased the company from Ormet in 2003 and took the company private in 2006. Packaging Dynamics has 11 facilities in the USA with sales of \$750,000,000. The Iuka facility has increased sales from \$19 million in 2005 to \$34 million in 2007. The Iuka plant has been hiring lately and plans to continue to ramp up production. The Iuka plant

has 50 employees and very little turnover. The Iuka plant manufactures foil backed paper products for the construction industry including a tri-plex foil and paper product used for roofing, a Celotex product for the United Kingdom market, and a foil-paper product used in the production of OSB by Louisiana-Pacific. A new energy conservation product is being developed.

Board members heard a report on the status of Pickwick Pines Marina. Written permission from TVA has been received to proceed with the grading of the site. There have been significant increases in the cost of the marina over the last two years while waiting for permits to be approved.

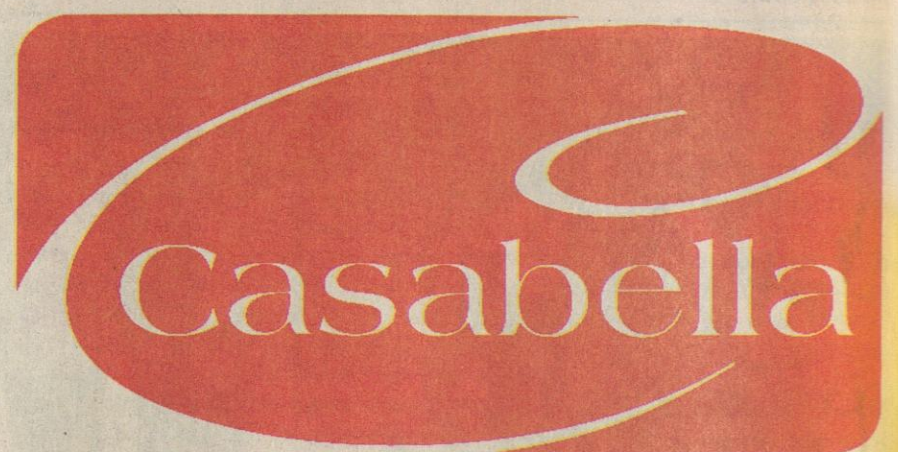

## HealthWorks! campaign launches with fanfare & generous donations

When Dean Hancock, president of Health Care Foundation of North Mississippi, announced on April 24 that the HealthWorks! Children's Health Education Center will open in Tupelo in the fall of 2008, the news was greeted with rousing cheers by young and old alike.

The third-graders attending the kick-off event at Gloster Creek Village were excited to learn that they will have a "really cool" and "really fun" field trip destination within 18 months. The adults in the audience were thrilled to hear that the innovative and interactive HealthWorks! center not only will augment classroom learning for thousands of students each year, but also will positively impact the health status of children throughout the region.

Developed by Memorial Health System in South Bend, Ind., the original HealthWorks! is a nationally acclaimed children's health education program serving more than 60,000 school children as a primary resource for curriculum-based health education.

"HealthWorks! is more than an educational program," Hancock told the crowd of approximately 175. "It is a culture of fun learning that inspires and motivates children to become more aware of their health and to make better decisions about their health choices."

"The best part of HealthWorks!, though, is that it was meant to be replicated in similar communities throughout the nation. And I'm pleased to announce that in the autumn of 2008, the first national replication of HealthWorks! will open here in north Mississippi."

With balloons, music, humor and interactive activities, the event exuded high energy and piqued the curiosity of many.

For Kate Wheeler, a third-grader at Church Street Elementary School in Tupelo, the presentation was "really cool," with her favorite presentation being the hilarious but highly educational skit involving the journey food takes along the digestive tract.

"We've studied the digestive system a little in school, but with this (activity) you could really see how it all works," Kate said. "It was a lot of fun!"

The program culminated with perhaps the most exciting news of all – the \$6 million capital campaign to construct

HealthWorks! had exceeded half of its goal even before the public kick-off began. By the official launch, The Campaign for HealthWorks! had raised more than \$3 million, thanks in large part to \$500,000 donations each by the Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Mississippi Foundation and North Mississippi Health Services.



"When we decided to move forward with HealthWorks!, the Health Care Foundation of North Mississippi asked two key organizations to partner with us," Hancock said.

"Both share a vision to make our state and region healthier, and both are equally committed to providing resources to improve children's health education. The Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Mississippi Foundation eventually became the very first – and one of the largest – donors to The Campaign for HealthWorks!. The board and leadership of North Mississippi Health Services also recognized the potential of HealthWorks! as a valuable health improvement tool – one that is perfectly aligned with its mission to improve the health status of the people of this region."

With that introduction, Kevin Spera, community programs manager for Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Mississippi, and John Heer, president & chief executive officer of North Mississippi Health Services, simultaneously presented checks to Hancock for \$500,000.

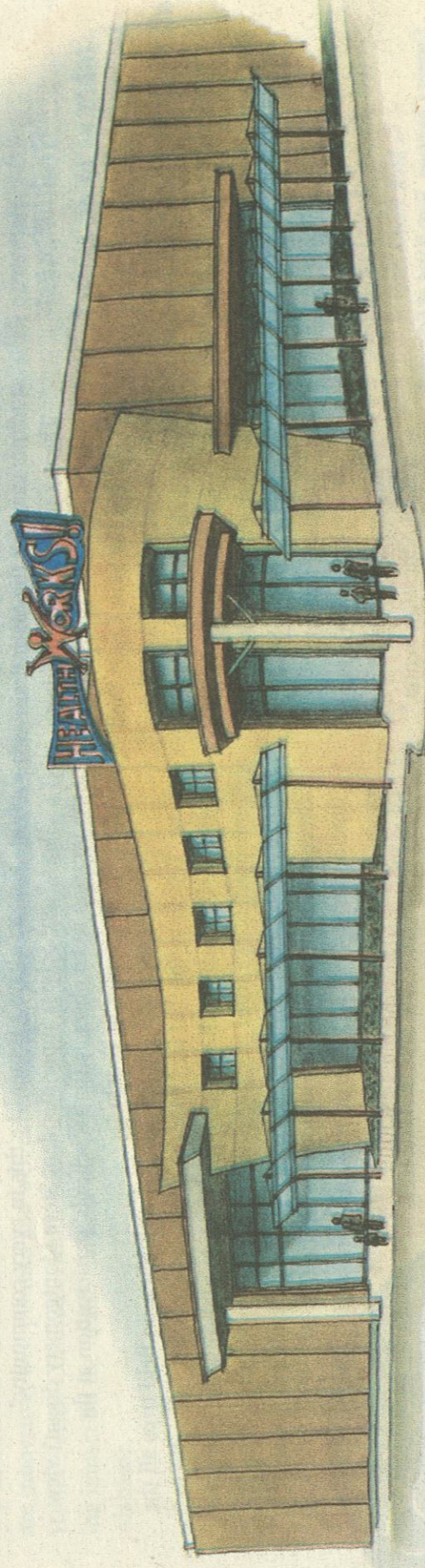

# improve the region's health status

**When the HealthWorks! Children's Health Education Center opens in the fall of 2008, it is sure to garner high marks from the more than 40,000 area schoolchildren who are expected to visit each year.**

For the regional civic, business and medical leaders who have had the opportunity to visit the HealthWorks! prototype in South Bend, Ind., over the past year, it is a program so impressive that they are joining forces to raise funds for this innovative educational endeavor.

Spearheaded by the Health Care Foundation of North Mississippi, HealthWorks! is a curriculum-based, interactive health education center that will offer hands-on learning to area schoolchildren ages kindergarten through eighth grade. It will be housed in the former Kroger building on Industrial Road in Tupelo.

Only the second center of its kind in the United States, it will replicate the HealthWorks! Kids Museum created by Memorial Health System in South Bend. Its purpose is two-fold – to enhance the health and science curricula for area schools and to effect lifelong change for healthier lifestyles among area children.

Through humor, hands-on learning and interactive exhibits and presentations, the HealthWorks! programs will educate students about proper nutrition, fitness, tobacco prevention, oral health and puberty.

Among the multitude of activities,

a minimum of \$6 million to build the innovative resource center. Children will be able to participate in (their health education) classes at the classroom level then come to HealthWorks! and have a hands-on learning experience."

Retired Tupelo surgeon and HealthWorks! steering committee member Benton Hilburn, M.D., agrees, "We're such a fertile area here in Mississippi to do something about improving the health of our kids and preventing adolescent obesity, which can lead to diabetes, kidney

failure and ultimately dialysis. I

feel that if we can prevent even one or two kids from getting overweight, becoming diabetic, developing high blood pressure and

subsequently

having kidney failure, it certainly could have an economic impact as well as an impact on the health of our community."

And that impact will extend well beyond the borders of Tupelo and Lee County, according to Bobby Martin, president/CEO of The Peoples Bank in Ripley and HealthWorks! steering committee member.

"The way I look at it, Tupelo can't support this project by itself," Martin says. "Schools in north Mississippi's 22 counties are going to have to participate to make it successful. We will need 40,000 kids to come through each year, so you've got to bus those kids in at some point. You can't have a center like this in every community."

West Point School Superintendent Steve Montgomery doesn't view the location as an obstacle for his schools' participation at the HealthWorks! center in Tupelo.

"We have buses and our teachers take children on field trips all the time. Tupelo is not that far," Montgomery says. "We will just need to schedule our visits at the beginning of the school year so we can plan appropriately. We want our students to go and see something like this."

Zell Long, HealthWorks! steering committee member and assistant director for community development with the City of Tupelo, has visited the museum in South Bend and predicts that Tupelo's HealthWorks! center will be "phenomenal." She says that she feels privileged to be a part of such an important endeavor.

"It's been neat to see the physicians and other community members on the steering committee be so excited about this project," Long says.

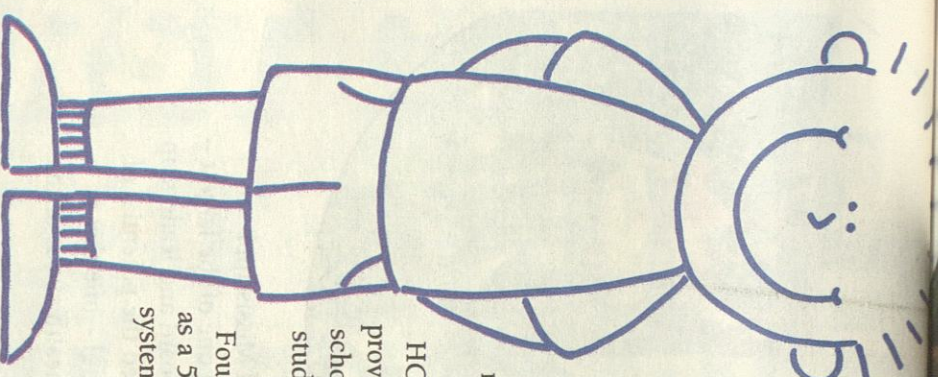

# A history of helping others...

**Since 1980**, HCF has provided a majority of its charitable resources for patient assistance and community health programs. It has received and distributed millions of dollars in charitable funding to support NMMC's mission of improving health in the region.

To address the unmet health care needs of lower-income children and youth, HCF began sponsoring NMMC school health centers. Presently, the Foundation provides nearly \$500,000 annually to support 17 school health nurses and three school health educators that serve more than 15,000 elementary and middle school students in 23 schools throughout northeast Mississippi.

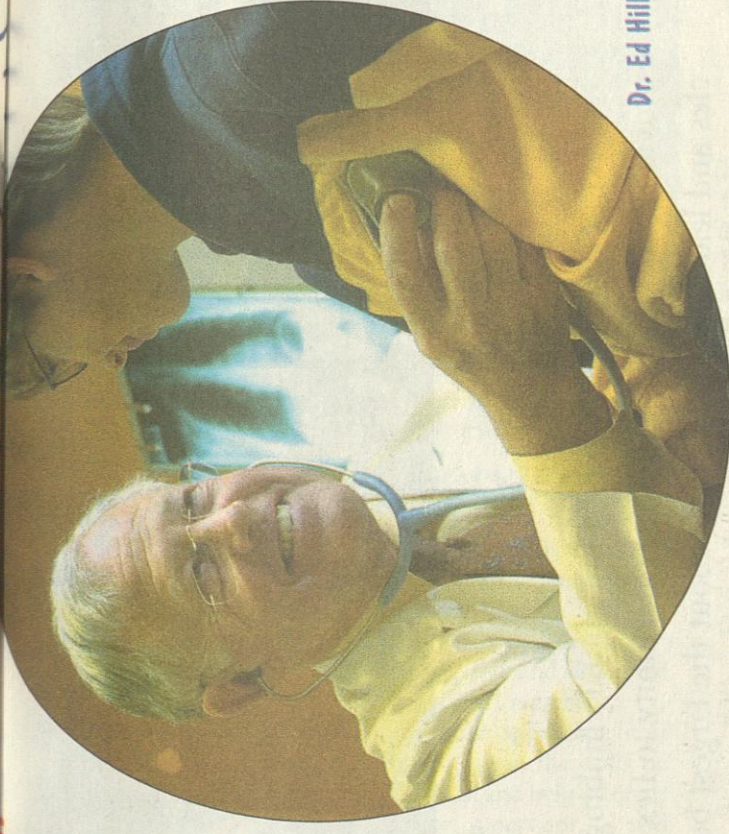


## Helping change children's health and lifestyle behaviors here at home

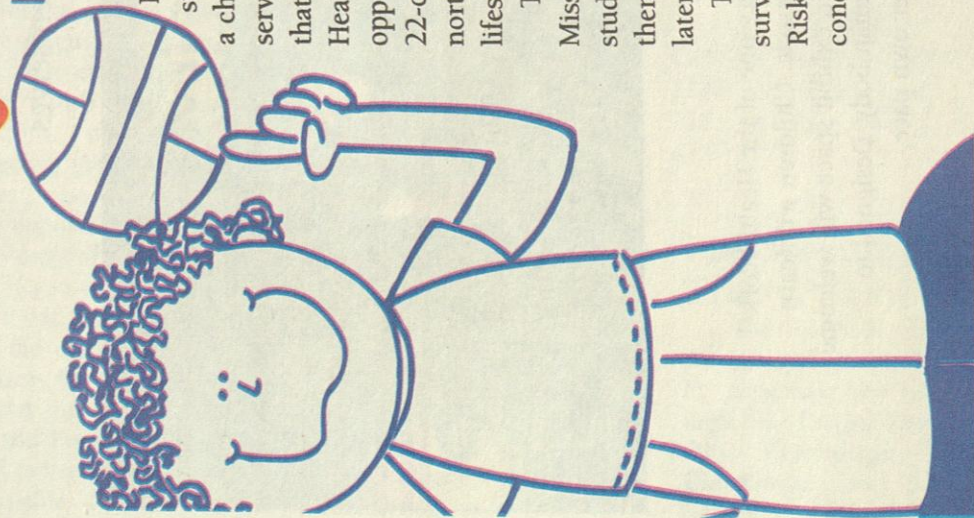
# The Urgent Need

In August 2004, the Health Care Foundation commissioned the Social Science Research Center (SSRC) of Mississippi State University to conduct a study to determine the need and interest for a children's health education resource center to serve north Mississippi. The results confirmed that a health education center such as HealthWorks! would provide increased opportunity for children and families in the 22-county region of north Mississippi and northwest Alabama to lead more healthful lifestyles.

The SSRC research team reported that Mississippi and Alabama high school students engage in behaviors placing them at risk for serious health problems later in life.

The MSU researchers coupled their own survey findings with those of a recent Youth Risk Behavior Survey which delivered very concerning information:

- More than 40% participated in alcohol consumption during the month prior to the survey
- More than 30% were classified as obese
- Nearly 70% were not enrolled in physical education class
- More than 80% indicated that they participated rarely in moderate physical activity
- 40% reported not being physically active
- 22% smoked tobacco regularly
- More than 70% fell into the overweight category

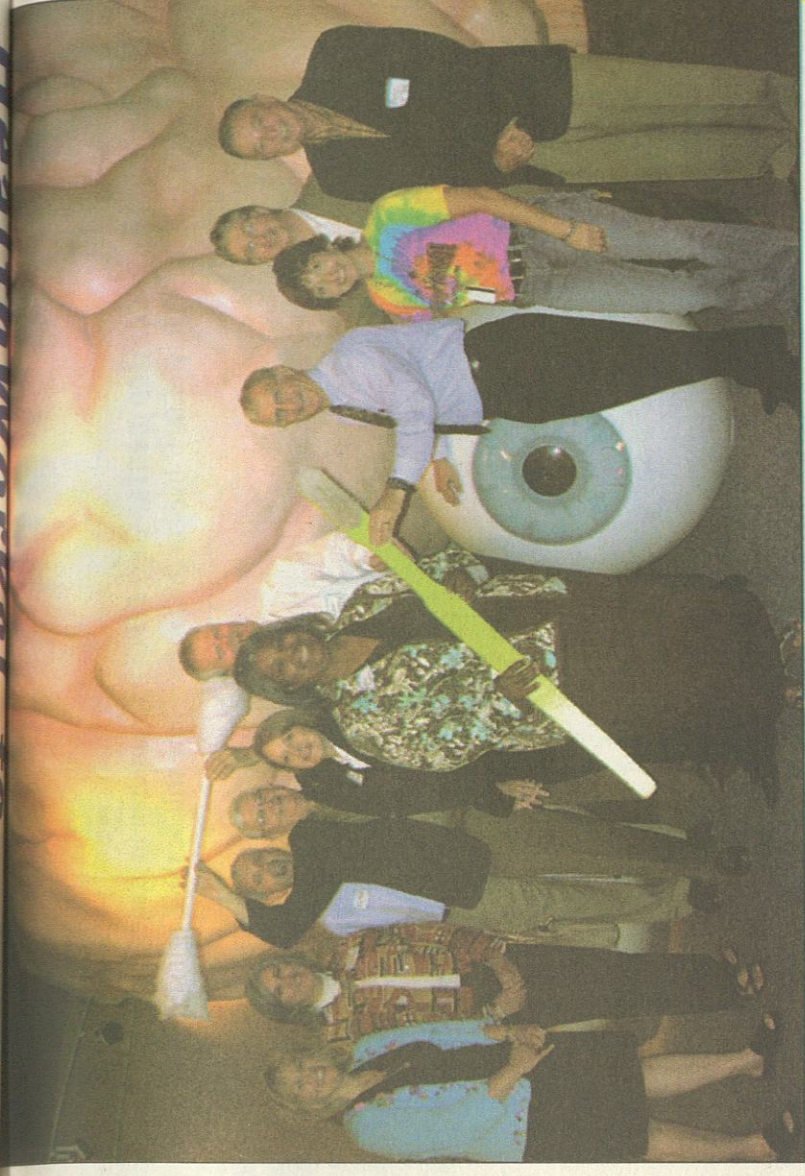

HCF and its community partners plan to construct HealthWorks!, a curriculum-based, interactive health education center for regional students enrolled in kindergarten through grade eight. Hands-on exhibits, state-of-the-art classrooms and a special theater will provide infrastructure for health education programming approved by the State of Mississippi Department of Education. The center will serve as an educational field trip resource for 80,000+ K-8 public and private school children and youth groups throughout the north Mississippi region. The HealthWorks! visit experience will be reinforced by complementary curriculum, based in part on a recently

completed MSU Social Science Research Center/ NMMC Community Health Assessment Study and provided to the schools for pre- and post-visit class work. The primary health targets will focus on:

- Oral Health
- Tobacco Prevention
- Proper Nutrition
- Fitness
- Puberty Education and Awareness



# HealthWorks!

**Our HealthWorks! will be a highly interactive health education center** designed to help children in grades K-8 understand that the choices they make today will have an impact on the quality of their lives in the future. There will be three primary elements of the center:

- a health and science education curriculum -- designed for the school-based classroom and for programming at the HealthWorks! center -- to be aligned with the standards of the Mississippi Department of Education

- a staff of instructors specially trained to engage children in learning activities.



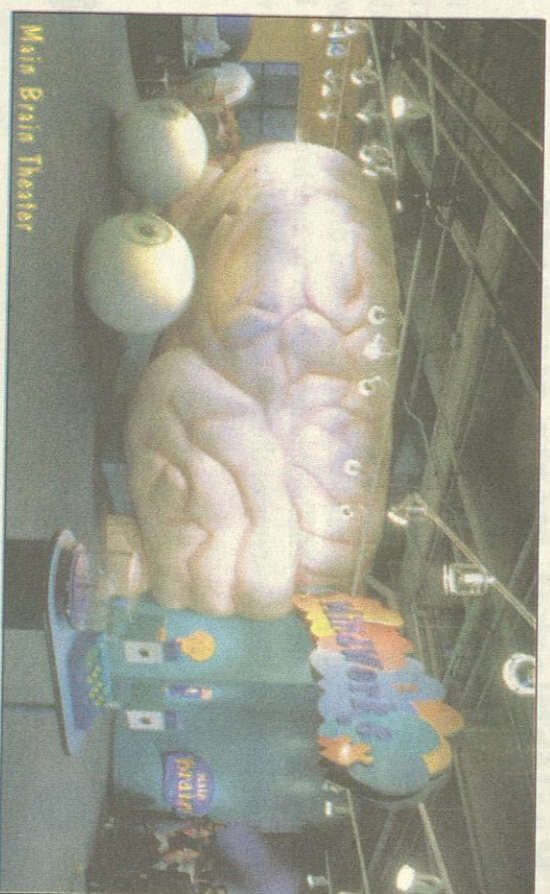

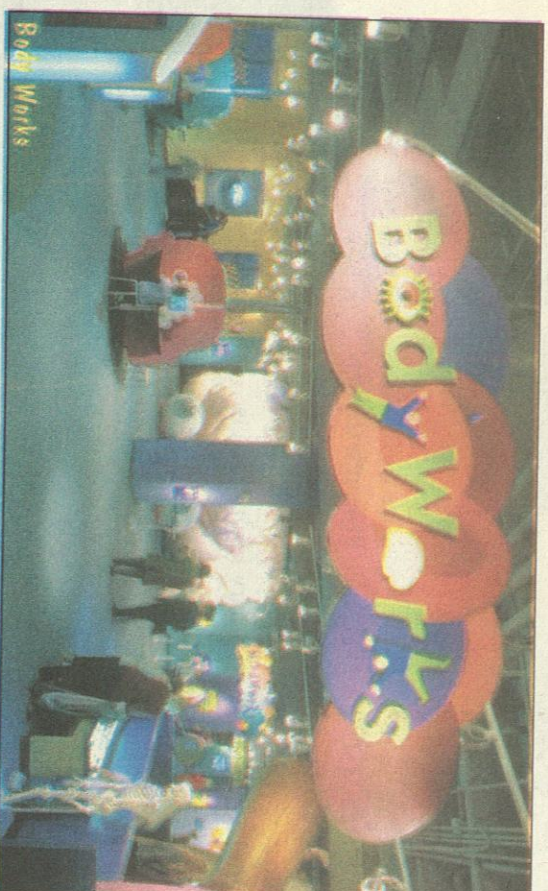

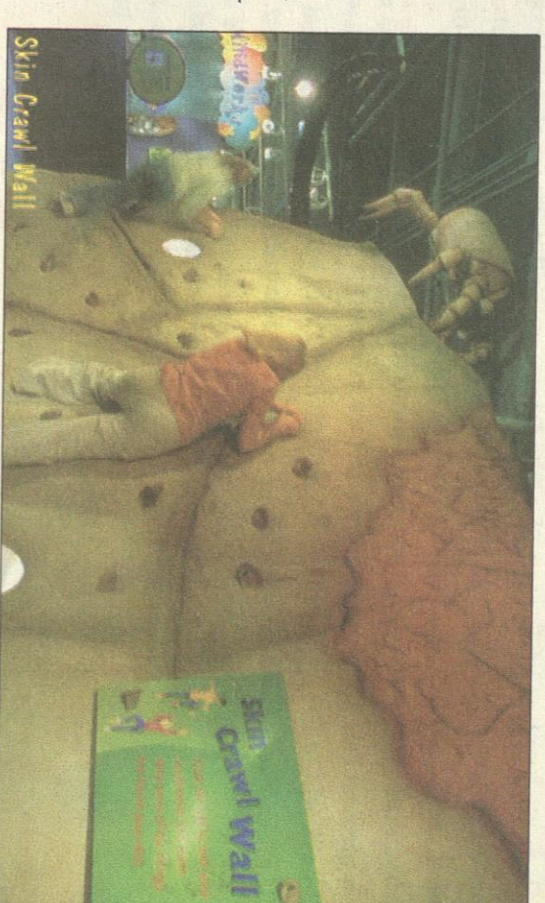
