Holcut Community Celebrates 100 Years On September 8th

In 1907, the community of Holcut became a town, but was later acquired for the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway.

It was the only town to be lost for the Waterway construction, and the Holcut Memorial Park was built to honor the town.

At the birthday celebration, planned for Saturday, September 8th, the residents and families are asked to come and tell their stories of the schools, churches, stores, families and even the funny happenings. A representative from the

Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum will be on hand to record these stories for future generations so that the wonderful history will not be lost.

The celebration will be at the Holcut Memorial Park with the registration starting at 10 a.m., and the story telling at 10:30 a.m. and last until there are no more stories to tell. There will be a birthday cake, food vendors and Tri-State Flywheelers Antique Tractor Club, t-shirts and lots of fun. Come stay all day and enjoy the festivities.

220th Anniversary Of The Signing Of The U.S. Constitution Celebration Planned

The public is invited to attend the historic 220th anniversary celebration of the Signing of the Constitution of the United States of America on September 16th, 2007 at the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum, aka old Tishomingo County Courthouse.

The tradition of celebrating the Constitution was started many years ago by the Daughters of the American Revolution. In 1955, the Daughters petitioned Congress to set aside September 17-23 annually to be dedicated for

the observance of Constitution Week. The resolution was later adopted by the U.S. Congress and signed into Public Law #915 on August 2nd, 1956, by President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Chief Tishomingo Chapter DAR and the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society in celebration of the 220th anniversary will present a historic program to include, reading of the Constitution, a flag presentation, musical performances, and ringing of the bells to symbolize the Bells of Freedom. Betsy Ross will be our special guest. The program will begin at 2 p.m. in the historic courtroom.

Local Industry Leaders Meet To Tackle Welder Shortage

Iuka, Mississippi.

According to industry leaders, there is a shortage of approximately 300 welders in Tishomingo County alone. With the announcement of Alabama National Rail Car in nearby Barton, Alabama, the shortage in metal trades may worsen.

Industry and job training leaders met recently at Café Memories in Iuka to discuss options. Representatives from Dynasteel Corporation, Truck Bodies and Equipment International, FerroSouth, Monotech/PSP Industries, Northeast Mississippi Community College, Mississippi Department of Employment Security, Yellow Creek Port Authority, and Tishomingo County Development Foundation were all present. Other parties involved include Tishomingo County

Vocational Technical Center, Skyline Steel, and New River Homes.

The purpose of the meeting was to begin a dialogue toward finding a solution to the worker shortage. Part of the problem is that most local citizens are not aware of the worker shortage. Another problem is that most students do not consider vocational technical trades as a profession, although workers with one and two year technical certificates may earn more than college graduates.

Employers are willing to employ and train individuals with no experience as long as the work ethic is good and the worker can pass a drug test.

Pilgrim's Pride Seeks Growers In Tishomingo County

Pilgrim's Pride is seeking individuals from Tishomingo County interested in producing poultry for the company's Russellville, Ala., processing plant.

Pilgrim's Pride purchased Gold Kist in 2006 which made the company the largest chicken company in the USA, with annual sales of \$7.4 billion, 55,000 employees and 7,300 growers.

Average net income, operating and construction costs can be obtained from Pilgrim's Pride at the contact information listed below.

The chicken grow-out houses must be a minimum of 175 feet from adjoining property lines and at least 500 feet

from the nearest residence. A minimum of 15 acres is needed and an alternate source of water required. Low weight bridges must not limit access to the site.

The science of poultry has improved dramatically over the past 20 years. Mechanization and automation have made the job of poultry growing much easier (although growers must be constantly alert for problems or potential problems).

New River Homes Achieves Milestone Production Of 30 Homes Per Week

New River Homes has achieved a milestone production of 30 manufactured homes per week.

New River Homes LLC started operations in the Burnsville Industrial Park during the first quarter of 2006 and currently employs 215 workers producing manufactured housing. The company plans to continue to ramp up production and increase employment to approximately 300 workers within the next 12 months. New River Homes is owned by Jack and Brad

Beard.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors is building an additional building adjacent to the current production facility for an expansion of New River Homes.

New River Homes is located in the Northeast Mississippi Waterfront Industrial Park with over 900 acres of industrial sites available on the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway and four-lane highway. A new access road and a barge facility were completed recently and there are

plans to build a rail spur into the industrial park. Owned by Yellow Creek Port Authority, the industrial park is located approximately half way between Memphis and Huntsville with four-lane connections to I-55, I-65 and I-22.

Contacts For Children

Perhaps you have a daughter who wears glasses and wonder if she would like to switch to contact lenses. Many girls, teenagers and younger, would probably rather wear contact lenses than glasses to improve their appearance.

This is a major change for anyone, especially for a child, and one of the most important things to consider is motivation. Because contacts require more care than glasses, your child should be highly motivated to want contacts.

Sometimes parents resist the idea because they think their child is not old enough. However, if your child is old enough to act with responsibility, she can learn the techniques involved in inserting and removing contacts. She can learn how to care for them so the lens will be kept clean and free of damage. A child who really wants to have contact lenses for her appearance's sake, will also be getting the same kind of correction that she needs in glasses.

GOING ON RECORD

Whether the legal obligation to report an automobile accident is mandatory or voluntary, it is a good idea to protect yourself by reporting any accident in which you are involved to the police. Even if you find yourself entangled in a seemingly minor fender bender, never agree to keep the incident secret by mutual agreement with the other party. Doing so leaves you open to the possibility that the other party may file a report that contends he or she suffered an injury. Without a police report documenting each party's version of events, those duped by the other party into thinking that the accident was of little consequence could find themselves with little to back up their claims.

When you are involved in an automobile accident, either as the driver, a passenger, pedestrian or bicycle rider, it is highly important to take the necessary steps to protect your rights. If you have been injured in an auto accident, you may be eligible to receive compensation. For further information, call my office to schedule a consultation. Come to experience you can trust.

HINT: Generally, a police report must be filed if an accident results in personal injury and/or property damage that exceeds a certain dollar amount.
