Mississippi. Iuka, According to industry leaders, there is a shortage of approximately 300 welders in Tishomingo County alone. With the announcement of Alabama National Rail Car in nearby Barton, Alabama, the shortage in metal trades may worsen.

Industry and job training leaders met recently at Café Memories in Iuka to discuss options. Representatives from Dynasteel Corporation, Truck Bodies and Equipment International, FerrouSouth, Monotech/PSP Industries, Northeast Mississippi Community College, Mississippi Department of Employment Security, Yellow Creek Port Authority, and Tishomingo County Development Foundation were all present. Other parties involved include Tishomingo County Vocational Technical Center, Skyline Steel, and New River Homes.

The purpose of the meeting was to begin a dialogue toward finding a solution to the worker shortage. Part of the problem is that most local citizens are not aware of the worker shortage. Another problem is that most students do not consider vocational technical trades as a profession, although workers with one and two year technical certificates may earn more than college graduates.

Employers are willing to employ and train individuals with no experience as long as the work ethic is good and the worker can pass a drug test.


