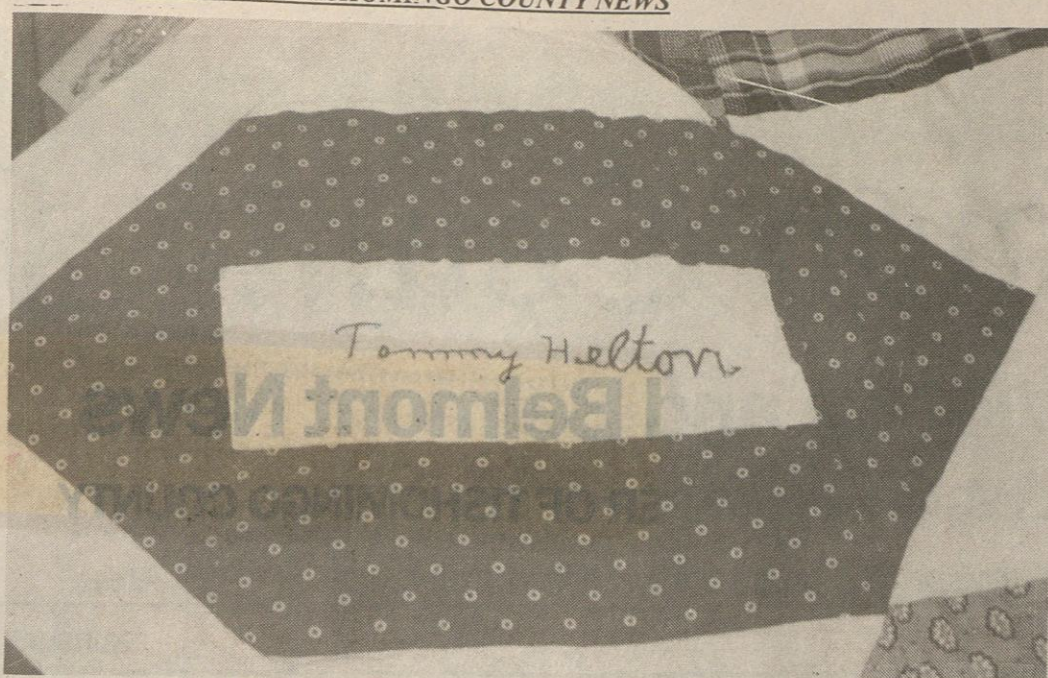

Quilt Bought To Pay Tribute To Beloved Brother

Mrs. Rhonda Helton Bullard of Corinth was the lucky bidder who took home the quilt which was auctioned off during the Heritage Festival.

The money paid by the winner of the quilt was donated to the Lela Timbes Clark Scholarship Fund. This scholarship is given each year in memory of Mrs. Clark who taught first grade at the Iuka Elementary School for many years. The scholarship is presented to a TCHS senior who plans to pursue a career in elementary education.

Mrs. Clark's daughters, Janette Clark Pike and Patsy Clark Pace, decided to auc-

tion the quilt off to raise money for the scholarship so the scholarship will go on for many years in the future.

This special quilt was made by students of Mrs. Clark's first grade in 1957-58. Each student brought a quilt piece from home with their name embroidered on it.

Mrs. Rhonda Bullard, a retired 2nd grade teacher at Burnsville Elementary spotted a very special name on the quilt and was overwhelmed with the desire to own the quilt. Her beloved brother, Tommy Helton (who was killed 19 years ago on Labor Day Weekend) had a bright red square on the quilt. The

square was no doubt embroidered by her late mother, which made the quilt just that much more special for her. Rhonda said that she, her sisters Sammie and Debra, and brother Tommy were all students of Mrs. Clark and she was proud to make this donation to the scholarship fund which will help other young people pursue that dream to be an elementary school teacher.

I got a nice letter from an old friend, Larry Holley, he has moved to Texas, but still gets the paper, and says they are not experiencing the snake shortage out there.

My attention has been brought to the danger of 25 and 30 Highway Intersection, north of Tishomingo. Many times this intersection has been mistaken for a 4-way stop. 25 Hwy is through traffic. 30 Hwy across is to stop, may I add, and stay stopped until 25 traffic is clear.

I was going north on 25 then needed to turn left West on 30, I stopped with my signal on, waiting for an oncoming truck. A van had already stopped to my right on 30, he looked at me then at the truck and just pulled across in front of the truck. The truck was going the speed limit and barely missed the van. I was scared.

Not long after that, I was on 25 headed to Iuka, at the same intersection, a pick-up already stopped on 30, pulled across going East. I swerved to miss him. Near wrecked! But finally got stopped about at the Dixie Station driveway. Again I was scared.

I truly believe this is what happened to the Michigan couple when they pulled out in front of a truck that early morning they got killed, there.

I could name a dozen more. Same intersection. And I travel this way Tishomingo and back many times a week. I help but notice the same term accident after accident.

My brother and his wife were on 25 going North (twice) the same man out in front of them. On sending my sister-in-law to the hospital. And some back, my brother-in-law going North on 25 and same thing happened to him.

My niece and a nephew were traveling on 25 and same thing happened. My niece was in Memphis for weeks because I could name a dozen or more for some reason another wrecked here. recently a life was taken at this intersection anyone has a suggestion, please let it be known. It could happen to your people, friends or neighbors as well.

Tishomingo Co. School District Promptness/Tardiness Policy

All students are required to get to school and class on time. Tardiness prevents students from achieving all that is academically possible. Parents are encouraged to make sure that their children are prompt. Tardies begin the first of August and end the last day of December, then begin the first of January and end the last day of May.

Students that check-in late or out early will be given a tardy for that particular class (by that class period teacher) if they miss 25 minutes or less of that class period (later in/early out). Students that miss more than 25 minutes of a particular class will be counted as absent for that period, but will be allowed to enter the classroom for the remainder of the class.

Students are to report to the appropriate class immediately upon checking in. Students are required to sign-in when arriving late and sign-out when leaving early - failure to do so may result in disciplinary action.

Students who are habitually tardy will be subject to the consequences outlined on the following discipline ladder:

1st TARDY - (in a particular class) - Teacher records tardy, parent/guardian notified.

2nd TARDY - Teacher records tardy, student warned, parent/guardian notified.

3rd TARDY - (5th-12th) Teacher records tardy, student warned, parent/guardian notified.

notified; (K-4th) Teacher records tardy, student warned, parent/guardian & DHS notified.

4th TARDY - (5th-12th) Student loses 2 breaks, parent/guardian notified; (K-4th) parent/guardian & DHS notified.

5th TARDY - (5th-12th) Student loses 4 breaks, parent/guardian notified, next tardy result in 1-day In-School Detention; (K-4th) Student loses 1 break, parent/guardian & DHS notified - process repeated each tardy thereafter.

6th TARDY - (5th-12th) 1-day In-School Detention, parent/guardian notified - process repeated each tardy thereafter.

Any student who is present at school but does not attend detention during break will have to make up that break in detention plus an additional break. If a student who is present at school during a break, that student will be assigned 1-day In-School Detention. If a student late for In-School Detention, he/she will not be assigned 2 In-School Detentions.

If a student is tardy due to a doctor's appointment, student must bring an excuse from the doctor the next day for the tardy to be removed.

Students who lose a break due to a tardy will make the work missed because that tardy. The work will be completed while remaining inside during the break if the student is missing.

when he was appointed to the Mississippi Supreme Court to fill the un-expired term of Chief Justice Armis Hawkins. He was elected to a full eight-year term in 1996.

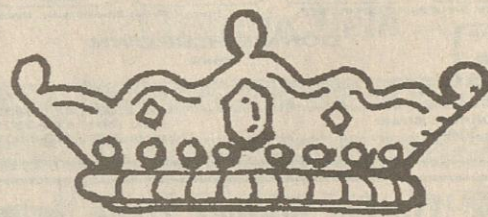

FY 2006 Tourism Impact Report Released

The Mississippi Development Authority has released the *Fiscal Year 2006 Tourism Impact Report*. The tourism impact report is the definitive statistical report on the economic impact of tourism on the State of Mississippi.

The report found that tourism is the sixth largest employer in the state with a direct annual payroll of \$1.4 billion. Statewide tourism expenditures were \$5.2 billion with \$377.5 million collected in tourism sales taxes. Total number of visitors to Mississippi in 2006 is 20.8 million.

The report found that for every \$1 spent in tourism advertising, there was a \$10 return on investment.

Visitors to Tishomingo County spent \$7,900,003 in 2005 and \$9,435,824 in 2006, an increase of over \$1.5 million in one year. Direct tourism employment in Tishomingo County in 2006

is 160. Tourism-related sales taxes rebated to municipalities in Tishomingo County were \$84,444 in 2005 and \$99,260 in 2006, according to the Mississippi Development Authority report.

Visitors to J. P. Coleman State Park increased from 42,860 in 2005 to 78,192 in 2006, an increase of 82.4%, the largest increase for any state park in Mississippi. Visitors to Tishomingo State Park increased from 105,028 in 2005 to 112,592 in 2006, an increase of 7.2%. Visitation to Mississippi State Parks decreased by 23.3% between 2005 and 2006, so 18 of the 24 state parks suffered a decline in visitors.

Congratulations to J. P. Coleman State Park and Tishomingo State Park management and staff for outstanding visitor numbers, and to the Tishomingo County Tourism Council for a record increase in visitors to Tishomingo County.
