Most of the Test-Demonstration farm families in the Tennessee Valley area are constantly looking for new ways to improve their farming operation. This is certainly true of the W.E. Cox, UTD farm family of the Midway community.

In hopes of increasing their net farm income, Mr. and Mrs. Cox planted 1 1/2 acres of cucumbers and 5 acres of pimiento peppers in 1968. This was the second year for them to plant the cucumbers but the first year for the peppers.

Looking first at the cucumbers, the total receipts from the sale of cucumbers on the 1 1/2 acres was \$1,325 the expenses for seed, fertilizer, and insecticides were \$85 for the 1 1/2 acres. Using research data, machinery and

equipment cost for preparing, planting, and cultivating the land would be about \$5 per acre or \$7.5 for the 1 1/2 acres.

Net returns to land, labor and management would, therefore, be \$1,232 or \$821 per acre. The cucumbers were fertilized at the rate of 400 lbs. of 15-15-15 per acre plus 270 lbs. of 30-0-05S per acre.

On the 5 acres of peppers, total sales were \$2,750. The expenses for plants, fertilizer, and herbicide was \$325 for the 5 acres.

In a special promotion, the Iuka Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with the Extension Service, an appeal is made for Tishomingo County farmers to plant more pimiento peppers and cucumbers as a cash crop.

Asking the question: "What are you going to do with your diverted acres?" They answer with "You can plant your diverted acres in peppers and cucumbers for a good cash crop for 1969."

Citing instances where such cases as Luther Chase of Holcut produced 7 tons of peppers for a cash income of \$765.00; Booster South gathered \$718.00 from one acre of cucumbers, and the W.E. Cox family gathered \$2,800.00 from 25 1/2 acres of pimientos on five acres in the Midway Community

Grower contracts for pimientos can be signed at the County Agent's office in Iuka. During harvest time, checks will be issued each time cucumbers are delivered to the grading station at the Tishomingo County Fair Grounds.

### Letter To The Editor...



# **Tishomingo Co. School Distric Promptness/Tardiness Policy**

Mississippi Development Authority has released the Fiscal Year 2006 Tourism Impact Report. The tourism impact report is the definitive statistical report on the economic impact of tourism on the State of Mississippi.

The report found that tourism is the sixth largest employer in the state with a direct annual payroll of \$1.4 Statewide tourism billion. were \$5.2 expenditures billion with \$377.5 million collected in tourism sales taxes. Total number of visitors to Mississippi in 2006 is 20.8 million.

The report found that for every \$1 spent in tourism advertising, there was a \$10 return on investment.

Visitors in Tishomingo County spent \$7,900,003 in 2005 and \$9,435,824 in 2006, an increase of over \$1.5 million in one year. Direct tourism employment in Tishomingo County in 2006
