## Roll Form Group Grand Opening October 10th

One of the newest industries in Tishomingo County will have its grand opening celebration October 10th at the Yellow Creek Port.

Roll Form Group (U.S.), Incorporated has been in limited operation for the past few months, and will welcome Governor Haley Barbour and other industry and development officials from two nations to officially open the \$23 million facility in the north part of the county.

"We are very pleased to welcome Roll Form Group to Tishomingo County," said Board of Supervisors President Arlie South. "This has been a true team effort to bring this fine company to Mississippi. Leaders at all levels pitched in to make this possible and we are very thankful for all their efforts."

The new Iuka facility is the Roll Form Group's fifth manufacturing facility and is their first outside of Canada. The

140,000-square-foot facility on 22 acres at the Yellow Creek Port industrial park will support 80-100 jobs by next year. Already approximately 40 employees have been producing rail car components, some of which have gone all the way to Mexico.

Included at the newly completed facility is a heavy cold roll forming mill and a new state-of-the-art very wide roll forming line. The company has invested approximately \$22 million in the facility to produce ready-to-use, high quality custom formed components to better service customers in the transportation, construction and marine industries in the United States and Mexico.

"It is a remarkable process," said Gary Matthews, Tishomingo County Development Foundation Executive Director. In layman's terms, Roll Form will form and fabricate huge steel items like the centerpieces of rail cars, and sheet piling like the kind used in coffer dams, retaining walls, docks and bulkheads.

The multi-modal (road, rail, and water) transport abilities of the Yellow Creek Port facility were one of the deciding factors in Roll Form Group locating there, along with the presence of FerrouSouth in the same park.

"An anchor tenant at the Port, FerrouSouth processes steel for companies like Roll Form Group," said Eugene Bishop, executive director at the Port. The location is critical for its river access, since the items are usually too large to ship economically by road. The Port has become a metal work cluster with Dynasteel, Monotech, FerrouSouth, Skyline Steel, and now Roll Form Group.

### New Car Tags at Courthouse

Beginning October 1st, a new tag design will be issued for all new purchases and renewals of regular motor vehicle license plates. As required by law, the design of the tag changes every five years.

The new design for the Mississippi license plate - the Biloxi Lighthouse standing in the light of a new day - recognizes a building of historical importance, and a significant time in our state's history.

The Biloxi lighthouse has long been recognized as a landmark of the Mississippi Gulf Coast, a sentinel erected in 1848 to aid ships navigating the Mississippi Sound. Throughout its 159 years, it survived a score of hurricanes, including the great storms of 1947 and 1969.

And, on August 29, 2005 it stood defiant against the wind and surge of Katrina. Today, it is no longer just a beacon to seafarers, but a tangible testament of resilience.

Joe Blount, Commissioner of Revenue, said this tag design is intended to be a reminder to us of all those who lost so much from Katrina, to serve as a symbol of our citizens' commitment to recovery as well as a symbol of our gratitude to all Americans for their prayers and generous support.

### ATTENTION: Citizens Of Tishomingo County From The Sheriff's Department

Lately we have received reports throughout the county of vehicles that have been vandalized costing the owners time and money. Reports state that the victims approached their vehicle and nothing appears to be wrong with the vehicles until the engine is started. The engine is extremely loud as if there is no muffler. Upon inspection of the vehicle by a mechanic it is found that the catalytic converter has been unbolted from the exhaust or has been sawed off. This has been going on for some time in urban areas and has just now reached the residents of Tishomingo County.

The stolen catalytic converters are worth up to \$120.00 a piece at recycling stations and can even be resold at used auto parts outlets. Other law enforcement agencies have reported that used catalytic converters have been found in raids of crystal meth labs. The converters are allegedly used to

filter toxins from the deadly drug. The vehicles that are usually targeted for this type of theft are those vehicles that are rarely driven. This way when the thief steals the converters it may be days or weeks before it is reported and by then the converter is long gone. We suggest that if you have a vehicle that is rarely driven to move it periodically every few days. Perhaps park it in different spots throughout the week. If the vehicle is not in running condition you may want to put skids or pallets underneath the vehicle in order to reduce the room needed to remove the converter.

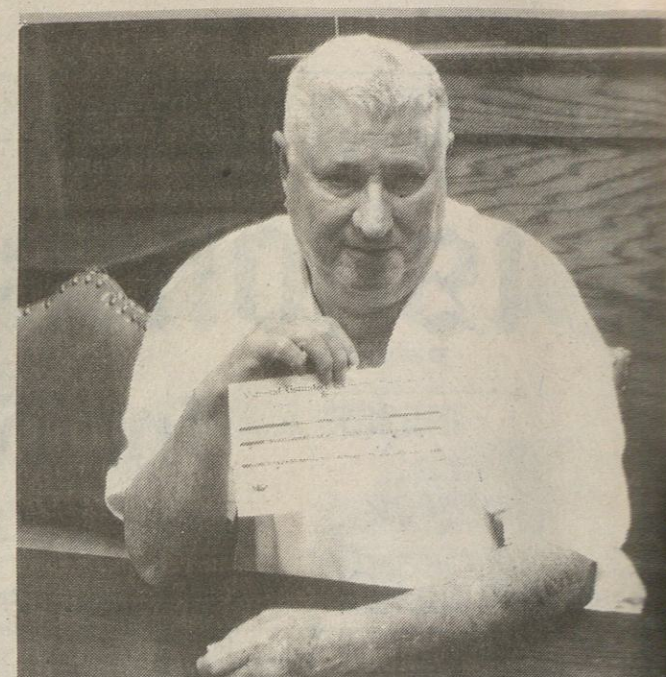

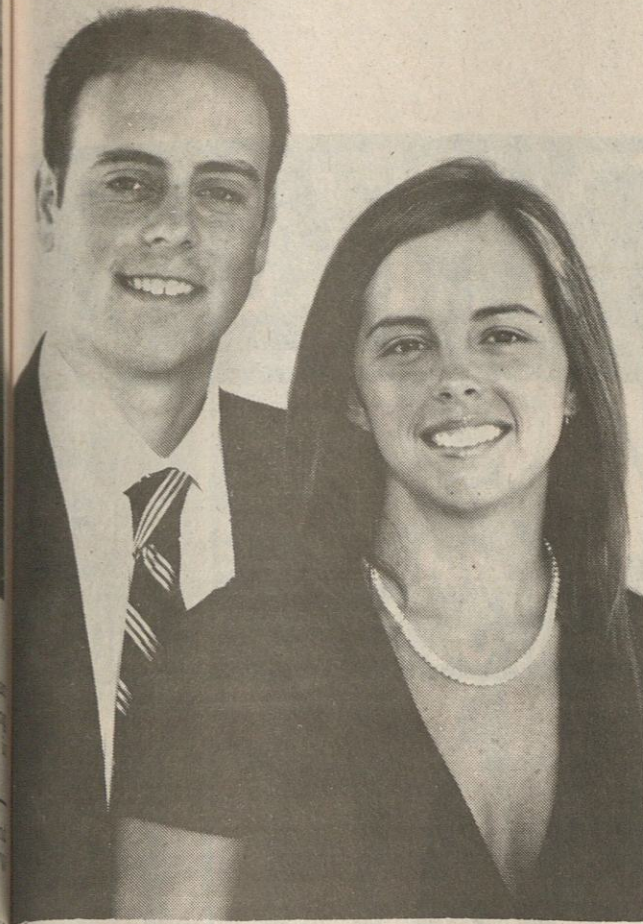

### Class of 1998 to be Honored at TCHS Homecoming 2007

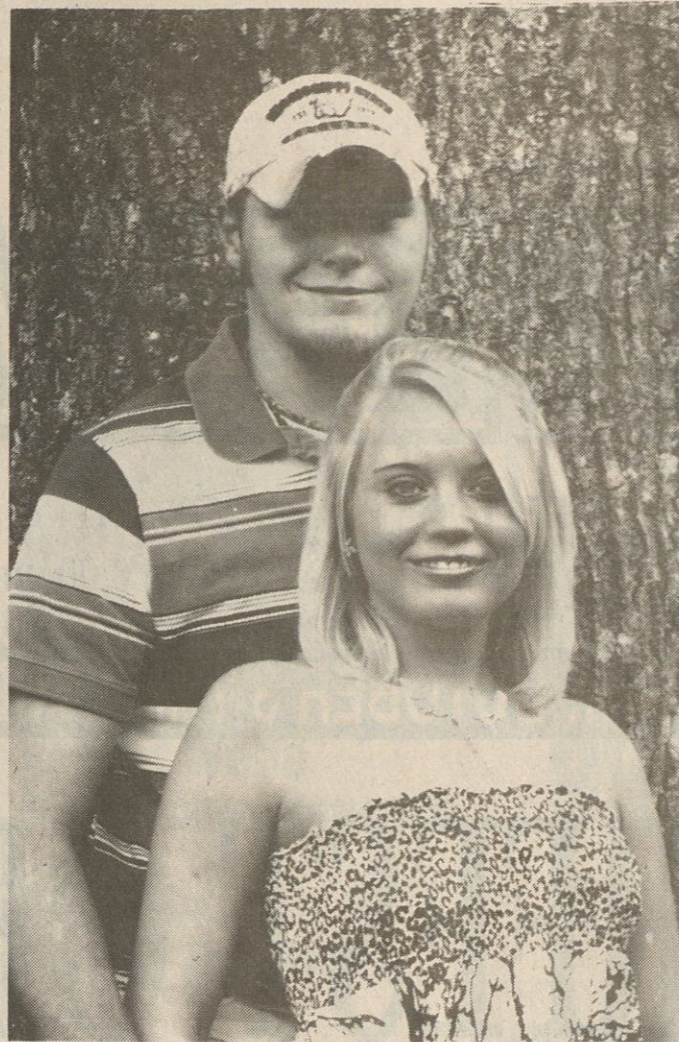
The students, faculty and staff of TCHS will begin a new tradition this year by honoring alumni from ten years ago at this year's homecoming.
