## Roll Form - Newest Steel Processor Holds Grand Opening at Yellow Creek Port

The newest component in the growing northeast Mississippi steel industry celebrated its grand opening October 10th at Yellow Creek Port.

Roll Form Group (U.S.), a division of Samuel Manu-Tech, Incorporated of Canada officially opened its 140,000-square-foot facility at the northern Tishomingo county industrial park and port with significant fanfare, a speech from the governor, and a tour of their new facility for all of the 175-180 guests and media who attended.

Governor Haley Barbour, who said he views himself as the chief economic development officer of the state, praised Roll Form's choice of northeast Mississippi for its first manufacturing facility outside Canada.

"You will like the synergies of working with FerrouSouth, Dynasteel and Skyline," he told Roll Form executives, referring to the several steel processing companies who have already established a lucrative presence at the Port.

"And you will like working with Mississippi people, from the manufacturing employees to your future clients. [Years ago] I would never have thought that more than 72,000 Mississippians would be earning a living in the metal trades," said Barbour. "Steel is an increasingly large industry in this state, and it is the key to Mississippi's entry into the auto manufacturing zone."

Barbour particularly praised the \$22 million investment Roll Form and its parent companies have made in the YC Port facility. State agencies provided \$2.2 million toward the development.

"This is a good deal," said Barbour. "Ten percent from the state and the company puts up the rest - and you don't get a beef plant."

Roll Form will employ 80 to 100 persons by next year, and already 40 employees are on payroll, and the facility has been producing rail car components. All but plant manager Rick McDonald, who moved here from Canada, are local people, from about a 50-mile radius around the Port, company officials confirmed.

As the steel moves through Mill 8 at Roll Form, a large band saw cuts the center sill piece at a computer programmed point.

Eventually, the plant will produce barge components, sheet piling like the kind used in dams and bulkheads, and side sheets for hopper railroad cars.

Roll Form does this with a cold roll forming mill process, in which a sheet of metal that has been rolled on a (usually 30-ton) coil is flattened, and then bent and shaped down a long line of machines until it is the desired shape.

Visitors to the grand opening were treated to a demonstration of the process that resulted in a center sill for a rail car. The whole procedure took just a few minutes with manufacturing engineers operating the computers that

controlled the mill.

The plant was built by Jesco, and Chairman and

CEO Mark Samuel praised it as one of the company's most beautiful facilities.

## Another Truck Wreck on Hwy 25 Injures Driver; Ties Up Traffic Near Cripple Deer

Around noon on Monday, a dump truck full of gravel overturned just south of Cripple Deer Creek bridge, tying

up traffic and injuring the driver of the dump truck.

According to statements at the scene, David Edwards, a driver for Bobby Riley Truck-

ing of Iuka, was apparently trying to avoid hitting a vehicle that was stopping in front of him and lost control of the International dump truck

In a statement made at the scene, Warren Setzer, of 1693 Hwy 25, was driving southbound on Hwy 25 and was stopping to turn into his driveway, and noticed that the truck behind him was not going to be able to stop. Setzer stated that another vehicle coming in the northbound lane would prevent the truck behind him from passing, so he sped up, but the truck lost control and overturned in front of his house on the west side of the highway.

Edwards was injured and taken by ambulance from the scene. He was later transferred to Tupelo, according to a statement from his employer.

An officer of the Mississippi Highway patrol was on the scene, but could not be reached for comment.

Representatives of the Midway Fire Department were on the scene to control traffic until the accident scene was cleared.

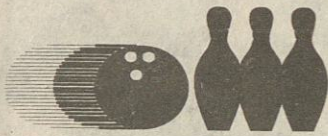

### Eyes Reveal Diabetes

Abnormalities in the eye, often provide the first hint of disease in some other part of the body. The patient may not be aware of any symptoms because the disease is in its early stages.

For example, diabetes damages the circulation by causing degeneration of the lining and walls of the blood vessels. The microscopic capillaries are usually the first to be attacked, then the minute arteries and veins. Diabetes may affect the eyes by causing a temporary blurring of vision or a sudden need for a major change in prescription for glasses or contact lenses. This is caused by more sugar in the blood and ocular fluid, changing the focus of the eye. Early cataract may also be a sign of diabetes and so may an inflammation of the iris.

Whenever your eye doctor notes an abnormality of the eye that may be related to diabetes or any other disease, you will be referred to a physician, or your family doctor for treatment.

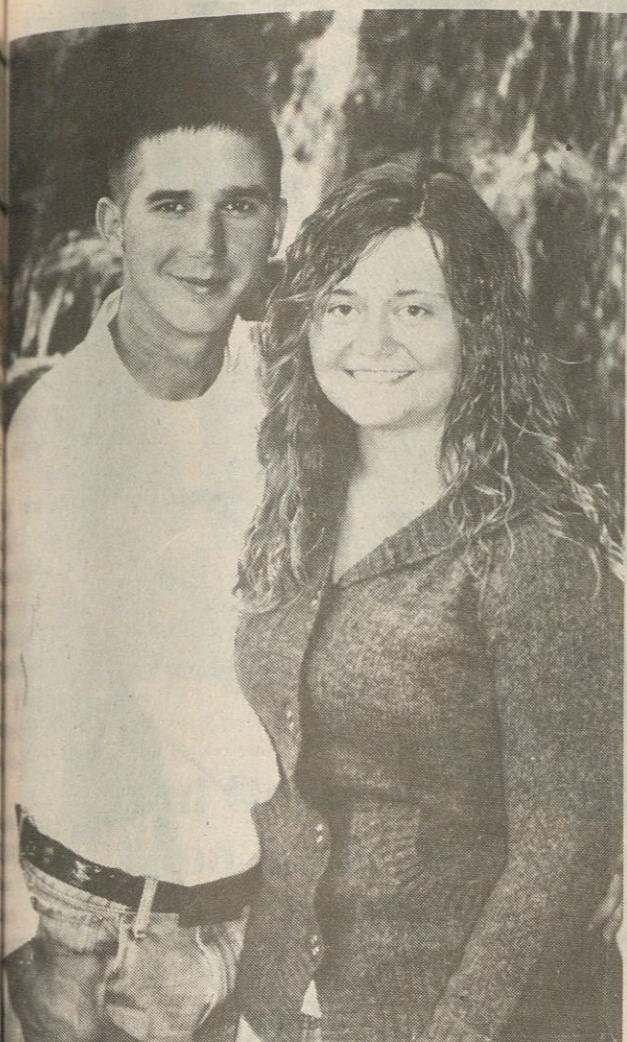

### Belmont and Iuka Police Departments Hold School Crisis Training Sessions

The Belmont and Iuka Police Departments held joint training sessions for responding to school crisis situations at Belmont School on Tuesday, October 9th. Conducting the training was Rick Hinds, Ralph Dance, and Pete Smith.

Officer Hinds is currently the Director of Training for the Corinth, MS Police Department and is a State Certified Instructor for three Law Enforcement Academies in Mississippi. Officers Dance and Smith are members of the Belmont Police Department's Special Response Team.

Local officers were informed of the best practices and tactics to use in response to a school crisis. The officers reviewed emergency response plans, responsibilities, and the logistics of dealing with such a situation, should one occur, at a local school. The officers are allowed to practice techniques designed for search and rescue in a school setting.

Police Chief Donald also organized the meeting to provide both city depart-

ments with some realistic training for responding efficiently and appropriately should the need arise. "I hope we never have to respond to a school crisis, but we wanted to be as prepared as possible if we ever do" stated Chief Reno. "This was good training for our officers and a starting point for getting our safety and response plan fine tuned and coordinated with the school district. We hope to have more practice along these lines in the future so that our community will know we have a plan, we've practiced that plan, and we are doing everything we know to do to manage the situation. Coordinating all the various agencies and departments is difficult at best, and nothing can simulate the chaos and emotions that would accompany a school crisis. Chief Randy Stringer and I wanted to impress on our officers the need to be prepared and I think we did that."

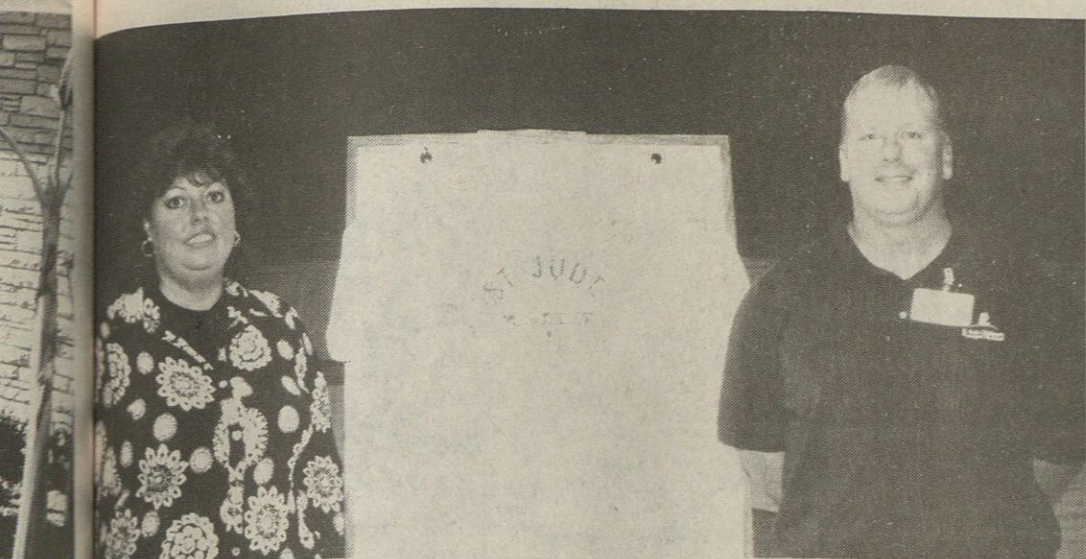
