## Meth Lab Exposed After Burnsville Traffic Stop Saturday Night

A meth lab in the county was exposed and two men are in custody on drug charges after what began as a routine traffic stop Saturday night in Burnsville.

According to Burnsville Chief of Police Mike Shipman, a gray Honda driven by Jeffery Jones, 33, of Tremont, Mississippi was stopped on U.S. Highway 72 for a malfunctioning headlight by Burnsville deputy Eric Harris at 9:14 p.m., October 20th.

A warrant check led Deputy Harris and Deputy Brandon Lambert to request a search of the vehicle, and the Tishomingo County Sheriff Department K9 Unit and Deputy Eric Bowman were

called to the scene.

Found in the vehicle were Energizer lithium batteries, a small amount of marijuana, and several items of drug paraphernalia, said Chief Shipman. All five passengers were taken to the sheriff's department for questioning and county narcotics investigator Jason Williamson was called in. The investigation led to the search of a residence in the county where a meth lab was located.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department would not release the location of the suspected meth lab, due to the ongoing investigation.

Jones was charged with improper equipment, no proof of insurance, a seatbelt viola-

tion, possession of paraphernalia and possession of (an undisclosed amount) marijuana.

Also, Shawn Rippie, 36, of Tishomingo, was charged with manufacture of crystal meth, and conspiracy to manufacture crystal meth, and also possession of paraphernalia. As of Tuesday, both suspects were still in custody at the county jail.

Other charges are pending the ongoing investigation of narcotics investigator Williamson. The 1986 Honda was seized by the Burnsville Police Department.

Three others were released after questioning.

# Holcut Celebrates 100th Birthday!

On Saturday, September 8th the 100th Birthday of Holcut was celebrated. Around 200 people gathered at the Holcut Memorial Park to share memories and reminisce about the wonderful town of Holcut. Holcut was a little town that came into existence in 1907 when the J.C. Rorie Road was built. Holcut had a school comprised of students

from surrounding areas. This school was closed in 1960 when students started going to nearby towns to attend school. The post office then closed, which helped end an era of closeness for this small town. When the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway came through, people were forced to sell their homes and move. There was no bridge crossing the canal at Holcut, which left the highway ending on both sides of the water. Holcut was gone.

The town of Holcut was named for the Eli Callicutt and John Holder families. Members of the Holder family were in attendance to celebrate this historic occasion. Many people told their family histories and stories of life at Holcut. People came from as far as Illinois to join in the festivities. Jan Anglin from the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum was on hand to record the stories and the history that was shared. Berlon

### Which Tint Color?

If bright light bothers your eyes or if you like the appearance of tinted glasses, you have a wide range of tints to select from. The shade you select is a matter of personal preference. However, for example, some experts recommend beige, brown, gray lenses for someone with a ruddy complexion.

For someone with dark skin, a rich brown burgundy might be more flattering than pastels. For blondes, some experts recommend a sunny yellow. Light complexioned people with gray hair, however, might want to consider a light blue lens. If eye comfort is a primary motive, pink, rose, flesh-colored lenses are recommended for those who work under harsh, glaring indoor light. ### Resurfacing of Highway 30 to Begin This Fall

Bonds Company will soon begin resurfacing Highway 30 between Tishomingo and Booneville.

The Mississippi Department of Transportation has let the contract to Bonds Company, of Burnsville, and they are free to begin when they are ready, said Barry Boyd, of the District Construction Division of MDOT in Tupelo.

The job consists of two lifts, or layers, of asphalt along the stretch of Highway 30 between the Tishomingo and Booneville, except for a small section where the new bypass near Booneville will come in, said Boyd.

Adam Wyers, spokesman for Bonds, said they would start in the next two weeks.

The job includes two phases, said Wyers.

"We will do one lift before winter, then in the spring do another," explained Wyers. "We could do both at the

same time in the spring, but the road is so rutted that we feel it will be of benefit to everyone to get a lift on the entire road before winter."

Traffic will be minimally impacted, said Boyd.

"We anticipate some delays, but not significant ones," Boyd said.

The job is funded by state highway funds.

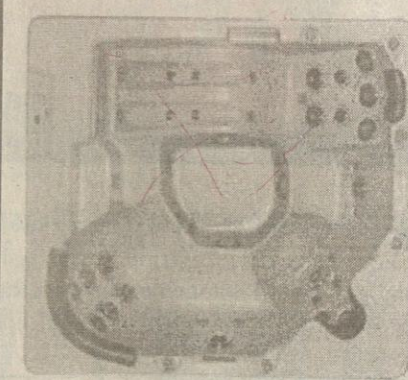

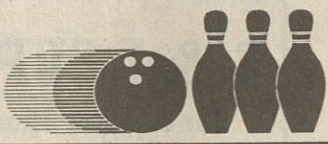

After graduating from radio school and passing my FCC General Radio License Test (after five times) I finally had the license. Finally, a job came open in Chicago, so I got the job. First thing I had to do was go back to school to learn about the aircraft radio gear. VHF, ADF, VOR, RADAR, etc. Not having any money, I lived in a

Volkswagen bus in the O'Hare Airport parking lot. The first McDonald's Restaurant was on the corner of Higgins and Mannheim Road. They had a big wooden arch out front. Guess they hadn't invented plastic yet!

Anyway, hamburgers were 3 for a dollar, so for one dollar I had three meals, breakfast, dinner and supper.

It was summer in Chicago and starting to get warm. I had a small electric fan in the bus but no power! So I got the idea to tap into the power of the light pole I was parked by. I took the little cover off of the base of the lamp pole which exposed the wires. I thought now if I could tap into those wires I could run two jumper wires and have a plug in. MAJOR MISTAKE!!! After

running one jumper wire to a plug, I reached in to strip another wire. There was the most brilliant flash I had ever seen which temporarily blinded me! After my sight returned, I discovered my right glove was on fire! I bet every light in the airport blinked! Never did find the wire strippers. They are probably part of the space junk that NASA is tracking! After a few months, I was able to bid back to Detroit. After 42 years, I retired.

I guess what this tongue in cheek letter is trying to say is after luck, perseverance but most of all the Lord's blessings I am able to be retired, pay my bills and have a little left. So many of our local old people and widows are not that blessed. Many have farmed or worked in the

little local factories and struggling because they have little or no retirement benefits.

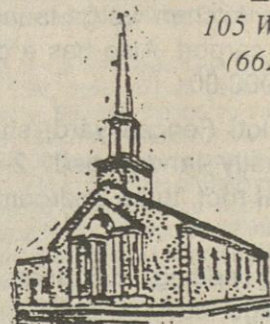

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## October Is Head Start Awareness Month

What is Head Start?

Head Start is a federally funded comprehensive child development program primarily for low-income children and families.

Signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson in the summer of 1965 as a demonstration project, Head Start has amazed this nation and dramatized its short and long-term effects by REACHING FAMILIES, TOUCHING CHILDREN, and INVOLVING COMMUNITIES.

Children enrolled in head Start receive a variety of services.

- Dental and Health screenings as well as Speech and Hearing Screenings. Follow up is conducted if necessary.

- Mental Health observations are conducted for possible behavioral problems and Teachers are given guidance as needed.

- Two meals and a snack are provided each day according to USDA guidelines.

- Educational Assessments are performed on each child twice each school year. Progress reports are sent home to parents with the results of the assessment.

- Two home visits are conducted per year and parent conferences as needed.

- One big field trip per year is sponsored by MAP and if parents wish to sponsor other trips, that is acceptable.

- One (1) birthday cake is made each month for the classrooms celebrating

birthdays of all children for the month.

Tishomingo County has four (4) Head Start sites: Belmont serves 75 children, Burnsville serves 54 children, Iuka serves 55 children and Tishomingo Blended Services serves 20 children.

Parent Participation is strongly encouraged. We want you to feel welcome in our center at any time and we want you to feel confident in leaving your child(ren) with us. Parent meetings are conducted monthly with the date and time selected by the parent group at the time of Reorganization when we also elect officers and sub-committee members.

Parents and Community Persons are elected to serve on the County Council which is comprised of all the Head Start Centers in the county.

Parents and Community Persons are also elected to serve on the Policy Council and State Board which meets monthly in Jackson, MS to work closely with Dr. Brown and other staff.

To be eligible for Head Start services families must meet certain criteria:

1. A child must be 3 or 4 years old before September 1st of the school year. (At Burnsville and Tishomingo the cut-off for 3 year olds is March 1st because we do not have a 3 year old classroom and State regulations require the child to be 3 1/2 to be in the classroom with 4 year

olds).

2. The family must meet income guidelines (exceptions are made if the child has a disability or the family has special circumstances).

3. The child must have a certified birth certificate, a 121 (shot record), social security card, and insurance card (if applicable).

Head Start registration is ongoing, so you may register your child at any time, however our official recruitment for children for the 2008-2009 school year will begin in January, 2008. If you have a child who will be eligible for next year and do not have all your documentation, begin now to get it together so we can complete the registration process and your child will have a slot.

Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing a free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

Please contact Debbie Walker, Child Find Contact Person for the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District, if you know any children who may have a disability by calling 423-3206 or writing her at the following address:

Tishomingo County Schools, 1620 Paul Edmondson Drive, Iuka, MS 38852.

The Child Find Person implements child identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find Person works with the local Head Starts, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact Person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly described the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents and

insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a non-discriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to attend the Eligibility Determination Conference by the Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/or related services, an Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

We now have twenty-seven special education classes in our district which provide services to students who have a physical, mental, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.

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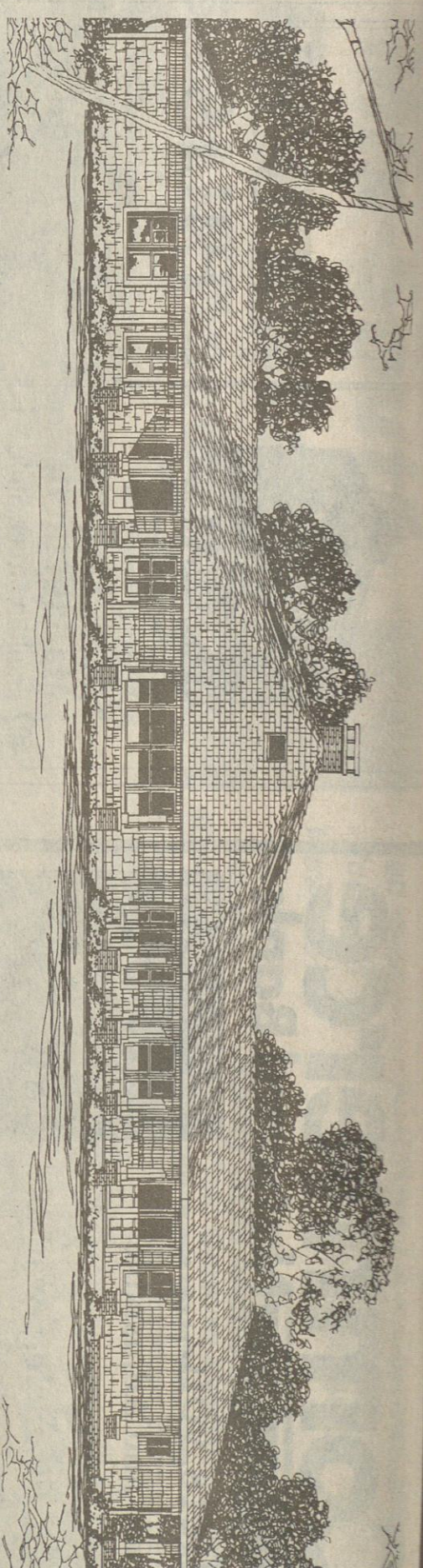
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## Contemporary Oceanview has a unique facade and floorplan

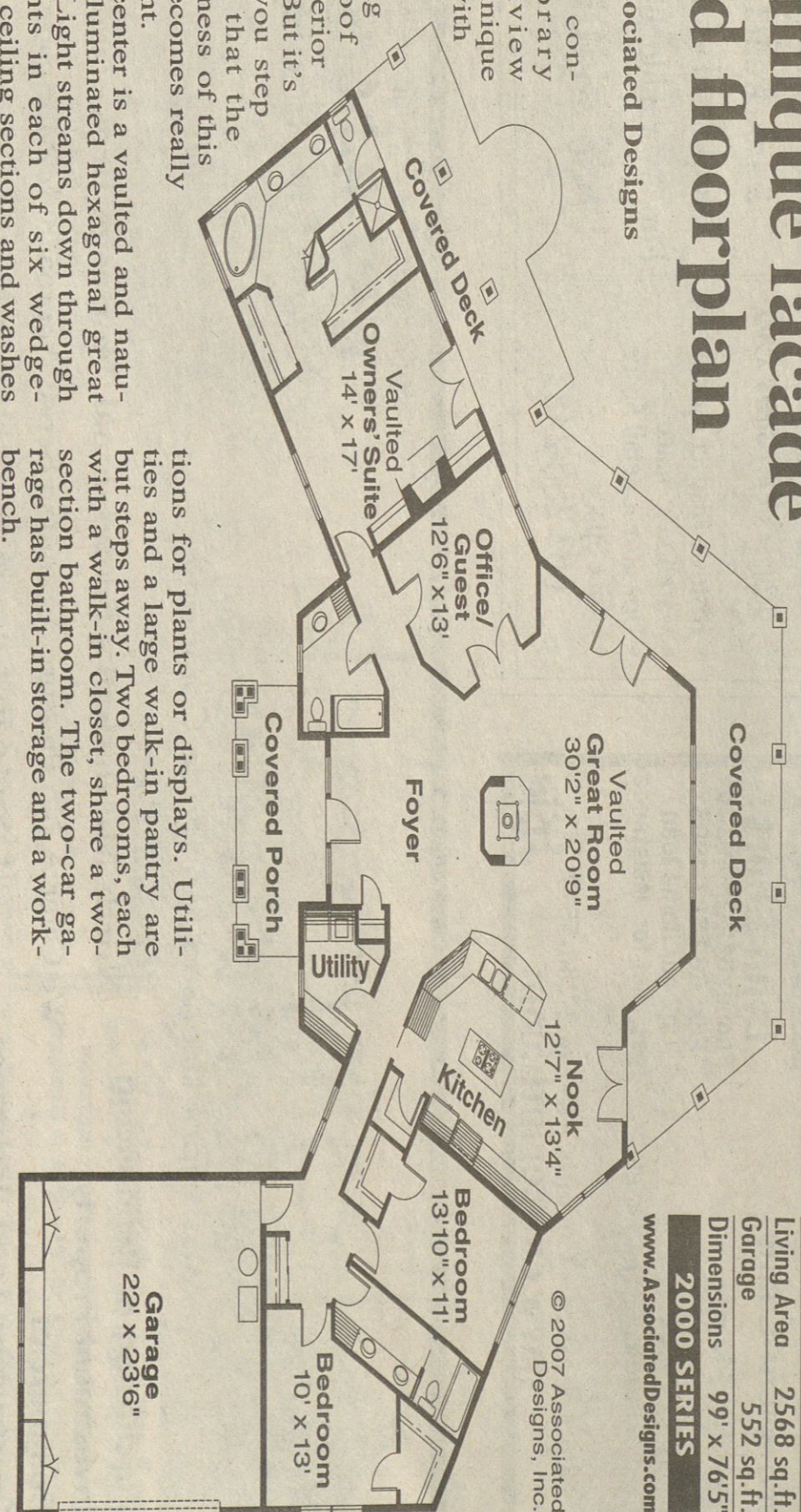

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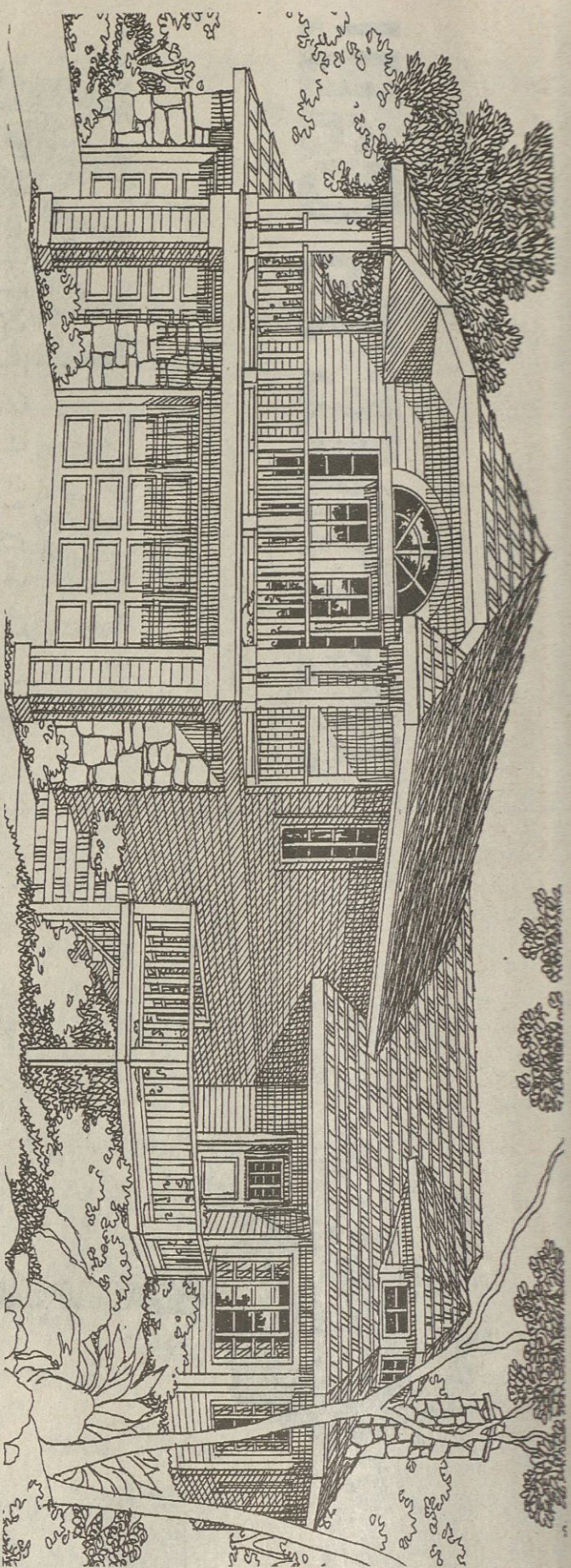
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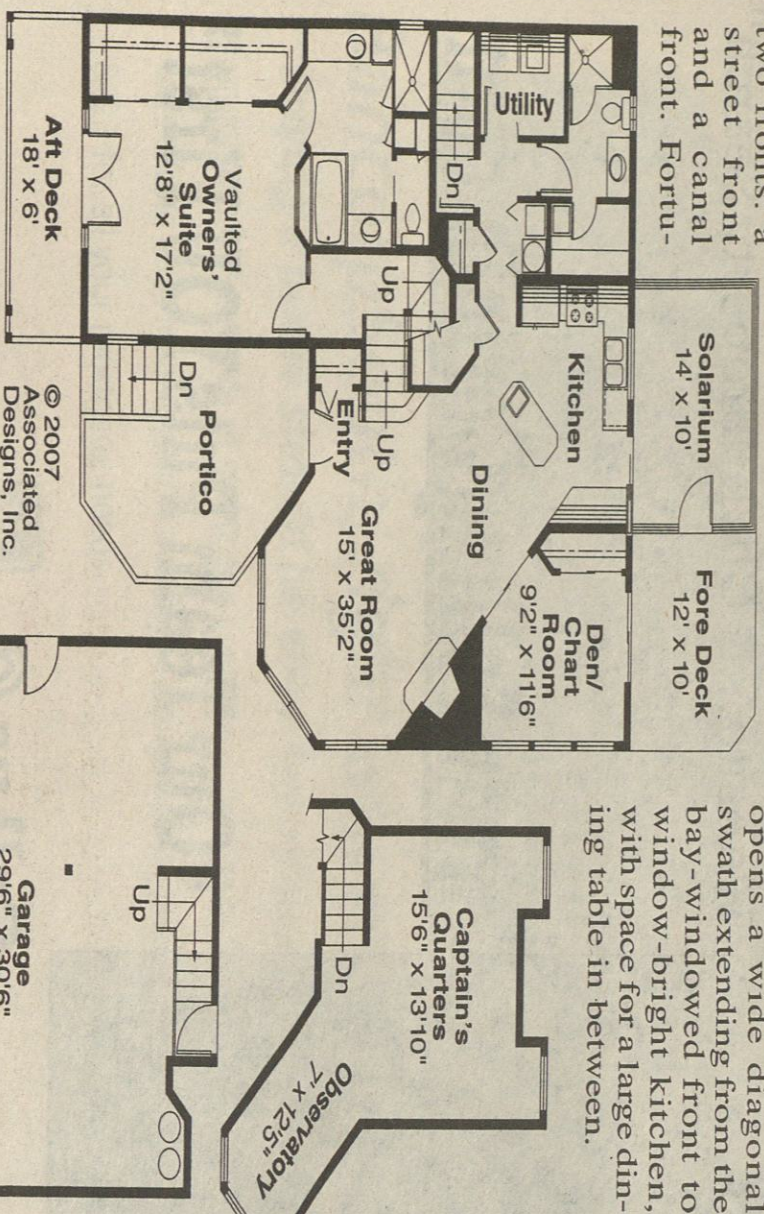
## Covington has views on two sides

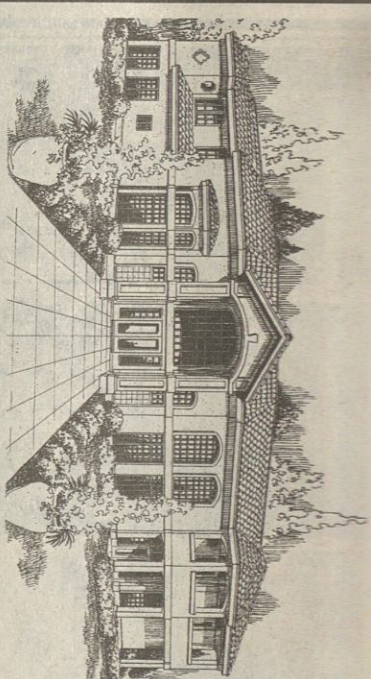

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To the right is another naturally bright space called the chart room. If you don't need a whole room for maps, it can be furnished in countless other ways. Sunlight spills in through windows on two sides, as well as a set of skylights. Wide sliders provide direct access to the fore deck. The kitchen includes a step-in pantry, work island with veggie sink, and built-in desk with shelves above. Gridded windows fill all of the gently arched openings in the Veracruz, giving this sun-bright stucco home a breezy Southwest or Mediterranean-style ambience. Dramatic stucco columns soar two stories high to support and highlight the grand entry portico, while vibrant tile roofing crowns the entire structure.

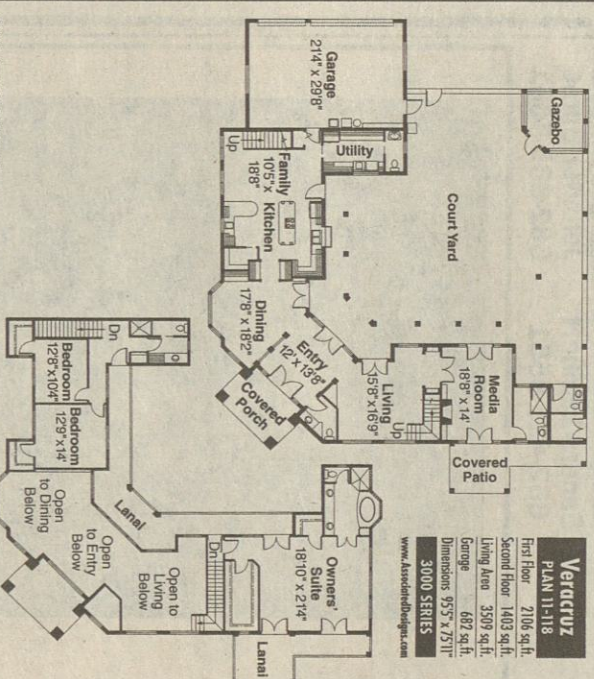
The interior is every bit as breathtaking. Double doors open into a two-story foyer awash in natural light from the sidelights and transom. Arched openings offer access to the formal rooms: living room on the right, dining room on the left. Then, surprisingly, the double doors straight ahead lead back out into an open courtyard. The arched-opening colonnade that runs along two sides of the inner courtyard provides direct access to most of the ground floor rooms.

Informal gathering spaces are on the left, reachable via the butler's pantry inside, or the passageway from the outside. Decorative columns anchor the four corners of the kitchen's long work island. An eating bar runs along one side, while another flush eating bar firms the peninsular counter near the ovens, prep sink, and roomy pantry. The double sink boasts a pass-through garden window with a courtyard view.

The kitchen is entirely open to the family room, and just a few steps from a generously sized utility room with a powder room at the far end. Past, or through, the Veracruz's living room, on the right side of the entry, is a spacious media room with a gas fireplace, adjoining bathroom, and covered patio.

Bedrooms are upstairs, joined by a lanai that overlooks the courtyard. The luxurious owners' suite has a huge walk-in closet, and a smaller adjacent one. Secondary bedrooms and a bath are on the far side of the opposite wing, which has another set of stairs.

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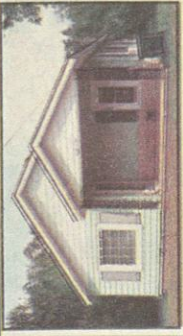


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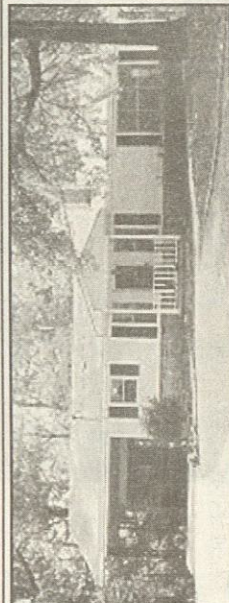
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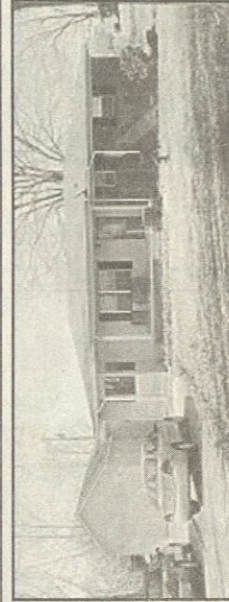
