Meth Lab Exposed After Burnsville Traffic Stop Saturday Night

by Pamela McRae

A meth lab in the county was exposed and two men are in custody on drug charges after what began as a routine traffic stop Saturday night in Burnsville.

According to Burnsville Chief of Police Mike Shipman, a gray Honda driven by Jeffery Jones, 33, of Tremont, Mississippi was stopped on U.S. Highway 72 for a malfunctioning headlight by Burnsville deputy Eric Harris at 9:14 p.m., October 20th.

A warrant check led Deputy Harris and Deputy Brandon Lambert to request a search of the vehicle, and the Tishomingo County Sheriff Department K9 Unit and Deputy Eric Bowman were

called to the scene.

Found in the vehicle were Energizer lithium batteries, a small amount of marijuana, and several items of drug paraphernalia, said Chief Shipman. All five passengers were taken to the sheriff's department for questioning and county narcotics investigator Jason Williamson was called in. The investigation led to the search of a residence in the county where a meth lab was located.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department would not release the location of the suspected meth lab, due to the ongoing investigation.

Jones was charged with improper equipment, no proof of insurance, a seatbelt viola-

tion, possession of paraphernalia and possession of (an undisclosed amount) mari-

Also, Shawn Rippie, 36, of Tishomingo, was charged with manufacture of crystal meth, and conspiracy to manufacture crystal meth, and also possession of paraphernalia. As of Tuesday, both suspects were still in custody at the county jail.

Other charges are pending the ongoing investigation of narcotics investigator Williamson. The 1986 Honda was seized by the Burnsville Police Department.

Three others were released after questioning.

Anyway, hamburgers were 3 for a dollar, so for one dollar I had three meals, breakfast, dinner and supper.

It was summer in Chicago and starting to get warm. I had a small electric fan in the bus but no power! So I got the idea to tap into the power of the light pole I was parked by. I took the little cover off of the base of the lamp pole which exposed the wires. I thought now if I could tap into those wires I could run two jumper wires and have a plug in. MAJOR MISTAKE!!! After

running one jumper wire to a plug, I reached in to strip another wire. There was the most brilliant flash I had ever seen which temporarily blinded me! After my sight returned, I discovered my right glove was on fire! I bet every light in the airport blinked! Never did find the wire strippers. What is Head Start?

Head Start is a federally funded comprehensive child development program primarily for low-income children and families.

Signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson in the summer of 1965 as a demonstration project, Head Start has amazed this nation and dramatized its short and long-term effects REACHING FAMILIES, TOUCHING CHILDREN, INVOLVING **COMMUNITIES**

Children enrolled in head Start receive a variety of

• Dental and Health screenings as well as Speech and Hearing screenings. Follow up is conducted if necessary.

• Mental Health observations are conduced for possible behavioral problems and Teachers are given guidance as needed.

• Two meals and a snack are provided each day according to USDA guidelines.

• Educational Assessments are performed on each child twice each school year. Progress reports are sent home to parents with the results of the assessment.

• Two home visits are conducted per year and parent conferences as needed.

• One big field trip per year is sponsored by MAP and if parents wish to sponsor other trips, that is acceptable.

• One (1) birthday cake is made each month for the classrooms celebrating birthdays of all children for the month.

Tishomingo County has four (4) Head Start sites: Belmont serves 75 children, Burnsville serves 54 children, Iuka serves 55 children and Tishomingo Blended Services serves 20 children.

Parent Participation is strongly encouraged. We want you to feel welcome in our center at any time and we want you to feel confident in leaving your child(ren) with us. Parent meetings are conducted monthly with the date and time selected by the parent group at the time of Reorganization when we also elect officers and subcommittee members.

Parents and Community Persons are elected to serve on the County Council which is comprised of all the Head Start Centers in the county.

Parents and Community Persons are also elected to serve on the Policy Council and State Board which meets monthly in Jackson, MS to work closely with Dr. Brown and other staff.

To be eligible for Head Start services families must meet certain criteria:

1. A child must be 3 or 4 years old before September 1st of the school year. (At Burnsville and Tishomingo the cut-off for 3 year olds is March 1st because we do not have a 3 year old classroom and State regulations require the child to be 3 1/2 to be in the classroom with 4 year

olds).

2. The family must meet guidelines (exceptions are made if the child has a disability or the family has special circumstances).

3. The child must have a certified birth certificate, a 121 (shot record), social security card, and insurance card (if applicable).

Head Start registration is ongoing, so you may register your child at any time, official however our recruitment for children for the 2008-2009 school year will begin in January, 2008. If you have a child who will be eligible for next year and do not have all your documentation, begin now to get it together so we can complete the registration process and your child will have a slot.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District participating in an ongoing statewide effort to identify, locate, and evaluate children, birth through the age of twenty-one, who have a physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional disability. Early identification of children in need of special education experiences is most important to each child. Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing a free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

The Child Find Person. implements identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find Person works with the local Head Starts, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact Person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly described the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents and insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a nondiscriminatory evaluation is Students are conducted. evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to the Eligibility Determination Conference by Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/or related services, Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the All students process. receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

We now have twentyseven special education classes in our district which provide services to students who have a physical, mental, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.
