Board Votes to Postpone Decision on Pickwick Pines Utility District

Monday, the Tishomingo ounty Board of Supervisors oted in front of a packed ourtroom to postpone a decion on a new utility district.

During its regularly scheded first Monday meeting, the oard met to hear concerns on ne formation of a new utility listrict for the Pickwick Pines mmunity on Highway 350 in e north part of the county.

More than 100 interested ersons,' including several ickwick Pines residents, backed the courtroom and fired uestions at supervisors Dale rice, Arlie South, Danny Ryan and David Sanders. Leon Cook was not present.

Though the stated purpose f the meeting was to determine e "public convenience and necessity of incorporating a tility district" for the gated ommunity developed by David McMeans, many voiced oncerns about exactly how the system would be paid for, what would be paid for, and by whom. Additionally, several parties discussed the necessity of the system, and if the need or it was determined by the roposed construction of a conention center.

Much of the concern was remature, explained Board of upervisors Attorney Nick hillips. The action being conidered is merely "the intent" to

start formation of the district. "Until the district is actually formed, we can't seek any unding; no bond is involved," explained James T. Belue, atorney for David McMeans who fielded most of the quesions, to the frustration of the inquirers, as they seemed to want answers from the supervi-

"The system is working,"

Phillips assured those present, "those involved in the issue are voicing their concerns, and they are being heard by the board prior to a decision being

Belue and his client came to the supervisors November 5th with a petition signed by about forty Pickwick Pines res-

When the petition was brought, supervisor Danny Ryan said he made a point to ask McMeans, "No county funds are to be committed to

And he was assured of that at the meeting by McMeans, Ryan said Tuesday

At the hearing, Belue pointed out that it would be to the Pickwick Pines residents' benefit to have an incorporated public entitity like a water association in charge of the utilities, because right now it is a privately held system, and would not be eligible for federal aid or grants in the event of a catastrophic disaster. If the system suffered a major disaster-Belue referenced the flood a couple years ago in Tishomingo that destroyed that town's sewer lagoon- the

owner would be responsible since it was privately held.

Some Pickwick Pines residents, through a couple of spokepersons, said they are against the formation of the system. Some said that they had already paid for the services, had water service already, and already had their utility assessments increased by 50 percent. Several residents said they don't have a water meter.

The area is currently served by Short-Coleman Water Association, but it is through a master meter that Pickwick Pines management

operates. Utility costs are paid by Pickwick Pines for those without a meter.

They were not interested in paying for the system, about \$1.8 million of which is reportedly already in place and functioning, (having been paid for by the developer) or in having additional development in the form of a proposed hotel and convention center.

McMeans has said that tourism and convention business would not only employ area people, but also bring in tourism dollars to the county, and the Tishomingo County Development Foundation has supported his efforts to bring tourism opportunities to the

One issue raised is that the Short-Coleman system only agreed to a certain amount of water to be allocated - enough for about 50 residences, which was approved by the Mississippi Department of Health, and currently there are about 270 homes on that same line.

In the end, the supervisors, all of whom will leave office in January, except Danny Ryan, voted to postpone action on the petition until after the first of the year

Of the newly elected supervisors scheduled to be sworn in this January, Brandon Grissom, James McDowell and

Steve Thorne were present. "I think this was handled in the right way today," said supervisor-elect James Mc-Dowell after the hearing's conclusion about noon. "We need to look a little closer at this issue. We are very supportive of economic development, but we need to make sure it is for the good of all the parties affected."

luka Middle School Break-in **Leads luka Police to Four Arrests in Recent Arson Fires**

Iuka Police have arrested three juveniles and an adult in connection with two recent arson fires and related burglaries in Iuka.

On Saturday, November 24th, Officers Rodney Pannell and Jeremy Lovelace investigated a break-in at Iuka Middle School, where suspected burglars had broken a classroom window and broken out a door of the principal's office. Two suspects were identified from a video surveillance recording and officers executed a search warrant at the residence of a juvenile in Iuka.

The juvenile was charged with burglary and larceny of a commercial building and will be prosecuted in youth court, said Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer in a prepared release.

Also charged in the IMS break-in was Travis Rabe, 20. Rabe was stationed at Fort Campbell, Kentucky and was extradited back to Iuka.

Information gained from the search and the IMS burglary led investigators to additionally charge Rabe with the GM Wholesale Building burglary, larceny and arson fire, stated Stringer. He is currently being held on \$500,000 bond in the Tishomingo County Jail.

Three juveniles were also charged with burglary and larceny, and accessory after the fact of arson, and will face prosecution in juvenile court.

Additionally, the information gained from these ar-

rests led officers to charge Rabe in the August 12th downtown luka fire of All-American Sports Cards.

Rabe has been charged with burglary, larceny and one count of arson of a commercial building in connection with the card shop destruction, stated the release.

One of the previously mentioned juveniles was also charged with burglary, larceny and accessory arson after the fact in the card shop

"Our officers worked tirelessly over the past week to quickly solve these cases," said Chief Randy Stringer. "We ask the public to provide any additional information in connection with these events to our office at 662-423-6340.

Two Bound Over for Grand Jury after String of Copper Thefts this Summer

Two men have been bound over for next week's grand jury following a string of thefts of copper and other items from Tri-State Recycling in Iuka.

On September 24th, Amos Schrock of Tri-State recycling reported a break-in, and the theft of several items, including a flat-screen television, camera, computer monitor and VCR.

Schrock had installed a

video surveillance system because of a large quantity of missing brass and copper, said Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer in a prepared release.

Officers investigating the break-in found the location where suspects had been entering the scrap yard over the

fence, and were able to find a trail of copper straws that led to the residence of one of the suspects, said Stringer.

Jason Dugger, of 1104 Quitman, faces possible burglary and larceny charges to be determined by the grand jury scheduled to meet the second week of December. He is currently being held for the IPD in the Lauderdale County Detention Center, and on other charges in Alabama.

Sheriff Rick Wilson and Deputy Bears of Waynesboro, Tennessee provided further information they had obtained from Brad Staggs about the copper being taken from Tri-State Recycling. Staggs also indicated Dugger's involvement, said Stringer.

Staggs also faces charges in the case, to be determined by the grand jury, the release stated.

Investigators were able to track that the stolen scrap metal was being taken to Roberson's Scrap Metal in Florence, Alabama, where they spent about a week sorting through checks and invoices to determine that \$51,224.80 in copper had been stolen over the summer, said Stringer.

"Thanks to the officers for a job well done in this case," said Chief Stringer.

Man & Wife Injured When **Buggy Hit by Truck on 72**

A Burnsville man and his wife were injured when their horse-drawn buggy was struck from behind by a truck Thursday morning.

The Amish-style buggy was being driven by R.C. Brewer, 75, of Burnsville. His wife, Louise, was injured in the collision and taken by ambulance to Iuka Hospital, where she was treated and released. R. C. Brewer was treated later, and also released. Mrs. Brewer was knocked unconscious in the collision, stated Brewer.

According to Brewer, a truck being driven by Hoyle Wayne Frederick of Iuka struck the west-bound Brewer

buggy in the left rear wheel. Both vehicles were traveling west on the Tenn-Tom Waterway bridge on U.S. Highway

thought lightning struck us," said Brewer, who says he often travels the roads in a buggy. He has just recently bought this particular buggy about a month ago, and it was properly equipped with a slow-moving vehicle sign, and lights.

The buggy was destroyed beyond repair, stated Brewer. And the horse was seriously injured, and will no longer be usable, according to Brewer.

Daughters Of American Revolution (D.A.R.) From 3 Counties Hold Joint Meeting

Daughters of American Revolution (DAR) held a joint neeting on November 16th, Chief Tishomingo (Iuka), LaSalle (Corinth), and Chapter Trace Chapter Natchez Booneville) met Friday at Ryan's Restaurant in Corinth o hear a presentation on the Kate Duncan DAR School.

The meeting was called order at 6:30 p.m. by Mrs. Chief Nelson, ishomingo Chapter Regent. Mrs. Carolyn Lambert, Regent of the Natchez Trace Chapter, served as Chaplain; and Ms. Bobbie Anthony, Regent of the LaSalle Chapter, blessed the meal with prayer. All those present articipated in the DAR litual, which included the ledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of merica, reading of the reamble and the American's and singing America," which was led by s. RaNae Vaughn. Mrs. lelson presented greetings om the President General, inda Gist Calvin, whose essage was to "Spread Varmth and Hospitality During the Holiday Season."

Chief Colbert Chapter in Tuscumbia, Alabama, was applauded on their 100th anniversary.

Following a delicious meal and social time, Mr. Charles Edmonds, Jr., Executive Director of the Kate Duncan DAR School in Grant, Alabama, discussed the history of the school. Kate

Duncan Smith DAR School, Inc., located on Gunter Mountain in northeast Alabama, serves grades K-12 and provides opportunities for the children of a large, rural area in the Appalachian foothills to develop a strong love of American ideals as they obtain a distinctive academic background. Emphasis is upon patriotic education throughout the curriculum. Although the school plant and enrollment have increased greatly in size and number since 1924, the same spirit of dedication to achievement, patriotic and moral values, and service to community and country exists on the campus today as it did in the early years of this educational experiment of the Daughters

of the American Revolution.

Kate Duncan Smith DAR School is the only school with grades K-12 in the United States owned and operated by members of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The Alabama Society DAR established the school in 1924 and named it in honor of Kate Duncan Smith (Mrs. J. Morgan), who had been the guiding hand for the Alabama Chapters for 21 years. In April 1928, the Alabama Daughters were joined in their noble efforts by the National Society DAR.

Several possible locations were considered but the selection of the present site was determined by its isolation and great need for

educational opportunities; the interest, enthusiasm, and great desire of the mountain people for a school; a highly intelligent native population, many of whom were descendants of Revolutionary ancestors; and the beauty of the site on the edge of Gunter Mountain overlooking Kennamer Cove.

Kate Duncan Smith is more than just a school for mountain boys and girls. It is woven and ingrained into the hearts of its students and graduates and has become the major force in the development of the local population educationally, economically, socially, physically, and spiritually.

The "Gem of Gunter Mountain" stands as a monument to the love and devotion of the DAR. Because of the love and concern of Daughters everywhere, this Gem sparkles more brightly each




Congregation Of New Salem Baptist Church Takes A Stand
