February Trial Set for K.D. Sanders

Keir Dula "K.D." Sanders is set to stand trial on two counts of murder February 4th in Tishomingo County Circuit Court.

Sanders, 41, was arrested in San Antonio in December 2005 after 20 years as a fugitive. He is charged with murder in the December 29, 1985 slayings of his maternal grandparents in the Goat Island community of Tishomingo County.

Sanders has been in custody at the Tishomingo

County Jail, after extradition from Texas.

W.D. Crawford, Jr. was found dead at his home along with his wife, Elma, who was stabbed and shot in the abdomen, but still conscious with authorities arrived.

Reportedly, Sanders was identified as a suspect because his victim grandmother wrote his name in blood at the scene. He was charged the next day with murder, but officials were unable to track him after he fled the area.

Graduate Scholarships Available From National Assoc. of Junior Auxiliaries

As a state board member, he will be charged with helping set direction and policy for the 227,000-member organization that represents agriculture and rural Mississippi.



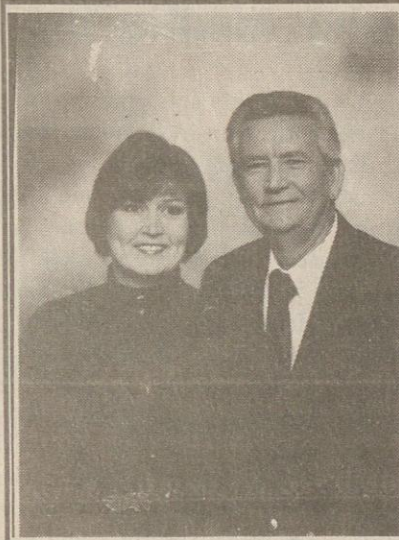

BOONEVILLE- Northeast Mississippi Community College's division of Workforce Training and Economic Development is conducting an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) basic class beginning Thursday, January 3, 2008 with registration set for 5:30 p.m. in Holliday Hall room 302.

Participants must be 18 and provide a proof of age such as a valid driver's license, have a high school diploma or GED, and a TABE score of 10 on reading or a composite score of 16 or above on the ACT taken since October 1989 (12 or above taken before October 1989).

Limited to a maximum of 30 students, the class is scheduled to meet each Tuesday and Thursday night from 5:30-9:30 p.m. until May 8, 2008.

Tuition is \$200 and is due at registration. Malpractice insurance is also required to be purchased at registration. The policy costs \$61. Books costs approximately \$140 and may be purchased in the Northeast Bookstore in the Haney Union.

Prerequisites include an American Heart Association CPR Healthcare provider card with expiration date after December 2007, TB skin test or chest X-ray (must have been performed after 10-1-07). Hepatitis B vaccine (at least one of the three injections) and be physically fit per physical examination by physician or Mississippi licensed nurse practitioner.

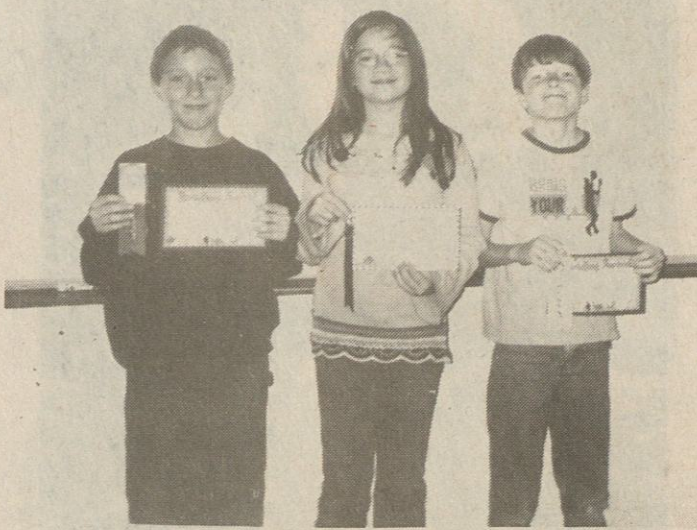

20/20 Vision Despite Glaucoma

One of the dangers of glaucoma is that you can have the disease in its early stages and not know it. This can cause serious accidents. Take the case of the chauffeur who never had an accident until he was 55. His first accident was minor. The motor vehicle bureau vision test showed 20/20 in each eye. This was a test for central vision and only for an eye chart viewed at 20 feet. In his second accident, a tragedy, he killed a child. The child was cycling to the right of the car, and the chauffeur never saw him until it was too late. When his eyes were examined, it showed glaucoma had reached the stage where his side vision was impaired. Unfortunately, he had never been tested for the disease before.

Glaucoma causes increased pressure of the fluids within the eye and may cause serious damage. The process is usually slow but ultimately may cause blindness. A test for glaucoma is standard in most eye examinations, especially for people over 40.

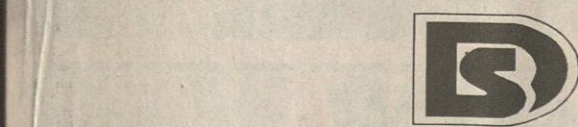

Blue Mountain Online Courses Growth Steady

BLUE MOUNTAIN - Steady growth has been the key to the success of the online program at Blue Mountain College, and that same consistent progress holds the key to the future of the program.

Since its beginnings in the fall of 2006, the BMC online program has averaged 61 students per semester and indications are that those figures will hold true for the first Spring Semester of 2008. Jan. 7 is the deadline for application to the Blue Mountain distance learning program for the first spring term.

Besides basic liberal arts

and business administration degree courses, Blue Mountain also offers courses for the Endorsement in Special Education and Certification in Library Media. The cost of each course is \$895, but employed teachers with a current license can enroll for \$600 each.

The online program was developed through a partnership with Learning House Inc., a leader in providing distance learning solutions for small colleges, particularly faith-based schools.

"We've offered two eight-week terms per semester, plus one eight week

summer term since we began," says Chris Driskell, the program coordinator for online instruction at Blue Mountain. "Each time we've had a good mixture of students taking online courses only and students enrolled full-time at Blue Mountain."

Judy Wilker, a social sci-

ences instructor, taught online courses from her offices at Mississippi State University before joining the Blue Mountain faculty this year.

"One of the primary misconceptions of online classes is that students have no con-

tact with the teacher," Wilker says. "There's a great deal of interaction that takes places with the students in online classes - if the student is willing to participate."

"In teaching history classes, I've come to know students through their writing and responses during discussions, as well as in phone conversations or simple emails. I love teaching online classes."

The benefits of distance learning are many, says Driskell. Not only are students trying to balance class loads with jobs better able to schedule their academics, but traditional students often take advantage to supplement their schedules.

Dr. Sharon Enzor, vice president for academic affairs, says while a BMC de-

gree is not yet available through online courses, "There are several 'core courses' - courses needed to earn a degree - offered through the online program. We are constantly monitoring the needs of students and we make every effort to meet their needs."

Sharon Arnold, a junior from Booneville, says if it weren't for the online course offerings at Blue Mountain

College she would have a hard time earning her degree. "The way my schedule is, it's very hard for me to get to campus," Arnold says. "I'm married and have three children, and I live an hour away. Online courses fit my schedule so much better."

The program is truly distance learning. Ramona Price, an online student from

Nevada working on her Special Education Endorsement, says, "BMC has been a Godsend to me. Teaching full time does not leave a lot of room for further my education, and special education courses provided a foundation that perfectly fit my needs."

Blue Mountain also has a student in China taking online courses in preparation for moving back to the U.S. and the college campus on a part-time basis in the fall of 2008.

Johnnie Armstrong taught physical education at Blue Mountain for 54 years and has seen nearly every "new trend" in education.

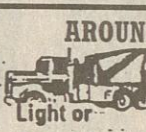

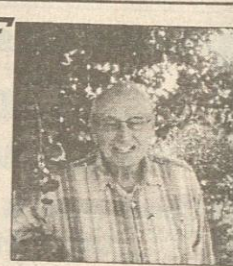

Call for Help - Through the 20th Century Club

Program recycles old cell phones to help domestic abuse victims

Iuka's 20th Century Club is collecting old cell phones and chargers to help abused women through a program called Call for Help-Through the 20th Century Club.

"We are accepting any kind of cell phone, with its charger if possible, and they will be reprogrammed to only dial 911," said Vickie Frye, a representative of the public service club in Iuka. The club is working with SAFE, Inc. of Tupelo.


SAFE (Shelter and Assistance for Family Emergencies) helps women who are victims of domestic abuse by providing them with the re-

sources to get out of a situation that is hurting them or their children.

"Clear any personal information or photos off the phones," said Frye. But they will additionally clear the phones, and block them so they can only dial 911.

Locations for turning in the phones include the Tishomingo County High School office, Iuka Library, Wellness Center and the Tishomingo County News offices.

In 1935-36 my family and I lived in Iuka where my father worked as a bookkeeper for the TVA - at its Iuka office, I think - during the building of Pickwick Dam. I was an eight year old, third-grader at the time.

I recall that we lived in what was known then as a tourist court - Bullard's cabins. It was on a paved road, probably US 72.

My teacher's name was Miss (or Mrs.) Johnson. I don't remember anything about the location of the school, or about the town itself.

My wife and I passed through Iuka on a Sunday, recently, and looked for the tourist court but couldn't find it, nor anyone to ask.

The one thing that stands out in my memory about our time in Iuka was that my father,

after being mis-diagnosed for various complications, was rushed to the hospital in Corinth where he had an emergency operation for a ruptured appendix which saved his life.

The purpose of this letter is to solicit your readers' aid in recreating some history. I would appreciate receiving information, pictures, news articles, mementos, etc pertinent to the time frame mentioned. Also, books or other publications which might be of historical value.
