Supervisors Re-appoint EMA Director, Head to Jackson for Training

The members of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors left Monday for Jackson to attend the Mississippi Association of Supervisor's Mid-Winter Meeting January 14 through 17th.

"We will be attending training sessions and networking with other supervisors around the state," reported Board President Brandon Grissom on Monday.

According to the unapproved minutes of Purchasing Clerk Lynn West, in business Friday, January 11th, the supervisors re-appointed Bill Strickland as County Emergency Management Agency Director. Strickland has been in that position since last year. This is a part-time position, and a portion of the salary is paid by the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, explained West.

The board put on the schedule to take up the issue of the Pickwick Pines Utility District on January 22 at 10 a.m. This will be part of the regular meeting to consider having a hearing, which would be legally announced, clarified West.

The board discussed the county's cell phone plan with a representative with Cellular South, who offers state contract pricing.

The supervisors were advised that the second lowest bid, B&E Equipment, was being considered for installation of a self-fueling facility at the Iuka Airport, since the initial low bid contractor failed to meet some of the contractual requirements.

The board approved travel for Sheriff Glenn Whitlock to attend a conference, and travel for Justice Court Clerk and deputy clerk to attend a mid-winter training conference.

Other business done Friday, according to board president Grissom included some bridge business and appraisals on related property.

The Friday meeting was the third official meeting of the new board since being sworn in last Monday, and much of the time they have spent in executive session addressing personnel issues.

Corrections

Grissom requested some corrections to last week's reports in this paper, including:

Brandon Grissom was elected president of the board, not Brian Grissom.

The proposal for a state prison includes the possibility of 60 to 70 jobs, which was one of the main reasons they are expressing interest in the proposal.

"The report of last week's business neglected to mention that Dean McRae Engineering of Iuka is still the county engineer, but that Cook Coggins has the state-aid funded roads and bridges work," said Grissom. "This is the same situation as we already had," he said.

Also, the regular meetings are on the first and third Mondays, (not second and fourth) so the next scheduled meeting is January 22nd, since the courthouse and county offices are closed on the 21st for the Martin Luther King holiday.

Tornado Damages Buildings at Tish. County Landfill

Severe thunderstorms and a tornado last Thursday damaged buildings at the county landfill and had students in county schools huddled in school hallways.

Landfill Damage

"We saw the clouds and felt the wind pick up and took cover in the office," said Andy Pruitt, an employee at the Tishomingo County Sanitary Landfill near Highway 25 at Midway.

"We shouted to Johnny [Hollander] to take cover, and he jumped in the backhoe inside the loading shed and we got under the table," Pruitt explained.

As soon as Pruitt joined landfill supervisor Lloyd Whitaker under a small table in the landfill office, the wind tore the back off the building. Hollander was inside the loading shed, which also had the siding torn off.

Whitaker was taken from the landfill by ambulance to Iuka Hospital for symptoms related to a heart condition. He was treated and released, according to his wife, Betty on Friday.

"Thank goodness he had his nitro-glycerin pills, he took two before the ambulance came, and the doctors indicated that is what saved him," said Betty Whitaker.

Students Take Cover

Warnings of tornadoes near Booneville and Corinth around 1:30 prompted school officials to initiate emergency procedures, though they had advised all county principals to be on alert regarding the weather all day.

Officials chose to keep the students in school, under supervision, rather than busing them home where they may or may not have anyone home to be with during bad weather, said Tishomingo

County School System spokesperson Joel Robertson.

Robertson said neighboring Mississippi school systems did not send students home, though some schools in Alabama and Tennessee did.

Tornado Confirmed

Officials from the National Weather Service in Memphis came and surveyed the damage on Friday with Tishomingo County Emergency Management Director Bill Strickland.

Based on damage and evidence, they determined that a F1 category tornado did indeed do some of the damage

starting in a line at the landfill and heading northeast where it did some more damage to trees in pastures on both sides of the highway. Several large trees were uprooted completely just off of Highway 25.

Some power outages due to branches on lines were reported and repaired in the New Salem Community and the Sardis Church area, said personnel with the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association.

Sirens were sounded at Tishomingo just minutes before the Midway event, said EMA director Strickland,

about 2 p.m.

"We are fortunate that we did not have the devastation Caledonia suffered," said Strickland. He urged citizens to be weather alert and take cover in such circumstances, until all dangerous weather has passed.

"I want to thank the volunteer fire department personnel for responding to the landfill and being ready for any emergency," said Strickland.

Fire Chief Urges Heater Safety During Cold Season

Citizens are urged to use caution with space heaters and fire during the cold months, advised Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom.

Grissom stressed that people with electric wall heaters need to be particularly careful, because some people put furniture in front of them and turn them off.

But some units will automatically kick on in low temperatures, even when they are turned off, Grissom explained. The only safe thing is to actually have them disconnected, or to keep three feet of clearance from them at all times.

The same rule goes for other space heaters - three feet clearance, said Grissom.

"Most of the calls we take in town, and many of the fires in the county are caused by improper use of space heaters during these cold months," he said.

Citizens who are doing outside burning on days when it is not raining are also urged to check with the forestry commission to see if it is an approved burn day.

New Reps, Senator Sworn in at Capitol in Jackson

Tishomingo County's two new representatives and new senator were sworn into the 2008 legislature last week, and one senator has been re-elected from his job apparently due to his elected position.

Eric Powell, District Four's new democratic senator received a letter of nomination last week from his employer of the last 11 1/2 years, Package Corporation of America in Counce, Tennessee.

"We were in the middle of negotiating an agreement to accommodate my need to be away in Jackson for the part-time elected job of state senator, and I got the letter without warning," explained Powell on Tuesday.

Powell is among many who have worked at PCA and held various elected positions, including one who was the full-time mayor of Savannah, Tennessee, according to Powell. Powell is a member of the United Steel Workers of America, the union that is active at PCA, and they were helping negotiate the terms of the agreement.

"This is totally contrary to the labor contract, and public policy, and against

everything management told him when he ran and got elected," said Tishomingo attorney Phillip Whitehead, long time friend of Powell who is helping on the case. "We will pursue the grievance process, first, and then go further if necessary," said Whitehead.

Ironically, Powell was appointed Vice Chairman of the Labor committee of the Senate, along with appointments to other committees that should prove beneficial to Tishomingo County: Finance, Forestry, Ports & Marine Resources, Tourism and Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.

J.P. Wilemon to Head Municipalities

District 5 Senator J.P. Wilemon, Jr. (D-Belmont) returned for a second term and kept his appointments to the Appropriations, Business & Financial Institutions, Education, Judiciary, and Universities & Colleges committees, and gained the chairmanship of the Municipalities committee, too.

pediatrician in Rutherford.

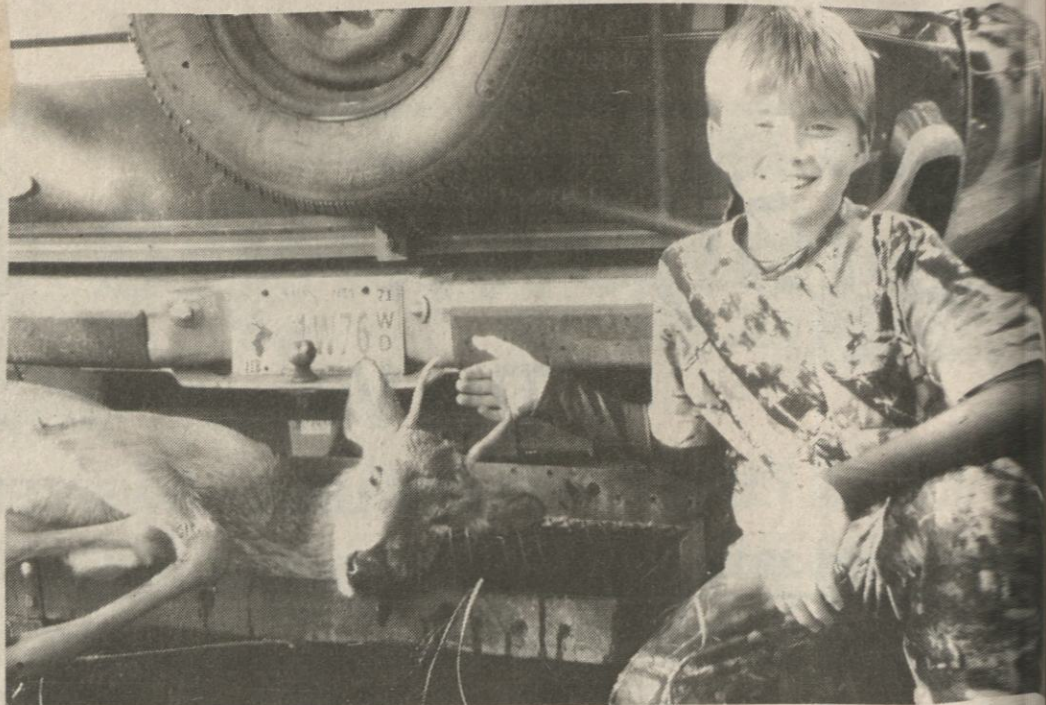

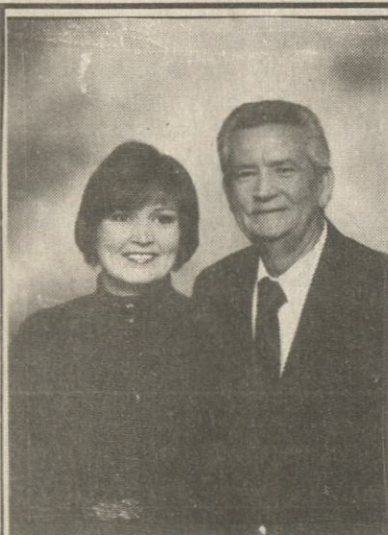

Are You Farsighted?

You've always been able to see well - until recently - whether an object was close-up or far away. An eye examination, however, reveals that you are farsighted. When you were younger it didn't affect your vision because your eyes' near-focusing muscles were strong enough to correct any vision deficiencies.

In time, these muscles begin to lose their strength. That's when a person discovers he or she needs the help of glasses or contact lenses to see well again.

If you're farsighted, whether you're looking at an object close up or far away, when the image enters your eye, it does not come into focus soon enough. In normal vision, an image is transmitted to the retina, (located in the back of the eye), and then sent to the brain. However, in farsightedness, the image is not in focus when it reaches the retina. The image transmitted to the brain is a blurred image. If you think you may be farsighted, visit your eye doctor.

Therefore, two muscles can be targeted at once, in opposing directions. 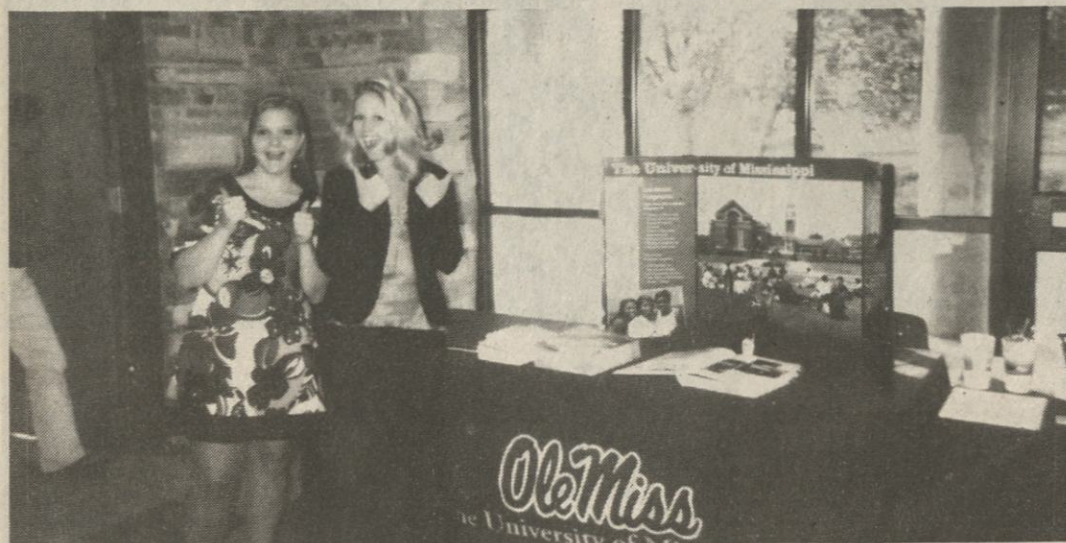

Finding myself in CAJUN Louisiana



Rheta Grimsley Johnson To Speak At Iuka Public Library

On Tuesday, January 22nd, from 12:00 until 1:00 p.m., popular syndicated columnist Rheta Grimsley Johnson will speak at the Public Library in Iuka, Mississippi. This talk is provided by the Friends of the Iuka Library as part of their bimonthly luncheon series. The Friends will provide a light lunch for \$2.00.

Rheta Johnson has a new book coming out in March of 2008, and its title is Poor Man's Provence: Finding Myself in Cajun Louisiana. What can you expect to hear on Tuesday? "The talk," she says, "will be about Poor Man's Provence - the book and the place - mostly." The place is near Henderson, deep in the heart of Cajun country in South Central Louisiana, on the very edge of the Atchafalaya Basin which is in fact the largest swamp in the United States.

Her title alludes to that haven in Southern France that lies seaside to the Mediterranean, and it's clear, starting with the very cover of the book, that Rheta finds the simple warmth and charm of Cajun country to be a sanctuary, a cure for indifference. "Henderson is the same latitude as my hometown," Rheta says, "with

a lot of the same flora and fauna. But the people are dramatically different. It was like coming home, in a way, except the place had been repopulated by more open, life-loving people. The music and food are exceptional in South Louisiana, but it's the people that make it truly different. The most different place you can travel without a passport."

In writer Kurt Vonnegut's musings he once asked his son, pediatrician Dr. Vonnegut, what life is all about. "Father," his son responded, "we are here to help each other get through this thing, whatever it is." Clearly, Rheta Grimsley Johnson is doing just that. She uses her life honed skills of keen observation and engaging writing to help us find our way in a world where she looks for hope and beauty, from stellar light to budding flower. And if you have followed her writing, you know she is quite the talented guide.
