On Tuesday, Superintendent Kuykendall announced that the Tishomingo County School Board has decided to "put on hold" plans to remodel the "old" Belmont gym. The plans included a stage area for drama and assemblies.

luka Middle School **Activity Center**

About 40 people helped school board members and faculty open the new Iuka Middle School Activity Building during a sunny Saturday morning ribbon cutting

After 15 months of construction by contractor Worsham Brothers, the \$1.4 million facility is complete and ready for students to use for physical education classes and assemblies.

It replaces two historic buildings - an auditorium and old gymnasium.

Michael Puckett, First District School Board Representative and a graduate of the Iuka Middle School, said many fond memories were made in the old buildings, but he was looking forward to new memories in the new buildings.

This will allow IMS to have facilities as fine as any at any other school in the state. About 370 students will be able to use the facility and it allows IMS to meet state mandated requirements for a physical education facility, said Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall. It will also be used for drama and musical productions.

When the IMS project and the Belmont gym were planned, the goals of the school administration were to get facilities as fine as money could buy for the students, and to conserve the tax dollars of the people of Tishomingo County, and we think we did that, said Kuykendall at both ceremonies.

More Guilty Pleas from Tish. County **Circuit Court**

Drug Convictions Get Light Sentences; Sex, **Gun Offenders Serve Time**

In a theme continued from the previous release of plea reports, defendants pleading to drug charges received light or suspended sentences, but courts did punish sex offenders and those guilty of firearm offenses with some time to serve.

The following pleas were heard in the 2008 January Session of Tishomingo County Circuit Court under Judge James Lamar Roberts,

Lilbren Ray Higginbottom, 45, of 96 Taylor Road, Fulton, pled guilty to one count of manufacture of methamphetamine and one count of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. He was sentenced to a combined 18 years with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC), all suspended, and 5 years probation. He must pay \$2,204 in

associated costs and fines. Jeffery Flack, 27, of 28 CR 286, Iuka, pled guilty to one count of possession of stolen firearms and was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, with 15 suspended and 5 years to serve with 5 years probation afterwards.

He has to pay associated costs of \$3,189.50.

Georgie "Mac" Wood, 49, of 23 CR 237, Iuka, pled guilty to one count of sexual battery and one count of incest and was sentenced to a total 30 years with 15 years suspended, and 15 years without possibility of parole, and 5 years of probation afterward. He has to pay associated costs in the amount of \$2,489.50 and register as a sex offender.

Aurora Lee Johnson, 40, of 1220 Martha Lane, luka, pled guilty to one count of statutory rape and one count of sexual battery. She was sentenced to 30 years with MDOC, with 15 suspended, and 15 to serve without possibility of parole, and 5 years probation upon release. She must also register as a sex offender and pay associated fines and costs of \$2,589.50.

Joshua S. Bobo, 25, pled guilty to one count of DUI death and was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, all suspended, and five years probation. He must pay associated costs of \$1,572.50.

Debra Trudell, 53, of 588 CR 989, Apt. 9, Iuka, pled guilty to one count of possession of clonazepam with intent to distribute, and one count of possession of hydrocodone with intent to distribute. She was sentenced to 15 years for each count, and all were suspended. She must serve five years probation, and pay \$1,669.50 in associ-

Sanders Begins in Oxford

A jury was seated Monday in Lafayette County Circuit Court, where the trial was moved late last week from Tishomingo County.

Prosecutors said Monday that they will not seek the death penalty in the case. That means the maximum penalty Sanders could face if convicted would be life in prison



Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail.

These five groups are:

1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older;

2. A registered voter who temporarily residing outside the county;

3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and/or

4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.

5. All voters who are members of the Armed Services, or other voters that fall within the Armed Services Absentee Voting

Other offices that will be elected in the November General Election will be:

1. Mississippi Supreme Court (Nonpartisan Offices) -There is no party primary for this office. The qualifying deadline will be May 9th.

2. County Election Commissioner for all five supervisor districts. There is no party primary; however, candidates may declare party affiliation, which will appear on general election ballot. The qualifying deadline will be September 5.

3. County School Board Member for School District 1st and 5th. There is no party affiliation and no primary. The qualifying period for School Board Member is August 6 - September 5.

Attorneys for Sanders said they will present an insanity defense. The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has stated previously that Sanders has been psychologically evaluated by the state, and was found competent to stand trial.

Sanders has been in custody in the Tishomingo County Jail since his arrest in 2005 in San Antonio, Texas. Jail officials have had to keep Sanders under careful observation and individually housed based on the nature of the crimes of which he is accused.

The cost of incarcerating and trying such a suspect will probably cost the county \$1 million or more, officials have stated.

Prosecutors said Sanders allegedly shot his grandfather, W.D. Crawford Jr., with a shotgun and beat him with a hammer on Dec. 29, 1985. Crawford died of brain hemorrhaging due to blows to the head, according to an autopsy. Authorities said Sanders also shot his grandmother, Elma Crawford, who died several weeks later of her

Sanders, 43, was on the Commissioner Presley's of-FBI's most wanted list when a San Antonio police officer stopped him as he was walking down the street with a known drug dealer, authorities said.

The Crawfords' bodies were discovered after their daughter - Sanders' mother, a McNairy County, Tenn., resident — called authorities when her parents did not answer the phone.

In 1990, a federal arrest warrant was issued for Sanders, charging him with unlawful flight to avoid prosecution. Officials at the time believed that he was on his way to Texas, where he had family members


