Harmony Central VFD Receives \$34,020 Grant

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has awarded \$34,020 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) to the Harmony-Central Volunteer Fire Department.

The Fire Department applied for the grant in May 2007 to purchase needed equipment for the fire department consisting of wildland engine and a Compressed Air Skid Unit for use in the departments Brush Truck. The grants enable local fire departments and emergency medical services organizations to purchase or receive training, conduct first responder health and safety programs, and buy equipment and response vehicles.

"The Assistance to Firefighters Grants program has been instrumental in building capacity and providing needed resources for our nation's firefighters," said FEMA Administrator R. David Paulison. "From the purchase of equipment to first responder training, the AFG program has helped improve response capabilities and saved lives and property in communities throughout the United States."

PARTIES

1. The Plaintiff, Dustin Morris, (hereinafter referred to as the Plaintiff) at all times relevant hereto, is a minor citizen, of the State of Mississippi and resides in Tishomingo County and that this action is brought on behalf of his next friend, his mother, Jeannie Morris, who is an adult citizen of Mississippi and resides in Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

2. The Defendant, Dennis Snyder, (hereinafter referred to as Defendant), is an adult citizen of Tishomingo County, State of Mississippi, and is last known to reside at 32 CR 470, Iuka, MS 38852.

FACTS

3. On or about October 16, 2007 the Plaintiff was operating his Silver Dodge Truck in a Westward direction on County Road 256 in Tishomingo County, Mississippi, with the road and weather conditions being wet and cloudy. At said time and place the roadway was a two (2) lane asphalt roadway with a curve and slight grade.

4. At said time and place, the Defendant was operating a dark blue or black Ford Truck in an Eastward direction on County Road 256 in Tishomingo County, Mississippi, with the road and weather conditions being wet and cloudy. 8. The Defendant had a duty to keep a proper lookout.
9. The Defendant had a duty to be alert for other vehicles.
10. The Defendant had a duty to see what he should have seen.
11. The Defendant had a duty to have his vehicle under proper control.

12. The Defendant breached the duties delineated hereinabove and proximately caused the wreck and Plaintiff's damages alleged herein.

13. The Defendant was negligent per se in his violation of Miss. Code Annotated Section 63-3-1201 and this negligence was the proximate cause of the Plaintiff's wreck.

DEMAND FOR RELIEF

14. The Plaintiff prays for the following relief:

(1) Trial by jury;
(2) Judgment for Plaintiff and against Defendant;
(3) An award of damages which will fully and fairly compensate Plaintiff for any and all property damage sustained to his vehicle and present and future pain and suffering, past, present and future mental anguish; loss of enjoyment of life's activities.
(4) Such other and further relief deemed just and proper in the premises.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff demands judgment of and from the Defendant in the Sum of not less than \$50,000 and all costs accruing in this action.

Jackson, MS---Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley made a formal motion today to halt the expiration date of more than 169,000 registrations on Mississippi's present No-Call List, thereby keeping the list permanent.

The motion, seconded by Commissioner Lynn Posey, and praised by Chairman Leonard Bentz, was unanimously accepted and entered into the record at today's 10:00 A. M. Docket Hearing of the Mississippi Public Ser-

vice Commission.

"Mississippians can rest well tonight, knowing they will not need to re-register before August 31, 2008, to keep their number on the No-Call List," stated Presley. "This is a major step forward in protecting our citizens against unwanted telemarketing calls and scam artists. I believe the Commission has sent a strong message today that our first priority is *always*

going to be looking out for the Mississippi ratepayers and consumers."

Presley added that many companies continue to violate the "No-Call" Act and his office is currently in the process of re-vamping investigative efforts to prosecute those companies who violate the law.

"I ask consumers to please contact our Investigative Staff if they are on the No-Call list and have received calls from telemarketers. We are going to do everything possible to shut down these predatory businesses, but we need the consumer's help by reporting these calls," Presley said.

without parole.

Attorneys for Sanders said they will present an insanity defense. The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has stated previously that Sanders has been psychologically evaluated by the state, and was found competent to stand trial.

Sanders has been in custody in the Tishomingo County Jail since his arrest in 2005 in San Antonio, Texas. Jail officials have had to keep Sanders under careful observation and individually housed based on the nature of the crimes of which he is accused.

The cost of incarcerating and trying such a suspect will probably cost the county \$1 million or more, officials have stated.

Prosecutors said Sanders allegedly shot his grandfather, W.D. Crawford Jr., with a shotgun and beat him with a hammer on Dec. 29, 1985. Crawford died of brain hemorrhaging due to blows to the head, according to an autopsy. Authorities said Sanders also shot his grandmother, Elma Crawford, who died several weeks later of her wounds.

Sanders, 43, was on the FBI's most wanted list when a San Antonio police officer stopped him as he was walking down the street with a known drug dealer, authorities said.

The Crawfords' bodies were discovered after their daughter — Sanders' mother, a McNairy County, Tenn., resident — called authorities when her parents did not answer the phone.

In 1990, a federal arrest warrant was issued for Sanders, charging him with unlawful flight to avoid prosecution. Officials at the time believed that he was on his way to Texas, where he had family members.

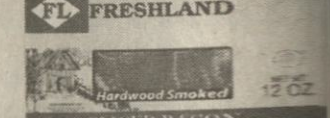

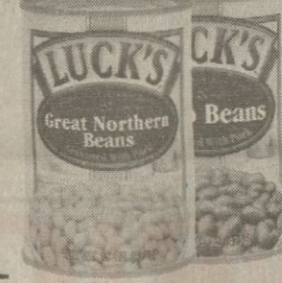

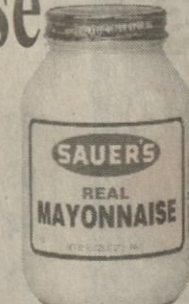
