Sgt. H.L. Kitchens of the Mississippi Highway Patrol said that the driver of the pickup did not see Ramsey and no charges are expected o be filed. Sanders Murder Trial Ends in Hung Jury



OXFORD - After eight hours of deliberations, a Lafayette County jury told Circuit Judge Thomas Gardner on Friday morning that no amount of further talks would break the 11-1 stalemate in the double murder trial of Keir Dulay "K.D." Sanders.

Gardner declared a mistrial due to a hung jury, and Sanders was remanded to the custody of Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. The case will be transferred back to Tishomingo County, and there was no discussion of a new trial date.

The six-man, six-woman jury sent out a note at 11:30 a.m. notifying the judge that they couldn't reach a consensus in the case, in which Sanders is accused of killing his grandparents. They had deliberated for more than five hours on Thursday and were sent home to return Friday after telling the judge they were divided 11-1 but had made some progress.

Sanders' fate hinged on an insanity defense and contrasting portrayals of the defendant - that of an intelligent boy who gradually succumbed to a mental illness that robbed him of his ability to know what he was doing and caused him to irrationally fear others versus that of a shrewd manipulator who functioned without medication for years and skillfully eluded law enforcement; and mother and stepfather, who that of a young man who pos- told of a downward spiral of sibly experimented with deteriorating behavior in



phetamine. **K.D. Sanders** Sanders

did not take the stand and spoke on the record only once during the trial as the judge advised him of his right to testify. Sanders listened attentively and responded politely and quietly to questions.

Gardner on Friday gave approval to a state motion to amend the indictment to charge Sanders as a habitual offender. The judge previously heard testimony that Sanders served jail time in Texas and had faced drug and burglary charges there under the aliases of David Matthews and David Montague. Fingerprint evidence was submitted linking him to the aliases, and a parole officer testified that Sanders was the same person.

The state began its case Tuesday with a series of law enforcement personnel who described the gruesome scene at the cabin where W.D. Crawford Jr. and Elma Lee Crawford were shot and Mr. Crawford fatally beaten with a hammer on Dec. 29, 1985.

The defense on Wednesday called Jannie Hadley and Gerald Hadley Sr., Sanders'

Sanders, who eventually was committed to the Mississippi State Hospital and also spent time in other mental health facilities.

Mrs. Hadley testified that the Crawfords had grown wary of Sanders and Mrs. Crawford, in particular, feared him.

The defense called a psychiatrist, Dr. Mark Webb, who testified that Sanders has schizoaffective disorder and that he met the standard for insanity because he did not know the nature and quality of his actions and did not know right from wrong at the time of the attack.

The state called a rebuttal witness, Dr. Chris Lott, a psychologist who essentially agreed with the diagnosis of the defense's expert witness but did not agree that Sanders was legally insane at the time of the crime.

Held at the Lafayette County Chancery Building, the case drew minimal attention in Oxford, with rarely more than a small handful of spectators in the courtroom.

The death penalty did not figure into the case because of existing laws at the time of the 22-year-old indictment, officials said.

Sanders was arrested in December 2005 in San Antonio, Texas, after an officer spotted him as a suspicious subject on the street, and Sanders had an authentic birth certificate for Keir

New Salem Home Burned Last Friday

A brick home in the New Salem community burned to the ground last Friday from a fire thought to have started in the utility room.

A man driving by the home of James Lowell and Sandra Barnes on County Road 283 noticed smoke coming from the carport. He stopped to see if anyone needed to get out, said Tishomingo County Fire Investigator Brian Grissom. The passerby started trying to fight the fire himself, since he had no phone available to call for help, but he couldn't find a hose, so he rushed to the neighbor's house. The neighbor, Greg McGee, a brotherin-law to the Barnes', was pulling up in the driveway and already calling 911, since he had also seen the fire.

The call came in about the fire about 11:40 a.m. on February 8th.

Units from Harmony Central, Crossroads and Burnsville responded to the

fire, but the house and two cars couldn't be saved.

Grissom said the cause of the fire is under investigation, but that it did start in the utility room, and the only things in there were a tanning bed and radio.

The home was insured, and the family is grateful for all the help they have received from friends and family. They plan to rebuild in the same place, as it is family land, and other members of the family live nearby.

Other Fires

There were several woods and grass fires on Saturday. People were trying to clean up yards and leaves on the pretty day, but wind caused problems, said Grissom.

In Belmont, units responded to three house fires on Thursday, only one of which was a total loss. A homeowner was saved by the smoke alarm when her dryer caught fire in the other end of her double-wide trailer.





How else to understand why we still hang in there through heart breaking news, bad colds, leftovers, and hair falling out and turning gray.




