Can You Overuse Eyes?

If you're past the prime of life and concerned about conserving your vision, you may want to about having to use your eyes too much. Your eyes will not wear out with use. Excessive use may result in eye fatigue or strain but it won't harm your eyes.

Farmington VFD Gives Pumper Truck to Carter's Branch VFD

The Carter's Branch Volunteer Fire Department was given a pumper truck by the Farmington Volunteer Fire Department last Saturday.

The gift of the 1979 Ford truck to the Carter's Branch department came about when Farmington Chief David Boren asked District One State Representative Lester "Bubba" Carpenter if he knew anyone who needed the surplus truck. Carpenter, a former paramedic was quick to answer that Carter's Branch

needed the pumper to replace an ancient one they have been using for years.

Tommy Williams, Carter's Branch Chief accepted the pumper on behalf of the 12 member volunteer fire department that serves about 150 homes in the very rural area east of Tishomingo to the Alabama state line.

The truck holds about 400 gallons of water and was bought by the Farmington Department new in 1979.

"It's a good truck, it's just surplus for us, and we wanted

it to be used by someone who needed it," explained Boren on Saturday, when the title was passed to the new owners.

On hand for the handover were all the county supervisors, state representatives and senators for the Carter's Branch area, plus Carpenter, who facilitated the trade, and State Senator Eric Powell for District 4, who was raised in the Carter's Branch Community.

A computer, located on the counter in the John Marshall Stone Research Library, is available to the public to use to key in names (or other search criteria) that can be used in easily locating a reference from the bookshelves, file cabinets, or museum displays. This program houses the extensive inventory of both the museum artifacts and the library references. All items in the possession of the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum are recorded here, given accession numbers, and labeled with an identifier that ties back to the database.

Belmont and Tishomingo County's basketball teams head to district competition this week with games on Wednesday and Thursday nights.

Tishomingo County is seeded 5th in the Region 1-4A tournament, and will face Center Hill in the first game Wednesday night at 7 p.m. (boys) and 8:30 p.m. (girls) at ICC.

Braves Boys

The boys faced Desoto Central last Friday, and lost in overtime by only 3 points. Standout junior guard Tyler Pritchard had 38 points in that

game, and first-year Coach Chip Johnson said a good performance from Pritchard would be great in the game against Center Hill.

The Braves lost in a pretty close game at Center Hill earlier in the season, said Johnson. "We didn't play as well as we should have at Center Hill, and we will correct those mistakes for this week."

A win against Center Hill would bring TC face to face with number one seeded Pontotoc on Thursday night, who trounced the Braves last week. A single win also qualifies the Braves for a spot in the North Half Tournament for another week of post-season play.




"These girls have earned everything they have accomplished and they are to be commended for their accomplishments," said Higginbottom.

4. 




