Golden Fire Dept. to Get New Pumper Truck in Fall

Bids on Railroad Bridge Repair at Leedy, Tish. Received

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors approved bids Monday on a new Class A pumper truck for the Golden Fire Department.

A low bid of \$198,454 for a Pierce Contender truck was taken under advisement by the board, pending the review and recommendation of the Golden Fire Department, who were set Monday afternoon to make that recommendation. The low bid was just slightly higher than the only other acceptable bid by Southeast Apparatus Sales.

The new truck will supplement the equipment of the Golden department, and eventually, will lower insurance rates in the Golden community, said Assistant Chief Shannon Garrison. Delivery of the truck is expected in the fall.

The purchase was made possible by a FEMA/

Homeland Security to Fire Fighters Assistance grant that covers the bid price, explained Garrison.

Railroad Bridges Bid

Bids were also opened Monday on the railroad bridge project on Trace Street just northwest of downtown Tishomingo. The "overhead bridge," as local people call it, will be taken out and a grade crossing will be installed over the Redmont railroad line there.

The low bid was offered by local company Parsons Earthwork for \$109,882. Ten bidders competed for the job, and the bids were as high as \$179,801 for the job that was estimated at about \$100,000 by Cook Coggins Engineers

of Tupelo, according to engineer Roland Humphries.

Last week the board accepted bids for a bridge at Leedy for which the low bid was \$426,898 by Dye Construction.

On both bridge jobs, the board voted to take the bids under advisement, and have the engineer review and tabulate the packages.

These two projects were funded through Mississippi House Bill 1492 of the 2006 session, which provided \$3 million to Tishomingo county and three others for railroad bridge repair. The projects are being administered through the Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development District

Developers Plan Multi-Story Condominiums in Downtown Iuka

No, its not a public swimming pool, nor a fishing hole, despite the clever sign placed by a mysterious prankster.

Developers are planning to build condominiums on the site of a recently burned historic building, right in downtown Iuka. Construction could begin as soon as this May, said developer Chuck Kay, who is completing designs and plans with partners Brent Brewster and Johnny Harbor.

The three or four-story multi-family unit will be built in the location of, most recently, the All-American Sports Cards shop that was burned by suspected arson last fall. Significant cleanup began last month of the rubble that was left, and the developers are now moving forward with the design stage, and acquisition of appropriate permits from the city, said Kay.

Plans right now are for nine, and possibly twelve 1,470 square foot units, some

of them with three-bedrooms and two-baths. The structure will feature New Orleans-style wrap-around balconies and wrought iron trim. There will also be an elevator for easy access, said Kay.

Kay said they hope construction can be completed in about 15 months.

"We are looking forward to the project and we feel it will help revitalize our beautiful downtown," said Kay. More information is available from him at 424-3105.

Sign Theft Causes Problems in Rural Areas

One supervisor had a road repair sign stolen only 20 minutes after they set it out.

Signs at Bloody Springs in the Mingo Community are disappearing at the rate of several a year, and repeated theft of a "stop ahead" sign threatens the security of one family's yard.

Ambulances have had to

search for more than thirty minutes in some cases trying to respond to emergency calls, because signs had been defaced or removed.

"This is a problem not only here, but all over the state," said Sheriff Glenn Whitlock on Monday, responding to concerns raised at Monday's county board meeting about rampant sign

theft.

According to Whitlock, the signs are being sold for cash to scrap metal dealers, and since they are in secluded areas, they are prime targets for theft.

Bloody Springs resident Ray Russell appealed Monday to county supervisors to help with the problem that threatens the home where his son

Sam's family lives.

One of the recently, and often, stolen signs is a "stop ahead" model near the junction of County Roads 85 and 102 that significantly reduces the number of cars that run through the fence around their yard each year. Without the warning sign, cars are often unable to stop at the sign at the T-shaped intersection.

Last year, a driver actually went through the fence in front, turned the car, and went out another side, missing his house by 10 feet. Three young children, live and play in that yard. They have replaced the fence several times since moving into the old family home in the mid 1990s.

Whitlock said Monday that he doesn't have the per-

sonnel to watch over the signs, but he did agree something needed to be done, suggesting more citizen awareness of the problem.

"We have seen more law [vehicles] driving by lately," said Sam Russell Monday night. "And there was one parked at the old Mingo store just tonight."

20/20 Vision Despite Glaucoma

One of the dangers of glaucoma is that you can have the disease in its early stages and not know it. This can cause serious accidents. Take the case of the chauffeur who never had an accident until he was 55. His first accident was minor. The motor vehicle bureau vision test showed 20/20 in each eye. This was a test for central vision and only for an eye chart viewed at 20 feet. In his second accident, a tragedy, he killed a child. The child was cycling to the right of the car, and the chauffeur never saw him until it was too late. When his eyes were examined, it showed glaucoma had reached the stage where his side vision was impaired. Unfortunately, he had never been tested for the disease before.

Glaucoma causes increased pressure of the fluids within the eye and may cause serious damage. The process is usually slow but ultimately may cause blindness. A test for glaucoma is standard in most eye examinations, especially for people over 40.

Tishomingo County receives \$750,000 of the money for the projects and must submit requests for reimbursement by June 30, 2008, according to NMPDD Economic Development Coordinator Wanda Christian.

Water Management District Update

The board received a

visit from Jimmy Mills, executive director of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District, a state agency that handles watershed protection and flood control issues in the 12-county district it serves.

The 31 member board has 2 representatives from Tishomingo County, Gerald Parsons, appointed by the board of supervisors, and Jerry Don Keith, appointed by the governor. Approximately 1 mill of the county taxes goes toward the work of the District, and the

county currently has at least \$17,000 appropriated as it's share.

Seven items that the agency is in the process of starting for the county include:

- Cleaning out Sand Creek between old and new Hwy. 72 in Burnsville.
- Investigating a remedy for the rapidly leaking Haines Lake in Tishomingo State Park.
- Carter's Branch
- Several creek issues in the town of Paden
- Cripple Deer flooding, which is affecting several landowners.
- Railroad ditch in Belmont

Mills said that the county needs to submit paperwork on five of these, some of which have been in progress since 2002. Acquiring easements for the projects are the responsibility of individual supervisors, and it is difficult to convince landowners to sign such a thing, explained supervisors.

The board had a long closed/executive session on economic development in the afternoon.

Local Quilter Wins Best In Show at Smoky Mtn. Quiltfest

For the second year in a row, a local quilter has won Best in Show at the Smoky Mountain QuiltFest in Pigeon Forge.

Dorothy Dailey, a charter member of the Needle Chasers Quilt Guild that meets in Iuka, won Best in Show and Viewer's Choice over hundreds of other quilts at the Pigeon Forge show that attracts quilt submittals from all over the country.

This was the first time Dailey, of Burnsville, has entered a quilt in this judged contest, though her exquisite hand work has won ribbons at local shows and across the region, including in Tennessee the Mid-South Fair and Bethel Springs quilt show, and at large shows produced by the Tupelo and Florence, Alabama guilds.

This is the second year in a row that a quilter from the Needle Chasers Quilt Guild has won the Best in Show prize, and viewer's choice at the Smoky Mountain Quiltfest. Last year, Norma Grissom, of Farmington, won the same prize on a quilt that went on to win Best Handwork-manship at the American Quilt Society's Nashville show in August.

Dorothy attended the show Wednesday through Friday with her daughter, Brenda and saw her Best of Show Ribbon then. The prize money is \$4,000 and since the quilt also won Viewers' Choice, as selected by the hundreds of visitors to the show throughout the week, she won an additional \$250 and a Brother sewing machine.

Dailey, who has been quilting avidly since retiring from Kimberly Clark in 1995, is considering plans to show the quilt at one of the premier shows in the country in Nashville in the summer. She

The State of Mississippi recognizes individuals with developmental disabilities during the month of March. One of the service providers in Tishomingo County is Tishomingo Industries. I asked Barry Sykes, Program Director of Tishomingo Industries in Iuka, for information regarding this facility and others like it throughout Mississippi.

Tishomingo Industries provides vocational training and real work opportunities to individuals with developmental disabilities. Work training is geared to jobs in the local economy and to skills which are beneficial in any environment. Real work opportunities are created by bringing sub-contract work from businesses into the workshop so that the individuals can train and earn wages.

Tishomingo Industries presently serves 16 individuals, and has the capacity to serve up to 22 individuals. This facility does sub-contract work for TBEL in Tishomingo. Individuals assemble back-up alarm kits and manual kits. They also perform sub-contract work for ACCO Ind. in Lincolnshire, IL. The individuals make Emuoo musical staff lines for the Illinois business. Birdhouses are also built and sold locally. Mr. Sykes said,

"There is always a need for more sub-contract work."

The workshop has over 4,000 square feet of workspace, inventory control, a quality control policy that states "satisfaction guaranteed," a bid price piece-rated production, the knowledge and ability of 4 floor managers, and free information and counsel on hiring individuals with developmental disabilities including tax breaks you may be due.
