School Board Hears Budget Comments, Leases Daycare

The Tishomingo County School Board heard comments about the 08-09 budget Monday, and has approved several personnel changes and adjustments in recent meetings.

The annual public budget meeting was Monday afternoon, and one person attended, reported Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall. A few questions directed toward Financial Director Beth White were answered, and the budget will be presented to the Board at the June 23rd meeting for their approval,

said Kuykendall. At the Monday regular meeting, the board approved the privatization of the daycare that has been operating at the TCHS campus for years. The daycare facility will be leased out, explained Kuykendall. "We've been losing about \$50,000 a year on it and it was time to do something' different," he said. Whoever operates the

daycare will still be under all the state regulations applicable, ensured board members. In other business Mon-

day, the "Good Monday" holiday was removed from the school year; children and staff will all come to school the day after Easter starting next year, said the superintendent.


John Barnett, a TC graduate, will teach science and social studies at TCHS, and volunteer with the football and baseball teams.

About 30 students failed 9th grade English this year, and since they declined summer school opportunities to make up the credit, they will have to repeat 9th grade English, verified Principal Eddie Britton. They can proceed with other courses, but have to have the 9th grade English before they can move on to the upper level English courses that are also required for graduation.

In the English II writing assessment test, 100 percent of the students at TC passed, and all but one passed from Belmont High School, stated Kuykendall.

Britton said he hopes to have similar results on the other state-required tests for which results are expected soon.

Hundreds of volunteers working toward a goal made something happen in Belmont last week that no other town in the county has managed.

They completed Kidstown Station, a new handicapped accessible, community playground at the Blue Springs Park in Belmont.

The development is just south of the old Belmont Depot building at Blue Springs, and within sight and a quick walk of the Belmont Youth Baseball Complex, and Belmont School. Since it is near the old depot building, (which was moved to the hilly Blue Springs Park from its original location near downtown) the playground has a railroad station theme, explained Tammy McDowell, who was volunteering in the art tent. For the last three years, organizers under the name Belmont Area Parks and Recreation Organization (BAPRO) have been raising funds to complete the project, designed by Leathers & Associates with input from local representatives and children. Last Tuesday through Saturday, as many as 200 volunteers contributed muscle power, organizational skill and just regular helpfulness to the playground effort, and it was opened for

The 100th anniversary of the Town of Tishomingo kicks off in a big way this weekend with a motorcycle show and 100-mile ride.

From 10 a.m. to noon there is a motorcycle show downtown, with prizes awarded every half hour, reported organizer Paula Rushing. The event is sponsored by Main Street Cycle in Tishomingo.

Categories for the show include Harley, Metric, Touring, Trike and Sportsbikes. There is no fee for the show.

At 1 p.m. trophies will be presented and at 1:30 all the gathered cyclists will go on a 100-mile ride, including members of the Christian Motorcyclist Associa-

FEMA Grant Assistance Offer Extended for Storm Shelters

Due to overwhelming interest, a FEMA program that helps homeowners pay for storm shelters has been extended, reported the county Mississippi Emergency Management direc-

About 27 homeowners m Tishomingo County have bought the storm shelters under the plan in which FEMA (Federal Emergency) Management Agency), brough a Hazard Mitigation Grant, pays 75 percent of the cost of getting one, said Bill Strickland, who heads up the Tishomingo County Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security.

Strickland has taken an additional 80 applications from county homeowners interested in participating in the grant program. Under the program, FEMA provides a list of acceptable contractors for the 8' x 10' above ground or in-ground shelters. Then, the homeowner has the shelter installed, pays for it, and sends FEMA the bills and invoices. Then FEMA reimburses 75 percent, explained Strickland.

The deadline for submitting an application is



Sudden Flashes And The Retina If you've been disturbed by sudden flashes in your eyes, this may be caused by an irritation of the retina. The retina is a layer of lightsensitive cells located in the back of the eye. When it is stimulated (or in this case irritated) it is capable of sending only one sensation to the brain: light. Just as the nerves in other organs have specific purposes - the ear for receiving sounds, the nose for smell and so forth light is the only sensation the retina can transmit. Even if the retina was pricked with a sharp pin, the only sensation it would transmit to the brain would be a flash

SECTION 3. Prohibition of Ramps, Jumps and Similar Devices

No person shall construct any ramp, jump or similar device for use by a person with a skateboard, roller blades, roller skates, or similar device in any public area or on any highway, street, alley, sidewalk, walkway, railway, entrance or exit to which the public or substantial group of the public has access, any other place used by vehicles or conveyances within the City of luka or any property on which skateboarding, roller blading, roller skating, or similar device has been prohibited or which contains a sign prohibiting construction of ramps, jumps or similar devices.

SECTION 4. Prohibition of Wax or Similar Substances

- Sidewalks
- Walkways in the City parks
