### Carmack Signs with NEMCC Tennis

BOONEVILLE, Miss.-Northeast Mississippi Community College head tennis coach Ricky Smither has announced the signing of Briana Ashcraft (Alcorn Central) and Summer Carmack (Tishomingo County) to his Lady Tigers tennis team. NEMCC women's tennis is making the move up to Division I competition in the Fall of 2008 making the local pair the first scholarship signees for Northeast's women's tennis program since the 2004 season.

"What a way to start off our women's signing class," said Smither. "With the ability to award scholarships we can now go out and attract players of this caliber. Briana and Summer are outstanding players and will raise the competitiveness of our team right away. Also, by signing two big-time players we automatically help ourselves in the recruiting of other quality players to our program."

Summer Carmack advanced to the 4A State semifinals during her freshman, junior, and senior seasons at Tishomingo County High School. She won her first, individual district title as a ninth grader in '04-'05, and later captured the title again as a senior in '08. Her 2008 Lady Braves team earned the district title. Following her senior campaign, Carmack was named a Mississippi Tennis All-Star.

### School Board Hears Budget Comments, Leases Daycare

The Tishomingo County School Board heard comments about the 08-09 budget Monday, and has approved several personnel changes and adjustments in recent meetings.

The annual public budget meeting was Monday afternoon, and one person attended, reported Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall. A few questions directed toward Financial Director Beth White were answered, and the budget will be presented to the Board at the June 23rd meeting for their approval, said Kuykendall.

At the Monday regular meeting, the board approved the privatization of the daycare that has been operating at the TCHS campus for years. The daycare facility will be leased out, explained Kuykendall. "We've been losing about \$50,000 a year on it and it was time to do something different," he said.

Whoever operates the daycare will still be under all the state regulations applicable, ensured board members.

In other business Monday, the "Good Monday" holiday was removed from the school year; children and staff will all come to school the day after Easter starting next year, said the superintendent.

Six transfers for students were approved by the board.

Recently, the board has approved the hiring of Cliff Little as the new girls' varsity basketball and girls' track coach at Tishomingo County High School. He formerly coached the East Webster (Webster County) boys to a state championship basketball win, and was the assistant for the girls' team that was a state

runner up, said TCHS Principal Eddie Britton.

Other personnel hires and adjustments are:

Malcolm Brown will be assistant coach for TCHS varsity girls' basketball, and Tim Yeager will take over the Iuka Middle School girls' basketball team.

B.J. Nunley graduated from TCHS and will teach at TCHS and Tishomingo Middle.

John Barnett, a TC graduate, will teach science and social studies at TCHS, and volunteer with the football and baseball teams.

Dana Bonds, who had been an assistant at the TCHS computer lab, will teach business computer technology at the Tishomingo County Vocational Education Center.

About 30 students failed 9th grade English this year, and since they declined summer school opportunities to make up the credit, they will have to repeat 9th grade English, verified Principal Eddie Britton. They can proceed with other courses, but have to have the 9th grade English before they can move on to the upper level English courses that are also required for graduation.

In the English II writing assessment test, 100 percent of the students at TC passed, and all but one passed from Belmont High School, stated Kuykendall.

Britton said he hopes to have similar results on the other state-required tests for which results are expected soon.

### Belmont Volunteers Complete Kidstown Station Playground

Hundreds of volunteers working toward a goal made something happen in Belmont last week that no other town in the county has managed.

They completed Kidstown Station, a new handicapped accessible, community playground at the Blue Springs Park in Belmont.

The development is just south of the old Belmont Depot building at Blue Springs, and within sight and a quick walk of the Belmont Youth Baseball Complex, and Belmont School. Since it is near the old depot building, (which was moved to the hilly Blue Springs Park from its original location near downtown) the playground has a railroad station theme, explained Tammy McDowell, who was volunteering in the art tent.

For the last three years, organizers under the name Belmont Area Parks and Recreation Organization (BAPRO) have been raising funds to complete the project, designed by Leathers & Associates with input from local representatives and children.

Last Tuesday through Saturday, as many as 200 volunteers contributed muscle power, organizational skill and just regular helpfulness to the playground effort, and it was opened for

children about 5 p.m. Saturday evening. An official dedication is to be announced in the near future, said Debbie Pharr, who was operating a band saw and overseeing the artistic details when first interviewed late Tuesday.

Tools, equipment and skills were donated to the well-organized cause, and even children helped carry water, paint in the art tent, and run errands on-site. Some volunteers were present at every shift all week.

People from all walks of life were in on the project, and inmates from Tishomingo County and Alcorn County put in many hours alongside community members.

"When I saw those children break through the chain and get to play for the first time, it made every bit of it worth it," said Becky Adams, who was one of the people who, years ago, first approached Mayor Bob Yarbber about the possibility of having a Kidstown-style playground in her hometown. She had taken her grandchildren to the play-

ground in Corinth and started wondering, "why can't we have one like that in Belmont?"

From that beginning, the BAPRO was formed, and support for the project grew, until they finally got to start the project last week, said Adams.

Lowe's Charitable and Educational Foundation contributed a \$25,000 grant to the BAPRO project, but there are still expenses that must be covered. A 2008 Ford Mustang is being raffled for \$100 a ticket. It will be given away the day of the official grand opening, and tickets are still available at Yarbber Drugs, Belmont Café, Spirit Bank, First American Bank and Piggly Wiggly in Belmont or by calling 454-9766.

### FEMA Grant Assistance Offer Extended for Storm Shelters

Due to overwhelming interest, a FEMA program that helps homeowners pay for storm shelters has been extended, reported the county Mississippi Emergency Management director.

About 27 homeowners in Tishomingo County have bought the storm shelters under the plan in which FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency), through a Hazard Mitigation Grant, pays 75 percent of the cost of getting one, said Bill Strickland, who heads up the Tishomingo County Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security.

Strickland has taken an additional 80 applications from county homeowners interested in participating in the grant program. Under the program, FEMA provides a list of acceptable contractors for the 8' x 10' above ground or in-ground shelters. Then, the homeowner has the shelter installed, pays for it, and sends FEMA the bills and invoices. Then FEMA reimburses 75 percent, explained Strickland.

The deadline for submitting an application is

June 30th, said Strickland. Applications are available in the Emergency Manage-

ment Office in the basement of the courthouse in Iuka.

### Sudden Flashes And The Retina

If you've been disturbed by sudden flashes in your eyes, this may be caused by an irritation of the retina. The retina is a layer of light-sensitive cells located in the back of the eye. When it is stimulated (or in this case irritated) it is capable of sending only one sensation to the brain: light. Just as the nerves in other organs have specific purposes - the ear for receiving sounds, the nose for smell and so forth - light is the only sensation the retina can transmit. Even if the retina was pricked with a sharp pin, the only sensation it would transmit to the brain would be a flash of light.

Even a tiny pull on the retina or a momentary stress on a tiny blood vessel caused by a slight rise in blood pressure may result in a flash of light to the brain. An occasional flash may be harmless. But it may also be an early warning of detachment of the retina, which can cause serious vision problems. Only an examination by your eye specialist can determine the cause and how it can best be treated.

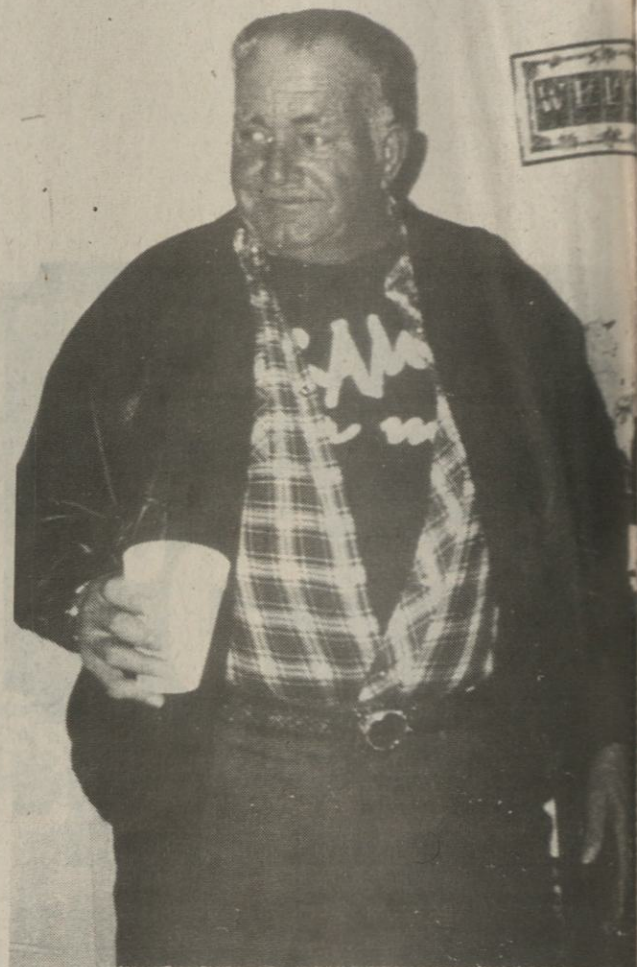
University of Mississippi Chancellor Robert Khayat and Dr. Dan Jones, UMMC vice chancellor for health affairs and dean of the

Congratulations to several world language students from Tishomingo County High School who attained national recognition for excellent performance on the 2008 National Spanish Examinations.

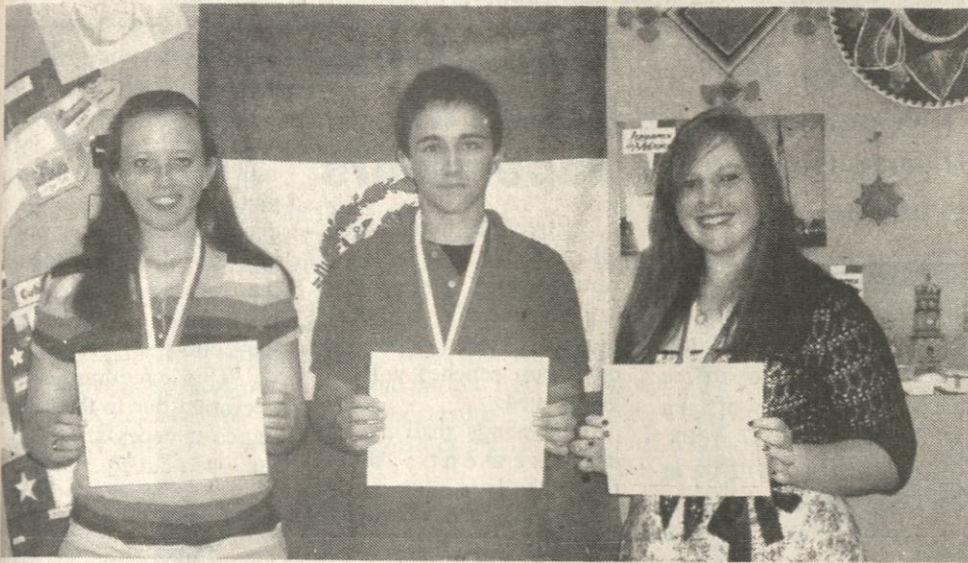
Students from TCHS earned a total of 3 bronze placements along with 3 honorable mentions. "Attaining any placement or

## Rebecca Gray To Be An Honored Guest Of Japanese Government

This June, Rebecca Sinner Gray of Iuka will depart for Tokyo, Japan as a participant in the Japan Fulbright Memorial Fund (FMF) Teacher Program. Mrs. Gray, who teaches at Hardin County High School in Savannah, Tennessee, was selected from a national pool of over 1,700 applicants by a panel of educators to earn this honor. This program allows

distinguished primary and secondary school educators in the U.S. to travel to Japan for three weeks in an effort to promote greater intercultural understanding between the two nations.

Rebecca will be among 160 educators visiting Japan in June. They will begin their visit in Tokyo with a practical orientation on Japanese life and culture and meet with Japanese

government officials and educators. They will then travel in groups of 16 to selected host cities where they will have direct contact with Japanese teachers and students during visits to primary and secondary schools as well as a teacher's college. They will also visit cultural sites and local industries in addition to a brief home stay with a Japanese family.

The trip is fully funded and sponsored by the Government of Japan, which launched the FMF Teacher Program to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the U.S. government Fulbright Program, which has enabled more than 6,000 Japanese citizens to study in the U.S. on Fulbright fellowships for graduate education and research. The Institute of International Education acts as the agency for the Japan Fulbright Memorial Fund to coordinate the recruitment

and pre-departure activities of the Teacher Program in the United States.

Up to 320 educators from all 50 states and the District of Columbia will be invited to visit Japan in June and October of 2008 (160 in each group). To date, more than 6,000 primary and secondary school educators have visited Japan through the JFMF Teacher Program. Upon her return, Mrs. Gray, along with other program participants, will share what they have learned about Japan with their students and communities through a variety of outreach projects.

## USDA, Rural Development To Discuss Housing Programs

June is National Homeownership Month and USDA Rural Development is moving the Rural Development field office and staff to the City of Iuka on Tuesday, June 17, 2008. The local office will be at the Iuka Public Library in Iuka from 9:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m.

This move to Iuka will allow the citizens of Iuka and Tishomingo County to visit with the USDA Rural Development Office Staff to discuss their housing needs and the Loan and Grant Programs administered by Rural Development.

Rural Development has programs available for new home construction; purchase of existing homes and home repairs. For further details about these programs you may obtain the details by visiting with the office staff on June 17th while in Iuka, or contact the Corinth office located at 3101 Mullins Drive, Corinth, MS or by calling 662-287-7223 ext. 4. Loans are available for low income individuals and are subsidized by the Government in order to provide a reduced monthly payment. Loans are also available to assist moderate income households to obtain financing of homes. The moderate income range for Tishomingo County can range from 43,300 up to 93,400 depending on number in the household.

Families must be without adequate housing and be able to afford the mortgage payments including taxes and insurance and have satisfactory credit history.

## Notice from Board of Supervisors

Effective immediately, all utility crossings (water, sewer, gas, phone, etc.) installed under County Roads shall be bored crossings; open cut trenches will not be allowed.

Crossings shall include encasement pipe that extends a minimum of 3 feet beyond the ditch line or edge of pavement, whichever is greater. All

costs associated with the crossing shall be at the Owner's expense. Prior to beginning work, the applicant shall obtain and complete a crossing permit indicating the location, size, and type of utility proposed for the crossing. No work shall begin until approval from the County is received.

This requirement is necessary due to the escalating costs necessary to maintain open-cut crossings.

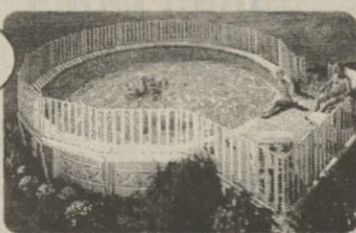

Fred Truesdale, NMMC-Iuka administrator, said, "As leaders in the health care industry, we must step up and proactively advocate healthy life habits, chief of which is the abstinence from tobacco products. It is key for our organization to deter unhealthy behaviors on our campuses that adversely affect those in our population who choose to make healthy choices."

Beginning July 8, all NMHS locations, whether the facility and grounds are owned, leased or rented, will be tobacco free. The new policy will apply to everyone on those premises. 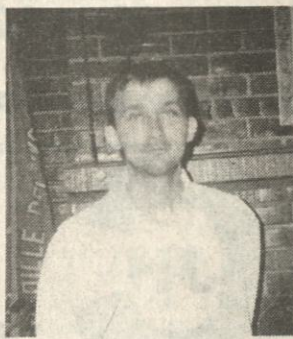
## Belmont Resident Looks Forward To Attending NEMCC

## Greg Ross Graduates From Fire Academy

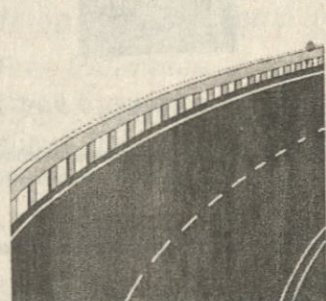

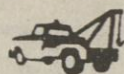

## LEGAL NOTICE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THAT CERTAIN ORDINANCE DATED JUNE 3, 1992, PROHIBITING SKATEBOARDS, BICYCLES, MOTOR SCOOTERS, MOTORCYCLES AND ROLLER SKATES ON THE SIDEWALKS WITHIN MINERAL SPRINGS PARK; TO ADD DEFINITIONS; TO ADD PROHIBITION OF SKATEBOARDS, ROLLER SKATES, ROLLER BLADES AND SIMILAR DEVICES; TO ADD PROHIBITION OF RAMPS, JUMPS AND SIMILAR DEVICES; TO ADD PROHIBITION OF WAX AND SIMILAR SUBSTANCES; TO ADD EXCLUSION OF PROHIBITION; TO ADD VIOLATION AND PENALTIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen that there has been an increased problem with persons riding skateboards, roller skates, and roller blades on public streets, right of way, sidewalks and walkways within the public parks, that not only create a danger for the riders, but for the vehicular traffic and pedestrians that have to avoid these riders; and

WHEREAS, the City of Iuka, Mississippi, finds and declares that the purpose of this ordinance is to protect the public health and welfare by prohibiting skateboarding, roller skating, roller blading and the like in public places within the City and its parks and upon its streets; and

WHEREAS, it will promote the public health, welfare and safety to prohibit skateboarding, roller skating and roller blading in certain areas as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, that the certain ordinance dated June 3, 1992, prohibiting skateboards, bicycles, motor scooters, motorcycles and roller skates on the sidewalks within Mineral Springs Park, is hereby amended to add the following:

### SECTION 1. Definitions

(a) Skateboard - A single platform mounted on wheels, having no mechanism or other device with which to power, steer or control the direction of movement thereof while being used, operated or ridden.

(b) Public area - for purposes of this ordinance includes all roads, streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, municipally-owned parking lots, public easements, paths and sidewalks. Public areas also shall include privately owned parking lots, which are open to the public for parking and walkways within the City parks. This term does not include privately-owned roads, driveways and areas not open to the general public.

(c) Roller blades (in-line skates) and roller skates - A device having more than one set of wheels affixed to shoes or boots and used to glide over surfaces by an individual.

### SECTION 2. Prohibition of Skateboards, Roller Skates, Roller Blades and Similar Devices.

Except in those areas specifically provided and designated by the City for such purposes, no person shall operate, propel and/or

ride any type of skateboard, roller skates, roller blades or similar device in any public area or on any highway, street, alley, sidewalk, walkway, railway, entrance or exit to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access, or any other place used for passage of persons or vehicles, within the City of Iuka or any property on which skateboarding, roller blading, roller skating, or similar device has been prohibited or which contains a sign prohibiting the use of skateboards, roller skates, or roller blades thereon.

### SECTION 3. Prohibition of Ramps, Jumps and Similar Devices

No person shall construct any ramp, jump or similar device for use by a person with a skateboard, roller blades, roller skates, or similar device in any public area or on any highway, street, alley, sidewalk, walkway, railway, entrance or exit to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access, any other place used by vehicles or conveyances within the City of Iuka or any property on which skateboarding, roller blading, roller skating, or similar device has been prohibited or which contains a sign prohibiting construction of ramps, jumps or similar devices.

### SECTION 4. Prohibition of Wax or Similar Substances

It shall be unlawful for any person to place wax or other similar substance commonly used to provide a lubricated surface for the purpose of easing the movement of skateboard, roller skates, roller blades or similar devices in or on any of the following locations within the City of Iuka:

1. Streets
2. Sidewalks
3. Walkways in the City parks
4. Alleys
5. City-owned structures
6. Entryways of buildings, including but not limited to steps leading up to entrance of buildings.
7. Property on which skateboarding, roller blading, roller skating, or activities have been prohibited or which contains a sign prohibiting the placement of wax or other lubricating substance thereon.

### SECTION 5. Exclusion of Prohibition

The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to wheelchairs or other devices designed to aid handicapped or impaired persons when operated by such persons. Nor shall anything herein prevent the City from establishing specially designated areas or constructing ramps, jumps, platforms or similar structures in its parks and other public places in and upon which persons may lawfully operate skateboards, roller skates, roller blades or similar devices.

### SECTION 6. Violation and Penalties

a. A person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and confiscation of the skateboard, roller blades or roller skates for a period of seven (7) days.

b. Each day or each event on which a violation of this article occurs shall be considered a separate and distinct violation.

SECTION 7. All provisions of the ordinances of the City of Iuka, including but not limited to the aforesaid ordinance of June 3, 1992, prohibiting skateboards, bicycles, motor scooters, motorcycles and roller skates on the sidewalks within Mineral Springs Park, in conflict with that ordinance are hereby repealed, but all other provisions of that ordinance and any other ordinance not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be published in The Tishomingo County News-Vidette, a newspaper having a general circulation within the City of Iuka, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, for the information and guidance of the citizens of said City.

SECTION 9. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after its passage.
