Elderly luka Man Shot; Suspect In Custody

Hezzie Whitlock, Father of County Sheriff and Tax Collector, Killed

Two Tishomingo county families are eeling with disbelief following the Friday afternoon shooting of an Iuka man in his

Shortly after 3 p.m., June 20th, Hezzie Whitlock, 91, was shot in the chest with 2.22 pistol while sitting beside his wife, and felean, in their Ash Street home.

According to investigators, Mrs. Whitlock identified the shooter as her great-VBS mephew, Josh Vandiver, 28, of 206 CR 169. 28th fro luka. Officers immediately went to his d needs home and took him into custody without formano incident

Vandiver was charged with murder by the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation. In n initial appearance Monday morning, Ishomingo County Justice Court Judge Billy Glover set bond at \$500,000.

Mr. Whitlock was administered resustation efforts at the home by emergency esponders and at the hospital, where he was pronounced dead. The body was sent to ackson for an autopsy, which is routine for teaths in which criminal action is susected, said Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon.

Hezzie Whitlock was the father of both ishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, and Tishomingo County Tax ollector Paul Whitlock.

The investigation has b e e n handed over to the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation Division of the Mississippi Highway Patrol, due to the relationship of the victim

to the sheriff, not because the suspect lives outside the city limits, as has been reported elsewhere. Vandiver is being held in Lee County for the same reason.

No Motive Known

luka police investigators spoke at length with the suspect and he has indicated no motive for the shooting, said luka Police Chief Randy Stringer.

Whitlock family members and investigators have verified that Vandiver's grandfather is the brother of Mrs. Jean Whitlock, and there was a peaceful purchase and pickup of an automobile from Hezzie

Whitlock earlier in the day last Friday. Both Josh Vandiver and his grandfather, Junior Horne, visited the home to pick up the vehicle, investigators said.

Contrary to rumors, Mr. Whitlock and young Josh had no known conflicts.

"We are just perplexed, to say the least," said Hezzie's son Paul Whitlock on Monday. "Daddy was a farmer all his life. and he never met a stranger," said Paul. "He refused to say anything bad about anyone." **Two Families Affected**

The Vandiver family is similarly puzzled over the behavior of Josh, who they think may have been affected mentally by a series of wrecks, and the deaths of his father and his grandmother. They have recently observed an increasing imbalance in his behavior, said his mother, Barbara

They said they were in the process of seeking help last Friday in getting treatment for the young man, who has had no history of violence or conflict with the law, and didn't have any personal conflict with Mr. Whitlock, according to family members.

Hezzie K. Whitlock died June 20th. He was a member of Pleasant Hill United Methodist Church and was a friend to

School Board Eyes New Policy for High School Student Checkout

The Tishomingo County School Board met Monday night and heard a proposal from the superintendent for changing the current policy that allows high school students to be checked out by a parent's phone

"We have exam-Tishomingo ined similar policies in eight other regional School districts, and all but two have eliminated it," said Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall. At another district, a student was hurt during a falsely

executed early dismissal. The current policy allows a parent to call the school and tell officials to release the student, explained the superintendent. The widespread, but forbidden, use of cell phones by students may have contributed to the proposed

After graduation, a student in the county actually let his principal know that he had called on his own behalf to be dismissed multiple times, and that his parent had never called, said Kuykendall.

What the superintendent proposes is for a par-

ent, or their appointee, to sign out any student in person. Additionally, the school can ask that person

for identification. "Our only goal is to protect the stu-dents," stressed Kuykendall.

Any parties with concerns or suggestions are asked to call the superintendent's office at 423-3206 before July 9th, so

Board that they can be addressed at a discussion on the subject at the July 14th school board meeting.

In other business, the board made some changes to address the increase in fuel costs. Cost of fuel in the mostly rural system was \$255,000 last year, and is projected to be at least \$400,000 next year.



Nearsightedness Not A Disease...

Nearsighted children often become nearsighted during the years of their most rapid growth. It is not unusual for them to require stronger glasses as often as every six months, outgrowing their prescriptions with every inch they gain in height.

This is not a happy situation, but is certainly no cause for alarm. A child's nearsightedness will NOT indefinitely. progress Rather, since it seems to be connected with growth in way, the nearsightedness will generally level off when a person reaches adulthood.

Years ago, myopic children were encouraged to avoid reading. In extreme cases they were actually kept out of school. That was rather medieval. Today the opinion is that ordinary reading or schoolwork is ok as long as the child has the proper visual correction. Please remember that myopia (nearsightedness) is not a disease - it's a visual deficiency that can be corrected.

Letter to the Editor

First off, I would like to make it clear that I do not feel that all police officers are bad. I have friends who are police officers. One thing about them that is the same as all other officers is that they are not above making mistakes. because any officer makes a mistake doesn't make them a bad police officer.

Yet, in Burnsville it goes far beyond just making simple mistakes and has been that way for far too long. I can't believe that I am the only one who thinks so, I may be the only one to say it but NOT the only one who thinks it. There have been no signs that it's going to get any better. In fact it seems to be getting worse. It isn't that the law is not being enforced but that JUSTICE is not being done either.

One man was arrested by Burnsville PD for "Disorderly Conduct Failure to Comply" MS law (97-35-7) after a woman came to their apartment and started a fight with the man's wife. The husband broke the fight up and called the police and was the one who got arrested. The women were not arrested even though the woman who attacked the man's wife was still on the property and trespassing. The judge noted this fact in his ruling but still found the

man guilty. The police refused to take the woman into custody as a citizen's arrest which is what the husband wanted before he was arrested. MS law (99-3-1 sub. 1) the law that gives the police the power to make arrests as police officers and states in the last part of that paragraph that "Private persons may also make

In fact the only way to have some one arrested for a misdemeanor if the police do not see it and in some cases even if they do is to file a complaint at city hall and only if the judge issues a warrant. MS law (99-3-1 sub. 1) doesn't require a citizen to file a complaint

before making an arrest for a crime they themselves saw even if they were the victims of the crime but this law has never been enforced.

Burnsville PD arrested another man after he walked out to his driveway to see what was going on when the police had a man stopped that pulled into the end of his driveway. At court the police said the reason they arrested the man that lived in the home was because the police officer told the man to go back inside his home and instead he just backed off some 25 to 30 feet and sat on the back of his own car and watched. The man was arrested for "Disorderly Conduct Failure to Comply" MS law (97-35-7). It should be pointed out that the man that had been stopped was still sitting in his car while the other man that was just watching was arrested. Only after did the police find that the man in the car was driving without a license and was arrested

himself. Burnsville PD broke up a fight in the middle of the street. The police only arrested one of the women who were fighting. The police officer said that the other woman did not have a weapon even though two witnesses, one about 100 yards away and the other 20 yards away, said they both had weapons. The woman that the officer arrested was charged with aggravated assault.

The next day the police told the woman that was arrested that she couldn't

sign papers at city hall to have the other woman charged and arrested as the police in the first case I spoke about said that you could do. If this is not playing favorites I don 't know what is.

Burnsville PD gave another person a ticket for failure to yield for emergency vehicle when he did pull over in less than seven tenths of a mile when it was safe to do so. The driver was not trying to

evade the police. He was just young and an inexperienced driver. Burnsville PD frisked the driver and his girlfriend and found nothing.

These are just what I have seen and heard myself. There must be others out there that know of more and maybe even worse. If you have you should make a complaint to the mayor and to the board of aldermen in Burnsville as soon as possible. Don't let up until something is done to stop it. Police act like this is what causes citizens to distrust in their government.

Don't be like others that say they just don't want to get involved. That is how the police get away with things like this and it could be only a matter of time before it happens to you and if you don't speak up who will, me? It's not going to stop for one person but it will for many.

As much as I would like to put all the blame on the officers who were involved with each of these cases I can't. The courts and the aldermen and mayors of Burnsville past and present have allowed these actions to happen. The board of aldermen are the one's that hire police officers in Burnsville and responsible by MS law (21-4) sub.

investigating misconduct of police and department and misconduct is found to act accordingly including but not limited to firing an

MS law (21-8-17 sub. 1) makes the mayor the supervisor of departments in municipality which includes the police department and order the officer to drop a charge by MS law (21-15-9). MS law (21-15-15) gives the mayor the power to remit and vacate fines. Also the court has the authority to find some one not guilty. Now is the time for them to do the jobs they were elected for and appointed to do or it is time for the citizens of Burnsville to elect those who will. Please don't sit back and let things like this happen in our own town.
