## County Archives & History Museum Thrives on Shoestring Budget

County supervisors hear annual report from executive director

The Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum (TCAHM) plays a vital part in maintaining the history of our county on a shoestring budget. Monday, Executive Director Jan Anglin, and RaNae Vaughn visited with the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to let them know the status of the Museum's activities for the last year.

The Museum is the latest county entity to "introduce itself" to the newer members of the board, and Mrs. Anglin provided an in-depth report for the board members, including visitor information and museum activities, and updates on the ongoing renovation of the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse, for which Anglin has secured more than \$90,000 in grants.

The TCAHM runs an extensive museum of county history in the old courthouse, from the Chickasaws, to Iuka's glory days (before 1958) as the "Marriage Capital of the South," to the present. In the last year, old floors have been replaced, the interior has been painted, and some exterior repair has been done, reported Anglin.

"We have tried to keep everything as historic as possible," Anglin explained, stressing their intent to keep the historic look of the building that was built in 1870. "We are trying to locate more photos of the courthouse to justify a metal roof, for that reason, and because we believe it will last longer than anything else."

Their goal is to maintain the building for a long time, and to rid the historic structure of some unpopular residents - bats. Anglin even stepped on a bat once, and they are not good neighbors, she assures.

### Tourism Attraction

People from all over the country visit the

museum exhibits and its genealogical archives, tracing their roots back to Tishomingo County, where hundreds of families settled in the 1800s, or came through on their way to destinations beyond. Anglin said just in the past month, she has spoken to visitors from Texas, California, and Arkansas.

Many visitors are people who have been married fifty or more years, and were married at the historic courthouse, said Anglin. They get local visitors, too, including even the "skateboarding" boys who come in to admire the arrowheads and artifacts. She anticipates more local and regional visitors, with the escalation of fuel prices.

Another growing tourism draw is geocaching, about which Anglin admits she is just learning. But, Board President Brandon Grissom said there are hundreds of geocaches hidden in the county, including some of his own. Geocaching is an outdoor treasure-hunting game in which the participants use a Global Positioning System (GPS) receiver or other

navigational techniques to hide and seek containers (called "geocaches" or "caches") anywhere in the world. A typical cache is a small waterproof container containing a logbook and "treasure," usually toys or trinkets of little value.

### Operation & Funding

The museum receives \$20,000 a year from the county to operate, and the remainder of its \$35,000 budget is earned through donations and sales of gifts and publications through its gift shop. It barely covers necessary expenses, like a \$600 heating bill that is sure to increase this year, but the museum remains debt free, operating on a lot of volunteer hours and by pursuing grants.

They ask at the door for a \$2 donation to visit the courthouse, and are hoping for other donations, like some new copiers and other office equipment. They gladly accept donations of both the monetary and volunteer variety.

"Even if someone can just help with menial tasks, they are welcome!" said Anglin.

### Premier Historical Archive

The museum accepts

all manner of historic objects and photographs, and indeed, has become an important historical consultant for many in the county who find something that they think has historic value. In one instance, a family found an 1876 grave found under a house in Belmont when the house was being torn down, and they called the museum. Museum employees and volunteers record stories from people all over the county, because in the absence of a university history department in the area, they are the best custodian of historic information.

The employees and volunteers attend many conferences each year, at their own expense and have not only learned much about running the museum and archive, but have publicized the museum, earning recognition and grant-earning attention.

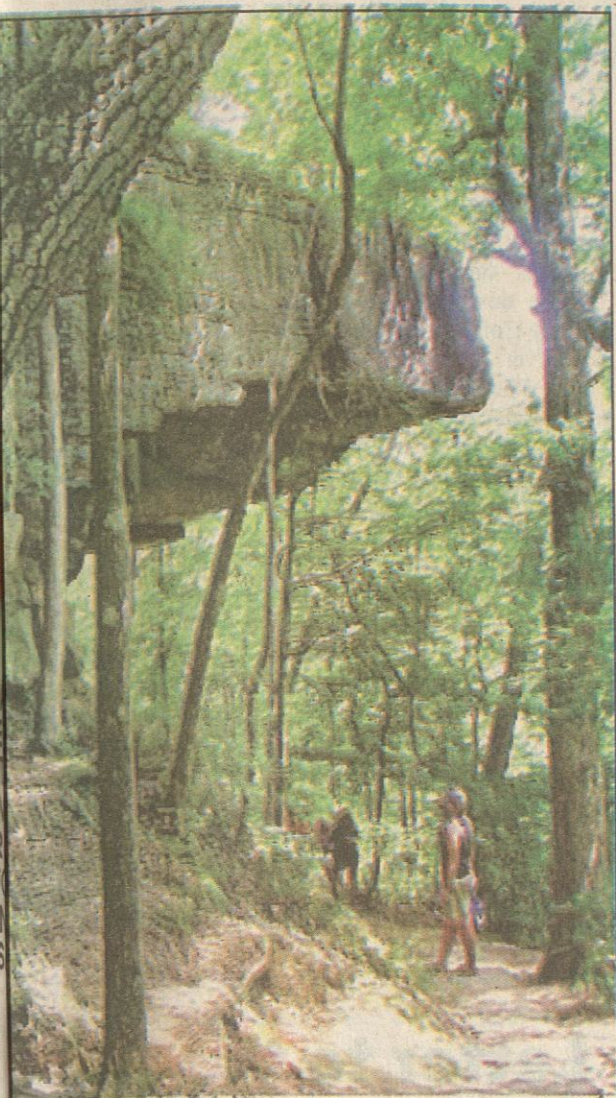
Following the presentation, the board said they appreciated the update, as they are beginning work on the new county budget in the next week.

## CEPA Taking Nominations for Board of Directors

In accordance with the laws of Tishomingo County, Electric Power Association, nomination for positions on the Board of Directors are now being accepted. There will be four positions open for election. The director is to be elected a three(3)-year term for the following supervisor districts: First, Second, Third, and an Area-large position.

Members of the Association may make nominations by either of the following methods:

1. By petition bearing signature of at least ten(10) members; nominations must be received by the Secretary of the Board of Directors at least ten(7) days prior to the date of the Annual Meeting. Nominations may be presented at the Main Office of the Association during regular business hours, Monday thru Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

2. From the floor of the Annual Meeting to be held August 9, 2008. The By-laws require that five (5) percent of the membership

be physically present in order that nominations may be made from the floor.

Nominees must be residents of the supervisor's district which he or she will represent. Any member, regardless of place of residence, may be nominated for the area-at-large position, provided, that the nominees for the at-large position may not be a resident of the second supervisors' district. The second district presently has a resident serving in an at-large position.

## County Development Foundations Meets New Industry

The board of directors of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation met with Iuka city officials at the new Iuka plant of Erway, Inc., on June 27th.

Plant Manager, Jim Hutto explained that Erway, Inc., was about 10 years old. The company is owned by the Tiffin family. The 120,000 SF plant is a Tri-State Commerce Park but the company had run out of space. The 80,000 SF Iuka building was purchased and owned by the City of Iuka and the company moved in recently.

The Iuka plant manufactures the side and panels for motor homes using a unique process that produces the largest panels in the industry. Resins are mixed within a negative pressure airtight bag that reduces emissions. Any fumes are further filtered through special filters before being exhausted to outside air.

With the slowing economy, Waterway, Inc., is up to full production. Waterway, Inc., also has not completed the installation of equipment and office furnishings.

Board members discussed the recently

completed environmental assessments on five industrial sites in Tishomingo County. The environmental assessments had no findings. Recommendations on geotechnical services were made to each municipality and the port authority. The industrial sites are 20 to 30 acre sites. Two of the sites are in Burnsville in the Northeast Mississippi Waterfront Industrial Park. One site each is in the Belmont Industrial Park, Iuka Industrial Park, and Tishomingo Industrial Park.

Board members heard a report on the grant applications for rebuilding the service road to Dynasteel.

Board members were advised that the Mississippi Development Authority had awarded TCDF a marketing match grant of \$5,200. The grant will be combined with TCDF funds of \$5,200 to pay for advertising on the Southern Auto Corridor web site over the next 12 months.

Board members approved up to \$6,000 to match the tourism council investment in printing of a new visitors guide to Tishomingo County. Mid-South Fine Printers of Amory was the low bidder.

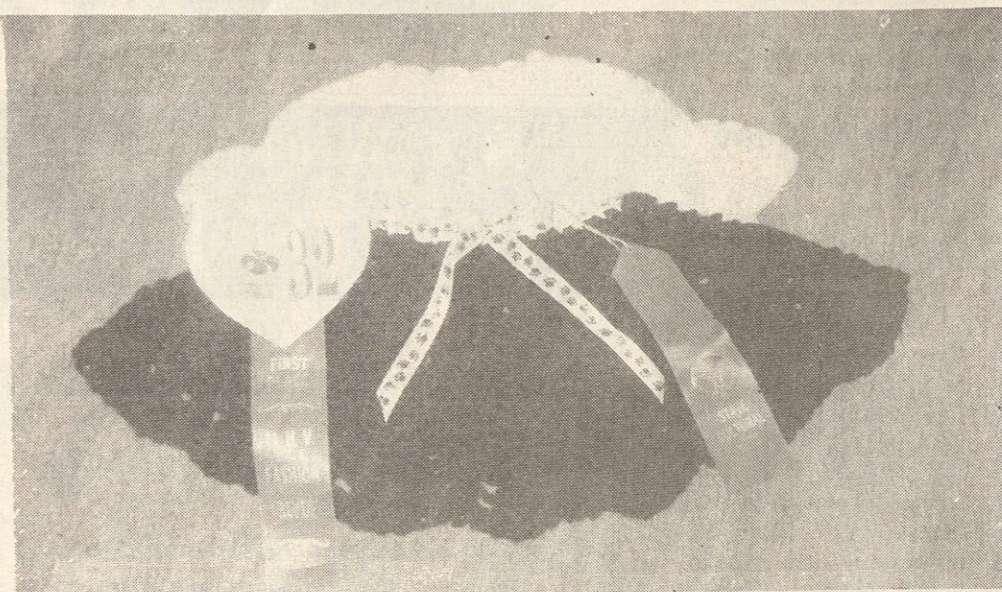

# Tishomingo Centennial Celebration a Success

More than 1,500 people attended the final event of Tishomingo's Centennial celebration, and turnout for every event was outstanding.

On Wednesday night about 400 attended the community singing service at Gospel Lighthouse Pentecostal Church. The congregation sang songs from throughout the years, and enjoyed a perfectly concise, entertaining history lesson by retired Tishomingo principal, coach, and history teacher Dr. Danny McClung. He had people's memories rolling back the years with references to the woodbug and Calaboose, Fran Theater and a wing for cash that used to be held in town on Saturday afternoons.

Some of the musical highlights of the night included an old Sacred Harp song, *When I Can Read My Bible Clear*, performed by select members of the Tishomingo Baptist Church choir (the Hundred-Year chorus, worship leader by McRae called them), accompanied by pianist Molly Savoy and alto saxophone played by Bart Umbley of Belmont.

Spontaneous applause erupted, even in the middle of the song, when Sara Sanner camp, also accompanied by her Molly on piano, played the *Tishomingo* song, a nationwide jazz hit in the 1920s. And the choir's rendition of *Out to the Lord* had hands and people standing over the congregation.

McClung's closing remarks were particularly poignant, as he described a

town that has lost many of its former industries and businesses, its high school, and has an aging population.

Building off the current Centennial Tree campaign, in which hundreds of new trees have been planted all over town to commemorate the Centennial, McClung said, "We need to plant trees—but living, human ones."

He described how this little town has grown and nourished hundreds of people within, surrounding and far beyond its approximately one-square-mile. He urged those present to focus on nourishing the growth of the young people who are growing up here now, in order to build the strong citizens of the future this town will need to face future challenges, he said.
