Economic Decline Hitting Home in Tishomingo County

Tishomingo County is feeling the impact of the economic decline evident in the rest of the country, and it hurts just a little more to the home.

Locally, gas prices haven't yet exceeded the \$4 that other parts of the country are paying, but the sudden cost increase in the last year is impacting the budgets of local families, businesses and institutions.

Cheap, abundant and accessible fossil fuels allowed us to create a world in which we are relatively unconstrained by geography, especially those of us in Tishomingo County. Years we have thought of heading off to shopping destinations or places that are thirty, fifty or miles away, just to get what we want, or to save a few cents at a bigger discount box store; maybe get a little more.

"This era is passing in history, and it is not likely this process can be reversed," says Rod Dreyer, columnist with the *Dallas Morning News* in a recent opinion piece titled "Geography Reasserts its

Tyranny."

"There is simply not enough oil being extracted quickly or inexpensively enough to meet global demand—nor, in all likelihood, will there be again. This is called peak oil."

Peak oil is a far more urgent crisis than climate change, yet its economic and social effects are not even on the agendas of the national candidates, or of state and local officials.

Every petroleum-dependent aspect of our economy, from our far-flung distribution systems for consumer goods to the daily commute is going to continue to get more difficult to sustain.

Impact to School System

The Tishomingo County Schools' fuel costs increased 43 percent in the 2007-08 school year (from \$181,149 to \$259,508), and that period ended right when the prices were climbing the fastest in the late spring. For the next fiscal year the schools' budget for fuel has been raised 73 percent.

"We've raised the

budget for fuel to \$450,000 for the next year," said Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall. "We just hope we have budgeted enough."

So what gets cut when the system has an increase like that?

"Right now, we are just tightening up and cutting down on extras, like not rehiring a central office position that was recently vacated," he explained. "We are looking at other options to save without affecting student services."

Talk is circulating of shorter school weeks, but the only option that has any life right now is a school year reduced by 10 days, which would have to be approved by the state legislature, said Kuykendall. The ten-day cut would allow students to go home earlier for summer break, but the days would be available for teachers to utilize for professional development, he said. This is an option the state superintendents' association has recommended

New Mobile Welding Lab Delivered

A new mobile instructional facility to teach welding skills has been delivered to its temporary home behind the courthouse and will soon be open to teach much-needed skills.

Several community colleges cooperated in the effort to set up the \$250,000 facility that will train workers in the much needed skills to support employment requirements at several metal processing factories in the area. Tishomingo County got the lab first, because it has the greatest need for welders and other metal workers at the several metal processors located in the county: FerrouSouth, PSP Monotech, RollForm, Dynasteel and Skyline Steel, all at Yellow Creek Port, and TBEI in Tishomingo. Power and utilities are being connected this week.

Using a multi-district grant funded by Three Rivers Planning and Development District, and Appalachian Regional Commission, Northeast Mississippi Community College, ICC, East Mississippi Community College and Northwest Community College created the fully-equipped lab that will have its home in Tishomingo county for the next few months, or until they don't have any more persons needing training. Classes will begin about the end of August, and will be offered both during the day and in the evenings to help supply the great need for welders in the county.

Co. Students Score Well on US History & Biology Tests

County high school students performed admirably on recent state-mandated Biology and U.S. History exams, announced the superintendent's office Tuesday.

Only one student, out of 199, failed the high school Biology I test, which is required for graduation, said Tishomingo County School Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall.

Three out of 184 students taking the U.S. History test failed, and Belmont High School had 100 percent passing the state required test.

The Biology I and U.S. History tests have not changed yet to the NAEP (National Assessment of Educational Progress) standard, which is viewed by some as a more difficult testing method.

Iuka Baptist Church Commemorative Ornaments Available to Order

The Iuka United Methodist Women's organization is now offering 2008 commemorative ornament, featuring the old Iuka Baptist Church.

The old church stood from 1915 to 1965, and the ornament features the Pearl Street entrance. This building was razed in 1965 to build a larger building to house the growing congregation.

Tina Steenerson, a North Carolina artist handcrafts each ornament using traditional stained glass materials and techniques in which an image is transferred onto translucent white glass. The images are hand tinted and kiln fired. The edges are edged in copper, making each ornament individualized.

Superintendent Plans No Change in High School Checkout Policy

High school students will be able to check out in accordance to current rules and guidelines, for the time being.

Tishomingo County School Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall announced Monday that at this time, the administration and board are taking no actions to change the current checkout procedure, but are still

evaluating the situation.

"We are planning to look at how we are enforcing the policies we have in place, which should be enough to stop the problem, if they are enforced," said Kuykendall.

Recently, the administration said they were looking at requiring in-person sign outs by a parent for all 9-12 grade checkouts, in-

stead of the current phone-in system, which had reportedly been abused by students. The safety of students when they leave the school was the primary consideration for the move.

The board met Tuesday night, July 15th and is scheduled to release new rosters of teachers and coaches at each campus in next week's *News*.

State Superintendent Hank Bounds request of the Mississippi State Legislature, said Kuykendall.

Impact to County

The Tishomingo County Supervisors are starting work on the new county budget this week, and are anticipating an estimated 35 percent jump in their fuel budget, to accommodate fuel usage by the landfill, sheriff's department, district workers and volunteer fire departments.

They have not yet formally considered what the escalating cost of petroleum-based road repair products is going to do to that budget item. Since last year this time, the cost to resurface a mile of road has gone up fifty percent, from about \$60,000 to \$90,000.

Local Impacts

Businesses are tightening their belts, too.

Though he doesn't know of anyone cutting back to four-day workweeks, Tishomingo County Development Foundation Executive Director Gary Matthews said that he has heard some local industries considering the option. The primary benefit of this action would presumably

mean less money spent on energy costs for a reduced workweek.

The increased difficulty in acquiring loans, and the sudden increase in energy costs are combining to slow the economy, Matthews said. Industries are reconsidering new projects and expansions, and are moving any new plans further into the future.

Companies involved in manufacturing of consumer goods are suffering, said Matthews. But ones producing goods consumed by corporations or governments, construction or major infrastructure are still doing well, he explained.

Matthews said the biggest impact is the unwillingness of several current economic prospects to commit to projects here in the county.

Families Impacted

Economic analysts say that as of last month, Americans have never before spent a greater part of their income on energy costs. The sooner we come to terms with the reality, the sooner we can begin taking serious steps to adapt.

Half of all income earned by Tishomingo

county residents is actually spent outside the county, said Matthews.

But, people are starting to rethink their habits of driving to Corinth, Florence or Tupelo as often as they might have this time last year. One the bright side, that should eventually result in local retailers offering what people are looking to buy; and service providers to offer services here that families have been driving elsewhere to receive.

Families are making the choice to stay closer to home on the weekends, too. Both J.P. Coleman and Tishomingo State Parks are seeing many more local visitors, in addition to the normal crowd. Park workers said the recent holiday weekend was one of the busiest in 20 years at J.P. Coleman State Park.

Any Plans for Adjustment?

You can see more gardens than normal, it seems, driving around our county, but is that just a coincidence, or the first steps in behaving in a more energy-secure way? Are we going to learn to live and work in ways that reduce our reliance on oil?

Years ago, communities banded together to get through tough times. They got what they needed close to home, and learned how to be happy with less "stuff." They knew where their food came from, and they appreciated seasonal availability. How will we act now?

Co-workers nominating Katie stated that she does her job well and is always willing to help others. "She is well liked by all and strives to perform well in all she does," the nomination stated.



MS Coach To Be Inducted into National Hall of Fame

Reception to honor Coach James "Chubby"

The National Federation of State High School Associations announced twelve outstanding individuals who will be inducted into the National High School Hall of Fame on July 7 at the Grand Hyatt Hotel in Washington, D. C. Coach James Drewry, football coach at Booneville high school, is one of those select individuals.

Coach Drewry is the most successful public-school coach in Mississippi history with a 320-146-5 record. Still active at the age of 76, Drewry has coached at Booneville High School since 1990 after also coaching there from 1965 to 1978. He has been a role model for his players, and he has always developed character in the young people of Mississippi. Being selected for induction into the NFHS Hall of Fame is one of the most prestigious honors awarded today, and I can think of no one more deserving of this honor than Jim Drewry."

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF SAID MUNICIPALITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,615,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND EXTENSIONS TO THE COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM OF SAID MUNICIPALITY, CONSISTING PRIMARILY OF IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND EXTENSIONS TO THE SEWAGE AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL FACILITIES OF SAID SYSTEM AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "Municipality"), acting for and on behalf of the Municipality, hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. The waterworks, water supply, sewage and sewage disposal facilities of the Municipality have heretofore been combined and are operated as a combined system known as the combined water and sewer system of the Municipality (the "System").

2. It is necessary and advisable and in the best interest of the Municipality and its inhabitants to issue combined water and sewer system revenue bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of One Million Six Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$1,615,000) to raise money for improvements, repairs, and extensions to the System of said Municipality, consisting primarily of improvements, repairs and extensions to the sewage and sewage disposal facilities of said System (the "Authorized Purpose"), for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand.

3. The Governing Body has employed Dean McRae Engineering Inc., Iuka, Mississippi, competent engineering firm, to study the System, determine the nature and extent of the improvements, repairs and extension necessary thereto, and make an estimate of the cost thereof.

4. Said engineers have determined the nature and extent of the necessary improvements, repairs and extensions to the System and have made an estimate of the cost thereof. Based on that information, the estimated cost thereof is the aggregate amount of One Million Six Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$1,615,000).

5. Said improvements, repairs and extensions are necessary, are economically feasible and would be in the public interest and of benefit to the Municipality, and the findings of said engineers are hereby adopted, including the estimate of the costs of said improvements, repairs and extensions.

6. Under the provisions of Sections 21-27-11 through 21-27-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), the Municipality is authorized to make such improvements, repairs and extensions and to provide for the payment of the costs thereof, or any portion of such costs, by and through the issuance of bonds, the principal and interest of and on which shall be payable from the revenues of the System.

7. The Municipality reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures for the aforesaid purpose prior to the issuance of said bonds and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse such expenditures made in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds.

8. A sum not exceeding One Million Six Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$1,615,000) must be provided and raised by the issuance of special obligation bonds in said amount, payable both as to principal and interest from the revenues of the System, as authorized by the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body does hereby declare its intention to issue combined water and sewer system revenue bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of One Million Six Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$1,615,000) (the "Bonds") for the Authorized Purpose. Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), the Governing Body hereby declares its official intent to reimburse expenditures made for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bond with proceeds of the Bonds to the extent permitted by the Reimbursement Regulations.

SECTION 2. Said bonds in the amount, for the purpose and

secured as aforesaid will be authorized to be issued at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at the City Hall on August 5, 2008, at 7:00 o'clock p.m., which date so fixed will be more than ten (10) days after the third (3rd) date of publication of this resolution, as directed by Section 3 hereof. If a petition signed by not less than twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of the Municipality be filed objecting to and protesting the issuance of such revenue bond issue on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then an election on the question of the issuance of such bonds shall be called and held as provided by law. If no such protest be filed, then such bonds may be issued without an election on the questions of the issuance thereof, and may be sold under the regular procedure for selling such bonds.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in the Municipality, and being a qualified newspaper under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. The first (1st) publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-five (25) days prior to the date fixed herein for issuance of said bonds, and the third (3rd) such publication shall be made more than ten (10) days prior to the date specified in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk of the Municipality shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of publication of this resolution and to have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

It is necessary and advisable and in the best interest of the District and its inhabitants to issue water system revenue bonds of the District in the maximum principal amount of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) to raise money for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, improving, bettering and extending the System (the "Authorized Purpose"), for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand not already being used for the Authorized Purpose.

3. The Board has employed Dean McRae Engineering, Inc., Iuka, Mississippi, a competent engineering firm, to study the System, determine the nature and extent of the improvements, betterments and extensions necessary thereto (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"), and make an estimate of the cost thereof.

4. Said engineers have determined the nature and extent of the Project and have made an estimate of the cost thereof, based on such estimate, the estimated costs are in the aggregate amount of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000).

5. The Project is necessary, is economically feasible and would be in the public interest and of benefit to the District, and the findings of said engineers are hereby adopted.

6. Under the provisions of Section 19-5-151 through 19-5-207, Mississippi Code of 1972 (the "Act"), the District is authorized to accomplish the Project and to provide for the payment of the costs thereof, or any portion of such costs, by and through the issuance of the Bonds (as such term is hereinafter defined), the principal and interest of and on which shall be payable from the revenues of the System.

7. The District reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of the Bonds, and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse expenditures made in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds.

8. A sum not exceeding Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) must be provided and raised by the issuance of the Bonds in said amount, payable both as to principal and interest from the revenues of the system, as authorized by the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Board does hereby declare its intention to issue water system revenue bonds (which may be issued as one or more bonds) of the District (the "Bonds") in the maximum principal amount of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) to raise money for the Authorized Purpose. Pursuant to Section 1-150-2 of the Treasury Regulations (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), the Board hereby declares its official intent to reimburse expenditures made for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds with proceeds of the Bonds to the extent permitted by the Reimbursement Regulations.

SECTION 2. Said Bonds in the amount, for the purpose and secured as aforesaid will be authorized to be issued at a meeting of the Board to be held at the Tishomingo County Water District, Water Office, in the City of Iuka, Mississippi on August 12, 2008, at 6:30 o'clock p.m. If a petition signed by not less than twenty percent (20%) or one hundred fifty (150), whichever is the lesser, of the qualified electors of the District be filed objecting to and protesting the issuance of the Bonds on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then an election on the question of the issuance of the Bonds shall

be called and held as provided by law. If no such protest be filed, then the Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof, and may be sold under the regular procedure for selling bonds issued pursuant to the Act.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Mississippi, no newspaper being published in the District, and having a general circulation in the District, and being a qualified newspaper under the provision of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, the first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for issuance of said bonds, and the last such publication shall be made not more than fourteen (14) days prior to such date.

SECTION 4. The Secretary of the District shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of publication of this resolution and to have the same before the Board on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.


