State Auditor Returns \$66,000 To County

State Auditor Stacey Pickering has recovered \$66,104 on behalf of Tishomingo County after former Sheriff David Smith and former Chief Deputy Sheriff Rodney Pannell were issued a demand for \$76,000 of missing equipment and missing funds. The State Auditor's Office received a complaint following a routine audit and conducted a thorough investigation which led to demand. investigation was opened in August 2002 and closed in 2008. The funds were

recovered from Smith's bond company and the Sheriff's Tishomingo Department.

"I am pleased to return this money to the taxpayers of Tishomingo County, said State Auditor Stacey Pickering. The State Auditor's Office conducted thorough a very investigation which led to the recovery of these funds. As State Auditor, I will continue to hold elected officials and county employees to the highest standard of accountability and will continue to hold

elected officials responsible for any misuse of taxpayer property and money."

David appointed sheriff Tishomingo County in 1994 and served as sheriff until 2004. Pannell served as the chief deputy sheriff under Smith until 2004. Since taking office January 10, 2008, State Auditor Stacey Pickering has recovered over \$1 million in misused, misappropriated embezzled funds. Pickering was elected the 41st State Auditor for the State of Mississippi.

Aaron Bath Participates In ROTC Cadet Training Program



Aaron R. Bath

For most college students taking the summer off between their sophomore and junior years, life is usually filled with a summer job, time at the beach or a little extra time in front of their favorite video game.

For the son of an Iuka couple, this summer is quite a bit more strenuous. Aaron R. Bath, son of Kent and Allison Bath of County Road 989, Iuka, is an Air Force ROTC cadet going through a boot camp of sorts, during a more than three-week physical and mental challenge designed to prepare more than 2,300 cadets nationwide for eventual commissioning as a second lieutenant.

This is the first year that

cadets have converged to one single location for their training, with the most sweeping changes to the program in more than 60 years. For Bath, it's the toughest challenge he'll face during his ROTC stint. "The toughest part of this training is being on the move from 4 a.m. to "lights out" at 9 p.m.," said Bath, who is a 2004 graduate of Tishomingo County High "Overall, my School. expectations for field training have been met and it is a tough and demanding program."

The ROTC field training course is divided into three phases: The first 11 days of the training is primarily devoted to classroom work, focusing on leadership, marching and problem-solving scenarios. Each group of about 30 cadets then move into a more intense, six-day training at the "Blue Thunder" camp, a tent city set up t Maxwell. There, the cadets learn hand-to-hand combat, land navigation, tactical communication, face leadership reaction obstacles and qualify at the small arms range on the 9 mm pistol.

For the first time, cadets

will wrap up their training with a six-day exercise at the Joint Forces Training Center at Hattiesburg, Miss., in an environment that gives them a safe look at what they might face if deployed to or Afghanistan. Iraq Reaction to roadside bombs, conducting convoy operations, learning small arms tactics and getting their first look at urban warfare situations are some of the challenges awaiting these

"While being here, I have learned the importance of time management, decision making, and situational awareness. These skills will help me to succeed in the Air Force as well as within my last two years of school." Bath is currently attending Mississippi University, pursuing a in degree aerospace engineering. "I am working towards a pilot rating and plan to be commissioned in
