Buchanan Cabinet Shop Destroyed After Lightning Strike

Family rebuilding & plans to start back up by early September

A longtime Tishomingo cabinet business was destroyed by fire after an assumed lightning strike Thursday evening.

Buchanan's Custom Cabinet Shop on County Road 55 was about eighty percent destroyed by fire, despite the best efforts of area firefighters. The fire was called in by neighbors, and by the time Jody McClung, Chief of the Tishomingo Volunteer Fire Department arrived at the scene, the building was fully involved. Along with Tishomingo, Fire's Branch, Midway and Eden fire departments responded.

The cause is not known, but the Tishomingo area experienced thunderstorms with frequent lightning during the late afternoon and evening Thursday. According to Pejoe Arnold of the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, about 1,500 homes were without

power after the Tishomingo substation was struck by lightning.

"There was a lot of fuel there, including a paint room," McClung explained, about the cabinet shop fire. He and some of the Buchanan family members on the scene were able to get some completed cabinets out of a storage room on the end of the building that suffered less damage, but many of their tools were destroyed. Robert and Brenda Buchanan were self-insured, as insurance premiums on a facility with paint equipment were prohibitive, they said.

The shop was built in 1980, said Brenda Buchanan, who works alongside her husband and two sons, Tim and Randy, at the shop. They build custom cabinets that are in hundreds of homes from Tishomingo to Tupelo, Olive Branch and Memphis, said Brenda.

It is not the first time the busi-

ness has caught fire, and family members said they are always alert during lightning storms. The last time was 18 years ago, but the damage was not anywhere near what it was this time, Brenda said.

Reopening Soon

With help from friends, the Buchanans were able to clear the damaged area by Friday afternoon, and by Sunday night, they had started rebuilding, and had a roof deck up.

"We plan to be back in business in the next week or so," explained Brenda. They have several orders to fill, she said. They were so thankful for the outpouring of support from neighbors, friends and clients, said. "David Whitfield, especially, used his backhoe to help us clear up, and will start with the electrical wiring Monday."

Bay Springs Resort Plans Described to Civic Leaders

City Council, Aldermen, Legislators, etc. get more information on proposed resort development

The concept of a \$300 million resort in Tishomingo County is a hard to believe for people.

Who would come to a rural area, even with a lake with lots of fishing and water recreation opportunities? Where would visitors come from? The surrounding towns

These are just some of the questions that prospective developers of a Bay Springs Lake resort tried to answer for county mayors, legislators, developers, officials and aldermen at an informal session last weekend in Belmont. Turned by statements of 10 construction jobs and permanent jobs, there are about 35 civic, school and state leaders present.

Doug and Kristine described in simple terms their plans for a family resort on 1,000 acres of previously unused property along the shores of Bay Springs Lake. They wanted town leaders to better

understand their preliminary plans for Bay Springs Resort, for which they are refining plans in the coming weeks.

They described plans for a high-end resort with 600-900 member-owned cabins, a hotel and convention center and many luxury amenities like golf courses

professionally designed by European golf celebrity Tony Jacklin, and a world-class marina designed by Brandy Marine, all in a package aimed to earn the approval of Audubon International. This group will address environmental sustainability and helps communities take steps to en-

sure that they are healthy and vibrant places in which to live, work and play, both today and tomorrow, according to their website.

The resort features and

So, Who Would Come? Would This Work Here?

You only have to look a few miles north to see what developed lakefront property can bring to an area.

Pickwick Lake started filling more than 50 years ago, and since then has become a huge draw for fishermen, boating enthusiasts and other tourists. According to Tishomingo County Tax Assessor Diana Turner, there are at least 200 lake homes that are "second homes;" owners use them only part of the year.

Additionally, there are about 125 lake homes for which the owners file homestead exemption, meaning they consider them their primary residence.

Hundreds of homes in areas near the lake, like Pickwick Pines, attract people from the region, too. And the prime location drives up the value of the property, which means more taxes are collected on

those properties, Turner said.

"There are people who are interested in a second home, a lake home, and they like having a town nearby in which to shop and sometimes become a part of. Many clients are looking for second homes with plans to retire later and they want it to be near a community," said a local realtor who has been dealing with Pickwick Lake properties for years.

What about the price? Who could pay \$300,000 for a place like the ones Martel is planning?

Concerning Pickwick, when you take into account the lake view and lakefront homes, \$300,000 is about an average price, said Turner.

Martha Segars Representing State at Republican Convention

The list of accomplishments of Tishomingo's Martha Segars is long and impressive, and she just added another one—she will be a delegate to the Republican National Convention in St. Paul next week.

She has held positions on many governmental, regulatory, church and volunteer boards through her years of community involvement. Currently she is active on the Board of Directors of the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway Authority, the CREATE Foundation Workforce Board, and the Board of Trustees at Tishomingo United Methodist Church, just to name a few.

She has been active for years in tourism in this county, and was recognized as Volunteer of the Year in the state for her work organizing the Trash-to-Treasures Along the Tishomingo, a 234-mile long series of yard sales from Demopolis, Alabama to Burnsville.

And most importantly, she says, she is grandmother to five, mom to three and sweet wife to Dr. Kelly Segars.

She said she believes in the Bible, and that is what drives her belief in the ideals of the Republican party. She and Dr. Segars have been to Republican conventions before, and you might see photos of them with prominent Republicans hanging in their offices.

When Governor Haley Barbour's office called her to be a delegate, she said she was very hesitant and after much consideration, decided to accept the honor.

She says she has since learned that being a delegate has a few more strings attached than just attending the convention. And she is not even a "super" delegate, she joked.

The GOP website says, "Convention delegates represent their state or territory of residence and cast a vote toward the nomination of the Republican Party's candidates for president and vice president of the United States."

"We will have breakfast meetings, and go on the convention floor at 2:30 in the afternoon," she explained. "We get a break, but we have to be there until 10!"

There will be lots of meetings, and luncheons, and she will attend a luncheon honoring Gov. Barbour. She is one of two women delegates from northern Mississippi.

She has already been contacted directly by several media outlets, and said there will 15,000 members of the media at the convention.

"You wouldn't believe the things they have thought it was ok to ask!" said Martha.

Mrs. Segars will be heading off to the convention at the Xcell Energy Center in St. Paul next weekend, but first she has to fulfill obligations in Mobile at the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway Conference.

Mobile Lab Aimed at Meeting Regional Need for Welders

Years ago all the community colleges in the state disbanded their welding programs; they sold the equipment and put their resources toward other vocational and traditional programs.

Today, local industries are hurting for qualified, trained welders—in Tishomingo County, steel processors are looking to fill about 700 welding jobs. In nearby Barton, Alabama, a Canadian National Railway railcar plant that is being built will need 1,000 welders.

The need is strong, and a consortium of area colleges have joined together to get some welding instruction available. The result is a \$200,000 teaching facility that will serve first in Tishomingo County, and then move on to other areas in north and eastern Mississippi.

The facility officially opened with a ribbon cutting last Thursday, and representatives of government, community colleges, and industry were present. They attended a luncheon afterwards at Homestead Restaurant.

Northeast Mississippi, Itawamba, Northwest and East Mississippi Community Colleges are involved in the training program as

the Mississippi Corridor Consortium, and Nadara Cole of NEMCC coordinated the effort. Funding for the project was provided by the Three Rivers Planning and Development District and the Appalachian Regional Commission.

The mobile facility that will serve a 27-county region has seven stations inside to train welders in several methods, including mig, tig and stick welding. There are four levels or modules of the training, and each can be completed on its own, as the students have time or resources.

Regarding resources, the Tri-State Foundation is providing some scholarship money to successful applicants. The modules can be done one at a time and cost about \$160 each. Many welders only need Level 2 training explained Wade Oaks, who is the contact person for those desiring the training.

Oaks said there are 70 applicants interested so far. Those interested can contact him at Northeast, any WIN Job Center, or the TCDF Office.

The mobile lab will remain in Iuka for as long as there are students wanting to take classes. Then it will move on to the other consortium colleges.

facilities would also be available for local residents to use, said Doug Martel. Boat docks, an equestrian center, swimming beaches, pools, trails and the golf course would all be open to the public, much in the manner of a state park.

Martel explained funding in generalities — they don't have a lease with the Corps of Engineers, yet. A more defined plan is in process, including the stringent Corps requirements for the site to be used for recreation. When it is complete, the plan will be considered by the Corps. A feasibility study is underway. Funding possibilities will get more specific with the progress of the design and necessary permits and approvals, Martel explained.

They have not requested any funds from the county or anyone else, Martel said. They plan to privately fund the project.

Income from the project will benefit the county, Martel said. The Corps is to receive 2 to 4.5 percent of gross sales, and 75 percent of that goes to the county. The club membership would go for \$250,000 to \$300,000, which is a good market price for a second home with full resort amenities, Martel explained.

Second Homes

"And to people who are in a position to buy a second home, it's a good price. The really big ones are \$500,000, and we sold one for \$535,000 last week," the realtor said. And those don't even have full resort amenities like those proposed at Bay Springs.

The luxury/lake home market is as strong as ever, according to realtors.

Who would come?

Martel said that the proposed market would include Memphis, Jackson, Florence, Tupelo and even closer, Booneville and some Tishomingo countians. To those who are looking for a second home, the distance is no more a consideration than it is to the hundreds who drive regularly to Pickwick Lake from all over the Mid-South.

As for coming to a rural, really rural area like the one you have to drive through to get to Bay Springs — you could consider a place like The Inn at Blackberry Farm, which has become a luxury resort that actually markets its location on a farm.

Doug Martel explained that a golf course is a significant draw in any case, and that boating in the South, like in the Gulf is

TV And Children's Eyes

If you're concerned about how your children's television habits may be affecting their vision, here are a few points to keep in mind. You may want to place limits on the amount of time he spends watching TV, so there will be ample time for study as well as active play and recreation as well as to protect their vision. Too much television watching may cause eye strain and fatigue.

TV should never be watched in a totally dark room. There should be some other light source in addition to the picture on the screen. Also, the TV set should be positioned so no glare will be reflected from sunlight or from another light source. It's also important not to sit too close to the set because of the possible (but remote) harm from radiation. One authority recommends that the viewing distance be at least seven times the width of the screen.

If you notice any signs that their eyes are bothered in any way when watching TV for a long time, have their eyes examined.

Heartington a harmonious blend of styles

Sleek and gently curved, the arched opening in the Heartington's entry porch extends a stately yet unpretentious welcome. The porch's lofty 12-foot ceiling serves as an enticing prelude to the expansive and naturally bright living spaces within.

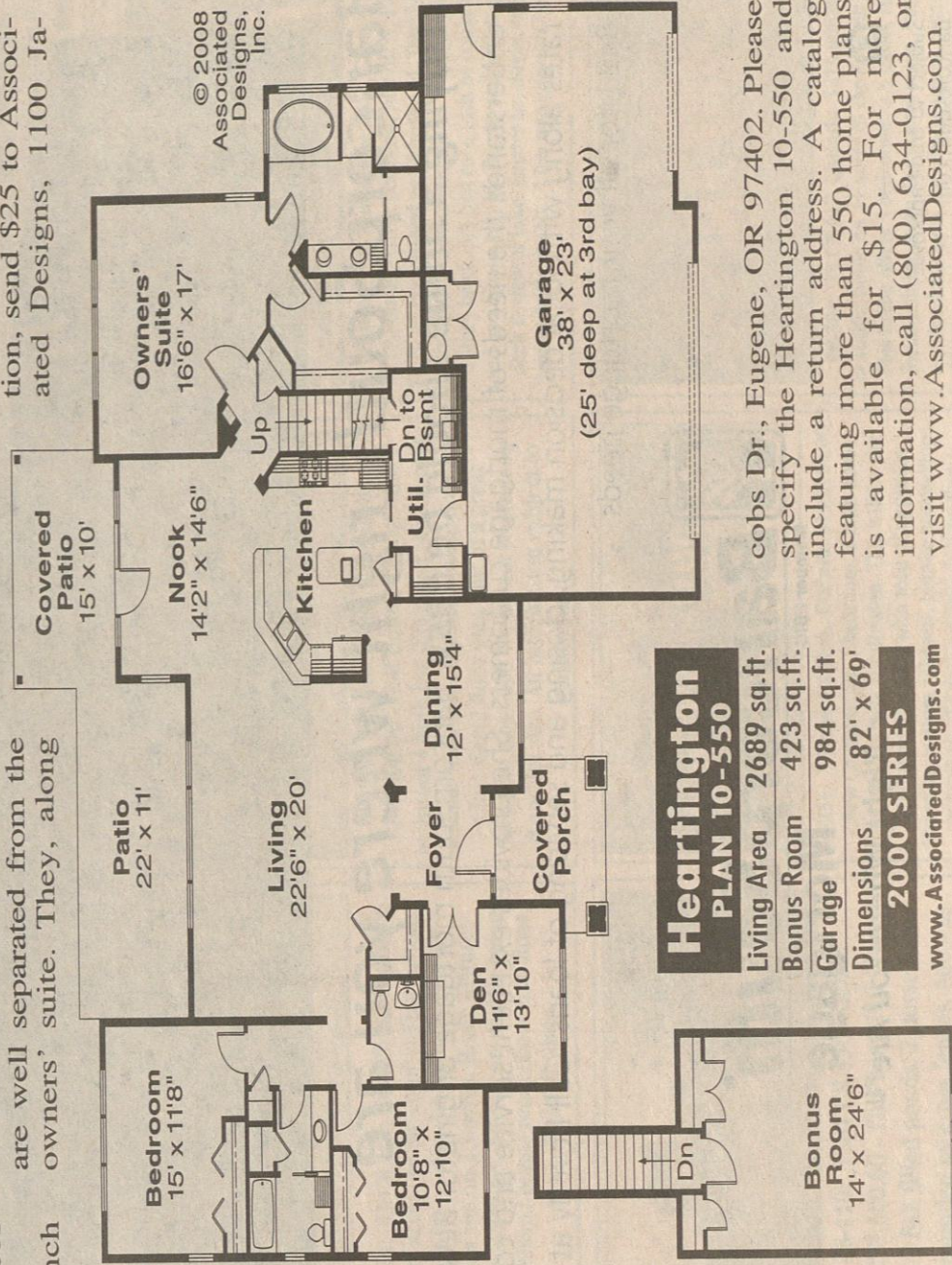

home, a starter home, or a scaled-down dwelling for empty nesters. Its 41-foot-wide footprint fits neatly on a narrow lot.

Tapered columns seated on stone veneer bases support the roof of the wide, recessed front porch, and decorative corbels highlight the ends of both front-facing gables. Multipaned windows, a sidelight and a transom also add their sparkle to the front facade.

Light washes into the foyer through that same sidelight and transom, along with slender panes at the top of the door. A roomy coat closet is just a few steps down the hall.

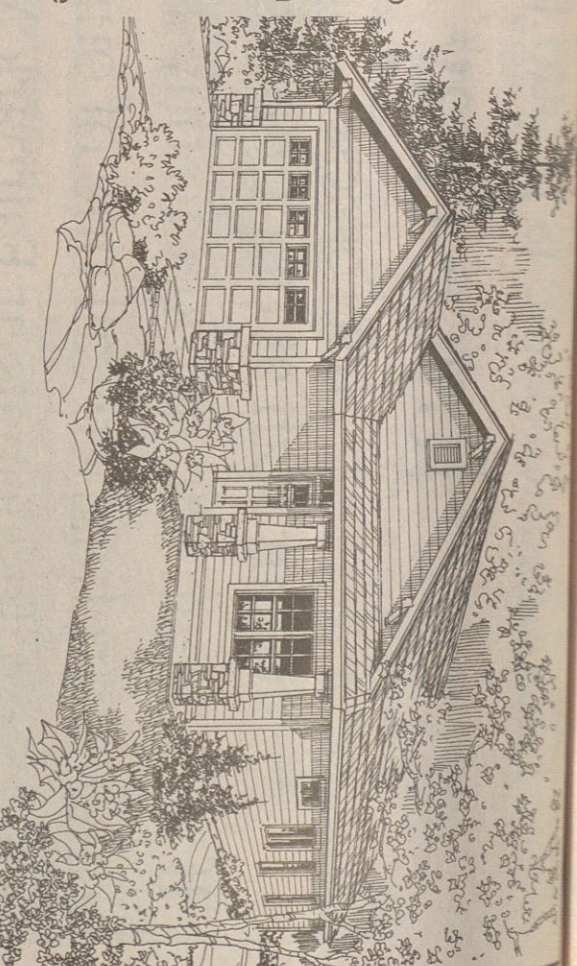
Family gathering spaces fill the home's left side, while bedrooms line up along the right. The living room and dining room flow together, creating one large, window-bright space at the rear. And that space is open to the kitchen as well.

The long eating bar that rims the peninsular counter shares one edge with the dining room, which allows it to double as a buffet for festive family meals and entertaining.
