Board Approves New Millage Rate

The Board of Supervisors voted Tuesday to approve the amended millage for the county, which they explained would not raise taxes.

In adherence to state statute, the board had to issue a notice and hold hearings about a proposed "tax increase," but Chancery Clerk Peyton Cummings explained that actually, taxes were not going up. Rather, the value of each mill collected is going up because the value of properties in the county has increased due to new construction and new businesses.

Only two people attended a hearing last Friday regarding the notice of a tax increase, said Board President Brandon Grissom.

Tax Assessor Diana Turner and her staff have been busy re-assessing properties throughout the county, and she has explained that substantial upscale residential construction around Pickwick Lake, and new industrial construction like that at Yellow Creek Port and Burnsville's Industrial Park has contributed.

In essence, explained Cummings, actual value of each mill has increased, so the county stands to gain more income than previously expected. They have/ been averaging \$112,000 per mill, and they project they could receive approximately \$125,000 per mill. This could help offset anticipated increased costs of fuel for county departments.

The board approved bids to replace heating/air conditioning units at the county building from which the Food Depot operates. The low bid by Daugherty Refrigeration (\$18,240) was approved of the three received from county providers of such services.

They also approved a bid by B&S Structures to build a drive-through canopy on the same building for a bid of \$12,318.

The board approved an insolvency report listing unpaid taxes on mobile homes (\$23,379.34) and personal property (\$15,682.66) from the tax collector.

The board approved travel for the Circuit Clerk to attend mandatory training/judicial college. The county would pay for one night, it was stated, and the

Unknown assailants ed three cows and ind a fourth in an attack week on the Natchez ce.

According to Tishogo County Chief Dep-Jamie Reynolds, someshot the three cows, of them multiple times, severely injured the of the fourth. The incioccurred sometime between 3 and 4 p.m. on August 27th on land leased to Tim Buchanan, of Tishomingo. The value of the dead cows, and the one that is severely injured, is valued at about \$4,000, according to Buchanan.

The cattle were part of Buchanan's herd that lives on land leased to him by the Natchez Trace and surrounds the Cave Spring stop on the Trace.

According to Buchanan, last year someone stole four large calves from the same herd and field, but officials don't know if the two incidents are related.

Buchanan, CrimeStoppers and the Sheriff's department are seeking information leading to the arrest of individuals responsible for the offense, and Buchanan is offering a \$2,500 reward for any information leading to the arrest and conviction of the individual (s) responsible.

County Prepares for Worst; Escapes Gustav

Tishomingo County avoided damage from hurricane Gustav, but emergency officials took action to make sure the county was ready.

County emergency personnel met with the supervisors Sunday to outline emergency preparations in case hurricane Gustav caused bad weather in the county.

The board of supervisors declared a state of emergency, which would allow the county to be eligible for federal emergency funds in case they were needed. At 2 p.m. Sunday, the board and about 35 emergency personnel met under the coordination of Tishomingo County Emergency Management Director Bill Strickland. Mayors, fire chiefs, and Red Cross officials were present to hear the plans that have been put in place, and to hear how they would be activated in case the county experienced storm damage from Gustav, which was threatening the coast Sunday afternoon.

The school system was represented and Iuka Middle School gymnasium was designated as a shelter if necessary – only if Tupelo was filled up. To be an official shelter, there have to be security and medical personnel assigned.

"We have plans in place, and will be better prepared for the next time," said Strickland.

Braves Triumph Over Alcorn Central in Opener, 40-7

If Pritchard takes some time off to ensure a good recovery, then second string running back Luke White could see some playing time against Belmont. White had a touchdown late in the Alcorn Central game when the second string got some experience.

Belmont Coming Up

For next week, Carter is concerned with his defense playing responsibly against Belmont's wing-T offense.

"Everyone has to play their position and be responsible for doing their job, and that takes discipline I did not see in last week's game," he said.

"We are leaps and bounds beyond what we had in the spring, but we need to improve before next week and the rest of the season," said Carter. "We've got to work on blocking during the kicks –we had a lot of first game problems."

neighbors who often watched the kids for me, got a call from Nolaeve. Wanted to know how I'd come through. She said, "Dot is not here, she's in bed with a migraine head ache." Wonder why?

There never was a dull moment. They could say the cutest things. We often had classes, while calling roll, I called Todd's name. "Is Todd here?" He said, "I here if I not dead."

Another cute saying this little boy had been to the Baptist Kindergarten, I asked him, "Wesley, what did you learn today?" His

and a kitchen. The kitchen is equipped with an electric range, running water, etc. This building is so erected and joined to old building that not a single one of the memorial windows of the old building is molested.

The old building, which was a frame structure erected before the Civil War and stood in a state of preservation, has been brick veneered. The two large front windows, which were the only windows of plain glass in the building, have been replaced with cathedral glass. New doors and transoms have been added.

the transoms of cathedral glass. New sidewalks, concrete curbs, and a platform have also been added. The note edition of the New Methodist Hymnal has been placed in the church.

In was late in the 1850's when the foundation of the old building was laid, and the building was not altogether finished when the war of the sixties prevented further work. Through its sacred portals were carried the sick, wounded and dying of both the Southern and Northern Armies.

In the early eighties, while the Rev. J. T. Mitchell was pastor, the church was remodeled. The tall spire was added to the belfry, the colonial porch was changed to a vestibule, the slave gallery was removed and the old box pulpit and mourner's bench were replaced by a similar stand and a chancel rail.

In 1897, while the Rev. J. H. Shoemaker was pastor, the church was again remodeled. The ceiling was arched, the floors inclined, new seats replaced the handmade benches made by the founder of the church and the memorial windows were remodeled. In the spring of 1898, nearly forty

years late, the church was dedicated with Bishop Hoss presiding. In 1906, directed by the pastor Rev. T. H. Lipscomb, an apse was added to the church, in the rear of which was placed an

art glass window depicting the Good Shepherd, and presented to the beloved G. P. Hammerly, who had served as superintendent of the Sunday School since the close of the War Between the States, and who continued to serve until his death in 1918.

Many of the bishops, the great preachers and evangelists of Southern Methodism, have spoken from the sacred desk of this old church. In 1900, when the body of our beloved exgovernor, John M. Stone rested in the chapel, Bishop Charles B. Galloway delivered the funeral oration.

Space would fail in writing of all the pastors and presiding elders who have served the church so faithfully and who are lovingly remembered. The old bell, which was a present to the founders of the church from the merchants of the city of Louisville, Kentucky, will soon ring a homecoming to these Veterans of the Cross (Civil war Veterans), and a glad welcome awaits all who may come to rejoice with us over our old church that is again made new. On this homecoming day, Bishop Hoyt M. Dobbs has promised to be with us, and the whole church is looking forward to his coming.
