I'm not sure, but I think it was back in the 60's when I first heard of "sidewinder" rattlesnakes.

It was probably on the Sunday night Disney show that we all watched, one of those "True Life Adventures". I've seen lots of pictures of them since and they are bad looking snakes. They move along and watch you even as they leave. I've never seen one, but that's gonna change, maybe today.

It's sunny down here. Tropical storm Julio blew through here yesterday, so I know that any track I find will be fresh. After a tropical storm, I don't want to be in a hurricane, this was bad enough. There were a few lunatic surfers out in it, obviously just released from the local insane asylum.

This spot in the desert is near a little town called Todos Santos, Mexico. It's about the size of Belmont, with bad roads and without the beautiful women. It does have "Hotel California" the one the Eagles sang about and a really good bar-- they say.

If I had known who it was, I would have grabbed it immediately, but I'm thinking its someone wanting to talk about their case. I answered it, it was Odle. As far as I knew, Odle had never been down here, much less seen a sidewinder, as far as I knew, I was wrong.

The most important thing to know when tracking a sidewinder, is which way he is headed, Odle tells me. You can see those weird marks in the sand, some bigger than others, but you can't really tell which way they go, at least I

But requirements were strict! With regular inspections, my age requirement was 18 months and older, I have potty-trained lots of babies.

One Memorial Day, my friend, Nolaee, who also had a Day Care, called and said, "seven well-dressed men from Jackson were there and would be at my place next," luckily it was noon and they had stopped to eat, we had eaten and that was no problem, and I had plenty of time to get everything ready. Faces to wash, runny noses to wipe, hair to comb, also having time to rake the yard. But...I had left the rake in the yard. While they were there, one little boy picked up the rake and hit another kid on the head. Lots of screaming! I must have passed inspection as I never heard.

We complained to MS State Board and from then on, we only had one inspector at a time, nice men from Tishomingo County Health Department. The conclusion of the seven well-dressed men was: our

neighbors who often watched the kids for me, got a call from Nolaee. Wanted to know how I'd come through. She said, "Dot is not here, she's in bed with a migraine head ache." Wonder why?

There never was a dull moment. They could say the cutest things. We often had classes, while calling roll, I called Todd's name. "Is Todd here?" He said, "I here if I not dead."

Another cute saying - this little boy had been to the Baptist Kindergarten, I asked him, "Wesley, what did you learn today?" His

Old Tishomingo Traces

by June Bullard

The Vidette, December 3, 1935
Luka Methodist Church
In June 1934, the members of Luka Methodist Church began the erection of a two-story educational building and the remodeling

of the old church building. The value of the church property before the building program was launched was \$3,500. Today the value is \$15,000. Cash has been paid for all construction. In addition to paying cash for

the building enterprise, all finances of the church are being met in full. The salary of the preacher was raised this year. The quarterly conference raised the amount suggested by the District Stewards of Benevolence and this is being paid in full.

The educational building has three assembly rooms, eight classrooms, two lavatories, pastor's study

and a kitchen. The kitchen is equipped with an electric range, running water, etc. This building is so erected and joined to old building that not a single one of the memorial windows of the old building is molested.

The old building, which was a frame structure erected before the Civil War and stood in a state of preservation, has been brick veneered. The two large front windows, which were the only windows of plain glass in the building, have been replaced with cathedral glass. New doors and transoms have been added.

the transoms of cathedral glass. New sidewalks, concrete curbs, and a platform have also been added. The note edition of the New Methodist Hymnal has been placed in the church.

In was late in the 1850's when the foundation of the old building was laid, and the building was not altogether finished when the war of the sixties prevented further work. Through its sacred portals were carried the sick, wounded and dying of both the Southern and Northern Armies.

In the early eighties, while the Rev. J. T. Mitchell was pastor, the church was remodeled. The tall spire was added to the belfry, the colonial porch was changed to a vestibule, the slave gallery was removed and the old box pulpit and mourner's bench were replaced by a similar stand and a chancel rail.

In 1897, while the Rev. J. H. Shoemaker was pastor, the church was again remodeled. The ceiling was arched, the floors inclined, new seats replaced the handmade benches made by the founder of the church and the memorial windows were remodeled. In the spring of 1898, nearly forty

years late, the church was dedicated with Bishop Hoss presiding. In 1906, directed by the pastor Rev. T. H. Lipscomb, an apse was added to the church, in the rear of which was placed an art glass window depicting the Good Shepherd, and presented to the beloved G. P. Hammerly, who had served as superintendent of the Sunday School since the close of the War Between the States, and who continued to serve until his death in 1918.

Many of the bishops, the great preachers and evangelists of Southern Methodism, have spoken from the sacred desk of this old church. In 1900, when the body of our beloved ex-governor, John M. Stone rested in the chapel, Bishop Charles B. Galloway delivered the funeral oration.

Space would fail in writing of all the pastors and presiding elders who have served the church so faithfully and who are lovingly remembered. The old bell, which was a present to the founders of the church from the merchants of the city of Louisville, Kentucky, will soon ring a homecoming to these Veterans of the Cross (Civil war Veterans), and a glad welcome awaits all who may come to rejoice with us over our old church that is again made new. On this homecoming day, Bishop Hoyt M. Dobbs has promised to be with us, and the whole church is looking forward to his coming.
