Bonds Company Sells to APAC

Longtime family-owned county paving business Bonds Company sold to APAC Asphalt Paving Contractors this week, concluded Larry Bonds, president of Bonds Company, founded in 1950 by Bill and Thomas Bonds. Bonds Company has been a major provider of paving services for the entire state area for the past century. Bonds has had a major impact on not only infrastructure, but on industrial development projects

through the years. "We haven't paved all the roads in the county," said Larry Bonds. "But we have tried." APAC has a local office in Corinth, and a plant in Glen. They are owned by worldwide construction materials supplier Oldcastle Materials, headquartered in Dublin, Ireland. More details will be available following the finalization of the transaction scheduled for Monday.

Pleas Heard In September Circuit Court

Camela McRae In the regular September session of the Tishomingo County Circuit Court, several pleas were heard and sentencing pronounced. On September 2nd, A.T. Jr. of Burnsville, pleaded guilty to one count of identity fraud in front of Jim Pounds, and sentenced to five years probation, since it was a first offense, said officials. Sentence is satisfactory. Completed his record was expunged, which Tishomingo County Sheriff Whitlock went on the object to, joining District Attorney's office opposing the clearing of his record. It's a matter of public record said Whitlock, regarding Marlar's current position as an alderman for the city of Burnsville. "He is a public servant, and such don't need to be hidden from the public."

Pleas Belmont man plead to two counts of felony in a minor in connection with an April 20th incident at Tishomingo State Park. Park officials and park were able to apprehend James McQuoid, of 78 Old 25, Belmont, after he fled from the scene where children said he was taking them, and had to grab them, said Assistant District Attorney Meyer. He was sentenced last day to 30 years in the custody of the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) for two counts of taking a minor. Twenty-five years were suspended, he must serve the other ten day-for-day, register as a sex offender and be in contact with the two men ever again. Tony Woods, of 228 956, Iuka, plead guilty to two counts of burglary larceny of a dwelling one count of uttering a check. She was sentenced to 25 years, with 20 suspended and five to serve in the Mississippi Department of Corrections. For the felony count she was sentenced to ten years, with suspended and five to concurrently with the previous count. She was ordered to participate

in a drug treatment program and was to report to the Sheriff to begin serving her sentence September 4th. Josh Freno, of Iuka, plead guilty to one count of burglary of a dwelling. He was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, and placed in the house arrest program for a year. If satisfactorily completed, he gets five years of post release supervision. Johnny Hollingsworth, of 508 No. Wilmoth, Iuka, plead guilty to one count of manufacturing marijuana and received twenty years, all suspended, and he was placed on probation. **Monday Pleas** Monday, September 8th, James McGee, Jr., of 950 E. Pike St., Iuka, plead guilty to one count of possession of cocaine with intent to sell. He was sentenced to ten years, eight suspended and two to serve concurrently with a sentence in Prentiss County. Robert Gibson, currently of the Tishomingo Co. Jail, plead guilty to one count of grand larceny in a 2004 case. He was sentenced to ten years with credit for time served and the balance suspended, with five years post release supervision. **Tuesday Pleas** On Tuesday, after a partial jury selection procedure, Terry White, of 57 County Road 14, Belmont, plead guilty to one count of sexual battery and one count of fondling. District Attorney Arch Bullard advised prospective jurors that the case involved a child. He was sentenced to twenty years with fifteen suspended and five to serve. Upon release he must register as a sex offender and be under post-release supervision for five years. Earl Wayne Robinson, Jr., 234 CR 1650, Mooreville, plead guilty to one count of simple assault on a police officer and one count of possession of marijuana. He was sentenced to five years with MDOC, two suspended and three to serve, plus two years of post release supervision. More pleas were scheduled to be heard on Wednesday, September 10th.

After a couple flubs earlier in the game, the fourth quarter was sweet redemption for sophomore Poole. In addition to the game winning reception, Poole ran for a 13-yard run earlier in the quarter.

Coach Kerry Moody said, "He had a couple penalties and problems earlier in the game, but we knew he could do it, and did not hesitate to go to him for the final play—and he delivered."

Poole was not the only one with penalties in the messy game played on a rain soaked field that was pretty slick toward the sides. And at times the play was pretty messy, too. Penalties were particularly a problem for the Braves.

TC opened up the scoring in the second quarter with a 30-yard field goal by Steven Atkins. Lee Griffin ran for 6 more points six minutes before

the half ended, but the extra point was missed.

After halftime, Tyler Pritchard ran for a 7-yard TCHS touchdown (extra point failed) and then Belmont finally got past TC's defense for a three-yard run by Gage Smith.

By the time Belmont

started their fourth quarter scoring, the Braves rallied and their fans started getting revved up, but it was not quite soon enough. In the final drive, TC held Belmont for several downs.

Coach Moody said, "We were very fortunate, but after 24 hours, we start

concentrating on the next game."

The Cardinals' minds have turned to this week's meeting with Kossuth.

The 1-1 Braves head to Corinth this Friday.

All games start at 7:30 p.m.


Former Alderman Ellis Strickland Dies

Glaucoma And Blindness
Glaucoma is a leading cause of blindness. About 3 percent of all Americans beyond age 65 are affected. That amounts to more than 2 million people, and about 60,000 of them are legally blind.

Glaucoma is not a single disease. It is a group of diseases of the eye. The group has in common a single feature - progressive damage to the optic nerve due to elevated pressure within the eyeball. As the optic nerve is damaged, blind spots and patterns develop that may progress to total blindness if not controlled. Although the disease usually involves both eyes, one of them frequently is involved earlier and more severely than the other.

Although central vision remains normal until the last stage of chronic glaucoma, your side vision will gradually diminish. Regular check-ups are essential for detecting glaucoma before major vision loss occurs. Further damage can usually be arrested, but nothing can be done to restore vision that has already been lost.

I have been to two and they were extraordinary! The aprons are so pretty and the stitches, rick-rack and designs are unbelievable.

I personally think they should donate all the aprons

to Mrs. Carolyn's museum so that they can be seen and appreciated.

Seeing these aprons will take some of you, like it did me, back to when you were little and mom or grandma made you a dress, or when they put on their aprons with the fancy rick-rack and the fancy little stitches that were just for you.

I encourage you to come to Iuka at 2 p.m. on Friday and Saturdays, when

Carolyn presents the shows at the old courthouse—the aprons are not on display all the time.

You will see a lot of talking about! I will go away looking at a pattern and some of the designs. See you there!







The American Angus Association has more than 34,000 active members and is the largest beef breed organization in the world.




