Coach Kerry Moody said, "He had a couple penalties and problems earlier in the game, but we knew he could do it, and did not hesitate to go to him for the final play-and he deliv-

Poole was not the only one with penalties in the messy game played on a rain soaked field that was pretty slick toward the sides. And at times the play was pretty messy, too. Penalties were particularly a

problem for the Braves. TC opened up the scoring in the second quarter with a 30-yard field goal by Steven Atkins. Lee Griffin ran for 6 more points six minutes before

the half ended, but the extra point was missed.

After halftime, Tyler Pritchard ran for a 7-yard TCHS touchdown (extra point failed) and then Belmont finally got past TC's defense for a three-yard run by Gage Smith.

Glaucoma And Blindness

Glaucoma is a leading cause of blindness. About 3 percent of all Americans beyond age 65 are affected. That amounts to more than 2 million people, and about 60,000 of them are legally blind.

Glaucoma is not a single disease. It is a group of diseases of the eye. The group has in common a single feature - progressive damage to the optic nerve due to elevated pressure within the eyeball. As the optic nerve is damaged, blind spots and patterns develop that may progress to total blindness if not controlled. Although the disease usually involves both eyes, one of them frequently is involved earlier and more severely than the other.

Although central vision remains normal until the last stage of chronic glaucoma, your side vision will gradually diminish. Regular check-ups are essential for detecting glaucoma before major vision loss occurs. Further damage can usually be arrested, but nothing can be done to restore vision that has already been lost.

Thomas L. Wiley, author of The **Angels of Lockhart To Be Featured Speaker At luka Library Luncheon**

Mississippi Thomas L. Wiley, will discuss his new book, The Angels of Lockhart, a family saga based on a true story set in Lauderdale County one hundred years ago.

The story is about his wife's great-grandfather, Stephen Parker, and his second wife, Lizzie, who from 1890 to 1910 buried all seven of their children in a nearby forgotten cemetery in the Lockhart community, ten miles north of Meridian. According to family, these children died of common childhood diseases, born in a time when medicine had little to offer. But the tiny gravestones tell a different story. None of the babies lived past twenty-two months and each died before the next was born. No two deaths were related: there was no epidemic or sudden

tragedy to explain so many losses in one family.

What went on in this anyone in the past ever questioned these deaths? Can it possibly be that secrets-unimaginable secrets-have been hidden by this family for the past one hundred years? Were these deaths as innocent as the family would have us believe or is there more to these Angels in Lockhart Cemetery?






