

Landfill Reorganization Aims for Efficiency, Cost Savings

The county has taken steps to reorganize the county landfill, including changes to cut down overhead and charge for industrial dumping. According to Fourth District Supervisor Steve Thorne, who is handling the changes at the landfill for the Board, the county has hired Mike Trimm as the manager of the facility, to handle all maintenance, personnel and purchasing. Former manager Lloyd Thorne is now assistant manager, receiving clerk and is handling dispatching. Thorne is making sure the trucks running the routes, he explained. The budget for the landfill operation was budgeted to be \$811,520 in fiscal year 2007-08, and has increased to \$931,090 for the coming year, reported board member Lynn West. Once in January and possibly before, funds from the landfill fund had to be transferred to the landfill because it was over budget, said Thorne. Increased fuel costs are impacting the budget. One thing that Thorne said will help cut costs is that they have four trucks that are all scheduled to be replaced by this week. Many times in recent years there were only two trucks running. Severe

maintenance and repair problems have kept trucks from running all the routes through the four-day regular workweek, which pushes the work to be done on Saturdays, when workers are paid overtime. They have installed a pressure washer to clean the vehicles, since buildup of debris was causing corrosion in some cases, said Thorne. One truck needed a \$55,000 new or reworked bed, but they were able to do it for less than \$10,000, Thorne explained. **Charging for Dumping** Another new policy will include charging \$9 per cubic yard for industrial dumping, like building materials or other industrial waste. Industries must have a permit in advance, and payments will be monthly, explained Thorne. Several area industries are dumping in the limited landfill space, said Thorne. Even trucks from Colbert County come and dump for free in our landfill. The industrial waste goes to the local rubbish site and is buried, but the household waste that is picked up by trucks at each residence is transferred to 18-wheelers at the landfill transfer station. The trucks take about two loads a day to the regional landfill near Houston, Mississippi—a round

trip of about 99 miles. Waste Management has the county contract to transfer the household garbage to Houston, said Thorne. **Rates for Industrial Dumping at Tishomingo County Rubbish Site** The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors adopted new rates for industrial dumping at the rubbish landfill site. The cost for this service will be \$9 per cubic yard. Each industry will be required to have a permit before being able to dump material at the site. This permit can be obtained at the office of the Board of Supervisors located at the Tishomingo County Courthouse, 1008 Battleground Drive, Iuka, starting September 22, 2008 at no cost. The method of payment will be on a monthly basis with each industry being billed through the Chancery Clerk's office and payment being due within 10 days of receipt of invoice. **NO INDUSTRY WILL BE ALLOWED TO DUMP AT THE SITE WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A PERMIT.**

More Guilty Pleas Heard in Circuit Court

More pleas were heard in the September 17th session of Tishomingo County Circuit Court. On Wednesday, September 10th, in front of Judge Thomas Gardner, Bobby J. Turner, 34, pleaded guilty to one count of grand larceny, simple assault on a police officer and possession of amphetamine in connection with an incident in Tishomingo April 28th when he held a shotgun on a Tishomingo Police Officer.

Turner was sentenced to a total 15 years with Mississippi Department of Corrections, 12 of which were suspended, and two years post release supervision. Bobby J. Voyles, 31, pleaded guilty to grand larceny, and two counts of drunk driving, third offense, in Tishomingo and Alcorn counties. For the drunk driving charges he was sentenced to five years each, four suspended each, to run concurrently. For the larceny charge, he was sentenced to 10 years, 6 sus-

pending with credit for time served. He also has to pay partial restitution of \$10,861.17 to Tomlinson Engineering Inc., along with a co-defendant in the case. Thursday, also with Judge Gardner, Bobby Braggs, of Alabama, pleaded guilty to one count of possession of methamphetamine and was sentenced to eight years, all

Iuka Youth Soccer Season Opens with 182 Players

More than 180 players, and all their coaches, referees, parents, siblings and some grandparents turned out for the annual opening day of Iuka Soccer last Saturday. Beginning with an opening ceremony, the day featured the only day games of the season beginning at about 9:30 a.m. Most all the teams will now play games each Monday and Thursday nights through October. New league president Scott Woodruff welcomed a large crowd, and informed attendees of the past year's improvements to the fields, including earthwork in the parking area and the beginning of a future concession stand. The league started in 2001 with about 40 players, said coach Fernando Remedios, who was one of the main organizers of the Iuka Youth Soccer League. Leadership by him and other strong coaches and officers have made it an outstanding program for children to get involved in a fun sport. Even the referees really stop a game to point out a tip or rule to players, so that they can improve their playing. Soccer is still new to many in Tish-

omingo County. Parents, who may be the loudest sideline coaches during baseball and softball games must, in most cases, just enjoy watching their kids play. Most parents readily admit they did not play soccer as children. You can still hear snippets of conversation like: "I don't have any idea how to play it." "I watched a little of those Olympic soccer games." But the kids definitely have the hang of the game. In practice the teams can sometimes look unorganized and like they will never get the idea, but Saturday you could tell that they do understand their coaches, and they seem to play with impressive agility and teamwork. "At the high school soccer level," said Lyndon Cain, who coaches both an under-14 team and the Tishomingo County teams, "we are starting to enjoy the fruit of the youth soccer league." Former youth players like Charlie Dean, Stephen Datsis, Cameron Bernal and Sara Carmack are strong players for

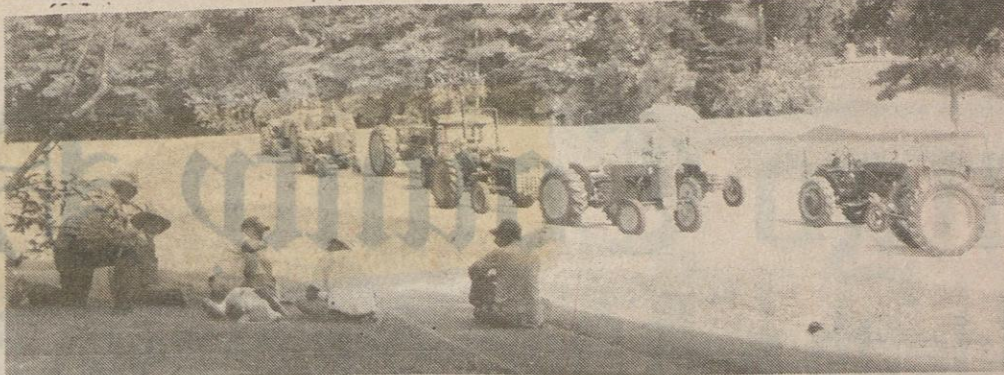
the Tishomingo County High School soccer team, now in its third year. Last year, TCHS saw two of its players get signed for soccer scholarships.

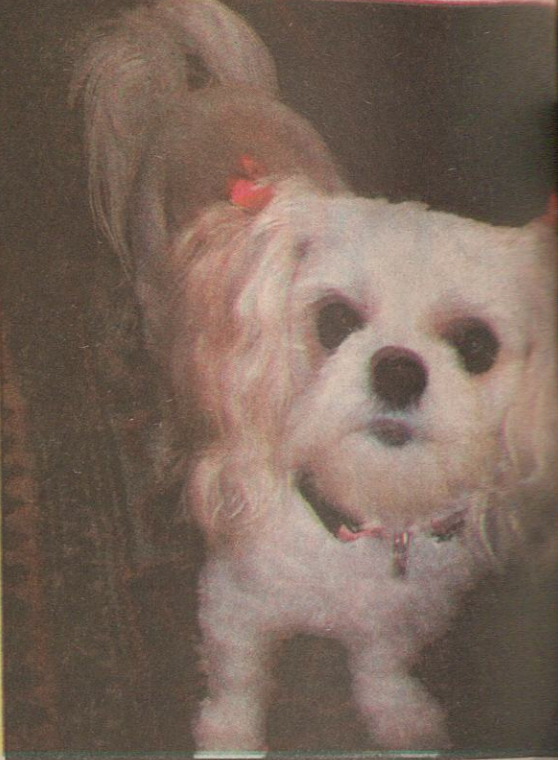

On Sun Glass Lens Color

The time has come to look cool in the sun. How do you decide which color lens is best for you? Here's some advice:

Neutral gray lets color pass with the truest fidelity. Green distorts colors very little. Brownish lenses reduce scattered blue light, giving more contrast. Don't drive with yellow or blue lenses. Either type can make wearers misjudge traffic signals.

Plastic lenses made with polarizing materials are good for cutting glare from horizontal surfaces, such as water and car metal. Glass photo chromic lens automatically adjust for the sun's brightness. The best ones have a range of performance, turning amber on overcast days to minimize the effects of haze and sharpen details, and becoming gray or brown on bright days. Photo chromics are appropriate for skiing, tennis and sailing. Another type is the gradient lens, becoming progressively darker from the bottom up. Often, lightly tinted, gradients serve more for flair than for glare.

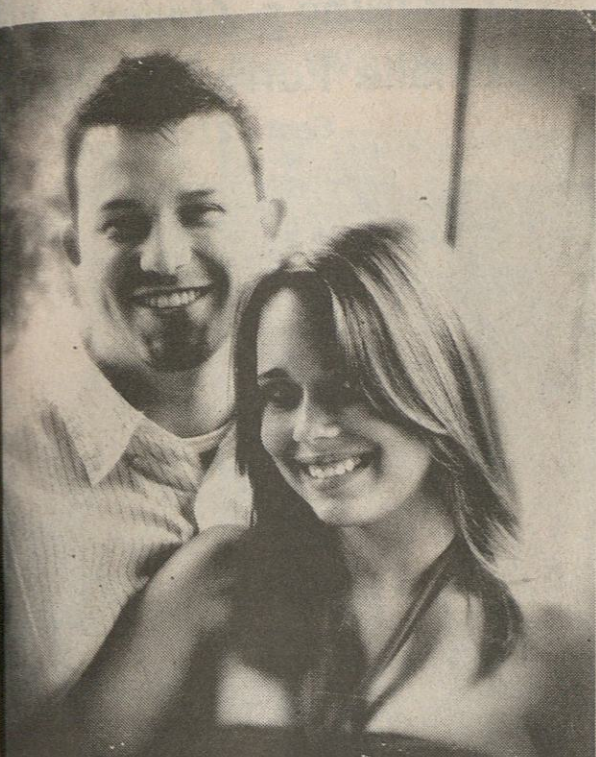

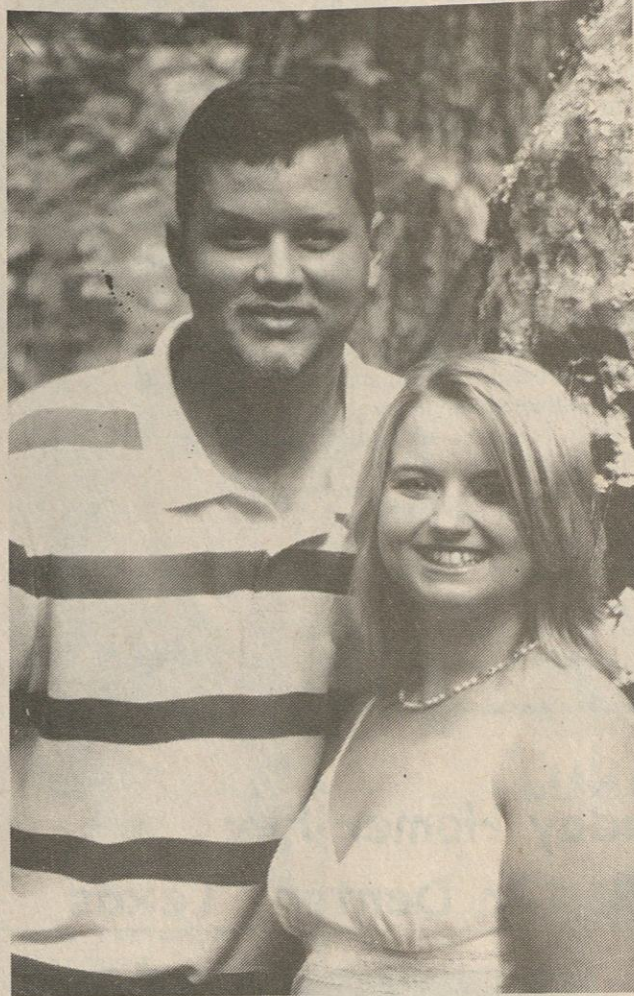
Wolfe-Sorg To Wed October 4th, 2008

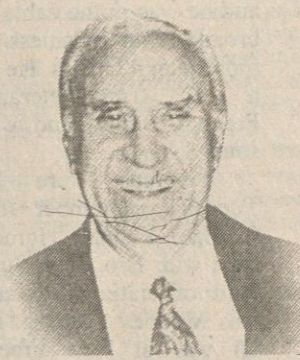
Lloyd Clayton McDougal, Jr.

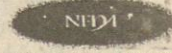

New Conservation Program In The Yellow Creek and Bear Creek Watershed

The Tishomingo County Soil & Water Conservation District and the MS Soil and Water Conservation Commissions would like to inform landowners in the Yellow Creek and Bear Creek watershed about a new cost share opportunity. These watersheds have been identified as priority watersheds in the Tennessee-Tombigbee River Basin to work on for the next three years.

We are offering a cost share program to landowners in these watersheds to implement conservation practices to improve water quality, correct soil erosion problems and sediment producing areas throughout the area. The cost share program is set up on a 60/40 cost share.

Some of the conservation practices that are available to landowners are as follows:

- Field borders
- Establishing permanent vegetative cover (pasture planting and renovation)
- Critical area planting
- Grade stabilization structures
- Stream bank and shoreline protection
- Heavy use area protection
- Nutrient Management (line on pasture land)

- Water and control basins
- Pond
- Diversions
- Fencing
- Water troughs
- Stream crossings
- Tree Planting

All landowners in the watershed areas are encouraged to sign up for assistance. You have to call the Natural Resources Conservation Service at 662-728-9003 or Tishomingo County at 662-423-6272. Saturday at 8 a.m. - recipient food distribution at Food Depot Warehouse.

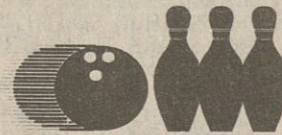
