## Burnsville's Sesquicentennial Focus of Waterway Festival This Weekend

The 17th Annual Waterway Festival will be held this weekend, September 26 and 27 in Burnsville. The celebration of the town's 150th birthday will be a featured part of the two-day festival, honoring the adoption of a town charter for Burnsville in 1832.

### Street Dance Friday

The festivities will kick-off Friday night with an annual street dance from 7 p.m. at the Burnsville Boat Ramp. There will be live music by Lisa Lambert and the Pine Ridge Boys and Southern Exposure. The Tishomingo County South Football League will be selling food at this event.

### Saturday Run & Fun!

Saturday's events will begin with a 5K Run at the City Park, registration starting at 7 a.m. and race at 8 a.m.

A Motorcycle Poker Run will begin at 11 a.m. with registration at 9 a.m.

The day of fun at the Burnsville Elementary School grounds will begin at 9 a.m. with live entertainment starting at 10 a.m. There will be food

vendors, an antique car show, an antique tractor show, lots of arts and crafts and fun inflatables for the kids.

### Early History Town of Burnsville

This history was compiled by Charlotte McVay; taken from information in "From the Early Frontier" and "Tishomingo County Mississippi Histories and Families."

Burnsville was settled in 1832 and was named for Jeremiah Burns, a hotel owner and large landowner who had moved there from Eastport.

It was mainly a farming community until, in the 1850's, the railroad saw it as an ideal location from which to turn trains around from Memphis and Chattanooga. By 1856, a turntable and roundhouse were built on land provided by a Mr. Cobb and Mr. Burns, who were the two biggest landowners. Mr. Burns became the Relay Station Operator and namesake for the town.

On January 25, 1858, a town charter was adopted by Burnsville's first citizens with a mayor/alderman

form of government.

Burnsville was located on the stage route (west of Iuka) from Iuka to Farmington and Corinth. The original charter granted Burnsville corporation limits at one mile square, the center being the Memphis and Charleston (now Southern) Railroad depot. Other surveys included Carmacks, Chandlers, Meadows and Hinton.

The Memphis and Charleston Railroad had a terminal until the 1940's. Some of the old turntable is still visible, and there was once a spur road that ran from south of Burnsville. Mr. Henry Stricklin of Holcut was one of the operators.

Southern Railroad #444 depot agents were: Sam Ferguson, Frank Ferguson, Tank Ferguson, L. E. Dean, A. H. Jones, John Moody, Mr. Phelps, Charles Brown, Frank Hill, Frank Emerson,

John Epperson and Rolleigh Atchley.

Early families included Marlars, Burns, Harveys and Whitakers. Wingo Epps operated a saloon. Mrs. G.

## School Bus Stolen; Left to be Hit by Train

An Iuka man is in custody after allegedly stealing a school bus in the middle of the night and then abandoning it to be hit by a train.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, Brian Duke, of Iuka, took a 1988 model 15-passenger bus from the Tishomingo County School District Bus lot on Paul Edmondson Drive in Iuka about 1 a.m. Thursday morning, September 18th.

Duke drove the bus through the gate, down by the Food Depot building, and attempted to drive around the barriers that were erected to block a closed railroad crossing. The bus got stuck on the tracks, and when he heard

the train coming, he abandoned the bus, reported Stringer.

A Norfolk Southern train operator saw the bus and slowed as it approached. It hit going only about 15 miles per hour, but the bus was totaled, according to Malcolm Kuykendall, Superintendent of Tishomingo County Schools. While insurance will cover the loss of the 1988 bus, Kuykendall said, it will cost more than \$70,000 to buy a new one.

Duke has been charged with larceny and malicious mischief and is in the Tishomingo County Jail.

The bus was used once a day to pick up handicapped students, said Kuykendall.

## Sheriff Looking for Suspect in Slashing Case

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department is looking for a suspect in a slashing incident that occurred last Saturday night near Iuka.

Nicole Johnson, a black female of unknown age whom authorities believe to be from Jackson, Tennessee is wanted on charges of aggravated assault following an attack on Miriam Anderson, 46, of Booneville.

According to Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, Anderson suffered knife wounds to

her forehead while involved in a dispute with Johnson. Also involved in the dispute was James Wooley, of County Road 193, Iuka, at whose home the incident occurred. Wooley, a white male, and Johnson fled the scene and are both being sought by authorities.

Anderson was taken to Iuka Hospital for treatment and released.

Sheriff Whitlock urges anyone with information concerning this or any other crime to contact the sheriff's office at 423-7000.

## Tishomingo Traces

Sometime before the Bullard Reunion, I started thinking about the Bullards who settled in Tishomingo County at its inception in 1837. There were several but John Bullard is the

progenitor of our family. His eldest son William married Rebecca Billings, daughter of George and Jemima (Stockton) Billings and remained in Tishomingo County while

the rest of the family moved on to what they thought would be greener pastures in Upshur County, Texas in 1958.

After a hundred years, all traces and contact with the Texas bunch were lost. However, in 1970, I advertised our family reunion in a national genealogical magazine and was contacted by one of my unknown Texas cousins from Houston. She and her husband came to our reunion that year and several years afterwards bringing other family members who also enjoyed the fellowship until old age prevented their traveling to Mississippi. ### Glasses vs. Contacts

If you've been wearing glasses and are considering changing to contact lenses, you probably have good reasons for wanting to do so. Wearing contact lenses can give you a more natural and attractive appearance. They also have the advantage of improving your peripheral or side vision because they rest lightly on the surface of your eyes with no gaps between.

Glasses must fit correctly to be comfortable, but in contact lenses, a good fit is even more important. Contacts must also be inserted and removed under hygienic or sanitary conditions. They should also be checked periodically, especially when you first begin to use them, to make sure they fit well and that you are following recommended procedures for insertion and removal.

The new contact lenses are smaller, thinner, and lighter than ever. Extended wear contacts can be worn for longer periods of time without need to remove them.

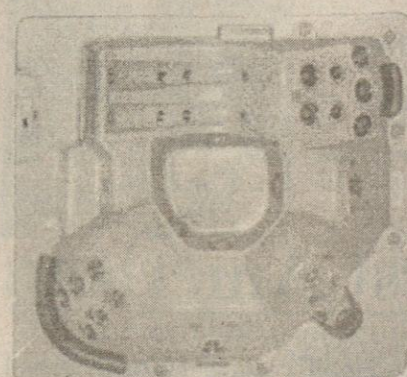

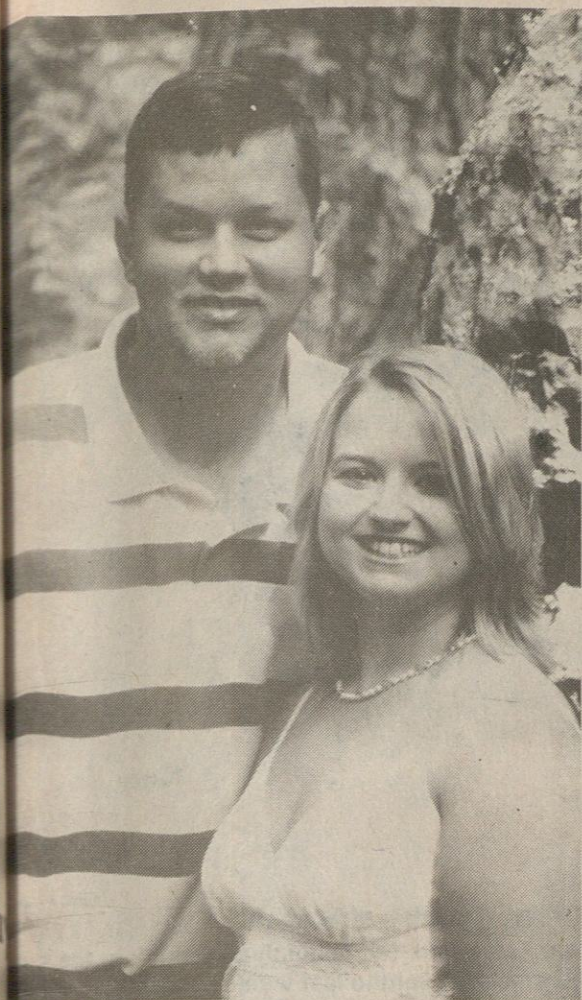

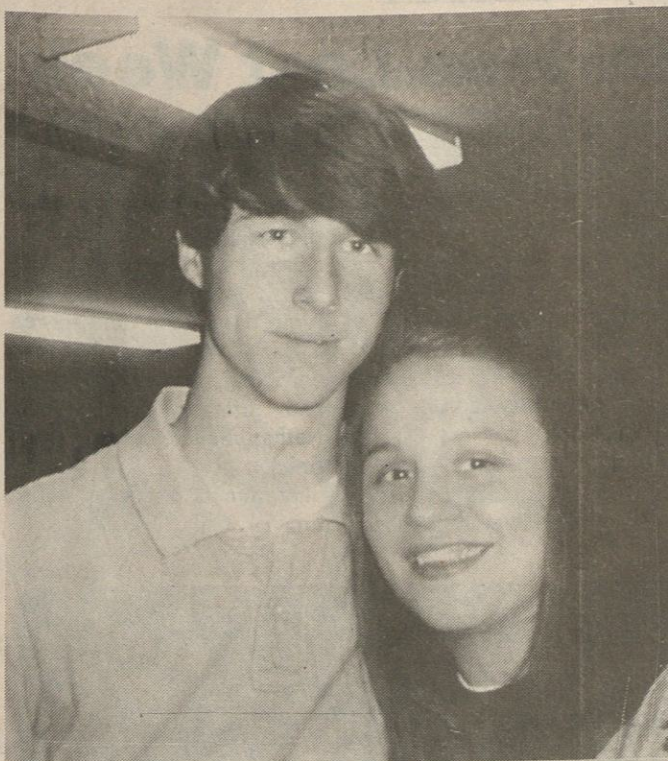

The Braves will travel to Saltillo this Friday and will hopefully come back home with a win.

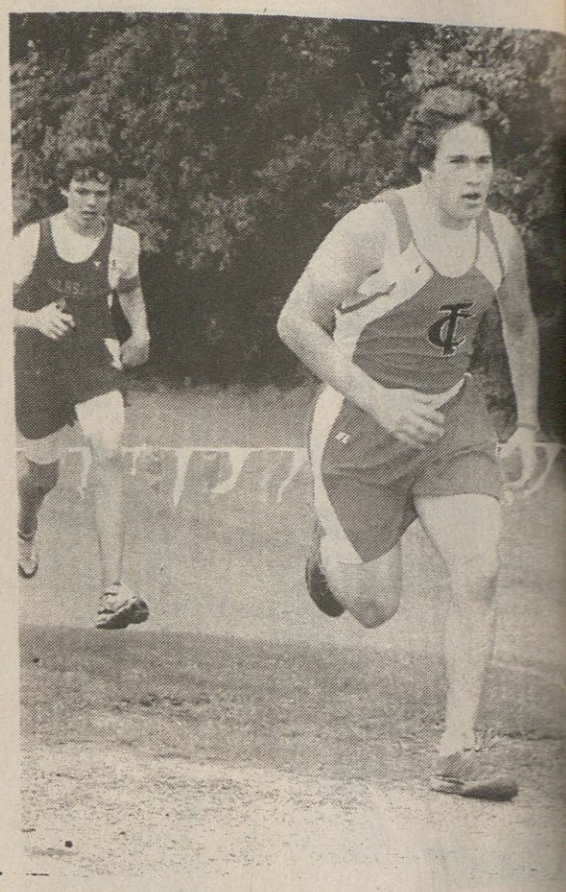
### Cross-Country

A continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) machine is used mainly by patients for the treatment of sleep apnea at home. Obstructive sleep apnea occurs when the upper airway becomes narrow as the muscles naturally relax during sleep. This reduces oxygen in the blood and causes arousal from sleep. The CPAP machine stops this by delivering a stream of compressed air, keeping the airway open.

It is estimated that approximately six out of 10 people experience at least one symptom of insomnia a few nights a week. The

NMMC-Iuka Sleep Disorders Center has the expertise and equipment to diagnose and treat sleep disorder such as sleep apnea, narcolepsy, restless leg syndrome and insomnia.

# Burnsville Celebrates 150 years

## History

continued from front

W. Smith was granted a license to operate a tavern in the village in July 1857. There was a stove-mill located where the Charles (then home is) that built whiskey barrels.

A church just outside of town was used as the principal school for several years while a small school began to develop and grow within Burnsville. Over the years each school grew and the principals changed between them frequently in attempts to maintain both. Eventually the two were consolidated at Burnsville in 1832.

The first school, established in the early 1850's, was known as the Lambert School according to Joe Lambert (age 89 in 1937). Early schools were: Gravel Hill, Rowland Mills, Punkin Center, Holliway, Hebron, Mt. Gilead, Overton Chapel and Pleasant Ridge. J. L. Cummings was known as the school-educator.

### Civil War Involvement

Being centrally located between Corinth and Iuka during the Civil War put Burnsville in the middle of battle for these towns in September of 1862. In one of these battles General Grant encamped in Burnsville hoping to trap General Price's regiment in Iuka. Grant's forces were routed in Burnsville but the following day his forces defeated Iuka and drove Price out, but failed to trap him.

Before the Battle of Iuka, General Orr, under the command of General Grant, was located at Burnsville. He drilled his soldiers there and sent out small

skirmishing parties to harass the Confederacy.

Also, during the Civil War, General Nathan Bedford Forrest camped at Burnsville several days before the Battle of Shiloh.

J. C. Walters was captain of the Burnsville Rifles during the Civil War.

### Post-War Years

In the post-war years Burnsville became an active lumber and rail community.

Early doctors in Burnsville were W. A.

Caveness (1869); John Harvey (1854); J. R. Nolen (1878); George Washington Hutton (1878); T. P. Haney, Sr. and Luther McDougal.

Andrew W. Conley was appointed first postmaster in 1856; Carroll Ferguson in 1857; and Robert N. Fitzhugh in 1858.

Along with Jeremiah Burns, Mose Dean and Lee Smith both owned hotels.

A cotton gin was operated by Homer Sitton and T. B. Woodruff. One of the largest cotton farmers was Allen Hale.

The Burnsville Theater was run by William Henry "Click" Pense and his wife the former Zola Braddock.

A large sawmill was run by Joe Lambert on what is now known as the Buster Honeycutt place.

The three oldest churches are Chapel Hill Methodist (1834), Burnsville Baptist (1836), and Antioch (1836). Chapel Hill is also the oldest church in the county.

Turnpike Mountain got its name from Jeremiah Phillips. He and his slaves used primitive tools to make the toll road and

charged people who used it. Mr. Phillips was overseer of the poor of the second district for many years.

There was also a water-mill on Turnpike Mountain.

According to "The Jesse Tree" by Miss Rayma Biggs, "Jefferson W. Biggs who married Jeffie Moreland, owned a water-powered gristmill on Yellow Creek east of Burnsville. The old mill site and dam area is now covered by the Tenn-Tom Waterway. At one time Jeff Biggs had a saloon on Turnpike Hill. Burnsville as early as 1858 tried to ban saloons in town. It was voted down, but in the 1870's Burnsville succeeded to ban the sale of strong drinks. Jeff just removed his saloon to Turnpike Hill, which was located on his land across the Creek from his gristmill."

Other owners of a water mill on Yellow Creek were Lamberts, Eppersons, Brooks, and Marlars.

Other saloon and tavern owners in Burnsville were: Jefferson Adams (1856), Mrs. G. W. Smith (1857), R. J. Montgomery (1857), E. M. Pride (1858), G. W. Smith (1860), A. J. Harrison (1860), F. H. Fragen (1860), Smith and Austin (1865), J. J. Dean (1865), Hardwick and Wade (1865), Wingo Bros. (1866), Humphrey-Gardner (1867), L. Parker (1868), and R. C. Martin (1870). These licenses were issued on a yearly basis, apparently.

On September 6, 1910, at a meeting, Mayor L. M. Gross and the board of

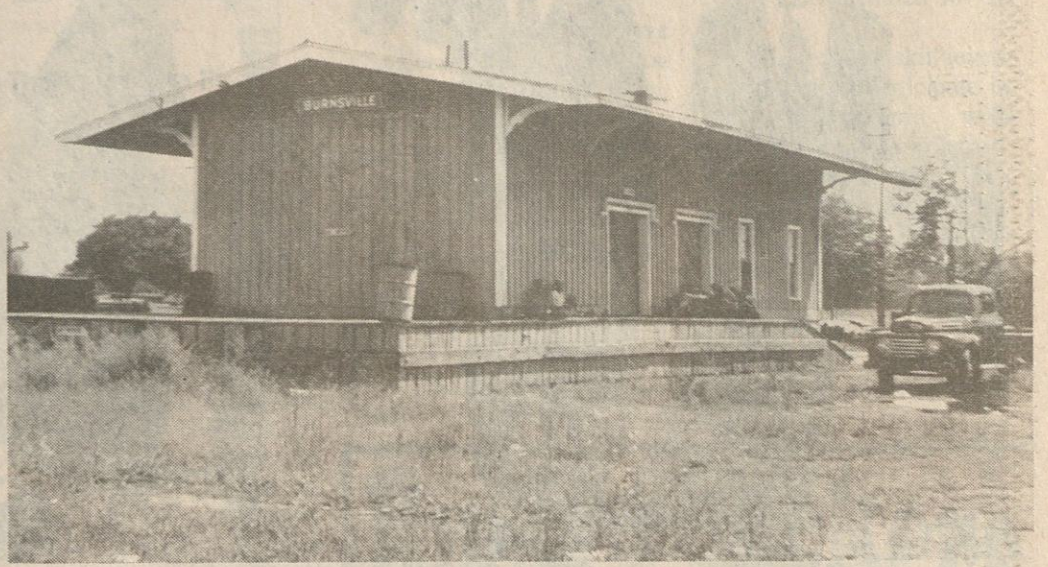

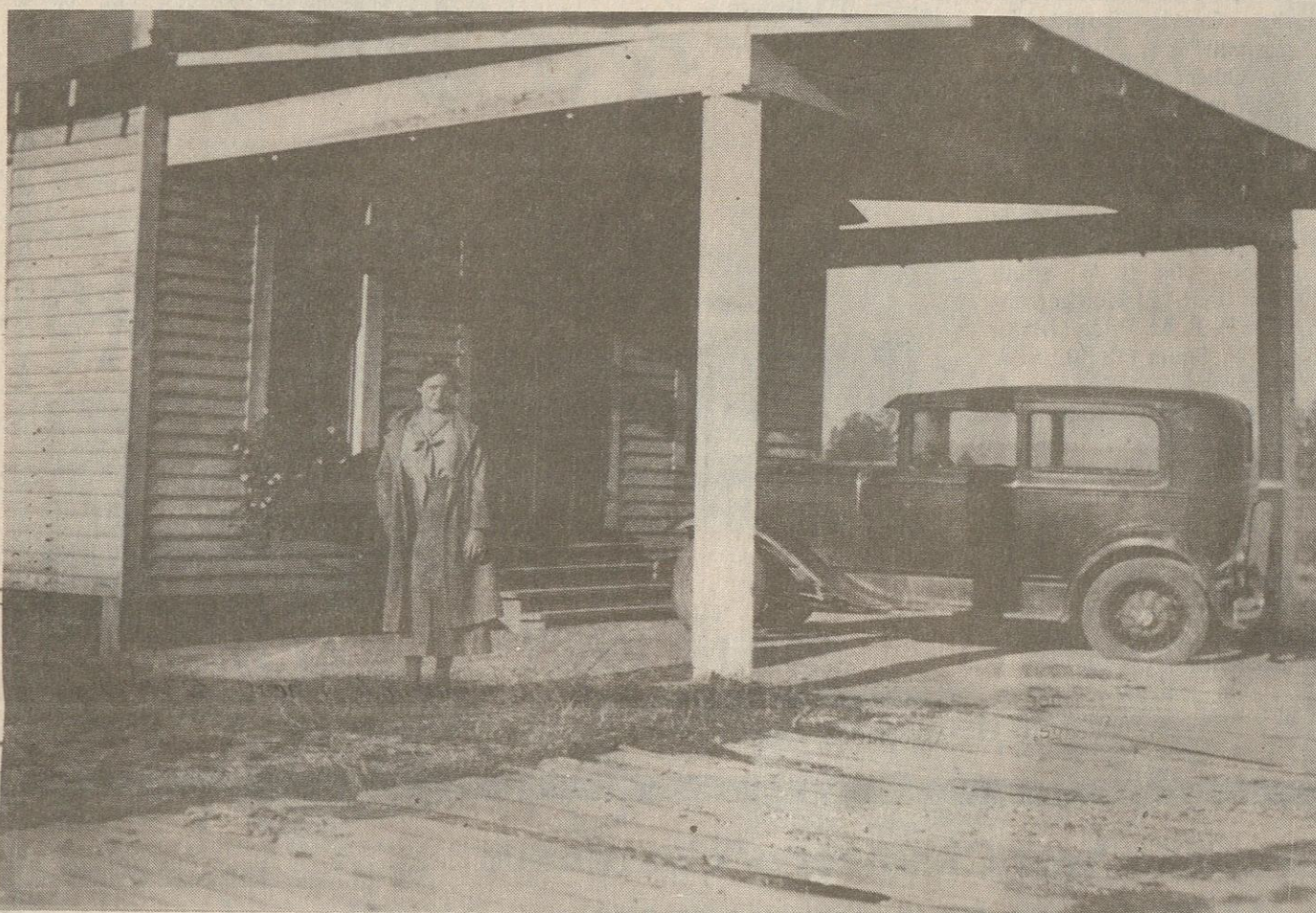

## Town of Burnsville First in "Women's Rights"

During this 2008 Presidential Election when the idea of a lady running for Vice President of the United States has become a reality, it is safe to say the Town of Burnsville has always had a special place in their government for women. In the 1920's Mrs. Mable Montgomery was appointed the first woman trustee of Burnsville School when it came a high school.

County Superintendent George Stricklen made the appointment and Mrs. Smith had the pleasure of signing both her children's diplomas when they graduated from Burnsville High School. In 1953, Burnsville again decided to let their town be governed by women. They chose Mable Montgomery, wife of the town's physician, to run as mayor. She was her husband's nurse and

bookkeeper. She had taught Sunday School in the Baptist Church for 30 years as well as being church treasurer for 20 years. Elected to serve with her were: Mary Davis, president of the Burnsville Homemakers Club; Mamie Trimm, a teacher at Glen; Ruth Floyd, a store owner and music teacher; and Dot Marlar, a school teacher for 10 years. Eula Elledge, the

only beauty shop operator in town, served as clerk for 16 years. Other ladies who served were Vonnie Tackett, Majorie Foote, and Mamie Rhine.

The ladies campaigned door to door. On election day, the ladies won 130 to 36. They kept the office for 16 years, working the first four years free because the town was broke.

### The Burnsville Fire

The business district of Burnsville was destroyed by fire in 1926. The Methodist Church located in the business section was also destroyed, as well as was the residence of W. C. Faust and the telephone exchange. The buildings, with the exception of one owned and occupied by the Burnsville Mercantile Company, burned rapidly. A part of the stocks were saved by some of the merchants, while others lost everything.

The only building left standing was the Epperson Merchandise Company, over which was the Masonic Hall. Other buildings destroyed were: the post office; the stores of R. L. Smith, G. R. Whitaker, J. J. Patrick and C. L. Blakely; the office of Dr. Haynie, where he also kept a supply of drugs; and the store of Miss Mary Walker.

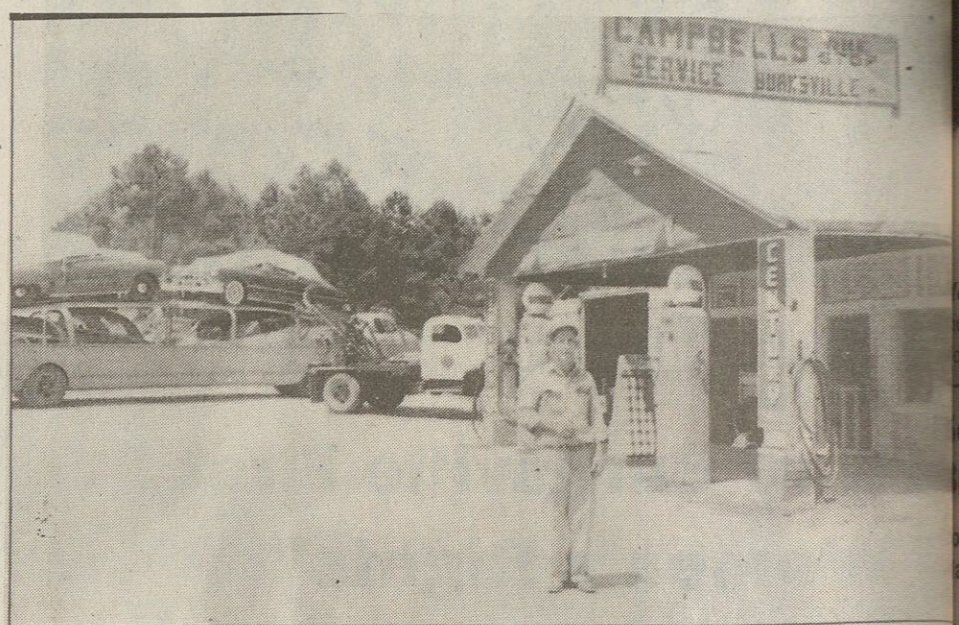

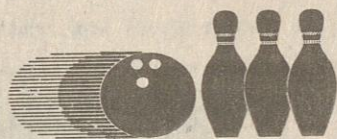
### R. L. Qualls Aided Chamber Early On

J. C. and Maxine Lambert sold their farm north of Burnsville in the early part of 1961 to Robert and Geneva Osborn. With \$500.00 from the sale they bought paint and began Lambert's hardware on Hwy. 72. J. C. worked as a barber and Maxine worked helping to begin Headstart in Burnsville. J. C. along with his two sons worked the hardware and later building supply store while making a living barbering. They took the profit from the paint and gradually increased the inventory and branched off to adding building supplies. They worked long hard hours but they had a dream and that was accomplished through that hard work and many sacrifices. J. C.'s dream was that Burnsville would grow and prosper and someday become a thriving city. His love for the people of Burnsville was great and as he knew it would. The town and the people supported his business with great loyalty. J. C. and Maxine and son Michael gave their all to Burnsville and God blessed them for their efforts. J. C. was on at least two Governor's Staffs. He was a Veteran of World War II. He finished school in the Army and then went on to barber school in Memphis. He served as Alderman for the town and was very involved in starting a Chamber of Commerce for the area. He helped a lot of people but always said the Bible said not to let your right hand know what your left hand was doing. His goal in building the first Burnsville Shopping Plaza was to bring revenue into Burnsville. Maxine was a child bride of 14 and continually worked on her education. She finally got her GED in 1965. The same year her daughter graduated. She went to college as her time would allow and was close to getting her college degree when she fell into ill health. She always said that education was the answer to most people's problems. She spent a lot of her time in helping kids through the Headstart program - getting their teeth fixed, getting their shots, and in several instances having their medical problems attended. She was not one to talk about the things she accomplished as long as she could help a child and the elderly. Their oldest son, Michael was also a big fan of Burnsville. He graduated Burnsville High School when he was 16 and then tried to enlist in the Navy. He was honorably discharged because of a birth defect in his hand. He went on to Northeast Junior College and to Memphis State where he graduated after a few years. He returned to work in the family business and in his spare time tried to help the people of Burnsville. He loved politics and ran for Mayor and won. It was some of the happiest years of his life. This family was truly a blessing to the wonderful city of Burnsville.

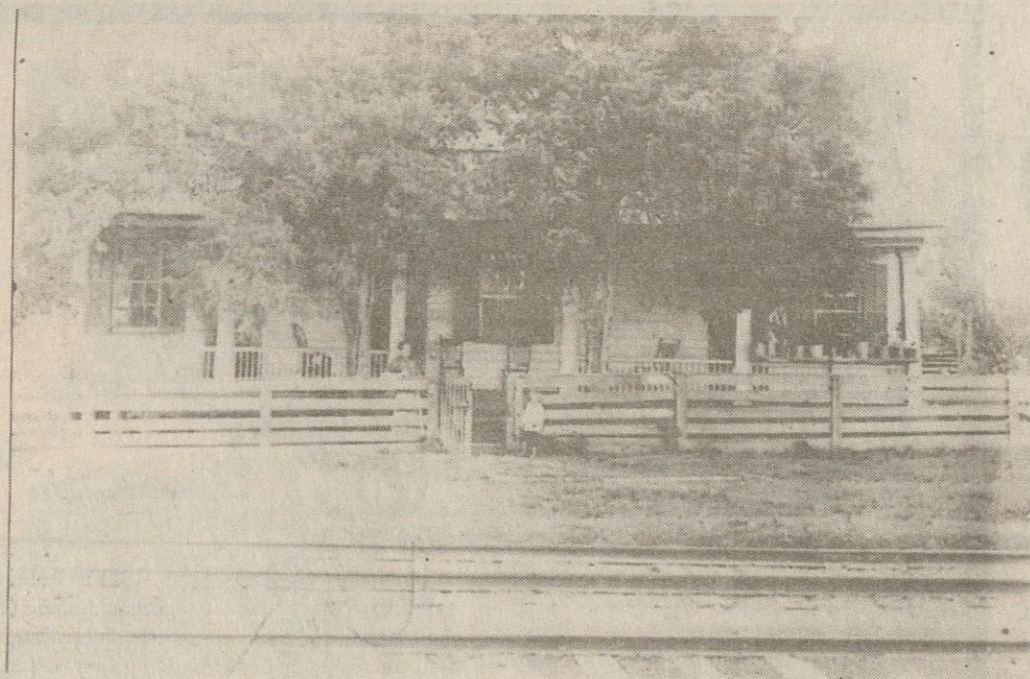

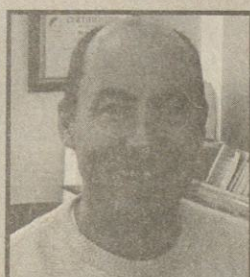
