Braves Win Over Saltillo 32-14

The Braves ended a three-game losing streak with a great win against the Saltillo Tigers last Friday night.

With a total of 254 yards (147 rushing, 44 receiving and 63 punt returns) Tyler Pritchard supported two touchdowns by Lee Griffin (74 yards rushing) and three by Matt Davis (41 yards rushing).

Total offensive yards for the night were 337, with 290 rushing and 47 passing, showing how the Braves

offense is working better together.

At the half, TC held the Tigers scoreless, 19-0, but the Tigers had some good plays in the second half, including two touchdowns to keep the game respectable.

The Braves are now 2-3, with a loss and a win in Division play. They host New Albany next week, and more division play in the coming weeks against Center Hill, Itawamba, Booneville and Shannon.

County Sets Regulations for Garbage Pickup

In a release Tuesday, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors announced the following regulations pertaining to garbage pickup in the county:

- Household garbage only (no wood or leaves)
- All garbage must be in tied bags.
- No overloaded bags (no more than 50 pounds)
- Do not let water get in bags or containers.

- Containers can be no taller than 3 feet.
- Garbage must be set out for pickup by 7 a.m. The landfill has started running a third truck to cut overtime, and may not run as usual.

Tractor-Motorcycle Collision Sends Cyclist to Hospital

This collision between a motorcycle and a county tractor on Monday afternoon resulted in the motorcycle driver being transported by ambulance to the hospital.

County employee Jimmy Barnett was driving a tractor and bush hog on County Road 298 near Grissom Chapel Church north of Burnsville around 12:30 Monday. He said he was turning around in the road to cut the other side when Randy Pittman came around the corner on his motorcycle. Pittman attempted to slow and avoid the crash, but the two collided, resulting in Pittman's front wheel getting lodged under the axle of the county-owned John Deere tractor. Pittman suffered a possible broken leg, said Barnett, but was speaking and alert after the accident, before being taken from the scene by ambulance. Barnett was unhurt at the scene afterwards.

Second District Supervisor Nickey McRae was on the scene, as well as several onlookers.

Marty McLendon Art Exhibit at Northeast Mississippi Community College Art Gallery in Anderson Hall, September 3 - October 13, 2008, 8-4 p.m.

Marty McLendon has a winning personality and a gift from the Master's hand with his pencil, chalk, paint brush, paint palette, or pottery design. Yesterday, I had the pleasure of touring his art exhibit at the Northeast Art Gallery in Anderson Hall on the Northeast campus. Those who have traveled with him on many international tours know the Lord touched his life many years ago and continues to use him daily in service to his community.

The following is a brief synopsis of the exhibit. On entering the exhibit in

Anderson Hall Gallery, one may sign as a visitor. Noting on the previous date, visitors registering were his friends Jim and Heather Allan of Scotland.

The first pencil sketch was a potter's hand molding the shape of a bowl on the potter's wheel. A pencil

sketch of a friend holding the hand of his infant son was heart rendering. But how can one adequately find words to describe the pencil sketch of his aged mother's hands on her open bible. Another favorite was a painting of his son David

picking flowers at about age two.

Marty taught art classes at Northeast for a 37-year career. His explanation of using Murphy's barn, formerly located at the site of the new Wal-Mart Super Center in Booneville for his art class field trips brought back many memories of my first trips to Booneville in my early career. He explained how he made a pencil sketch of the old Murphy barn, then made a photo of the barn, and subsequently instructed his students how to sketch, paint, and add other dimensions to their work.

Marty's montages of Corinth, Northeast, and other locations are included in his display. His original montage of Corinth is owned by Kimberly Clark at their facility in Corinth. The montage with the confederate flag as the background creatively included local favorites.

Sunflowers, magnolias, sycamore trees — all were artfully captured by the Master's hand — even a hummingbird in flight. Other paintings depicted the new fallen snow during winter months.

However, most of all, I enjoyed the paintings Marty has produced from his travels to England, Ireland, Scotland, Italy, and Greece. Edinburgh Castle on the great rock extrusion, St. Andrews Golf Clubhouse and rock bridge, scenes from the Isle of Arran in Scotland, the Northern

Ireland coastline, Ireland's forty shades of green, Irish countryside dotted with black faced sheep with thick coats of wool, a colorful harbor near St. Andrews in Scotland, the blue domes of cathedrals in Santorini, Greece — all show the great wealth of talent from our local artist.

Marty has pottery for sale included in his exhibit at the gallery. The unique sea shell design for pottery handles shows another dimension of his creativity.

I write this tribute

because as we traveled in other countries, Marty always included tours of major art galleries that included the grand paintings of artists through the ages. Please find time to appreciate the work of our great friend and local artist.

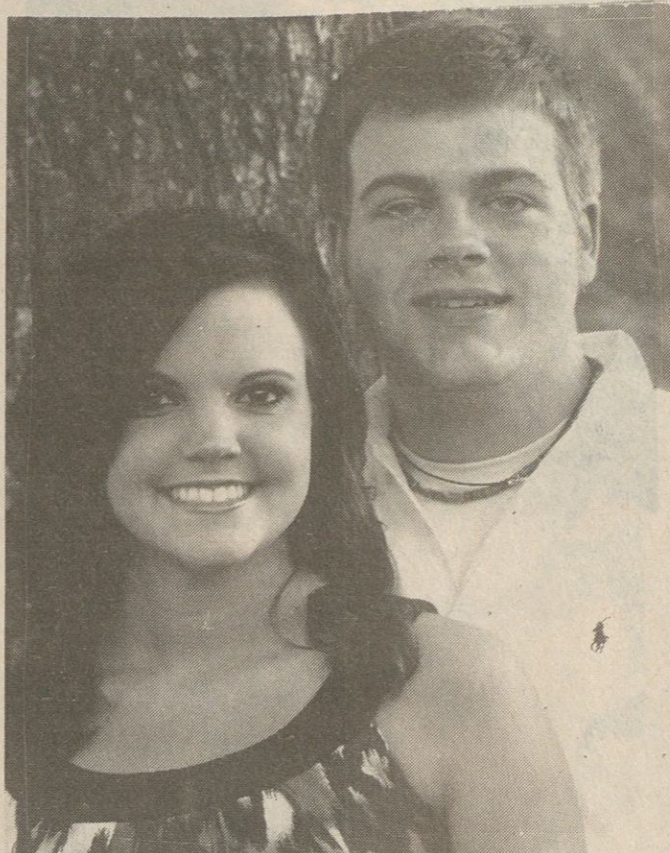

4. Any works that have been previously exhibited in the Tishomingo County Fair will not be accepted. Entries will be exhibited according to space available.

5. The judges reserve the right to refuse entries.

6. Specifications: All art must be suitable for hanging and measure no larger than 4 feet x 4 feet or artist must furnish own display. Space is limited. If you need more than 4 feet, please get prior approval.

7. Reasonable care will be used at all times in handling entries, but entries will not be insured. The Tishomingo County Fair Board will not be responsible for any loss or damages whatsoever.

8. All entries are eligible and will be judged for awards. A qualified

judge will make selections for cash award before the opening of the fair. NO prize will be awarded in the absence of a quality entry.

9. Artwork will be accepted Monday, October 6th, from 11:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. at the fairgrounds.

10. NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER OCTOBER 6th AT 7:00 P.M. Exhibits are not to be removed until Monday, October 13th.

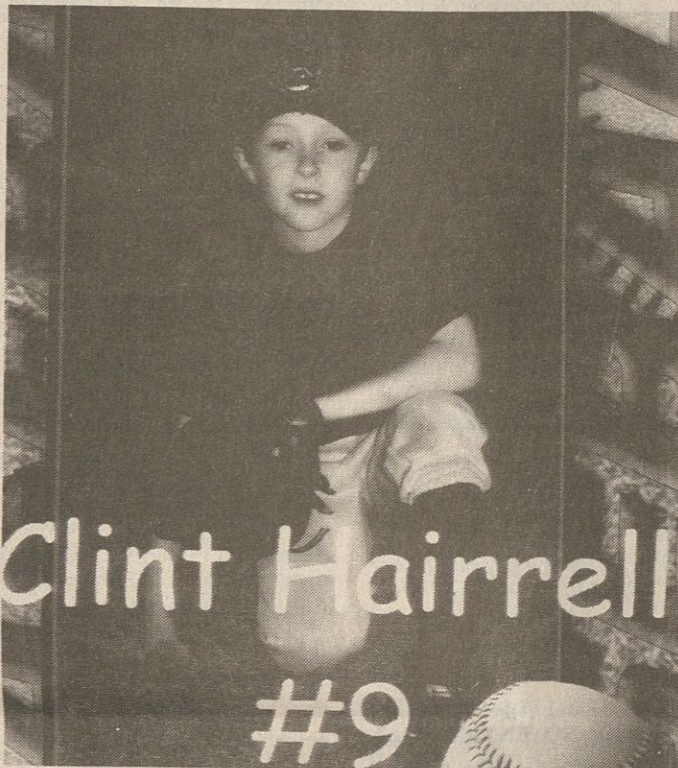

I got 1,834 signatures for the petition signing I held at the Mineral Springs Park in Iuka, and at other locations, and I am still collecting more signatures.

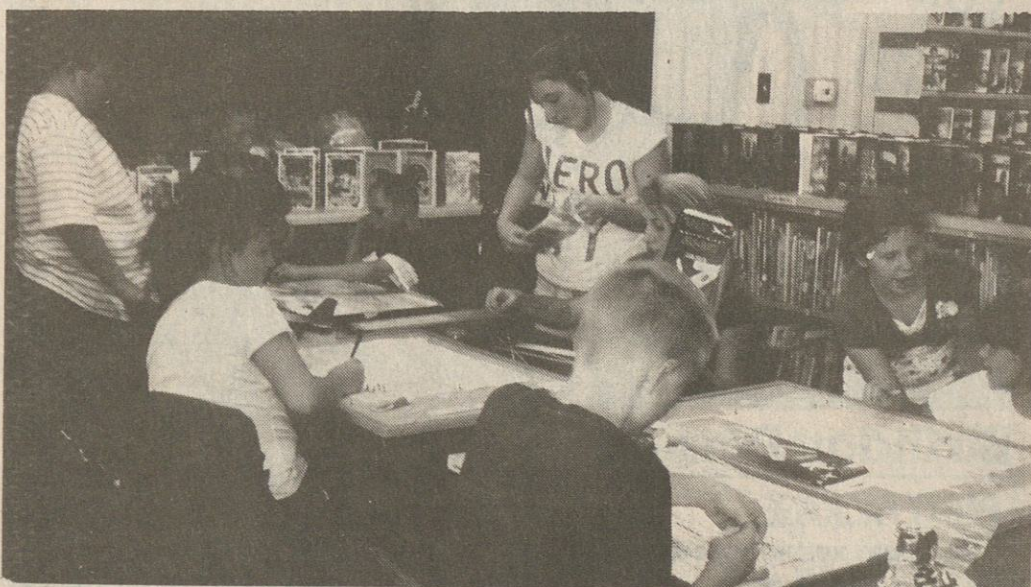

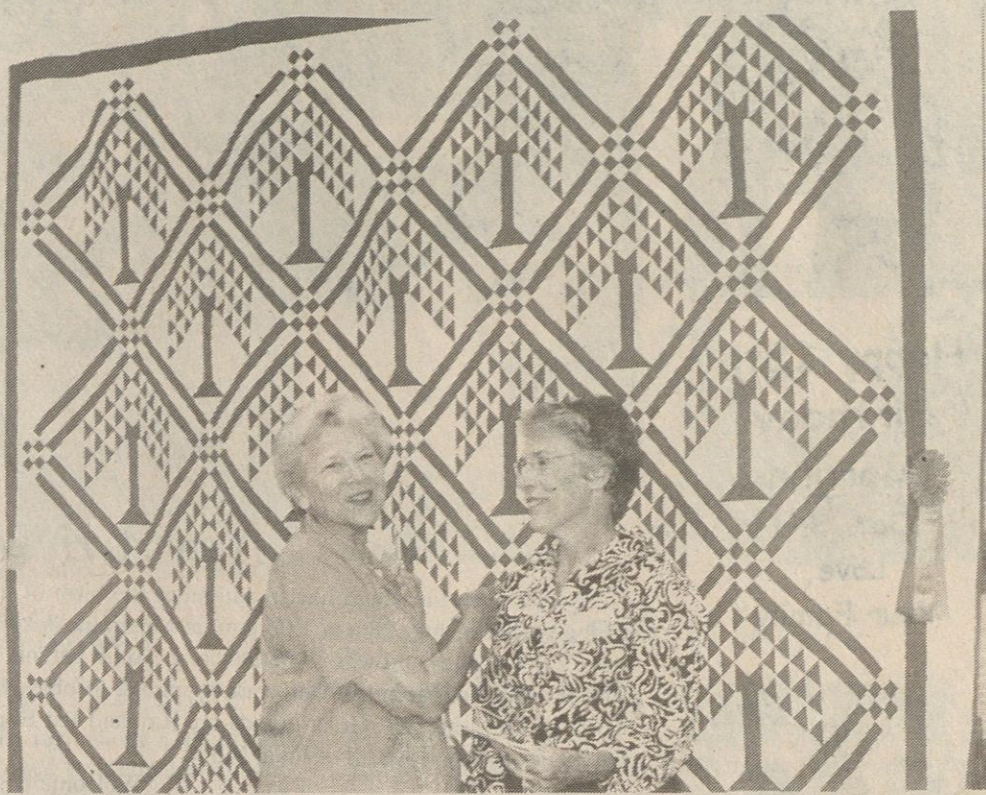

Childers Votes Against Bailout

Washington, DC — Congressman Travis Childers (D-MS) released the following statement in response to his vote against the \$700 billion Wall Street bailout:

"Hard-working families are struggling in the face of job losses and home foreclosures resulting from overall economic instability. They are justifiably angry about a bailout that would require them to dig deeper into their pockets to rescue Wall Street from its own recklessness."

"Earlier this year, I voted against a budget that would raise the federal debt to an unprecedented level. Today, I was again compelled to vote my conscience against a massive debt increase."

"While I appreciate the bipartisan effort to craft this legislation, at the end of the day, I could not, in good conscience, vote for a bailout of Wall Street that would increase our national debt by such magnitude and place such a heavy and undue burden on working families."

by including provisions for oversight and accountability over the past week. While it was still not convincing enough for me or my constituents, I will keep an open mind as negotiations continue in hopes that a more fiscally responsible plan that ensures protection of hard-working Americans will be presented."

"A central concern is the fundamental issue of fairness. Asking every American to shoulder an additional \$2,300 in debt because of Wall Street's reckless mistakes is incredibly unfair. Working families have been left on the sidelines for far too long as tax breaks and special treatment have been handed to the wealthiest and most powerful interests. The average American's stake in the economy needs to be protected."

"I look forward to negotiating a plan that makes sense for American taxpayers, and will continue to put North Mississippians first as the effort to reach a fiscally responsible, bi-partisan solution continues."
