On Thursday, October 9th, there will be several gospel groups performing beginning at 6:30. This will include the Lovelace Family, Ricky Ryan, Simply Grace and Iuka's hometown favorite, the Unity Four.

Armbands are still available for \$12 on Wednesday and Thursday nights. You can ride all the rides as many times as you wish with an armband.

Friday night will

Blinking, Tears,  
And Oxygen

Like all living tissue, eyes must have a continuous supply of oxygen. Tears dissolve oxygen from the air and carry it to eye tissue. Not only do tears bathe eyes with oxygen, they also keep contact lenses moist and comfortable. Some people, particularly the elderly, have eyes so dry that they cannot wear contact lenses; others must use lubricating drops frequently.

Most of us have enough tears, but we may not be able to use them efficiently because we have poor blinking habits. Blinking pumps tears over the surface of the eyes. If your eyes are red and burning and your vision becomes blurred when you are wearing your contacts, it may be because your blinking is incomplete and tears cannot flow.

We tend to take blinking for granted, yet some people do not blink properly. Blinking problems can be corrected. Your optometrist can provide detailed instructions on proper techniques.

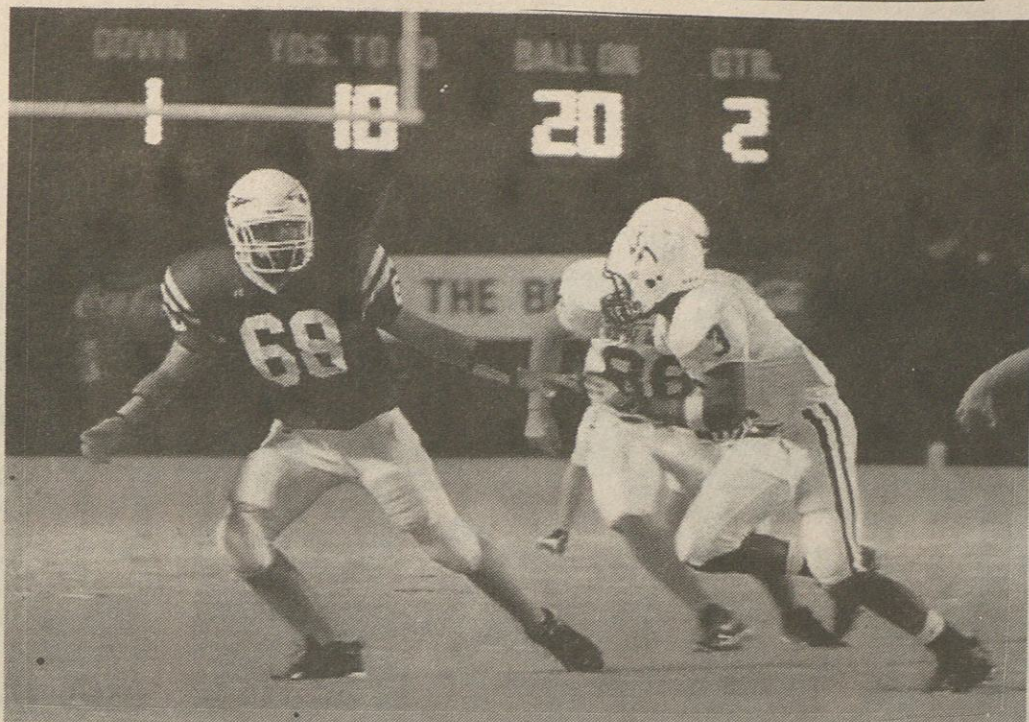

## Tate Cutshall Always In For Hebron

It's hard to say just when Tate Cutshall catches his breath during Hebron football games.

When the Eagles have the ball, Cutshall could be lined up at tight end or receiver. When Hebron's on offense he could be at linebacker, corner or safety. When on kicking plays he has no rest; he's the kicker. But the senior takes it all in stride. He's used to being the utility player.

Cutshall started out playing football in the seventh grade when his friends told him their team needed a kicker. He was a better player, so it was an easy transition. But he quickly found himself lined up at cornerback and receiver. So much for just kicking.

Now he's even more of an offensive weapon for the Eagles. In addition to handling all the kickoffs, punts, field goals and extra points, he's caught one touchdown and rushed for another through Hebron's first four games. He's kicked four PAT's and ran the two point conversion, too. His one field goal attempt was wide.

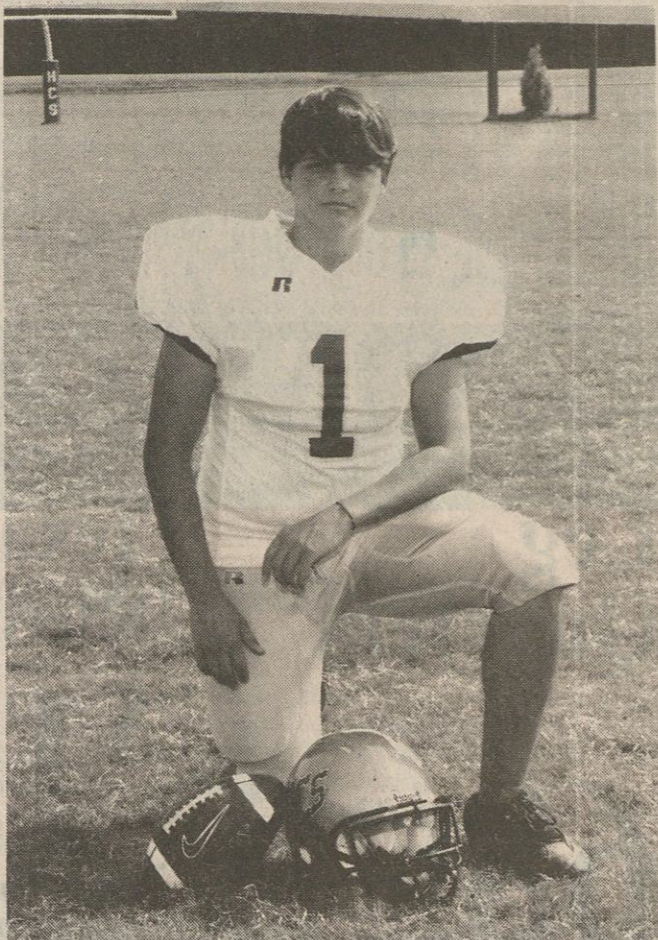
After playing outside linebacker for the beginning of the season, Cutshall played cornerback for Hebron against Immanuel. His assignment was stop Immanuel quarterback/running back/receiver Meshun Harris.

And Cutshall was cool with that.

"I feel more confident at corner because I'm more experienced," he says.

That's not to say Cutshall isn't doing his thing at linebacker. He's been in on a gang on tackles this year and has a fumble recovery, a few sacks and an interception.

The pick came with five seconds left against Newton in Hebron's second game this year. With time winding



down, Newton tried to throw a quick out to score one last time.

Cutshall wasn't having it. He read the quarterback's eyes and knew where he was throwing. So he jumped his receiver's route and took the ball back 40 yards the other direction.

Hebron still would have lost if he had scored, but Cutshall says running on a wide open field was a good feeling. On the other hand, he was just waiting for someone to catch up to him and tackle him, which they did.

Cutshall got a taste for the end zone earlier this season when he caught his first touchdown pass against New Site.

"I've always just gotten us down the field. I never really scored until this year," he says.

As the kicker, Cutshall had scored extra points and field goals, but this was his first touchdown. Which was a load off his shoulders.

"I was just relieved. I didn't think I'd ever get that

chance," he says.

But there's nothing wrong with kicking for points. In fact, Cutshall, who plays midfielder in soccer, wishes his team would kick more field goals and go for two less. More points for him.

Since taking up football, Cutshall has been a two-sport athlete. He also plays second base for Hebron's baseball team. He's played soccer all his life, but Hebron doesn't have a soccer team.

When he goes to college, the soccer player may reemerge. Cutshall says he may try to walk on to a football team as a kicker, or at least play intramural soccer.

His parents, Jason and Kelly Cutshall, would like for him to take a shot at pharmacy school, and he still may. But first he has to go out and do a little bit of everything on the football field.

## Absentee Voting For General Election

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the November 4th General Election. You may come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, October 25th, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and Saturday, November 1st, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, for absentee voting.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the circuit clerk's office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail.

• These five groups are:

1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older;
2. A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;
3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and/or
4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.
5. All voters who are members of the Armed

Services, or other voters that fall within the Armed Services Absentee Voting Law.

• All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a registered voter.

• All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballot may be hand delivered.

November 1st will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the General Election.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on November 3rd in order to be eligible to be counted for the November 4th General Election.

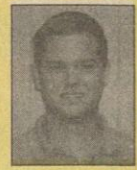
