Eyesight Dr. Phillip Gray **OPTOMETRIST** Blinking, Tears, And Oxygen Like all living tissue, eyes must have a continuous supply of oxygen. Tears dissolve oxygen from the air and carry it to eye tissue. Not only do tears bathe eyes with oxygen, they also keep contact lenses moist and comfortable. Some people, particularly the elderly, have eyes so dry that they cannot wear contact lenses; others must use lubricating drops frequently. Most of us have enough

tears, but we may not be able to use them efficiently because we have poor blinking habits. Blinking pumps tears over the surface of the eyes. If your eyes are red and burning and your vision becomes blurred when you are wearing your contacts, it may be because your blinking is incomplete and tears cannot flow.



Donations are the way that money is raised to cut the cemetery. In 1998, I received donations from 28 people totaling \$1,179.00, this year (2008), ten years later. I received


contributions from 10 people (and three of them were from out of state) for a total of \$570.00.







#### Absentee Voting For General Election

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the November 4th General Election. You may come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, October 25th, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and Saturday, November 1st, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, for absentee voting.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the circuit clerk's office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail.

• These five groups are: 1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older;

2. A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;

3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically

#### disabled; and/or

4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.

5. All voters who are members of the Armed

#### B Services, or other voters that fall within the Armed H Services Absentee Voting B

Law. • All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a registered voter.

• All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballot may be hand delivered.

November 1st will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the General Election.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on November 3rd in order to be eligible to be counted for the November 4th General Election.


