## The Burial of An Exceptional Dog

Monday, October 20th, 2008, was a typical October morning, weather-wise, but the events of the day were anything but typical on this blue-skied, sunshiny morning.

I had been invited by a close Alabama friend to come and go with her to a funeral. Did I know the victim? No, but he was being flown here from Coudersport, Pennsylvania for burial. I knew it had to be a special occasion. Having the curiosity of a cat, I thanked her and said, "I'll be there."

I rolled out of bed and made my way to my grandson's house where he (Shane), Glo, Carri Beth, Zoe and I set out through the Freedom Hills of Northwest Alabama to the Key Underwood Coon Dog Cemetery, the only one of its kind in the world, for the burial of "White Hills The Merchant," from Coudersport, PA, a four-legged Walker Hound.

When we got in sight of the location, cars, trucks, SUV's, TV cameramen, newspaper reporters and lots of amateur photographers lined the road and the parking area. I knew this was something I had never experienced, although Chester and I had carried our children there for picnics down through the years and just enjoyed the beautiful surroundings.

For you who are not familiar with coon hunters, may I inform you that they are not a bunch of red-necked country-bumpkins. They are "men" who would turn down any amount of money for their prized possession. The funeral that I was attending was for just such a dog.

Several well-dressed ladies, all in black dresses and hats, took their honored seats. Some had veils over their faces to hide their grief. Some of the men wore tuxedos, too.

Mr. L.O. Bishop was Master of Ceremonies. He welcomed everyone and introduced the platform guests: Dr. Scott Sealy, who gave the invocation; Dr. Freda Daily, retired Superintendent of Colbert County Schools; Rev. J.B. Burns, who gave the benediction; and Mr. Raynor Frost, owner of White Hills "The Merchant" who gave the eulogy of his prized coon dog. He had a long pedigree of a treeing Walker Hound who had not only been a friend and companion, but had made him proud. He was Grand Water

## Identity of Assailant Sought by Victim's Family

A Tishomingo family is seeking information on an unknown assailant who allegedly attacked a teen driver last Wednesday.

According to Nina Thorn, of Tishomingo, her daughter, Michelle Allison, 17, was leaving her workplace, Animal's Choice veterinary clinic last Wednesday afternoon, October 15th, about 5:30. She looked both ways, and thinking the way clear, pulled out on County Road 197 in front of an oncoming silver Mustang. After she pulled out, she saw the Mustang, and accelerated to help prevent a collision.

Shaken by the near collision, she pulled over when she saw that the driver of the Mustang had pulled over. Then, reports Thorn, the driver of the Mustang approached Michelle's car,

while she was still belted in, and assaulted Michelle through the window.

Michelle has been treated for a cracked nose, and a cut under her eye, and she suffered a black eye, said Thorn. Her glasses were knocked off, into the road, and she had to be driven home, she was so upset, said her mom.

The family is offering a reward for information leading to the identification of the alleged assailant, who got back into her car, which included another adult woman and a toddler, and left the scene. She is described as having shoulder length blond hair and a tongue ring.

## Board of Supervisors Approves Two Road Projects Before Going to Fall Conference

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors approved road projects in the third and fifth districts before heading down to Vicksburg for their fall conference.

The board accepted bids last Friday, during a work session, for "mill, base repair and surface" of Rock Crusher Road, according to purchase clerk Lynn West. The low bid of \$298,516.90 from APAC, Inc. was approved for award. The estimate by the state aid engineers was \$255,357.98, reported West.

Bids for replacing a cross drain pipe at Red Bud Road were also accepted, and a low bid of \$44,178.10 by Buddy Ayers was approved for award. The state aid engineer's estimate for the job was \$50,837, reported West.

No start date was identified.

The board members are in Vicksburg this week for the Fall Conference of Supervisors, and so the regular third Monday meeting did not occur. The next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 3rd.

### Put Your Car Keys Beside Your Bed At Night...

Tell your spouse, your children, your neighbors, your parents, your Dr.'s office, the check-out girl at the market, everyone you run across. Put your car keys beside your bed at night.

If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off, and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies. This tip came from a neighborhood watch coordinator.

Next time you come home for the night and you start to put your keys away, think of this: It's a security

alarm system that you probably already have and requires no installation. Test it. It will go off from most everywhere inside your house and will keep honking until your battery runs down or until you reset it with the button on the key fob chain. It works if you park in your driveway or garage. If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break in your house, odds are the burglar/rapist won't stick around...after a few seconds, all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there and sure enough the criminal won't want that! And remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there.

This is something that should really be shared with everyone. Maybe it could save a life or prevent a sexual assault. My Mom has suggested to my Dad that he carry his car keys with him in case he falls outside and she doesn't hear him. He can activate the car alarm and then she'll know there's a problem.

As Mr. Frost completed his eulogy, his voice was filled with emotion over what he was leaving in this remote area, where no sounds of civilization can be heard. The birds were disturbed by our presence and only the rustling in the leaves of possibly a squirrel, rabbit, deer or coon could be heard.

The dog pallbearers let out mournful sounds on occasion, but even they seemed to know when it was proper to mourn audibly.

Not-quite-traditional funeral songs played included "Moonshine Freedom Hills" and "Ole Troop," which were written and recorded by the late J.D. Lindsey of Red Bay, Alabama.

Mr. Bishop gave an interesting history of Freedom Hills and the Coon Dog Cemetery in tribute to Mr. Key Underwood, founder, whose dog "Troop" was buried there on Labor Day, 1937.

Dr. Freda Daily led the

assembly in the singing beautiful, patriotic song, "Bless America". The dog was given and the signal and immediately rang out through Freedom Hills played by Eddie Thomas.

My heart swells with think of how God has blessed America. Here we have freedom to honor one special creation with and with the blessing of a fellow-man. I pray that we continue to bless America help us to be worthy of freedom.

The body was laid to rest in what looked like a Radio Flyer, followed by pallbearers, three of which belonged to Mr. Frost. The dog was owned by Mr. J.R. Bishop.

# CHS Grad Wins Award as Horn Lake Assistant Principal

*Editor's Note: Rosie King, daughter of Doug and Christie, graduated from Tishomingo County High School in 1996. She is now assistant principal at Horn Lake Elementary School. This article was published in the Commercial Appeal on October 10th.*

Rosie King is a person of words. But her tears came easier than words Thursday morning at Horn Lake Elementary School, where the state schools superintendent and a foundation official from California surprised her with a \$25,000 award.

King was announced as one of two Mississippi recipients this year of the prestigious Milken National Education Award, which comes with it a \$25,000 check for personal use.

Aaron Wilson, a teacher at Woodley Elementary School in Hattiesburg, is the other winner. A panel selects the recipients. Nominations are involved in the process.

Nationally, up to 80 teachers and school administrators each year receive the award, which cites them as the nation's best. It is presented by the Milken Foundation of Santa Monica, Calif.

King, 30, is in her second year as Horn Lake Elementary's assistant principal after working four years as a teacher, one as an administrative intern and one as a district's reading and language specialist.

Speaking to the assembly Thursday after the announcement, King said, "I am crying. I am crying because I am so excited. These are happy tears. This is such an honor. I don't know what to say. Thank you, thank

you, thank you."

The school's students, faculty members and community dignitaries had been called to the assembly supposedly to hear Dr. Hank Bounds, state superintendent of education, talk about state testing.

But when he started talking, Bounds apologized that he had had to "fib a little bit" about his reason for coming to the school.

He then introduced Jane Foley, senior vice president with the foundation. Foley took the students and others in the audience through a series of steps that led to the announcement.

After Foley described the award and said someone in the audience would receive it, King said she was trying to think which of her teachers it might be.

And then, King said later, "everything stopped" when she heard her own name announced.

After the shock, came the tears and the grasping for words. The tears continued to flow, but the words started coming back.

"You know the thing about being a teacher or an administrator and everything that we do is that it all depends on what the kids do, so what is standing behind a great educator is a bunch of great kids. I am so glad to get to be here at this school with you (the students) and get to be at this school with the best teachers in the world."

King said she wished she could give each person at the school the award "because you deserve it."

In an interview, Bounds said teachers and other educators are today's real heroes.

He said Mississippi has really good teachers and the

award shows that one of the greatest in the nation is at Horn Lake Elementary.

Foley said King is in the top 1 percent of educators in the nation. She said the award is designed specifically to give King an incentive to stay in the profession.

Overall, she said the awards, which have been presented yearly since 1987, are also designed to bring recognition to the work that teachers and other educators do across the nation.

As an award winner, King will receive an all-expenses-paid trip to Los

Angeles in the spring to participate in the Milken National Education Conference. And she will be a part of continuing foundation programs.

DeSoto's last Milken Award winner, Carol Burton (2000), now a teacher-mentor at Hernando Elementary School, took part in Thursday's announcement.

In Mississippi's first year of participation in 1991, Connie Murphree, then a teacher at Hernando Middle School, received the award.

ago, but the dining room was finished last week—after just seven days of work by a crew from Oklahoma, said Tucker.

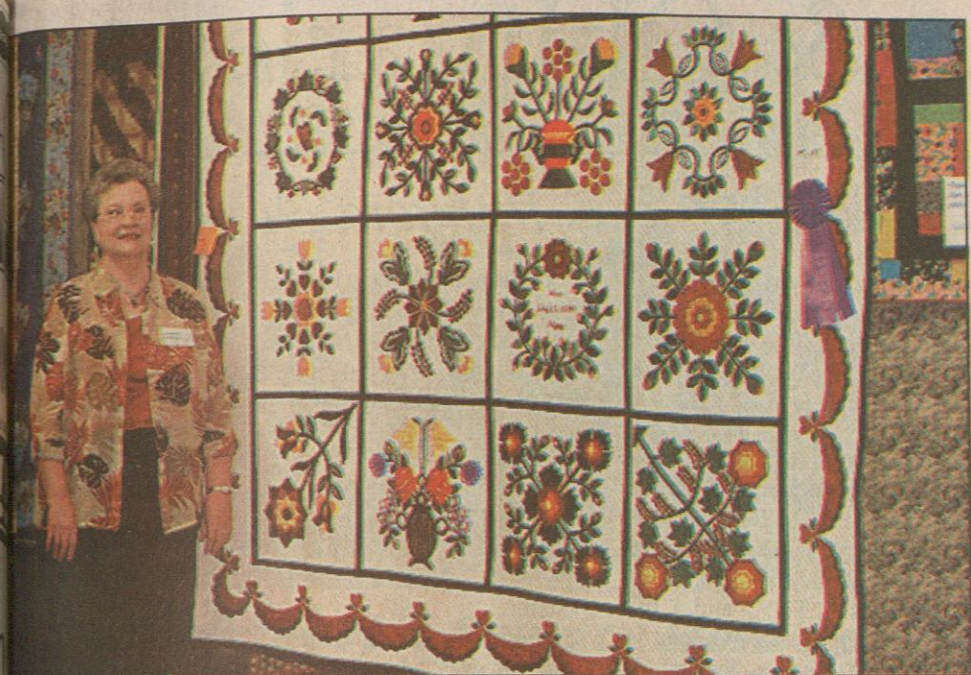
To facilitate the remodel, the dining room closed early a few days.

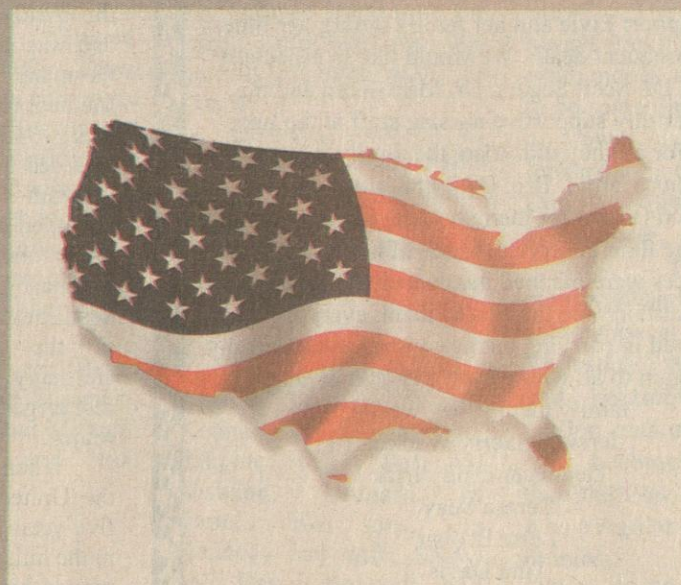

## Grant Funds For Tishomingo County Residents

Tishomingo County Emergency Management Agency announces that the Hazard Mitigation Grant funds for residents of Tishomingo county have been approved. These grant funds are for residents that have applied for Storm Damage Assistance. Applicants who will receive the grant packet from the Emergency Management Agency.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is participating in an ongoing statewide effort to identify, locate, and evaluate children, birth through the age of twenty-one, who have a physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional disability. Early identification of children in need of special education experiences is most important to each child. Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

Please contact Debbie Walker, Child Find Contact Person for the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District, if you know any children who may have a disability by calling 423-3206 or writing her at the following address: Tishomingo County Schools, 1620 Paul Edmondson Drive, Iuka, MS 38852.

The Child Find Person implements child identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find Person works with the local Health Department, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is

the responsibility of the Child Find Contact Person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly described the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents and insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a non-discriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to attend the Eligibility Determination Conference by the Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/or related services, an Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

We now have twenty-nine special education classes in our district which provide services to students who have a physical, mental, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.
