Voter turnout was said Though he didn't win to be high nationwide, but according to Circuit Court Clerk Donna Dill, turnout in Tishomingo County was comparable to county-wide official elections. The election commission and Dill's staff were able to compile all votes except affidavit votes, of which she said there were less than 100 in the county.

Tishomingo County voted along with the state of Mississippi, giving Republican John McCain 74 percent (6,195) of the county vote to Obama's 23 percent (1,941). Statewide, McCain received 67 percent.

In state races, Roger Wicker won the race to finish the unexpired term of Trent Lott in the Senate with 55 percent of the total vote to Ronnie Musgrove's 45 percent. In the county, Wicker's margin was greater - 67 percent of the vote to Musgrove's 32

Senator Thad Cochran retained his seat with 62 percent statewide over challenger Erik Fleming. In the county

Cochran won 74 percent.
Travis Childers won his seat in the House of Representatives with 54 percent district-wide over Greg Davis' 44 percent. In the county,

Childers won 57 percent. **Election Commission**

In the races for election commissioners, Pete Walker won in District 1 with 66 percent of the vote, to Judy Brown's 33 percent.

In District 2 there will be a run off November 18th between incumbent Jeff Wilemon, who won 35 percent, and challenger Mary Sue Wright, who won 44 percent. Mack Phifer earned 19 percent in that race.

In District 3, incumbent Sherry Gwatney won an overwhelming 72 percent of votes, over challenger Raymond Gist with 27 percent.

In District 4, Floyd "Snake" Ware won with 55.9 percent of the vote over Josh McNatt, who earned 43.9

In District 5, Ron Deaton was unopposed and earned 99 percent of the vote.

School Board

In the two school board elections, the incumbents held onto their seats.

In District 1, Michael Puckett won 56 percent of the vote over Keith Wimberly with 43 percent.

In District 5, incumbent Harold Sparks narrowly avoided a runoff by earning 51.22 percent of the vote over challenger Boyd Lee Tidwell, who received 48 percent.

Two men are in custody in Corinth following a pair of robberies last Monday in Tishomingo County.

Robert A. Morrison, 46, of Corinth, has been charged by the county with robbery for allegedly stealing cash from the register at Otha's Ouick Stop on Highway 25 near North Crossroads.

According to Tishomingo County Chief Deputy Jamie Reynolds, around 1:30 p.m. October 27th, the sheriff's department got the call about an apparent robbery at

Morrison was shown on the store camera to be making a purchase, and when the clerk opened the drawer, he reached over and grabbed cash from the register drawer, said Reynolds. Morrison then got away in a vehicle driven by Michael Dillworth, 45, also of Corinth.

The same evening, around 10 p.m., said Reynolds, sheriff's deputies assisted officers of the Iuka Police Department following a robbery using a similar method at the Exxon on

Battleground Drive. Morrison took at least a \$100 bill, said Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer. Officers searched the area, but did not find the

That night, officers in Corinth located the vehicle parked at an apartment complex based on information sent out by the TCSD earlier in the day. TCSD investigators questioned the owner of the vehicle, Dillworth, who later gave Morrison's name.

County High School students scored perfectly on required Subject Area Tests taken last Spring. These tests are some that are required for graduation.

On the Biology I test Paige Thornton made a perfect score of 500.

On the U.S. History test, which was taken by juniors last spring, Wesley Trimm made a 489, the highest at TCHS. No one scored a 500, but all students who took the test

On the Algebra I test, which can be taken in any grade, five scored a perfect 687: James Caleb Ervin from TCHS; Mary McRae from Tishomingo Middle School; and Luke South, Ashley Richardson. and Kayleigh Tucker from Burnsville Middle School.

Supervisors Discuss Landfill, Roads, Industry

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors did a lot of listening in the morning session of their regular first Monday meeting November

they heard comments and suggestions on the county landfill from contractor Mike Nelson, who offered some help and advice with scheduled repairs to the transfer station concrete pad.

Nelson suggested a relocation of the transfer station, and overall reworking of the collection system for household garbage in the county, as opposed to fixing the sinking pad at the current station. He praised recent improvements made at the landfill, like the improved maintenance of the equipment, but suggested regional collection points to make it more convenient for customers to dump trash, and therefore keep the county cleaner. He offered some assistance and equipment for compaction and cleanup at the site.

Next, the Board heard from engineer Roland Humphries, of Cook Coggins Engineering of Tupelo, about recent bridge projects, and other road issues

Structures in Right of

The board also discussed a letter from the Office of

State Aid Road Construction stating that mailboxes and other structures on any road where state aid money was expected to be used must comply with proper guidelines "in order to improve safety ensure continued funding at the Federal and State levels." According to the September 15th letter, any projects that had nonconforming structures would

The problem, explained supervisor Nickey McRae, are structures that are in the right of way and are immovable like brick mailboxes, entrance gates, or other structures that would not break away easily

This only applies to state aid roads, which few people know if they are on, said McRae. There are probably only a dozen or so problem locations in the county, in the first and fifth districts, he said. If you have one of these structures, and want to know if it is a problem, contact your supervisor, McRae suggested.
