Mississippi and Tishomingo County Stay "Red"

Obama Wins Presidency

Though he didn't win a majority in most Southern states, including Mississippi, Barack Obama made history Tuesday by being elected the nation's first African-American president.

Obama won 52 percent of the national popular vote, John McCain's 47 percent with 86 percent of precincts reporting. The electoral votes were 338 to 160.

The new co-chairmen are David and Amanda Pryce, who have been personally affected by cancer.

Relay For Life needs as many individuals, businesses and civic groups to participate to continue the fight against cancer and hopefully prevent someone else from experiencing the negative effects of this devastating disease.

Voter turnout was said to be high nationwide, but according to Circuit Court Clerk Donna Dill, turnout in Tishomingo County was comparable to county-wide official elections. The election commission and Dill's staff were able to compile all votes except affidavit votes, of which she said there were less than 100 in the county.

Tishomingo County voted along with the state of Mississippi, giving Republican John McCain 74 percent (6,195) of the county vote to Obama's 23 percent (1,941). Statewide, McCain received 67 percent.

In state races, Roger Wicker won the race to finish the unexpired term of Trent Lott in the Senate with 55 percent of the total vote to Ronnie Musgrove's 45 percent. In the county, Wicker's margin was greater - 67 percent of the vote to Musgrove's 32 percent.

Senator Thad Cochran retained his seat with 62 percent statewide over challenger Erik Fleming. In the county Cochran won 74 percent.

Travis Childers won his seat in the House of Representatives with 54 percent district-wide over Greg Davis' 44 percent. In the county,

Childers won 57 percent.

Election Commission

In the races for election commissioners, Pete Walker won in District 1 with 66 percent of the vote, to Judy Brown's 33 percent.

In District 2 there will be a run off November 18th between incumbent Jeff Wilemon, who won 35 percent, and challenger Mary Sue Wright, who won 44 percent. Mack Phifer earned 19 percent in that race.

In District 3, incumbent Sherry Gwatney won an overwhelming 72 percent of votes, over challenger Raymond Gist with 27 percent.

In District 4, Floyd "Snake" Ware won with 55.9 percent of the vote over Josh McNatt, who earned 43.9 percent.

In District 5, Ron Deaton was unopposed and earned 99 percent of the vote.

School Board

In the two school board elections, the incumbents held onto their seats.

In District 1, Michael Puckett won 56 percent of the vote over Keith Wimberly with 43 percent.

In District 5, incumbent Harold Sparks narrowly avoided a runoff by earning 51.22 percent of the vote over challenger Boyd Lee Tidwell, who received 48 percent.

Braves Head to Playoffs at Pearl; Cardinals Face West Bolivar

The Braves played well against Division 1-4A powerhouse Shannon last Saturday night, though they did lose 5-21. The tough play should serve to prepare them for the first playoff game against the Pearl High School Pirates this Friday night in the first game of the state playoffs.

Distressing to the Braves team is the loss of quarterback and defensive back Lee Griffin, who suffered a broken arm in the final regular season game against Shannon Friday night. The senior broke both the bones in his left forearm, has had at least one surgery, and possibly faces additional surgery later this week, according to family members. Due to continuing swelling, doctors still couldn't even apply a cast at press time Tuesday.

"I hate it for Lee, I'd just as soon it be my arm as his," said Coach Steve Carter in an interview Monday morning. "He is one of the greatest kids I have ever worked with; if I'd ever had a son, I'd wish he'd have been like Lee."

Carter said running back Tyler Pritchard would start quarterback, and that they would rework plays from that position.

"We lose some running power from Tyler," said Coach Carter. "He can't throw to himself, or hand off to himself, so we'll have to work around that."

Sophomore junior varsity quarterback Jake Walker will probably take over Griffin's defensive duties, and he had some impressive rushing against Shannon. Both

In regular season play, the Braves ended 5-5.

Pearl had its seventh straight victory last Friday against Yazoo County, 42-6, and has a season record of 8-2 for the 4A Region 6 first-place spot. They have had a super year under first-year coach, and alumnus, John Perry. This is the first winning season their seniors have ever had.

The game will start at 7 pm Friday at Pearl High School. The team will leave around noon from TCHS.

Belmont Heads to Rosedale

The Belmont Cardinals face defending 2A state champion West Bolivar on their home turf in Rosedale Friday night, since they also earned a fourth place in their division.

West Bolivar is 8-2 for the season and is coming off a seven game winning streak. The Cardinals ended their season 8-2 after a decisive 53-0 victory over Hatley last week.

Two Charged After Oct. 27th Robberies at Otha's, Exxon

Two men are in custody in Corinth following a pair of robberies last Monday in Tishomingo County.

Robert A. Morrison, 46, of Corinth, has been charged by the county with robbery for allegedly stealing cash from the register at Otha's Quick Stop on Highway 25 near North Crossroads.

According to Tishomingo County Chief Deputy Jamie Reynolds, around 1:30 p.m. October 27th, the sheriff's department got the call about an apparent robbery at

Otha's.

Morrison was shown on the store camera to be making a purchase, and when the clerk opened the drawer, he reached over and grabbed cash from the register drawer, said Reynolds. Morrison then got away in a vehicle driven by Michael Dillworth, 45, also of Corinth.

The same evening, around 10 p.m., said Reynolds, sheriff's deputies assisted officers of the Iuka Police Department following a robbery using a similar method at the Exxon on

Battleground Drive. Morrison took at least a \$100 bill, said Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer. Officers searched the area, but did not find the suspects.

That night, officers in Corinth located the vehicle parked at an apartment complex based on information sent out by the TCSD earlier in the day. TCSD investigators questioned the owner of the vehicle, Dillworth, who later gave Morrison's name.

Students Make Perfect Scores on 2007 State Achievement Tests

Several Tishomingo County High School students scored perfectly on required Subject Area Tests taken last Spring. These tests are some that are required for graduation.

On the Biology I test Paige Thornton made a perfect score of 500.

On the U.S. History test, which was taken by juniors last spring, Wesley Trimm made a 489, the

highest at TCHS. No one scored a 500, but all students who took the test passed.

On the Algebra I test, which can be taken in any grade, five scored a perfect 687: James Caleb Ervin from TCHS; Mary McRae from Tishomingo Middle School; and Luke South, Ashley Richardson, and Kayleigh Tucker from Burnsville Middle School.

On the English II Multiple Choice, Elizabeth Robinson scored a 675, which was the highest score for TCHS. The required passing score was 645. All sophomores take this test, and all of them passed the English II writing test.

Luke South also scored perfectly on the Mississippi Science Test, taken last spring.

Supervisors Discuss Landfill, Roads, Industry

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors did a lot of listening in the morning session of their regular first Monday meeting November 3rd.

First they heard comments and suggestions on the county landfill from contractor Mike Nelson, who offered some help and advice with scheduled repairs to the transfer station concrete pad.

Nelson suggested a relocation of the transfer station, and overall reworking of the collection system for household garbage in the county, as opposed to fixing the sinking pad at the current station. He praised recent improvements made at the landfill, like the improved maintenance of the equipment, but suggested regional collection points to make it more convenient for customers to dump trash, and therefore keep the county cleaner. He offered some assistance and equipment for compaction and cleanup at the site.

Next, the Board heard from engineer Roland Humphries, of Cook Coggins Engineering of Tupelo, about recent bridge projects, and other road issues.

Structures in Right of Way

The board also discussed a letter from the Office of

State Aid Road Construction stating that mailboxes and other structures on any road where state aid money was expected to be used must comply with proper guidelines "in order to improve safety and ensure continued funding at the Federal and State levels." According to the September 15th letter, any projects that had non-conforming structures would be deferred.

The problem, explained supervisor Nicky McRae, are structures that are in the right of way and are immovable - like brick mailboxes, entrance gates, or other structures that would not break away easily if hit by a vehicle.

This only applies to state aid roads, which few people know if they are on, said McRae. There are probably only a dozen or so problem locations in the county, in the first and fifth districts, he said. If you have one of these structures, and want to know if it is a problem, contact your supervisor, McRae suggested.

In the afternoon, the Board met in executive session with Gary Matthews, Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation, regarding a company making plans to locate in Tri-State Commerce Park.

One Charged for Assault

An Iuka woman has been charged with simple assault for allegedly attacking a teen as she sat in her car last month, reported the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department.

Michelle Allison, 17, was allegedly attacked by another driver after she stopped to apologize for nearly causing a collision on County Road 197 the afternoon of October 15th.

The alleged assailant left her car and hit Allison several times as she was still strapped in her seatbelt.

Charlotte Michelle Station, 18, of Iuka, was charged with simple assault, a misdemeanor (since there was no weapon involved) said Chief Deputy Jamie Reynolds. She was released on bond.

Reynolds said a tip was received by the sheriff's department after the assault and offer of reward was published in the News. The informant, declined the reward.

According to Reynolds, Morrison was arrested around 9 a.m. Tuesday, October 28th, in Corinth, where he was still being held this week, due to existing charges the city of Corinth had on him. He will be transferred to Tishomingo County when charges in Corinth have been processed. This case was presented to the Grand Jury last week, said Stringer.

Dillworth was charged by the county with accessory after the fact, and is being held in Corinth.

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE FOR INITIAL HEARING

Tishomingo County is considering applying for a Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) amount up to \$650,000. The project will utilize CDBG funds for Economic Development/Public Improvements. The State of Mississippi has been awarded approximately \$30 million that will be made available to eligible communities on a competitive basis to fund eligible community development activities. The funds will be used for one of the following purposes:
1. To benefit low-and-moderate income persons;
2. To aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight;
3. To meet other community development needs of particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or safety of the community where other financial resources are not available to meet such needs.

The activities for which these funds may be used include the areas of housing, public facilities, and economic development. More specific details regarding activities, program requirements, and the rating system will be provided at a public hearing which will be held in the Tishomingo County Boardroom in Iuka, MS on November 21, 2008 at 9:30 a.m. The purpose of this hearing is to obtain citizen input into the development of the project.
