Belmont native Mac McAnally has won the award for Musician of the Year at the Country Music Association Awards.

McAnally was nominated for the same award last year, and this is one of many awards he has won in his distinguished career as a musician, producer, songwriter and artist. He is a member of Jimmy Buffet's Coral Reefer Band.

He is on a hot streak winning this award and writing Kenny Chesney's popular new single, "Down the Road," which features Mac on guitar and vocals. Along with these accomplishments, he played guitar on the latest George Strait albums, and was inducted into NSAI's Songwriter Hall of Fame, according to his website.

But back home in Belmont, he is known as just "Mac," and home folks are proud of him. He is the oldest of three children of the late Lyman and Ella Mary McAnally, and his baby sister Lisa McAnally Holt lives with her family in Belmont, and works as a third-grade teacher at Iuka Elementary. Another sister lives in Columbus.

"We are proud of him," said sister Lisa of Mac's latest

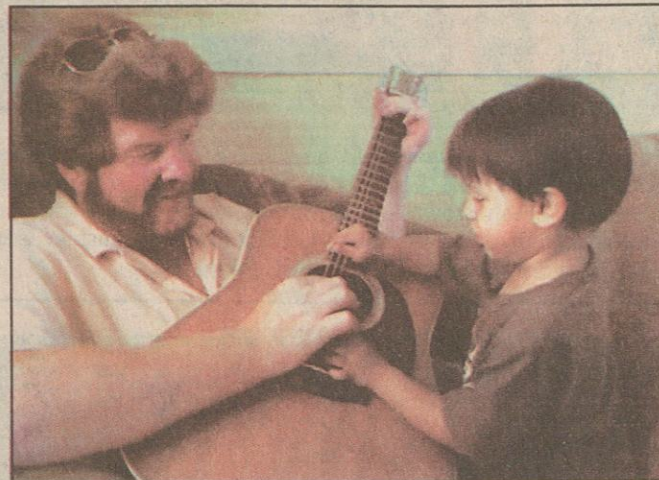

## Gresham Quarry Keeps Tishomingo on Map as Major Source of Hartselle Sandstone

A 1966 photo of a Tishomingo County quarry was recently reprinted in the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality newsletter. The published caption identified it as "I. E. Gresham with his grandson beside a recently-quarried *Lepidodendron* log in the

Hartselle Sandstone at the Gresham Quarry in Tishomingo County. It was taken by Ed Blake, June 3, 1966."

A kind reader of the *Tishomingo County News* forwarded it to us, since it was about Tishomingo County.

After a little research with Joyce Gresham White,

it was discovered that this was Cordy Gresham and his grandson, Jimmy, and that the photo is actually at the J.O. Southward Quarry, now closed down.

The photo originally ran with a story about this stone cutter being one of the last of a dying profession - stone quarry work. Mrs. White contradicted this, as the Gresham Stone Quarry near Tishomingo State Park is still in operation. It is the only working quarry in this area, historically known for supplying Tishomingo Stone, which is called Hartselle sandstone by geologists.

All five Gresham brothers worked at the Southward Quarry: Cordy, Earl, George, Eddie and Reece. They invested in a saw that would cut the stone and it was a great business within the quarry for the Gresham brothers and for the owner, J.O. Southward.

For the last twenty years, Bob and Clemmie Gresham have run the quarry his daddy ran. He still sup-

plies building and landscape stone from Florence to New Albany and beyond. In recent years some of his best sellers have been Tishomin-

go stone birdbaths, benches, bird feeders and other stone items for the garden. In nice weather, they have many visitors enjoy a walking trail

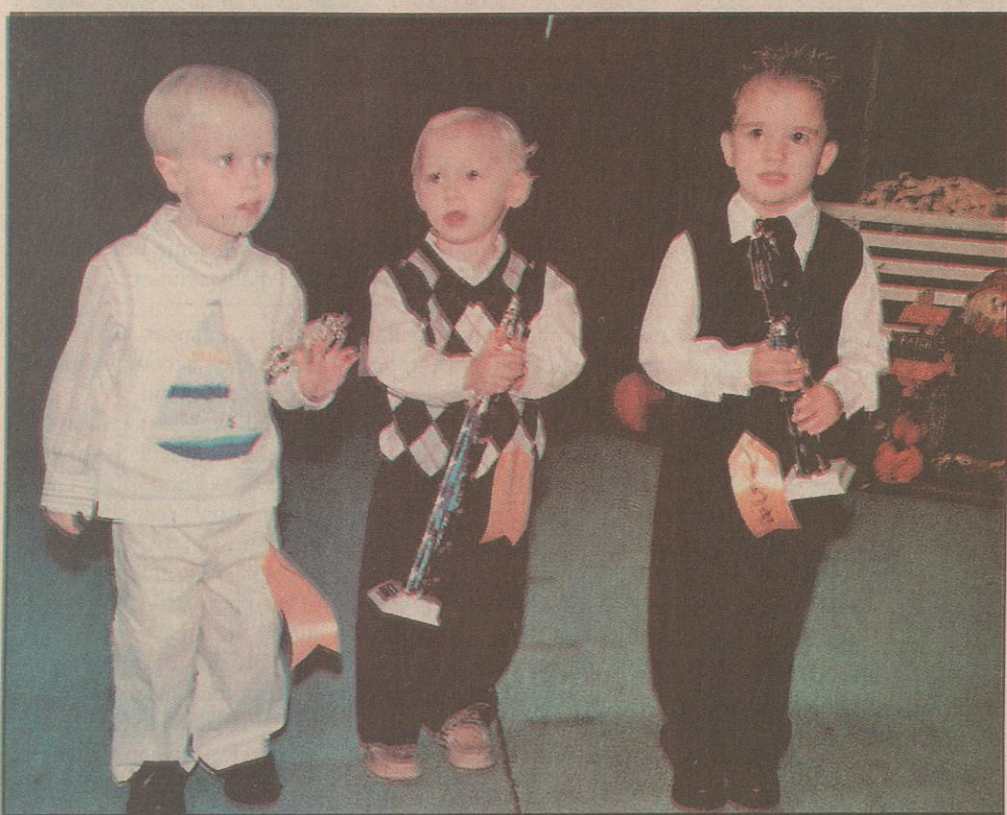
around the quarry, too, said Bob Gresham.

Bifocals For Young People

At one time, it was believed that whatever lens prescription corrected a youngster's vision problem - be it farsightedness, nearsightedness, or astigmatism - was automatically correct for all vision tasks and distances. Today we know this is not true. In a modern, thorough vision examination, a doctor of optometry can evaluate a child's ability to see well at all distances.

Sometimes, such an examination does reveal that a young person's most clear, comfortable and efficient NEAR vision requires a lens power that differs from the necessary DISTANCE correction. As with adults, bifocals are usually the most convenient way to provide these two different prescriptions in one pair of glasses. When this is the case, most children can become accustomed to bifocals with little difficulty. Remember: the most important thing is to allow the child to have maximum vision at all times, at all distances.

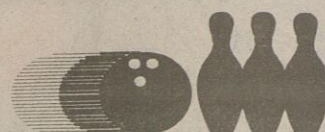
### NEMCC Recognizes Mobile Welding Unit Graduates

### 1919 Front Street In Iuka

Mrs. Lucille Pruitt is sharing with our readers this rare photo of Front Street in Iuka in 1919. She reports that after the town's wooden water tank burned, another wooden water tank was built and this photo was taken on "Water Tank Day" 1919. Everyone in town showed up for the occasion. Food was served, flags were flown and little girls dressed in their Sunday best white dresses and long stockings. Note the large tree standing in the middle of Front Street. It appears to be a pine tree and damaged. To the left can be seen the old J. C. Jourdan Drugs which is now occupied by Morgan Stanley. To the right of the drug store is Bridges Lunch Room which appears to have a grand stand in front. The new water tank would have been built behind the lunch room in the alley.

In the 1925 panoramic photo of Iuka located in the News office, the Jourdan Drug Store is located in the building now occupied by Photography by Charles. In the years between 1919 and 1925 the drug store must have moved next door. Also in the 1925 photo the tree appears to be a large oak tree full of leaves, with a barrier around it to protect it. If you know the mystery of the tree or any further information about this photo please contact the News office.

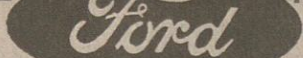

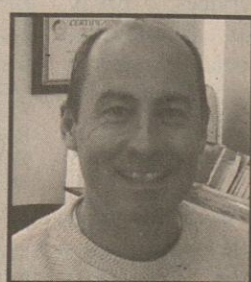

### HELL IS SOMETHING BEYOND DEATH

Have you noticed a downplaying of the doctrine of hell in our days? Mankind does not like to think of a place of punishment after death, but that is exactly what the Bible teaches concerning those who die without Christ and salvation. Luke 12:4-5 says, "And I say unto you My friends, Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do. But I will forewarn you Whom ye shall fear: Fear Him, which after He hath killed hath power to cast into hell; yea, I say unto you, Fear Him." The Lord Jesus told us that we need not fear men, who can kill our physical bodies,

I wonder why it is that some people want to believe all of the beautiful things that the Bible teaches, but they do not want to believe what even Jesus taught about hell? If there is a place called heaven, there is also a place called hell, and it is not the grave, nor is it annihilation, as some religions teach! May God give us a new generation of preachers who preach about the need to fear God, Who after He has killed, has power to cast into hell! The beautiful side to the message is that Jesus died for us, so that none has to remain lost. Heaven can be ours, instead of hell, by repentance and faith in Jesus Christ!

### NMMC Social Worker Receives Statewide Honor

Gina Smith, LCSW, was recently named the Social Work Leader of the Year by the Mississippi Society for Social Work Leadership in Health Care.

Smith resides in Saltillo with her husband Greg and daughters Clancy and Jenny Kate. She is the daughter of J.P. and Bobbie Wilemon of Belmont.

Smith is the social work regional manager for North Mississippi Medical Center's Home Health

Agency. She joined the NMMC staff 20 years ago, transferring to Home Health after five years at the hospital.

The Social Work Leader of the Year demonstrates excellence in leadership, relates in an effective manner to health care administrators, physicians, nurses and other personnel, provides community service and has responsibility for the day-to-day supervision of staff. Smith leads a health care social work program in the Home Health Agency, supervising seven social workers who make 2,260 visits each year. For the past 18 years Smith has collaborated with other personnel at NMMC to lead a community grief support group. She also coordinates Home Health's "We Care Workday," which helps needy patients with projects such as enhancing handicap accessibility at their homes, roof repairs, house cleaning and yard work.

In addition, she participates in the Methodist Senior Services program, "Meals on Wheels," in which she helps deliver food to

homebound senior citizens. She serves as chairperson of the Joint Commission's function, "Ethics, Rights, and Responsibilities," where the goal is to improve care, treatment, services and outcomes by recognizing and respecting the rights of each patient and by conducting business in an ethical manner. She teaches first grade Sunday School and has served for three years on the jail ministry in the Tupelo area.

The Mississippi Society for Social Work Leadership in Health Care accepts nominations from its membership each year, and a panel reviews the nominations.

"I love social work because I get to help people in some of their hardest

times," Smith said. "I see the challenges they have and I can help them find strength within themselves and overcome their problems. Social work in health care is so essential because when people are ill or disabled, either temporarily or long-term, it sort of creates a new reality for them. Social Workers can help them see things in a different light and help them through the changes they are experiencing. We work with all aspects of a person's life and look at their whole environment. We serve as an arbitrator between the patient, family and health care providers to see the best ways to meet

people's needs."
